Danny Roberts - Goalkeeper

Re-joined the club for a second spell in Jan 2018 from Belper Town. Danny originally joined Leek during the 2010/11 season and has since also played for Norton United and Witton Albion helping both to win promotion. A strong, dominant keeper who has made over 150 appearances for Leek Town. Danny was a member of the NPL team of the year in 2018/19 and in 2019/20 boasted the meanest defence in the league with only 19 goals conceded including 16 clean sheets.

Sam Booth - Goalkeeper

Sam is young, talented goalkeeper and is a product of the Crewe Alexandra academy, and has risen through the ranks appearing as a first team substitute and a regular for the Clubs U23 side. Sam is signed on dual registration and will add depth and competition to our squad.

Jessy Bavanganga - Defender

Comfortable as a full back or central defender. Jessy made his first team debut in April 2018 and became the first graduate from the Blues NPLFA Academy side to make it into the first team squad. Formerly on the books of Stoke City as a youngster.

Darren Chadwick - Defender

Originally signed from Norton United in July 2014. Darren was part of their NWCFL Championship winning squad after joining from Stafford Rangers. Following a successful season at Harrison Park where he was named Manager's Player of the Year he left to join Witton Albion, but was back at Leek by Nov 2015 and has now passed 200 appearances for the Club.

Olly Harrison - Defender

An imposing strong defender who had previously been a scholar at Crewe Alex. After a stint in Sweden for IKF Ostersund he returned to the UK and signed for Leek Town at the tail end of 2018/19 season, making his debut against Glossop NE. Virtually ever-present in 2019/20 and an integral part of the meanest defence in the NPL.

Louis Keenan - Defender

An experienced defender who joined Blues from Loughborough Dynamo at the start of the 2019/20 season, where he had played under Assistant Manager Peter Ward. A previous member of the NPL team of the year. Achieved the most starting appearances of any outfield player in 2019/20 & 2020/21 - "Keeno" has become an immediate crowd favourite.



Scott Wara - Defender

An imposing, versatile defender who has recently joined the Club from Stoke City U23s following his release in 2020. Scott was born in Fiji and received his first call up to the Fijian senior national team in March 2018, making his debut in September 2018.

Josh Ryder - Defender

Josh joins Leek Town from near neighbours Congleton Town. A classy defender who has impressed for the last two years playing in the North West Counties Premier Division. Prior to this Josh was a scholar at Port Vale and on the books of Wolverhampton Wanderers.

Matthew Bell - Midfield

A left sided midfielder, who is equally comfortable in the middle. He began his footballing career progressing through the youth ranks and signing professional forms at Port Vale before moving on to Mansfield Town. He first joined Leek Town in 2012 and was key member of Lee Casswell's successful team. "Belly" moved to Nantwich Town in 2015 where he accumulated 200 appearances at Step 3. Now in his second spell with Leek Town after re-joining from Nantwich Town in October 2019.

Lewis Short - Midfielder

Joined the Blues in Sept 2018 after a short spell with Chorley. Lewis was on the books of Crewe Alexandra and then went on to play for Northwich Victoria, Airbus UK, Nantwich Town, Connahs Quay and Bala Town. Comfortable as a left back or higher up the pitch, with an eye for spectacular goals.

Marc Grocott - Midfield

Combative midfield player signed in June 2017 from Kidsgrove Athletic where he was Manager's and Player's player of the Season in 2016/17. Marc began his career on the books of Stoke City where he spent several seasons and gained experience with loan spells at Alfreton Town and Stafford Rangers. "Groctuso" is a firm fan favourite now in his 5th season with the Club.

Billy Reeves - Midfield

Classy midfield player who arrived at Harrison Park in September 2018 after a spell with Stafford Rangers. Billy was previously on the books of Port Vale where he made a number of first team appearances. A popular player with his peers and fans, winning Players Player in 2018/19, and having another impressive season in 2019/20.

Jack Wakefield - Midfield

Jack joined the club at the start of the 2020/21 season, his impact was immediate with 2 goals in 4 games. He was released from Port Vale as a scholar earlier that year. Jack is an energetic, technical midfielder with an eye for goal who can also play higher up the pitch.of Aston Villa before going on to play for Wolstanton United and Alsager Town.

Tim Grice - Striker

Prolific striker signed in Sept 2011 from North West Counties League side Eccleshall. Tim started out at the Stoke City Academy and was also on the books of Aston Villa before going on to play for Wolstanton United and Alsager Town. Our longest serving player "Gricey" is the club's record goal scorer with 204 goals for Leek in just over 381 games for Leek, and is affectionately known as Mr Leek Town.

Rob Stevenson - Striker

Attacking player who previously had a spell at Harrison Park under Lee Casswell in the 2012/13 season. Since then Rob has played for Market Drayton Town, Belper Town and Stafford Rangers before returning to Leek in Oct 2016. "Stevo" is talented player renowned for individual goals and mazey runs and now closing in on 200 appearances.

Oliver Putnam - Striker

Olly is a young striker previously a member of the Staffordshire Schools U18 squad, he has had short spells at Eccleshall, Hanley Town & Newcastle Town. Olly joins us from Chorley FC.

Will Saxon - Striker

A winger who can also play as a striker. Will joined us from Step 3 neighbours Nantwich Town. Will has experience in the Northern Premier League after a successful spell with neighbours Kidsgrove Athletic in 2018/19. He is an exciting player to watch and has a good goal scoring ratio.

Dan Trickett-Smith - Striker

Dan has returned to Leek Town for his second spell after being released by Port Vale this summer. THE STORY SO FAR ...

Mickleover Sports F.C. was founded in 1948 as Mickleover Old Boys playing in the Derby & District Senior League. For the next 44 years until their resignation in 1993, they were the longest serving club in the league. In 1982 they, along with other members of the club, embarked on an ambitious campaign to develop their own football and cricket facilities on meadow land at the end of Station Road in Mickleover.

During the next ten years dedicated club members led a serious fundraising drive, raising over £30,000 and work on the new ground finally began early in 1992, with the facilities formally being opened later that year. Following development of the new facilities the ambitions of Mickleover Sports F.C. were increased and an application was made to join the Central Midlands Football League. This was successful and in 1993 Sports officially entered the non-league Pyramid for the first time. They drafted in an entire new management team led by Tony Shaw which resulted in both teams finishing óth in their respective divisions.

Season 1994/95 saw Sports gain promotion to the CMFL Supreme Division and reach the semi-final of theLleague Cup on the way. In 1996/97 Mark Kelsey took up the managerial reins and Sports finished a creditable 6th in the Supreme Division. Meanwhile, off the field Mickleover were learning to manage the new facilities. There was some limited on-going expenditure in the railing off of the pitch, laying of slabs to provide hard standing and erection of a small stand, but with the general ground maintenance as well, there was little money for anything else. However, in order to progress (or even retain their CMFL status) the club needed to erect floodlights. A concerted fundraising effort was made and in 1997, at a capital cost of over £30,000, our ambition was finally realised.

The next development was aimed at providing dedicated facilities for our junior football teams. With the help of a National Lottery grant it involved taking one of the adjacent fields, to turn into a junior pitch. In addition to this, we built new changing rooms, referee's room, toilets and showers, put in sewerage and re-built car park. Back on the pitch, season 1997/98 saw Sports gain a 3rd place finish in the CMFL Supreme Division and just 12 months later further improvement saw them crowned as the 1998/99 CMFL Champions.

This season also saw Sports first venture into the Carlsberg FA Vase, where they embarked on an exhilarating cup run. After beating several teams from 'higher' leagues they were eliminated at the 3rd stage in controversial circumstances. Winning 3-0 at eventual finalists Bedlington Terriers and with only 14 minutes

remaining, the home side's floodlights suspiciously failed. After an FA enquiry Sports lost the replay 2-0.

So, the club was assured promotion to the Northern Counties East League and season 1999/2000 saw Sports playing for the first time at level 5. After challenging hard, they finished in 4th place in Division One. They also reached the semi-final of the Derbyshire Senior Cup and for the 2nd year running they fell in the 3rd round of the FA Vase. Season 2000/2001 saw Sports go one better by finishing 3rd and reaching the 4th round of the Vase, but the following year was less successful, with a 5th place finish and early exits from all cup competitions.

Mark Kelsey was replaced by ex Belper Town manager Martin Rowe who led Sports to the NCEL Division One Championship in his first season in charge. For good measure Sports also won the Division 1 Cup (Wilkinson Sword Trophy) and reached the final of the Derbyshire Senior Cup for the first time in their history. Once again they reached the 3rd round of the FA Vase, where they eventually lost by the odd goal in nine, after 240 minutes of football, to eventual semi-finalists Oadby Town. So, Mickleover were once again in a position to move up the non-league pyramid to the NCEL Premier Division, we did however have to erect a 280 seat stand first.

After 3 seasons of 'consolidation' at their new level, season 2006/2007 was arguably Mickleover's most successful season to date. Despite early exits from both the FA Cup and the FA Vase and the subsequent departure of manager Martin Rowe. New manager Dick Pratley led Sports to their highest ever position in non-league football, 7th place in the NCE Premier Division, and Sports also won NCEL League Cup along the way beating Garforth Town.

The following year was disappointing as for the first time in recent history, Sports finished lower than the previous season. However it was to be no less than a minor 'blip' as the following season Sports eventually won the league by 7 points. The step up to Unibond level was significant and we were expecting a tough season. Unlike some other clubs, we will not jeopardise Sports future by paying players more than we can afford, but the development of several key U19 Academy players plus some astute signings by manager Dick Pratley, gave Sports confidence.

Life in Unibond Division One South started well at Butt Hole Lane home of Shepshed Dynamo with a 4-0 win. After 17 games Sports record was mid table W7 D4 L6. Then a record run of 16 consecutive wins catapulted Sports to the top of the table. Sports were never to look back and won the league by 7pts. They went on to win the Chairman's cup by beating FC Halifax Town at The Shay. Then lost the Peter Swales Trophy on penalties to Guiseley.

THE STORY SO FAR CONTINUED...

2010-11 was another step up for Sports into the Northern Premier League now sponsored by Evo Stik. The season did not start well with Sports gifting points to opposition. Their first win came away at local rivals Matlock Town with a tremendous display (also doing the double over them). But still Sports were gifting points especially the never to be forgotten 6-6 home draw against Nantwich Town. Sports were 6-3 up with 6 minutes to go. In the end Sports ended in 14th position and were safe with 4 games to go.

2011-12 saw Sports relegated for the first time. Despite scoring more goals than any other team in the bottom half of the table, inconsistent performances saw Sports drop down into Evo Stik Division 1 South. 2012-13 Sports started with 2 wins but this form dropped and were 3rd from bottom in December. Dick Pratley and Colin Hoyle left, Charlie Palmer took over temporarily until permanent management team of Glenn Kirkwood and Craig Hopkins took over in January. Season ended with Sports 2nd from bottom narrowly avoiding relegation having used 53 players.

The 2013-14 season had been a great improvement on what had gone before but was ultimately marred by play-off final defeat to local rivals Belper. The management duo of Glenn Kirkwood and Craig Hopkins were determined to use the pain of disappointment in a positive way for the next campaign.

Sports started the 2014-15 season in positive mood, and but for good runs in both the FA Cup and FA Trophy would have topped the table almost from the start. Postponements to league games because of the cup competitions meant that they were always playing catch up, but even so they still managed to rise to pole position with games in hand. Their home record was excellent, and results on the road also impressive, so much so that they ended the season having scored in excess of 100 goals and the only disappointment was that the last day draw at home to Sheffield FC denied them the record of most points gained in an individual Evostik Division One South season. 2014-15 Sports also won the inagural EvoStik NPL Academy League.

Sports started 2015-16 well getting to 8th. But having

an unsettled side with a lot of movements in and out saw them in the relegation spots. Sports had a very disappointing season in the Cups and went out at the first time of asking in all competitions. Back in the League, Sports picked up with 11 games to go when forced to have a settled side due to the close of the Transfer window. Sports survived with a game to go, and that last game at already relegated Stamford joint managers Kirkwood and Hopkins resigned. Sports were quick in approaching Captain and Academy Manager John McGrath to take over. Sports also went on to win the EvoStik NPL Academy League again.

2016-17 Sports finished the season with most points they have gained in the NPL Premier division. Again early exits from the major FA Cup competitions was a disappointment. Sports blooded a lot of the their Academy players with Lewis Belgrave becoming the first NPL Academy player to Captain any 1st team. Again Sports won the Academy league again.

2017-18 Sports finished in their highest ever position – 12th as John Mcgrath continued to give Youth their chance to shine with 6 teenage debuts. One of these – Morgan Williams developed throughout the season and eventually was snapped up by Coventry City for a fee of $\pounds12000$ plus add-ons. Sports competed well against all the top teams but were too inconsistent against lower placed teams and this, along with a poor disciplinary record, meant a play off position was out of reach.

The loss of top scorer Andy Dales to Scunthorpe United for a fee of $\pounds 10,000$ plus add-ons badly affected Sports 2018/19 season as their lack of goals meant a continual struggle throughout the season. They competed will against several of the top sides but only a good finish to the season and a last day win saw them survive the drop. An appearance in the Derbyshire Senior Cup Final at Pride Park was the highlight of the season and although they put in a good performance they lost out to Alfreton Town by 2-1.

The 2019/20 season was cancelled in March due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Sports were 13th in the league with some considerable games in hand.

Season 2020/21 was to prove very frustrating for all the clubs at our level as for the second successive season the league was ended by the Covid virus. The difference to the last one was that Mickleover had had their best start to a season since they were promoted to the Premier Division.

Granted only ten games had been played but Mickleover were standing top of the table having played three of the fancied teams all away from home, the best performance being a great 4-1 win at previously unbeaten Nantwich Town. At this time the team looked to be well balanced, solid at the back with goals from both midfield and attack.

In the FA cup we had two good wins away to Leek Town and home to Newark FC and only went out to National league Division one North St Albans City after extra time (1-1) on penalties - to make it worse they were to appear on Television two rounds on. Perhaps the worst performance came in the FA Trophy, where after a fine 5-0 home win over Dereham Town they travelled south yet again this time to Hitchin Town where they disappointed in a 3-0 defeat.

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation is a charity set up in memory of Daniel Wilkinson who died in 2016 aged 24, while playing the game he loved, from an underlying heart condition called Arrhythmogenic Right Ventricular Cardiomyopathy (ARVC).



Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Loughborough University followed where he completed a degree in Accounting and Financial Management while playing non-league football. He was an athlete who enjoyed the gym and took his health and nutrition very seriously. He lived life to the full and had so much ahead of him.

Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!

SUDDEN CARDIAC DEATH IN THE YOUNG (SCD)

- SCD is the leading cause of death in young athletes during sport and the majority of deaths occur with NO SYMPTOMS or family history.
- ARVC can be found in one in every 1,000 to 5,000 young adults IF IT IS LOOKED FOR.
- Warning signs may include light-headedness, fainting, palpitations, swollen legs, breathlessness.
- Every week in the UK, 12 apparently fit and healthy young people (aged 35 and under) die from previously undiagnosed heart conditions.
- In Italy, where screening is mandatory for all young people engaged in organised sport, they have reduced the incidence of young sudden cardiac death by 89%.

OUR MISSION

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation has been set up to raise awareness of SCD and to provide funding towards heart screening, defibrillators and CPR/defibrillator training primarily for grass-roots sporting teams.

Tragedies can be prevented through cardiac screening. It is vital that young people are identified and treated.

CALLUM HAWKINS goalkeeper

Currently on loan from Burton Albion for a second time, Callum has proved to be a reliable goalkeeper. Born in Rotherham he has learned his trade with Burton's Academy, and signed professional for the Brewers in May 2018. He was with Mickleover for a six week spell between December 2018 and February 2019, having previously been out on loan at Gresley in 2017. His plans suffered a major blow last season, when he damaged knee ligaments in August and sat out the rest of the season.

JOE SLINN goalkeeper

Joe started his goalkeeping career at Port Vale. During his spell at Vale Park he also had a four month loan spell at Stalybridge Celtic. He signed professional in February 2017 having captained the Youth team, before moving to Walsall in 2018. He went out on loan again to Rushall Olympic for most of the 2018/19 season before leaving Walsall in August 2019. After a few months with Atherton Collieries, he had another four months with Alvechurch, before moving on again to Newcastle Town in February of this year. He joined Mickleover in summer 2020 and shared first team duties with Hawkins throughout the aborted season.

JAKE BENNETT defender

Jake started playing for his hometown club Telford AFC as a 15 year old, making two first team starts before going out on loan to Market Drayton. He was initially spotted by Mickleover management during a friendly match against Market Drayton, and became a Sports player in December 2014. He joined Sheffield Utd in 2016 and made his first team debut in the EFL Cup in 2017. He was due to go on loan to Chesterfield, but a couple of cruel injuries meant he never got to play for them and following his release by Sheffield Utd, he had a brief spell at Alfreton Town, before joining Coalville Town in December 2019. He opted to return to Mickleover during the summer, of 2020.

DECLAN BACON forward

Dec returned to the Don Amott Arena last season, having been a Mickleover player a few seasons earlier. He finished 2019/20 with Gainsborough Trinity, after just over a year at Alfreton Town. He has also played at Sheffield and Scarborough.

ALEX MORRIS defender

Stoke on Trent born school PE teacherAlex began his career as a Port Vale Junior, playing regularly in their reserve team before moving on to Leek Town. He had spells at both Nantwich and Newcastle Town, before finding a home at Kidsgrove Athletic in 2018, where he stayed until the end of last season. Alex was first choice left back last season and one of the mainstays of our table topping defence.

JOE BATEMAN defender

Ex Derby centre half, who was a regular in the Rams under 23's until his release this summer. Signed for Micleover in August 2021.

JAMES BUTLER defender

A Stoke City Schoolboy and Academy player for nine years, James became a regular in the Potters Under 18 and Under 21 Premier League teams, a solid dependable centre back. Whilst on loan at Kidsgrove Athletic, Butler impressed their opponents, Hartlepool in an FA Cup tie and he was offered a work experience stay. He didn't manage to break into the first team squad and returned to Kidsgrove. During the summer of 2020 he made the move to the Don Amott Arena.

PHIL WATT defender

Phil started his football path with his home town club of Rotherham Utd. He moved on to Lincoln City in 2004 and spent four years at Sincil Bank, where he made his first team debut in the opening match of the 2007/8season. There had been a couple of loan spells at Grantham during his time at Lincoln, but for the next three years he was at Corby Town. After another loan spell at Grantham, the dependable centre back made it a permanent move, but after one-season moved on to Boston Utd. His next move was to Coalville Town, before starting a long association with Belper Town. In three different spells he reached the 150 appearance milestone for the Nailers. He also had a spell at Lincoln Utd and Frickley Athletic in between his Belper experiences, from where he joined the Sports line-up during the summer.

DEMPSEY ARLOTT-JOHN forward

Youngster recently released by Leicester City after being a regular in their Under 23's and Under 18's sides. Signed in August 2021.

KEMY AGUSTIEN midfielder

Born in the Netherlands Antilles, his career started with Dutch side Willem II. After two years as a junior he signed professional in 2004 and played 55 games in the Dutch Eredivisiewhere his midfield skills flourished, before moving to AZ Alkmagr. Although he was with AZ for four years, scoring two goals in his 25 games, he also had loans at Roda JC and played 20 games for Birmingham City in the Championship. A further loan at RKC Waalwijk preceded a permanent move to the UK with Swansea City. He played 47 times for the Welsh side in both the Championship and Premiership, winning the League Cup with them in 2012/13. He had a loan spell at Crystal Palace, before joining Brighton, play-ing 17 games between 2013-2015, before moving to Denmark with Vendsyssel. The next stop was the Scottish Premiership with Hamilton Academicals, then back to the Netherlands with Dordrecht and SV Tec, with a spell in the Philippines at Global Cebu in between. His first non league team in the UK were Nuneaton, but moves to Halesowen, Barrow, Wrexham and Bradford Park Avenue were followed by his move to Mickleover at the end of last season. He also gained International honours with the Netherlands at Under 19, 20 and 21 levels and played 13 times for Curacao, winning the 2017 Caribbean Cup.

STUART BEAVON forward

One of Mickleover's most experienced players, his career started in the Hellenic League with Ardley United, before moving to Wallingford. He was snapped up by Didcot Town, where he quickly found his goalscoring touch and played 139 games, scoring an amazing 107 goals and winning the 2004/5 FA Vase. He then spent three seasons in the Conference with Weymouth. 2008/09 saw his first spell in the Football League on loan with Wycombe Wanderers. After 125 games and 34 goals he moved to Preston North End. He settled at Deepdale, staying for two years, before an initial loan at Burton Albion became permanent for the 2014/15 season. He left in January 2017, destined for Coventry City. Although he was a Coventry player for the next two seasons, his final one was spent on a years loan at Wrexham.

Early into the 2019/20 season he joined Nuneaton, but it was when he began his current connection at Mickleover, he found his scoring touch, getting 10 before the season was curtailed.

JOSH SATCHWELL forward

A product of Sports own Academy, Josh mainly plays as a striker, but can also play wing or centre back. A regular member of the successful reserve team, and kingpin of the Midlands and National Academy Championship wining team last season. He has had trials at Coventry City and Fleetwood Town.

BEN GOWING midfielder

Ben started last year playing with Paddy Webb at Eastwood and by the end of the season had scored 13 goals in his 32 appearances. Has had spells with Belper Utd, Long Eaton Utd and Dunkirk. He joined the Sports squad during the summer 2020.

ROGER LEE midfielder

Bermudian international who has been playing his football in Latvia and Estonia in the last couple of seasons, having also played at Loughborough, Stafford Rangers, Corby and Basford. Signed in August 2021 and has just become available following international clearance.

Bobby joined Mickleover last year after three years with Burton Albion. He made his first team debut at the end of last year and was also a member of the Mickleover Academy side who won both Midlands and National titles. Bobby started his footballing career playing for Malaga in Spain.

PADDY WEBB forward

Leek started brightly and soon had an attempt on goal with a glancing header from Clarke after a good cross from the left, which went out for a goal kick. Market Drayton, who were kicking downhill, hit some longer balls but Leek were able to counter attack quickly. Trickett-Smith hit a cross field ball to Wakefield who advanced and returned the ball back to Trickett-Smith who played it wide to Keenan,

he then delivered a delicious cross with Grocotts header being gathered. It was then time for Market Drayton to attack with a deep cross from Russo to Montagu, the resulting header was collected by Roberts. Drayton continued to attack and it was Bavanganga this time who intercepted, advanced and found Saxon who shot was saved by the keeper. Leek were having a good spell and at the heart of this was the industrious Trickett-Smith who was combining well with Saxon & Clarke.

The break through came in this period when Wakefield received the ball on the half way line, turned and advanced forward finding Saxon in the centre who slotted his shot past the outstretched Rawlins to open his account for the season. Leek continued to counter attack whilst Market Drayton hit longer balls into the Leek box, this resulting in several corners. Just before half time Roberts collected the ball from a corner and was then fouled by Burroughs has he ran out of the box, this leading to an altercation between the players and a yellow card for Burroughs.

defended very well but not without cost as Bavanganga picked up a yellow card for a rash challenge and several needless freekicks were given away. Market Drayton bombarded the Leek box with several corners and long range shots but Roberts would not be beaten. Despite being a man short Leek were still dangerous and Trickett-Smith broke from the half way line and was brought to the ground by Hughes who was booked for his trouble. Despite the fall being clearly in the area the original offence started outside the box and a free kick was awarded. The freekick did not trouble the keeper and Neil Baker shored up his defence by bringing on the experienced Darren Chadwick.

Leek were managing the game well and were restricting Drayton to long balls and shots from distance, resulting in several corners. The Leek faithful had to hold their breath as a long looping shot was tipped over by Roberts who had been excellent all afternoon. The referee had now played 5 minutes over the 90 and the final whistle was greeted with rapturous cheers from the travelling Leek contingent who had seen their side register their first league win of the season.

Leek had shown character and resilience against a much improved Market Drayton Town and deserved their victory, they now look forward to Saturday where they will play Mickleover in the FA Cup.




Which manager signed you for Leek and where from? Peter Ward, I was looking for a club at the time

Leek soon got their third goal with only 20 minutes gone, again Chantelle Gallagher turned provider with another Leek Town set piece, this time an in-swinging corner reached the back post and found Cassie Hyde unmarked to head the ball home.

Leek almost extended their lead again just before half time, with Gallagher firing a shot goalward, for the Sporting Khalsa keeper to parry it out, but only to the feet of O'Conner. Her shot was expertly tipped onto the cross bar from the Khalsa keeper, keeping the score-line 3-0 at half time.

Khalsa came out second half with a lot of determination to get back into the game and looked to test Leek's defence but Leek stood strong and dealt with Khalsa's attacks until the 72nd minute when a bouncing ball wasn't dealt with by Leek and the Khalsa forward smashed the ball past Leek's keeper.



CHAIRMAN CHAT WITH JON EELES

Welcome to Chairman Don Amott, Secretary Tony Shaw, Club Officials, the Management team, players and supporters who have made the short trip to Buxton today for the the First Qualifying Round in the FA Cup.

I write this after our games against Runcorn Linnets and Market Drayton last weekend, we were out played on the Friday against Runcorn and it was an old fashioned battle on Bank Holiday Monday to gain our first league win of the season. At the moment we are looking very much out of sorts on the pitch, we have played well in patches but also poorly for periods too and we have been punished for individual errors in games. There are so many factors contributing to this including missed chances, injuries, a covid interrupted pre season and the fact we are not playing at Harrison Park, but I am not making excuses - the management and players know we need to do better and are working hard to put that right.

On Monday we travelled to Market Drayton on the back of a narrow loss to Runcorn and with four first team players injured, it was always going to be a battle and thats what it proved to be. I felt we played well in the first half and deserved our lead - we counter attacked well and perhaps could have just tested the keeper more. The second half started in similar vein to the first but on 65minutes we lost our centre forward to a straight red card for an off the ball incident, I feared the worst but we battled and the character and resilience of the lads came through - we still looked dangerous on the break but naturally Drayton had more of the ball and we




restricted them to one shot on goal in 90mins which Danny dealt with. A word on the red card, I have no complaints as I was close to the incident - Zack Clarke will learn from this and he was genuinely apologetic for what happened, his suspension starts on Monday so he is still eligible to play today, I am sure we will see a reaction from him.

A few words about our Emirate FA Cup tie today. Our previous tie was a potential banana skin playing away from home to a Step 5 Club but I felt we dealt with this well coming out as 2-0 winners. We were then rewarded with a home time in the First Qualifying Round against our old adversaries Mickleover. This is a repeat of last seasons FA Cup fixture where we met them at Harrison Park in the same round. On that night Mickleover ran out 2-1 winners, I recall we were in control of the game until Matt Bell was substituted for concussion and we conceded two quick goals either side of half time. We will be looking to even the score tonight but I am sure our visitors will be doing their very best too. Mickleover were top of the NPL Premier league last season, as we were, when the season was curtailed but like us they have not hit those heights yet - with 3 home wins in the league and 3 away losses. We have watched them several times and the management team have commented that they are similar to us, a good team but lacking confidence and having a stuttering start.

Tonights game is a cup game so anyone with a season ticket will need to pay to get in, we have had a good response from people using the Kaizen Ticketing solution and we will build on this game by game.
