Report of the Trustees

for the Year Ended 31 January 2023

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 January 2023. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objectives and aims of the charity are:

The advancement of public participation in sport in the Grangemouth and district area.

The provision of recreational facilities and organisation of recreational activities, with the objective of improving the conditions of life for the persons for whom the facilities or activities are primarily intended.

These will be achieved by:

Playing, fostering and supporting the game of rugby union football under the auspices of Scottish Rugby, European Rugby and World Rugby.

Providing and supporting teams playing within the leagues or otherwise organised by or under the auspices of Scottish Rugby.

Administering, developing, co-ordinating, regulating and promoting the proper running of the Club in co-operation with the members and all such other things as are incidental to or the directors may think conducive to the attainment of all or any of the above objects

Public benefit

The trustees have referred to OSCR's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the aims and objectives of the charity and in planning its future activities.

Benefits and Beneficiaries

In accordance with its charitable objectives, the charity continues to provide facilities in the Grangemouth and district area for the provision of recreational facilities and organisation of recreational activities, with the objective of improving the conditions of life for the persons for whom the facilities or activities are primarily intended. The charity's principal beneficiaries are therefore the children and young people along with club members and people from the Grangemouth and district area who use the facilities.

Trustees' Assessment of Public Benefit

In monitoring the progress of the charity in terms of delivery of public benefit, the trustees use the following measures of success and gather evidence accordingly:

- Feedback from the service users on the facilities and activities available.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal funding sources

The main sources of funding are through membership fees, rental income, sponsorship, Scottish Rugby funding and profits from Grangemouth Stags Rugby Football Club Trading Limited.

Reserves policy

The charity will always maintain sufficient liquid reserves to meet its obligations and actively fund raise to ensure it maintains this position. The main sources of funding are through membership fees, rental income, sponsorship, Scottish Rugby funding and profits from Grangemouth Stags Rugby Football Club Trading Limited. The charity aims to maintain free reserves to cover 3 months operating costs.

Going concern

The accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis. The Trustees have assessed the Trust's ability to continue as a going concern and have reasonable expectation that the Trust has adequate resources to continue in the operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the accounts.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial results of activities and events

Total income for the year amounted to £85,854 (2022: £81,434) and represents donations received along with income from fundraising and investment income.

Resources expended totalled £85,692 (2022: £90,796) and therefore there was a surplus of £162 (2022: deficit £9,362) in the current year.

The trustees are satisfied with the financial performance of the Trust for the year.

All funds held are unrestricted funds and free reserves total £27,710 (2022: £27,548).

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

Grangemouth Stags Rugby Football Club is a company limited by guarantee governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 17 May 2019. It is a registered charity with OSCR.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The trustees who are also directors shall be elected at an AGM and shall hold office until the following AGM.

In the event of a vacancy arising during a trustees term of office, whether by death, resignation or operation of law the trustees may appoint another person to hold office until the next AGM.

All persons standing for election as a trustee must be nominated by written notice signed by two Full Members, one proposing and one seconding the nominations, sent to the Secretary. The notice must be received by the Secretary 28 clear days prior to the AGM at which the relevant election is to be held. Nominations for election outwith the foregoing period, including from the floor of an AGM, may only be accepted if no timeous nomination for an office has been received. The Secretary shall intimate nominations received when giving notice of an AGM.

The trustees may approve processes for election from time to time subject to compliance with the foregoing provisions of this article.

Organisational structure

The overall strategic direction of the charity is determined by the trustees, who are also responsible for the day-to-day management of the charity. The trustees work closely together, holding meetings on a regular basis and otherwise keeping in touch with one another through informal discussions that take place either face to face, over the telephone or by e-mail. At the present time, there are no sub-committees in operation.

Induction and training of new trustees

All new Directors receive an induction to the organisation and its activities, their role and the responsibilities of Trustees. Training will be provided as required and with agreement of the Board.

Key management remuneration

None of the trustees received any remuneration or benefits from the charity during the year. The day to day operations of the club and staffed by volunteers.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

Major risks to the organisation are reviewed regularly and where possible, systems and procedures put in place to mitigate the risks faced by the charity. Internal control risks are minimised by the use of robust procedures for the authorisation of all transactions. Risks in funding are being mitigated by diversifying the sources of income for the charity for example through fund raising activities and expanding our rental and membership incomes.

COMMENCEMENT OF ACTIVITIES

Charitable activities commenced on 17th May 2019.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 January 2023

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Preparation of consolidated financial statements

The financial statements contain information about Grangemouth Stags Rugby Football Club Limited as an individual company and do not contain consolidated financial information as the parent of a group. The charity is exempt under Section 399(2A) of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirements to prepare consolidated financial statements.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Related party exemption

The charitable company has taken advantage of exemption, under the terms of Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland', not to disclose related party transactions with wholly owned subsidiaries within the group.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
