TODAYS' VISITORS



Founded: 1972 Nickname: The Heartlanders

The club was founded in 1972 as Nuneaton Amateurs when a dispute at Co-op Sports F.C. led to many members moving to the Nuneaton Griff and Coton Miners Welfare Ground. Nine players and officials paid £1 each to start the new club and Colin Wetton became the first manager with Colin Rathbone as Chairman and Derek Brown, Treasurer. Defeating Jet Blades 2-1 away in their first-ever game, the Amateurs were denied a championship success in their 1st season when opponents did not turn up for a late-season replayed game. The Coventry & North Warks League decided there wasn't time to fit in another match, but the Amateurs finished a fine season by annexing the Coventry Telegraph Cup.

The club was accepted into the Coventry and Alliance Suburban League Premier Two. Another superb season saw them promoted into the top Division where they more than held their own and Derek Brown gained representative honours for the League side.

The now Nuneaton Griff went on to gain many honours until there followed a bleak spell of fortune leading to relegation. During the mid 1980s the present Chairman, John Gore took charge of team affairs. He was successful in arresting the slide and turned Griff into a powerful Coventry Alliance outfit.

On retiring in 1996 he made the best decision in the clubs history, persuading the then 34 year-old Mark Green to come out of retirement; he totally transformed the club as Nuneaton Griff FC swept all before them in the Coventry Alliance, In 1998-99 Griff applied for membership of the Midland Football Combination and was placed controversially in the Premier Division, but repaid that faith by winning the Championship in their first two seasons, also adding the Challenge Cup for good measure. In the process they made history by winning the latter at Villa Park and the following night annexing the Coventry Telegraph Cup at Highfield Road, Coventry to become the only club to play two finals on consecutive days on two different Premiership grounds and win both times.

Since then the club has given many local players from the successful youth section their first steps on the football ladder. In 2015-16 the club reached the last eight of the F.A. Vase and set a new record crowd for the Pingles Stadium of 870!

Griff retained their place in Division One for season 2019-20 and local cousins and former players Adam and lain Green were appointed as joint managers, They resigned in 2021 and former player Sam Belcher was appointed in their place. After a difficult start, Belcher stabilised the club and then built a squad that went from strength to strength finishing in 8th place in two consecutive seasons.

DSFC Under 18's Manager

With 9 changes from Saturday's 5-1 League win over Paget Rangers, in a starting II which included three current youth team players, with a further three on the substitutes bench, Spa qualified for the next round of the Cup. Despite the vastly different starting line-up, Droitwich were the more dangerous side throughout the evening and started well as Josh Hurdman's attempt from the edge of the area cleared the cross-bar. Danny Barnes tried his luck from a similar position with 14 minutes on the clock, as the Saltmen enjoyed plenty of possession.

Drnitwich took the lead on the half hour mark when Alex Dugmore's bicycle kick was palmed clear by Rangers 'keeper Edjangue, but only as far as Jamie Lucas; the former Bristol Rovers man heading in from close range. Soa then put the pedal to the metal as Roland Krol, then Josh Hurdman both came close, and on 33 minutes the Krol scored an unstoppable bullet header for 2-0. Jake Allen then tested debutant 'keeper Joe Neeson from

range while at the other end, after fine skill from Jack Davies his shot on the turn narrowly missed the top corner and the sides went in separated by a score-line of 2-0 at half time. Droitwich continued their dominance into the second half as chances fell to Hurdman then Lucas. but Edjangue made a brilliant save to tip his low drive around the post.

The Rangers stopper could do nothing about Spa's third of the evening as Krol made an incursion into the box, he pulled it back for Lucas who made no mistake from 8-yards into an empty net. Edianque was called into action once more to deny Davies's solo effort, blocking a fierce drive at the near post, then an even better save to thwart Hurdman as he burst through the middle of the Smethwick defence.

The visitors did manage a consolation goal as Allen finished well from close range just over 10 minutes remaining, but Droitwich secured a fully merited 7th successive win in all competitions in an entertaining game, played in the right spirit, to qualify for the 3rd Round of the competition.




