PRIMARY CARER

The Role of the Primary Carer:

- A Primary Carer is required for every junior and senior game
- The Primary Carer in liaison with the Coach/Team Manager shall ensure the team's First Aid bag is available and properly equipped before each game
- The Primary Carer, in liaison with the Team Manager/Coach, shall ensure the availability of emergency contact numbers and have a working phone to hand
- The Primary Carer will understand the Emergency procedures of the venue, know who the venue's First Aid staff are (if any) and the location of any key equipment (e.g. stretcher, wheel chair, defibrillator, etc.)
- The Primary Carer will sit on the Team Bench during the game alongside the Coach and Team Manager
- The Primary Carer will attend promptly to players on or off court, as required, e.g. when time has been called due to injury or blood rule required (the Primary Carer is the only person allowed on court to attend to players)
- If an injury requires the player being carried from court, liaise with umpire regarding assistance from non-coaching personnel
- To keep accurate records of any incidents and treatment or action taken using the Accident Report forms
- To ensure verbally that Team Managers and Coaches have confidential Medical information on all players, the Primary Carer will be notified of any medical needs prior to the match commencing.

The Primary Carer must have:

- A current and valid approved first aid qualification
- If supporting matches involving U18 players, a current DBS check
- Knowledge of the Club's Emergency procedures
- Have the ability to maintain confidentiality
- Enthusiastic with a good knowledge of the club and people within it
