



BEXLEY CRICKET CLUB –

FIRST AID / ACCIDENTS/ INJURIES at Manor Way or other remote venue.

Dear member

Bexley Cricket Club is affiliated to the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) and under the directives of the ECB, as a Club we are duty bound to provide adequate first aid cover.

Our qualified coaches/managers/team captains and some other members have attended a recognized first aid course (First Aid for Appointed Persons) as required under the Health and Safety Executive legislation. They will conduct basic first aid for the safety and well-being of a person injured as a result of an accident, illness or sports related injury whilst at Bexley Cricket Club (or associated remote sites ie Loring Hall). This includes training on the use of the defibrillator equipment sited both at Manor Way and Loring Hall.

All incidents of illness or injury will be recorded in the Accident Record Book. This must be acknowledged and signed by all relevant parties including yourself. The accident book is located in the kitchen area in the pavilion at Manor Way.

Appointed Persons can only conduct IMMEDIATE first aid as advised in the official training courses.

They are not qualified medical practitioners.

An ambulance must be called to any incident where injury is serious or cannot be dealt with on site and requires immediate attention from a medical professional.

Details of local medical establishments and contact numbers are displayed by the telephone in the pavilion.
