#### Q: Hello Anthony, thanks for sitting down with us and having a chat. How are you and how has the first year of fatherhood been?

AL: Very good, everything seems to be now going in the right direction towards a level of normal and cricket is just around the corner which is always exciting. Fatherhood has been the hardest but most rewarding year of my life! Hats off to anyone with two or more!

## Q: You've been playing for Upminster since your colt days, how did you first come to the club and what was it like then?

AL: I joined in year 7 I hadn't been in the area long and a few lads at Gaynes were playing so came down with them and been here since. It was a club going through huge growth and was the beginning of the multi XI and large colt section that you see today.

#### Q: Your best figures of 7/66 came in 2005, in a great 5<sup>th</sup> XI including the likes of Colin Thompson, Joe Margetts and Gwynne Mack. What was it like playing in that team as a young 16 year old? Also, how does it feel to peak at 16?

AL: It was a great experience to play with guys who had 30+ years of playing cricket behind them, you did do a lot of running around however! Gwynne was the skipper for my first game as an 11 year old and is an absolute gent. As for peaking at 16 it's been all downhill from there!

#### Q: As a batsman, your big day out in the sun came in 2010 when you smashed 123 for Karim Govani's 5<sup>th</sup> XI in an excellent win. How did it feel when your brother Steve rocketed past that in his infamous 170\* at Woodford Wells 8 years later?

AL: Bit of a surreal day that...we went for quite a few and England were playing Sweden in the QF of the World Cup so everyone was having a pint or two at lunch. I think I was more nervous than Steve was but he played an absolute blinding knock which turned out to be crucial come the end of the season...

# Q: You were a key member of three league winning seasons (2017/18/19) how would you sum up them seasons? And what were the main factors in the success?

AL:The first was Josh's first season as captain and was very enjoyable celebrating his 18<sup>th</sup> and a league win on the same day! The second was a proper nail biter all year and was the first time the 3<sup>rd</sup> XI won the league after so many years of coming a game or so away. It came down to the last day winner takes all showdown with Wells which we scraped. The third was just us and Brentwood going toe to toe which we won by a single point and was great to see another skipper in Ollie White win his first!

We managed to win some really tight games in all three years that previously we lost by a few runs or wickets and that came down to everyone in the team wanting each other to do well, each player having a settled role in the side and a great blend of youth and experience.

With the new season in sight, Upminster's groundsman Mark Severn and club volunteers have been busy preparing for what will hopefully be a full season of cricket. All three squares were once again aerated in January 2021 and Mark has been treating, feeding and cutting all of the tables since

then. The winter fence erected in late September stood the test of time and was finally taken down just before Easter and the sleeves for the removable metal poles that were installed last season to rope off the square during the summer were cemented in thereafter. Twenty hours of rolling was undertaken on the main square in late March, which was perfect timing before the ground became too firm.



With such a wet winter, work on the square was slightly delayed, however towards the

end of March, the rain ceased and the square and the outfield started to dry out. In my years of playing for Upminster, I have never known the park as wet as it was this winter. Thankfully,



everywhere seems to have dried out nicely and the square in the park is looking as good as ever, which is testament to the specialism of Mark Severn and the tireless work put in by club members.

As you'll read elsewhere, the club has been investing in our out-grounds which will hopefully see the playing surfaces and overall facilities improve significantly. It also gives the

club scope to host more senior matches, as well as enabling the junior section to play more home matches.

At HQ, the concrete ramps to the containers were installed just after the Easter weekend and it is planned that the stairs to the scorebox on top of the containers and the fencing around the stairs will be installed in time for the league season.







Unfortunately, as the ground was so wet at the time, the cement lorry caused damage to the outfield in front of the clubhouse. However 4 tonnes of sand, loam and seed was laid to try and rectify the damage. It will look ugly at the start of the season, but player safety is

important and it is hoped that it won't be long before the area fully recovers.

The electrical installation has been completed by James Evans and all three containers now have light and electricity, where the new bowling machines can be powered. The club has invested in four new bowling machines for the use of the coaches and members and the machines have already proved to be very popular with the younger members. We hope that as a club, with the continued investment in facilities and equipment we can produce quality cricketers that will go on and strengthen the club and hopefully the county.

All squares are looking good and are being prepared for the season and although the main square is ready to go, there is still plenty more work required at Coopers and Campion to prepare the facilities for cricket. In the coming weeks, our regular band of volunteers will be hard at work at Campion and Coopers getting the wickets rolled, the sight-screens ready and



undertaking other tasks that will get our out-grounds ready for cricket on Saturday 8th May 2021.

As always, I would like to thank everyone who has given up their time to help with the various tasks over the winter and also getting the grounds prepared for the coming season. I hope this year we will get in a full season of cricket and hopefully the restrictions will start to ease and we will see an end to these very strange times that we have experienced over the past year or so.

The club's financial performance in 2020 was outstanding, thanks to some careful planning, two exceptional fundraising events and the remarkable support over the year of the club's membership.

This has allowed us to invest those funds back into the club and improve facilities, something that the committee has taken forward with gusto over the winter. There has been a long list of purchases and it's great to see some of these in action in the recent Easter cricket camps for our Colts members. The new bowling machines have earnt their money over the last two weeks, and the boys and girls have certainly enjoyed hitting lots of balls while the bowling machines put down some juicey half volleys.

After last year's installation of new nets and containers at the main ground, the club has started to make further investments in our out-grounds this year. A new heavy roller has been delivered to Coopers School and the committee are on the lookout for another roller to buy for Campion school. With the club growing and looking to nurture our home-grown talent, improving the playing surfaces at our out-grounds will hopefully see the club developing some talented players for future years.

In addition, the club has funded the installation for two new artificial wickets at Coopers school, which will give the club scope to host more senior matches, as well as enabling the junior section to play more home matches.



We have also made the significant investment in roll-on covers for the main ground, enabled by extending the new net facilities which will now double as overnight storage for these nets. In order to give the Selection Committee the best information possible, you will need to have marked yourself Available on the App in order to be considered for selection for the following weekend. The Selection Committee generally meet on a Monday evening, but this can also be on Sundays so it's important we are all fully up to date for the following weeks.
