COVID-19 RISK ASSESSMENT

Downham Town Football Club, Memorial Playing Field, Lynn Road, Downham Market, Norfolk, PE38 9QE

Introduction

As an affiliated club organising and hosting FA step 6 football activities we have a legal duty to take reasonable care to avoid acts or omissions which are a reasonably foreseeable risk.

This risk assessment has been created to identify the significant hazards and risks that could result in someone being harmed with a particular emphasis on those risks associated with the COVID-19 pandemic. It includes, where appropriate the identification of suitable mitigation measures that shall be followed by all associated with football activity at our club.

Given the constantly evolving nature of the public health crisis, this risk assessment will be reviewed regular and our mitigation measures updated in line with current government and FA guidance.

In this unprecedented time, we are grateful of feedback from our members, guests and all those associated with our football activities that will help us to continuously improve.

Our Approach

In creating this risk assessment, we have followed the 'Six Key Steps' published by the FA and subsequently by the Mid Norfolk Youth League. Specifically, we have:

- 1. Kept up to date with Government and FA guidance.
- 2. Contacted our insurance provider and confirm that we are covered to undertake activities in the current public health crisis.
- 3. Completed a thorough risk assessment as detailed in the remainder of this document and implemented a process to regularly review the content and mitigations. This assessment has been reviewed and approved by the club secretary who has signed this current version. Subsequent versions will be approved in a similar way.— see below for more details.
- 4. Updated Club policies where appropriate.
- 5. Briefed all DTFC youth staff on the content of this risk assessment including the committee, youth team coaches and managers, first aiders, welfare teams,, volunteers, officials and players. This document will be shared with visiting teams before any match..
- 6. Taken steps to ensure that activity will not be undertaken if the club has any concerns about the safety of club officials and/or participants.

Key Guidance Points

Below is a our response to the key guidance notes outlined by Norfolk County FA:

- A maximum of 30 people are to attend any organised sporting event.
- Participants for both home and visiting teams will provide names and contact details prior to activities taking place
- Our facility is fully compliant with current government legislation and guidance. The club house will remain closed to visitors and non-club staff
- All participants are required to supply their own hand sanitiser, which is to be used, before, at half time and after the scheduled football match.
- We have appointed a designated COVID-19 club co-ordinator [INSERT NAME]. This person will be responsible for recording contact details of all participants on their team and supply to NHS Track & Trace upon the event of an outbreak.
- Players will be informed that spitting and shouting should be avoided, as the main mode of transmission of the virus is in respiratory secretions.
- Players, coaches and officials will be advised to arrive changed and shower at home.
- Goal posts, corner flags and footballs will be wiped down before, during (half time) and after a match.
- First aiders will wear a mask and gloves where social distancing cannot be followed.
- Spectator groups will be requested to limit their size to 6 people per group and spread out around the pitch.
- Match fee payments including for officials will be cashless where possible I.e bank transfer within 48 hours of match
- Spectators to be informed prior to the match to bring loose change for refreshments to reduce the amount of money exchanged

Health Check Guidance

Participants, staff and spectators are requested to undertake a Covid-19 self-screen prior to attending any of our activities. The table below provides a checklist for doing so as a useful guide:

Each participant should self-screen prior to arrival at training to ensure they do not have any of the following symptoms (confirmed by a parent for those under age 18), as these are potential indicators of Covid-19 infection.	Check negative	Check positive
