TODAY'S VISITORS



Hinckley AFC is a community owned club that was established in January 2014, following the liquidation of Hinckley United. The town of Hinckley has had a football team for many years, the earliest recorded team being Hinckley Town, who played in the Leicestershire Senior League in 1889. Following a name change to Hinckley Athletic, the club acquired land on Middlefield Lane, and in the mid-1990s narrowly missed out on promotion to the Southern League on 3 occasions. Hinckley Town were formed after a name change in in 1972, and were promoted to the Southern League.

In the summer of 1997, the two chairmen established that both sides had something positive to offer a merger. Thus, Hinckley Town and Hinckley Athletic became Hinckley United, who won promotion to the Southern League Premier Division in 2001.

After finishing in 6th place in 2003/04, United were accepted into the newly formed Conference North. They moved into a new ground, on Leicester Road, in March 2005. In 2006/07, Hinckley reached the play-off final, then seasons of financial woe followed, and after relegation from the Conference North in 2012/13, the club was liquidated 6months later.

After appointing Carl Abbott as their first manager, Hinckley AFC's first match was on 5th July 2014, a 4-2 win against landlords Heather St John's. Abbott led AFC to a third-place finish in the Midland League First Division in their inaugural season, and set a new league record for matches with 27 games without defeat in all competitions.

The on-field success continued into the start of the 2015/16, when they overturned Redditch United to reach the Second Qualifying Round of the FA Cup. and won their first piece of silverware: going by winning the Senior Cup with a 5-1 victory over Dakham United in the Final.

In 2016/17 AFC finished runners-up and had a best ever run in the FA Vase, reaching the last 16. Abbott stepped down the following October, and the club had several managers for short spells between then and the present day.

The club were moved to the United Counties League in 2021-22 and finished 2nd, whilst hitting a new FA Vase record 18-0 win at St Martin's. Former assistant Joe Conneely took charge in 22-23 as the club were moved back to the Midland League, and in his first season Hinckley won the League Cup by defeating Whitchurch Alport and finished in 3rd before losing in the Play-off Semi Finals.

MATCH REPORT





From the first whistle Andy Crowther's men made their intentions clear as Jake Breckell was called into action twice in the opening 5 minutes to deny Josh Hurdman and James Lemon from breaking the deadlock.

When the visiting 'keeper was beaten, Jordan Sale intervened to clear another Lemon effort off the line.

Josh Hurdman opened the scoring with a fabulous first time volley from 20-yards which rifled into Breckell's top corner on 12 minutes. Six minutes later and Breckell was picking the ball out of his net again as Rudd's powerful low drive from 30-yards out flew into the bottom corner, just 2 minutes later Rudd had a brace when he headed in from close range. It was 4-0 on 25 minutes when Lemon turned his marker and finished well.

Bridgnorth had suffered an upheaval of their playing personnel over the week & struggled to break out of their own half. Their first opportunity on minutes fell to Leo Matiya who beat the offside trap but missed the target just Ollie Sayer to beat., but the Shropshire side pulled one back on 38 minutes as Captain Chris Sterling was fouled in the area and converted the subsequent spot kick.

Spa regained their 4-goal advantage 5 minutes later via a Perry Moss tap-

in, and then Breckell was on hand to save brilliantly and deny Charlie Tilley a 6th goal before the break. The second half continued in a similar fashion, and Rudd was millimetres away from a first ever hattrick on 48 minutes but his shot went just the wrong side of the post.

Josh Hurdman scored his second making it 6-1 on 50 with a back post header.

Lucas Edmonds was introduced and made an immediate impact as first he, then Hurdman, forced Breckell into further saves before Lemon put his effort just the wrong side of the post.

Edmonds & Lemon spurned a further three chances in quick succession before Edmonds, in his second spell at the club, scored his first senior goal for the Saltmen on 65 minutes.

Another fantastic finish as he chased onto a through ball and with Breckell off his line a first-time dink from the edge of the area lobbed the back-tracking Bridgnorth 'keeper and it was 7-1.

With 10 minutes remaining Woody Hawkett also scored his first senior goal for Spa, and Breckell was forced into action twice more before the end, making impressive stops to deny Hurdman a hat-trick. The visitors' only chance in the second half fell to substitute Sam Otisi who with the goal at his mercy fired well off target to cap off a grim afternoon from Bridgnorth, and to compound their disappointing away form; with just 4 points collected on their travels this campaign they have the worst away record in the Division.

The U2I's are progressing nicely, sitting fourth in the table which is no mean feat considering the upheaval earlier in the season. A O-O draw away against Brooke House International and a 2-1 home victory against Stourport Swifts sets us up nicely for our trip to league leaders Boldmere St Michaels (today).

The Under 18's Floodlit side have reached the Final of midweek Worcestershire County Cup after a nail biting 5-4 penalty shootout win; Joe Neeson saving three of the Pershore Town penalties following an untidy but entertaining 1-1 draw.

They followed this up with arguably the best performance of the season away at Hereford FC on Wednesday night, coming away with a well-deserved 3-1 victory.

Goals came from Harry Griffiths (2) and Will Dallaway. But we controlled the game from start to finish.

The MJPL 18's have fallen away results wise in recent weeks despite some good performances, and the squad continues to be depleted such is the transition into Under-21 football for a lot of players. It's a tough and unforgiving league especially at the top end.

Finally a big shout out to Woody Hawkett who scored his first goal for the senior side last Saturday. Woody had progressed really well this season and fully deserves his first team chance. He has consistently been the stand out player in the Under 21's as nominated by our opponents and has shown fantastic leadership qualities in the Midweek Floodlit Youth League.





Allscott Heath got a good point at home to Nuneaton Griff on Saturday in their hunt for the play offs. The draw makes it seven points from their last three matches and leaves them in 4th with a six-point gap over Cradley Town in 6th. They have been strong at home throughout the season with nine wins from fourteen matches. Nuneaton Griff took the lead in the first half thanks to a Steven Pywell overhead kick to go into the break with a 1-0 lead. The hosts responded in the second half and managed to find an equaliser through Harry Morris to get a valuable draw; a good point for both teams.

Droitwich Spa 8-1 AFC Bridgnorth

Droitwich continued their excellent home form with an emphatic win against relegation strugglers AFC Bridgnorth. Their form at Kingy's has been a real strength with ten wins from twelve matches. The Saltmen got into a 3-0 lead in the opening 25 minutes thanks to a brace from Cory Rudd & a goal from Josh Hurdman. It was 4-0 on the 25th minute thanks to a strike from James Lemon. AFC Bridgnorth got a goal back in the 38th minute through a penalty by Chris Sterling to make it 4-1. Perry Moss scored a few minutes before the break, and further efforts in the second

half from Josh Hurdman and substitutes Lucas Edmonds & Woody Hawkett made it 8-1 in an excellent win for Droitwich. It was a tough day at the office for Bridgnorth, for whom it's looking an uphill struggle to stay up. Ingles 3-0 Smethwick Rangers Ingles continued their good form with a convincing win against Smethwick Rangers at the Thringstone Miners Centre. The result leaves them in 2nd with 60 points and in the hunt for the top three. A good crowd of 62 supporters turned up to watch Ingles get their 8th home win of the season. A solo effort from Jack Allen and a brace from Jude Ayetine gave Ingles all three points. They've been one of the most consistent teams in the league with just one loss from their last eight. Smethwick are probably going to be playing at step seven next season. It's all building for the visitors over the next few months and looking at the bigger picture.

Stapenhill 1-1 Hinckley AFC Stapenhill held leaders Hinckley AFC to a draw at Maple Grove. A battling point for the Swans and an encouraging result against one of the standout teams. An excellent crowd of 110 turned up to watch the match in Burton, where Lewis Campbell scored for Stapenhill in the 35th minute before the visitors equalised thanks to an effort by Lewis Rankin in the 42nd minute. The Swans held out in the second half for a good point & response from Stapenhill to the 4-0 loss at Hinckley last week.

The hosts dominated the opening stages of the game with the lively Umaru Saho causing no end of problems down the left flank. Ollie Sayer was alert to parry away a dangerous set piece in an early flurry of corners for the Hammers.

Frimpong then produced an even better stop to deny Lemon with a strong one-handed parry from close range.

Droitwich further threatened through another Rudd header,

Collins and Binner, who was twice denied by some great last ditch blocks.

The Saltmen continued where they left off in the second period and managed the game well. The first chance fell to Lemon who couldn't quite get on the end of Collins's low cross. But on the hour mark the Droitwich Captain made amends as he received Collins's flick on, rounded Frimpong and tapped home into an empty net.

Lemon came close again with a fearsome 25-yard volley which narrowly missed the target. The hosts always possessed a threat going forward but Andy Crowthers' men managed the second half brilliantly in a well organised performance.

Cradley got the score back to 2-3 when Saho beat the offside trap and finish clinically into the bottom corner with just 3 minutes of normal time remaining, but Droitwich returned to Worcestershire with an important 3 points to make it 5 games unbeaten as the Saltmen hope to be hitting some form at just the right time.
