TONIGHTS' VISITORS



Worcester City Football Club was formed on 9th September 1902 when another Worcester-based club, Berwick Rangers, went into liquidation. The Birmingham League agreed to let City take over Rangers' fixtures, and the Club moved to St. George's Lane in 1905.

City's first honour was the Worcestershire Senior Cup, which was won for 6 successive seasons; 1908 - 1914, and in the final season before World War 1 a Birmingham League and Senior Cup double was achieved. City began to attract some quality players and surprised everybody by winning a second Birmingham League title in 1924/25.

For 1928/29 City appointed Frank Womack & clinched the title with ten wins out of their last eleven matches. Joe Smith, an ex-England and West Bromwich Albion player took over for 1929/30 and won the title again, City scoring an incredible 153 goals in 34 games. Billy Boswell scored 6 goals in 1 game; a club record he still shares.

Although crowds flocked to the Lane when football returned after the war, there was little success until 1957/58, when under player-manager Roy Paul, City took Aldershot to a second replay in the F.A. Cup First Round, going out at St. Andrews, Birmingham in front of a crowd of 22,926 - a record for a City game. The following year, City defeated Liverpool in the FA Cup at the Lane before losing to Sheffield United in

front of a record home crowd of 17.042 in Round 4.

City nearly went out of business in the early sixties, but in 1976/77 the Southern League Division 1 North was won, with City gaining 69 points from a possible 76 and losing only one League match - the final one! Two years later, the Southern League Premier Division title was won for the first time. City's biggest home crowd in the Southern League since 1966 - 7,386 – turned up against Kettering to see City win the championship 6 for a short while City were regarded by many as the best non-league club in the country. In 2004 City became founder members of the Conference North and in 2005/06, City reached the second round of the F.A. Cup, losing 1-0 to Huddersfield Town at the Lane in a game televised live on the BBC. 27th April 2013 was the final match at St Georges Lane, against Chester FC in front of 4,027. Worcester City FC ground shared at Aggborough for 3 seasons during which time City defeated a Football League Club away from home for the first time; a 1-2 win at The Ricoh Arena v Coventry City. The club then moved to Bromsgrove Sporting. On the Pitch, they were relegated from the Vanarama Conference North but the Club dropped down 3 Leagues as the Board opted to resign from the League. Planning Permission for a ground at Perdiswell was refused, but City moved back to Worcester, at Claines Lane in 2020. After several years in the MFL Premier Division, City now play in the Hellenic Premier League.

Griff took the lead on 53 minutes as the Droitwich defence seemingly switched off, the ball found its way to Dan Edmonds who burst into the box with just Chadwick to beat, and he made no mistake to roll the ball into the bottom corner.

Edmonds could have doubled the guests' advantage just 3 minutes later but Alex Dugmore was there to scramble the hall off the line.

Droitwich spurned numerous chances from promising positions as Lemon, Binner and Moss were all off target as the Saltmen turned the screw, but Spa failed to break down an almost unflappable defence, despite winning against the same opposition O-6 just over a month ago!

Spa drew level when a corner was flicked on to the back post and Charlie Tilley was there to stab home with 13 minutes remaining.

From the next attack, Droitwich were indebted to Chadwick again who produced an unbelievable save to deny Edmonds' powerful close-range drive by tipping on to the cross-bar which ensured that the two teams were made to share the spoils.


