## AGENDA ITEM 2.1 Legal Structure Changes and Implementation Progress Report

#### 1. Preamble

- 1.1. The calling of this Extra-Ordinary General Meeting is a key milestone in the long, and evolving, history of the Club. After over 140 years, and seven years of work, we will shortly become an incorporated body having completed the key work to set up Timperley Sports Club Limited (TSC Ltd). The purpose of this EGM is to update members on the work to implement the resolutions approved at the 2018 AGM and seek approval to the final resolutions to commence trading as TSC Ltd from the 1<sup>st</sup> April 2019, subject to completion of registration with HMRC.
- 1.2. The changes should be seen as a continuation of the history, activity and ambition of the Club as all these elements, along with assets, liabilities, contracts and employees will be transferred to TSC Ltd, not the end of TSC. The Club has changed its structure, rules and the way it operates many times since 1877 and this change builds on that history of seeking to evolve and develop the best way to run the Club.
- 1.3. The legal structure we approved at the 2018 AGM, a Community Benefit Society with exempt charity status (CBS), was the structure that best met our needs and retained a strong focus on members. Becoming an incorporated legal entity would also address our long-held ambition to remove the considerable responsibility placed on our two Club Trustees (currently Nick Burnett and Alan Holdsworth). Our near neighbours Sale Sports Club and Altrincham Kersal Rugby Club have also recently become CBSs for similar reasons, and they have been most helpful in sharing documents and experience with us.
- 1.4. The new legal structure will change the way we have to do some things and we have set out a comparison summary (attached agenda item 2.2). As with any change this it is quite normal and would have had to happened irrespective of which legal structure we had adopted. The work to set up the new legal structure has also acted as a trigger to review and update many of the documents and processes required to run the Club. Over the course of 2019 these will be shared with members and will hopefully give members a greater understanding of how the Club is run and how they can get involved.

This paper summarises the background, progress since the 2018 AGM and details of the new structures that will be put in place to take the Club forward.

#### 2. Background

- 2.1. It has been a long-held objective of Timperley Sports Club (TSC) to change its legal structure from an unincorporated association (and Community Amateur Sports Club (CASC)) to an incorporated body that would better serve and protect the interests of the club, current members and future members.
- 2.2. This has been a long and detailed piece of work led by the Executive Committee and members have been updated on the key phases of work and approved a number of decisions over the last few years at TSC AGMs:
  - 2.2.1. The background to this change was originally shared with members at the 2012 AGM and it remains a crucial step to be completed prior to commencing the next phase of major Club development (Project 18).
  - 2.2.2. Phase 1 was completed in April 2016, and endorsed by the **2016 AGM** and addressed changes implemented by HMRC on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2016 that impacted Community Amateur Sports Clubs (CASC's) and led to the setting up of a wholly owned subsidiary of TSC called Timperley Sports Club (Trading) Ltd.
  - 2.2.3. The **2016 AGM** also approved a second phase of work to be progressed by the Executive to bring forward proposals to establish TSC as an incorporated legal entity. Phase 2 of the work would focus on the work to review and assess the most appropriate legal form for TSC to adopt to change the legal status of the Club.
  - 2.2.4. The **2018 AGM** received a report on the work to progress identifying and implementing the most appropriate legal structure for the Club and approved the following resolutions to progress to the implementation phase (Phase 3) of the work:

### Resolutions approved by the 2018 AGM

To support the smooth transition and set up of the new legal structure and convert TSC to a Community Benefit Society (with exempt charity status) the Executive Committee recommend the following resolutions to members for their approval:

- a) To **endorse** the recommendation of the Executive Committee to **proceed** to put in place all necessary plans and structures to enable Timperley Sports Club **to become a Community Benefit Society with exempt charity status with effect from 1**<sup>st</sup> **January 2019**, including registration with the Financial Conduct Authority and HMRC.
- b) To **approve** the transfer of all Timperley Sports Club assets, liabilities and employees to the new entity, including the transfer of share(s) in Timperley Sports Club (Trading) Ltd as part of the setting up on the new legal entity.
- c) To **approve** that the 2018-19 Timperley Sports Club Membership fee (for members aged 18+) shall include a sum of at least £1 to be held on behalf of members to purchase that member's share in Timperley Sports Club (CBS) with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2019 or the date of set up and become a member of Timperley Sports Club (CBS).
- d) To **note** that an Extra-Ordinary General Meeting will be held to share with members the finals details of the set-up stage and the proposed structures and roles for the club including election of Directors.

### 3. Progress since the 2018 AGM

3.1. The Executive has completed a wide range of work to implement the resolutions agreed at the 2018 AGM. We are pleased to report that:

- 3.1.1. Timperley Sports Club Limited (TSC Ltd) was registered as a Community Benefit Society with the Financial Conduct Authority (the regulator for CBSs) on the 17<sup>th</sup> October 2018, with the registration number 7857. Registration involves submitting the Rules of the Club to the FCA. A full copy of the new TSC Ltd Rules, along with the current TSC Rules and Constitution, are available on the TSC Website and are on the Club Noticeboard. Online link to new and current Club Rules.
- 3.1.2. To complete the registration the Executive had to undertake detailed work to review, adapt and refine a set of model Rules used by CBS's to reflect the legal form and particular requirements of the Club. The new Rules will replace the current TSC Constitution and Rules.
- 3.2. The TSC Ltd Rules include a number of Objects that set out what the Club exists to do, this is linked to seeking Charitable status and reflect both our current Constitution and working Vision and Mission. **The Objects of TSC Ltd as set out in the Rules are:** 
  - Rule 4 The objects of the Society shall be for the public benefit:
  - (a) The promotion of community participation in healthy recreation for the benefit of the inhabitants of Timperley and surrounding areas by the provision of facilities for playing cricket, football, hockey, lacrosse and other sports.
  - (b) Without distinction of age, sex, sexual orientation, race or of political, religious or other opinions to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation with the objective of improving the conditions of life, health and wellbeing of the public.
- 3.3. At the 2018 AGM it was anticipated all set up work would be completed by 1<sup>st</sup> January 2019 and that this would be the date of transfer of trading and all other activities from TSC to TSC Ltd. Due to the amount of work required we were unable to meet this timescale and subject to HMRC approval we are now targeting a transfer date to commence trading of 1<sup>st</sup> April 2019 or soon thereafter.
- 3.4. TSC Ltd completed its application to HMRC for tax exempt charity status in January 2019 and this will replace our current CASC status. This is the final step in the process to complete the set-up of the new legal structure and we anticipate this being completed by the time of the EGM. If there is a delay, we will move the proposed transfer date accordingly.
- 3.5. As part of the registration process, the Executive Committee had to approve the appointment of three founder members of TSC Ltd who were required to complete the FCA registration process and to take forward the interim operation of TSC Ltd. The Executive appointed the current Trustees (Alan Holdsworth and Nick Burnett) and the current Club Secretary (John Allen) as the founder members of TSC Ltd.
- 3.6. The Founder members have held a number of Board meetings and in line with their responsibilities set out in the Rules and have appointed the Directors as an interim Board prior to planned full elections in November 2019. Agenda Item 2.3 sets out a summary of the Board structure and responsibilities and sub-committee structure. Agenda item 2.4 sets out the Board composition and interim Board members. Agenda item 5 sets out the timeline for future elections.
- 3.7. Detailed work is also progressing well to put in place a wider range of processes, policies and procedures to operate in line with the TSC Ltd Rules and CBS exempt charity status including:

- Review and updating, if required, of TSC Policies. It is the intention that all applicable current TSC Policies will be adopted by TSC Ltd and updated and or new policies developed over time as required.
- b) Some of the operational elements of the current TSC Rules, for example bar opening hours, honorary club positions etc are being incorporated into a new set of Operating Regulations to be approved by the TSC Ltd Board to guide the operation of the Club.
- c) Terms of Reference will also be established for the main Sub Committees of TSC Ltd and an important new sub committee will be responsible for membership. Working with a representative for each sports section this committee will help develop and improve of processes for the collection of subs, member records and data.
- 3.8. In addition, the following work is also underway to support the transfer to TSC Ltd:
  - a) Novation (transfer) of agreements, contracts, loans and covenants from TSC to TSC (Ltd)
  - b) Transfer of TSC (Trading) Ltd from TSC to TSC (Ltd)
  - c) New organisation structure, roles for the new Board and sub-committees. As a legal entity the Club will have a Board and Directors (with Director responsibility)
  - d) Finance, accounting and tax including relevant HMRC registration including deregistering of our current CASC status
  - e) Membership processes, setting up member / share register as all voting members will now hold a minimum of one share in TSC Ltd
  - f) Holding an EGM to finalise arrangements for the transfer of TSC to TSC (Ltd)

#### 3.9. Summary of main impacts:

- a) Current TSC Members and those wishing to become members will need to become a member of TSC Ltd and sign a complete a new membership form over the next few months and before the first AGM of TSC Ltd. Forms will be available at the EGM. Members will hold a minimum of one share in the Club, and irrespective of the number of shares held each member will have one vote. Shares are withdrawable and cannot be traded. The £1 will now be deducted from the 2019-2020 annual subscriptions.
- b) The Club will cease to be a CASC but will to continue to access the same or similar benefits by registering as a CBS with exempt charity status. The changes will not impact on Gift Aid. We will need to continue therefore to ensure that our future activities meet our future charitable objectives.
- c) Eligible members will continue to have a vote at the TSC Ltd AGM and elect some members to the Board. Our two Club Trustees will be replaced by a Board of Directors accountable to the members.
- d) TSC (Trading) Ltd will continue to operate the Club's non-charitable linked trading activity and make donations to TSC Ltd to assist in furthering its charitable aims.
- e) The assets and liabilities of TSC will transfer to TSC Ltd including the bank accounts, lease, loans and any outstanding grant agreements.
- f) As with any legal form there will be a range of responsibilities that we will have to undertake in future including reporting to both the members and the FCA.
- g) To ensure we complete and bed in the new governance and operating arrangements an interim Board has been appointed by the Founder Members to oversee the transitionary period until November 2019 when the first AGM of TSC Ltd will be held. All interim Board Directors will stand down or seek election to the board at this time.
- h) After the initial elections cycle in November 2019, a third of Directors will retire on rotation at the AGM but shall be eligible for re-election if they wish to put themselves forward.

3.10 The TSC Executive and TSC Ltd Board are confident that all final arrangements will be in place ready for a smooth transition to start trading as TSC Ltd, subject to HMRC approval on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2019.

### 4. Future Operating Model and Structure

- 4.1. As part of the changes we have looked at how we run the Club and used the opportunity to document more clearly overall operating model and committee structure and roles. We hope that this will enable more members to understand how the Club operates and the roles of members involved both at a Club and sports section level. (see Agenda Item 2.3)
- 4.2. The Interim Board of Directors is also set out in Agenda Item 2.4.

#### 5. Outline Timeline

5.1. The following outline timeline has been prepared to set out the planned cycle of AGMs and elections as we complete the transition to the new structure. We will also work with sports sections and TSC (Trading) Ltd to confirm their AGMs dates and build into the overall timeline (Agenda Item 5).



### **Outline Timeline**

Future Annual General Meeting cycle

Future TSC Ltd reporting cycle will be linked to the Financial Year 1st April to 31st March and the Rules of the Club.

TSC (Trading) Ltd Financial Year is Currently  $1^{st}$  January to  $31^{st}$  December and will be adjusted to  $1^{st}$  April to  $31^{st}$  March as soon as practicable. TSC (Trading) Ltd AGM's will be held in line with its AGM and Rules



### 6. Member questions

There will be Question and Answer session at the EGM and a number of informal drop-in sessions to find out more and clarify anything prior to the vote to complete the transfer of TSC to TSC Ltd.



To set up and register the new legal entity TSC Ltd it was necessary to appoint a small number of Founding Members who submitted the applications to both the FCA and HMRC.  The current Executive Committee approved that the current two Club Trustees (Nick Burnett and Alan Holdsworth) who hold legal responsibility for TSC and the Club Secretary (John Allen) were the most appropriate TSC members to endorse as the Founder Members of TSC Ltd, and be appointed Directors of TSC Ltd.
		The Founder Members have specified duties and powers set out in the FCA approved Rules. They are responsible for appointing Interim Board members and the smooth transition to the first TSC Ltd AGM planned for November 2019 when all of the Interim Board will stand down and elections will take place for all elected Director vacancies.
How will membership work?	Currently members pay an annual subscription to be a member of the TSC to play sport or be social member. 

Annual Subscription (Subs) rates are recommended to the AGM for approval by the Executive after taking feedback from Section Chairs and giving section committees the opportunity to review and feedback as part of the annual review of subs.  Annual Subscriptions go towards the cost of running and investing in TSC's clubhouse, playing facilities and grounds and form an important part of the Club's income.	Once a member of TSC Ltd, to benefit from the club's facilities and activities members will pay an annual subscription. This includes a range of annual fees for Playing and Non-Playing members. (see Proposed 2019 -20 Subscriptions)  The membership year for annual subs will change to 1st April to 31st March to tie in better with the playing seasons and be the same as the Financial Year of the Club. ### c) Sub Committee Scope



# Extraordinary General Meeting of Timperley Sports Club Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> March 2019

### **RESOLUTIONS**

Further to the resolutions passed at the last club AGM on the 26<sup>th</sup> April 2018, the unincorporated organisation known as Timperley Sports Club (TSC) was formally registered as a Community Benefit Society (CBS) (an incorporated organisation) under the name of Timperley Sports Club Ltd (TSCL) with the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) on the 17<sup>th</sup> October 2019, with registration number 7857.

An application to request tax exempt charity status as a CBS was made to HMRC in early January 2019, this being the final step in the transition to TSC's objective of becoming a fully incorporated members organisation.

In order to now finalise this transition from TSC (unincorporated) to TSCL, a CBS (with tax exempt charity status) the Executive Committee of TSC proposes the following resolutions to all members for their approval;

### Resolution 1 – Legal Structure Implementation

Proposed by the Executive Committee

a) That in accordance with Clause L of the Club's Constitution and Rules 16.1 and 16.2 of the Club Rules (both dated 28th April 2016), the unincorporated organisation known as TSC (formerly Timperley Cricket, Hockey, Lawn Tennis and Lacrosse Club) since 1877, will cease trading and all operations and be dissolved on the 31<sup>st</sup> March 2019, or on such other date as the Executive Committee may decide, following successful receipt of exempt charity status from HMRC relating to the new Society known as TSCL.

This date to be known as the 'transfer date'.

NOTE: This Dissolution Resolution, in line with the TSC Rules, requires the support of 75% of voting members attending a quorate EGM.

b) That all assets, liabilities and employees of TSC together with its shares in Timperley Sports Club (Trading) Ltd (TSCTL) be transferred to TSCL on the transfer date.

NOTE: The TSC 2018 AGM has already approved this Resolution and it is included for ratification now that the name of the new legal entity is known.

c) That all trading and operations previously carried out in the name of TSC be carried out from the transfer date under the new CBS, trading and operating in the name of TSCL, under the new Rules as approved by the FCA on the 17<sup>th</sup> October 2018.

NOTE: The principles set out in this Resolution were approved by the 2018 TSC AGM and this Resolution is proposed to this EGM for completeness, now the name and registration date of the new legal entity are known.

- d) That the existing powers of the former Executive Committee and Trustees of TSC be delegated to the new Board of TSCL with effect from the transfer date, in order to review and complete any final and outstanding matters relating to the previous trading and operations of TSC, including:
  - i) The setting of subscriptions for the year 2019/2020
  - ii) The appointment of Club Auditors
  - iii) The final reporting to members as would have been expected during a normal TSC AGM
  - iv) Approval of TSC financial accounts up to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2018 and from 1<sup>st</sup> Jan 2019 to the transfer date

### Resolution 2 – Honorary Club Positions

Proposed by the Executive Committee

- a) that John Wood is re-elected to the honorary position of Patron until the 1st AGM of TSC Ltd, when the honorary role will be put forward for election in the normal way
- b) that Nick Burnett is re-elected as TSC Club President until the 1st AGM of TSC Ltd. AT the point of transfer the President will become an honorary role and will be up for re-election at the 1st AGM of TSC Ltd
- c) that Alan Holdsworth and Nick Burnett are re-elected as TSC Trustees until the transfer to TSC is complete. This is a precautionary measure in the event of any administration delays with the transfer
- d)that all current TSC Honorary Life Members and Section Vice Presidents continue to be recognised for their contribution to the Club by TSC Ltd and past contributions to the running and development of the club
- e) that the 1st AGM of TSC Ltd will consider any nominations and election of new Club Honorary Life Members and Section Vice Presidents
