TODAY'S VISITORS



Chelmsley Town were founded by members of the Christ Church Bible Class in 1927 and played as Christchurch FC until 1968.

The club played in the Handsworth League in the early years, and recent research has revealed that the clubs original home ground was Summerfield Park, Ladywood, until the War (when the club continued without a break) then moved to Rookery Park in Erdington.

The club soon moved again, spending a 19-year period at Wallace Road, Selly Park before the 1st team moved Chelmsley Hospital, Marston Green. The club played in the Mercian League from the mid-sixties, winning the Premier Division in 1965 & 1967.

In 1968 with the building of Birmingham's overspill city 'Chelmsley Wood', club Secretary Len Ward saw it advantageous for the club to change its name to 'Chelmsley Town'.

Chelmsley joined the Midland Combination in 1972 and by 1988 had reached the Premier Division.

The club also enjoyed a number of high profile friendlies in the 90's, with Birmingham City & Aston Villa visiting the Pavilion ground, where around 3000 spectators were present.

In 1975 the club gained entry to the FA Vase for the first time.
In 1996 floodlights became necessary to play in the Premier Division, and

despite finishing 11th the club were relegated as floodlights couldn't be installed.

By 1999 Chelmsley were relegated to Division 2, with the club in serious danger of extinction. Current first team manager Steve Solomon's association with the club's senior team began here, a former player of the youth 8 junior section, he returned from a short spell with Coleshill Town's Youth team. In 2002/03, with just two active board/committee members remaining, Steve Solomon was offered the job as player-manager; at the tender age of 23.

The club finished bottom of the league for the next 3 seasons, but the new manager had put in place a structure and ethos for the club which still exists to this day.

In 2009 Chelmsley collected their first silver wear in 10 years by winning the Fazeley Charity Cup. 2011/12 saw Chelmsley promoted, finishing 3rd in Division 2, and won the Mid Comb Vase, A fire at the clubs home in May 2012, meant Chelmsley returned to Selly Oak for 2012/13, playing home fixtures at Northfield Town. The club returned to Marston Green for 2013/14, and after a couple of seasons of consolidation the club were promoted in 2016 to the Midland League Division One, after an absence of 20 years. The clubs new home is Pack Meadow, Coleshill, and the club have an agreement to play its home fixtures there for the foreseeable future. Well known former players are Ellis & Troy Deeney, the latter moving directly from Chelmsley to Walsall in 2006. He still regularly attends Chelmsley home fixtures.

MATCH REPORT





Droitwich Soa earned a second successive home victory after a hard fought battle with mid-table Coventry Copsewood. In a cacey first half it was the visitors who took the lead when on 15 minutes Eden Mukenge broke the offside trap, cut inside and finished well with just Sayer to beat; this being the first effort on goal from either side in a drab opening on a difficult surface. The Saltmen replied when Manuel was equal to Connor Collins' 18th minute effort, but the Copsewood 'keeper could do nothing about a screamer of an equaliser from Josh Hurdman on 23 minutes. Spa's playmaker picked the ball up, took a touch and from 30yards hit a sublime effort into the top corner to draw the home side level.

The first half continued in the same fashion, with the only effort of note being a long range Nathan Binner effort which narrowly missed the target.

vhat prove to be the winning goal just 2 minutes before the half time ck from the half way line was flicked on by Collins, and a defensive lapse

allowed Perry Moss all the time in the world to stroke home into the far corner from close range. The second half was much more entertaining as both sides created numerous opportunities to add to the scoreline: the first chance fell to Hurdman on 46 minutes who fired over after some neat build-up play between Collins, Moss and Binner. Just 2 minutes later though Copsewood should have drawn level as Harvey Wells' powerful effort from yards out was somehow kept out by Ollie Saver. Copsewood spurned further excellent chances for Mukenge and Ellis but some wayward finishing ultimately cost the visitors at least a share of the spoils.

Droitwich managed the game well and could have extended their lead through free kick's from Brighton and Binner, as well opportunities for Cory Rudd, Alex Dugmore, Herdsman, Moss & Woodall. The Saltmen did have the ball in the net for a 3rd time deep into injury time after Copsewood committed all men forward (including 'keeper Manuel) and Dugmore broke away, but after squaring to Hurdman to tap into an empty net, after deliberation the linesman flagged for offside.

A very positive couple of weeks for the development sides.

The under 21's got back to winning ways in the MFL with a 1-0 away victory over Leicester F&E Academy, the all-important strike coming from Will Dallaway.

Following that up with an impressive demolition of Diamond Academy, 6-1, thanks to goals from Hawkett (2), Athey, Tierney, Ofori & Barnes.

The MJPL U18's had probably the best win of the three teams by beating a very strong Rugby Borough outfit 5-1 at Kingys. Goals from Jake Tew (3) & Jesse Assomougha (2) wrapping up the three points, but unfortunately going down a week later at Atherstone Rangers to undo all their good work from the Rugby game.


