#### A WORD FROM OUR SPONSORS



We are looking forward to the new cricket season and to our second year as the club's main sponsor. Last year we thoroughly enjoyed the Benefit Day and thank everyone involved in making us feel so welcome.

The new tax year has just begun and we are busy with obtaining information from clients to prepare their 2017/2018 tax returns. These tax returns need to be filed by 31st January 2019. The tax charge on Child Benefit has brought many more tax payers into the Self-Assessment system so if you are claiming Child Benefit and your taxable income is £50,000 or more you should be preparing a tax Return.

HMRC have changed the way they deal with tax free child care and remind working parents that they can use Tax-Free Childcare to pay for regulated holiday clubs. Parents, including the self-employed, can apply online for Tax-Free Childcare – part of the government's Childcare Choices offer – for children who are under 12.

Tax-Free Childcare will cut childcare costs for working families by up to £2,000 per child per year, or £4,000 for disabled children. For every £8 parents pay into their childcare account the government will add an extra £2, up to £2,000 per child per year.

Parents can find out what help is available on the Childcare Choices website.

This website includes a Childcare Calculator that compares all the government's childcare offers to check what works best for individual families.

We hope that members find our article interesting and informative. We are happy to assist members with any accounting or tax matters.



# HOUSE & GROUNDS


For the coming season and going forward, Upminster CC has secured the services of groundsman Mark Severn to prepare the wicket and work on the main square. Mark is hugely experienced and has worked at many local clubs over the years and it is his passion and ambition to prepare cricket pitches of the highest quality at Upminster. Following an assessment during the winter by an ECB senior pitch advisor, it was ascertained that the main square would benefit from specialised work and in the near future, the entire square will need to be lowered in order to produce as good a cricket wickets as possible. Mark has started his pre-season work already and although he will be doing the bulk of the work, it is anticipated that he may require the assistance of club members in undertaking some of the work. If you see Mark around the club please make him welcome and offer assistance if needed.

The facilities at Coopers School have significantly improved in recent years and it now really is a lovely ground for the third and fourth elevens to play cricket. As in recent years, the club has taken responsibility for the pre-season work and over the Easter weekend, a group of club members worked tirelessly in scarifying and rolling the square, as well as preparing the covers, tidying the container and repairing some damage to the sight screens. The sight screens will need to be erected before the start of the season, so when a date has been identified, members are encouraged to help out where possible.

Post season work at Campion was undertaken at the end of last season and this year's pre-season work was carried out on the weekends of 7th and 14th April. It is likely that Mark Severn will be undertaking weekly work at Campion, but again, members are encouraged to help their captains out as and when required. The square is only small, however with on-going work and attention, the wicket will continue to improve and give our younger members their first taste of playing on grass pitches.

Upminster Cricket Club is striving to offer its members excellent playing facilities and like everything in life, you get rewarded for the effort one puts it. So, if you can spare an hour or two rolling the wicket at Coopers during the week; watering the main square in the park on a Sunday evening; or assisting at Campion, please do not hesitate to contact me, your captains or any member or the committee.

- Nicky Ison and John Curtis who shared the top bowler honours with 10 wickets apiece.


Louis Pickering also made his debut for Kent 2nd XI in April with some notable performances – well done Louis!


