COVID-19 Secure Risk Assessment

Malmesbury Victoria Football Club has produced this Covid-19 Secure risk assessment to cover all areas of its operation.

This risk assessment has drawn on guidance issued by Government, Statutory Bodies, and the Football Association.

In addition to this risk assessment all volunteers, members and users of Malmesbury Victoria Football Club are always expected to follow in full the latest government guidance on social distancing and hygiene.

This risk assessment is an evolving document and will be updated in accordance with Government and Football Association advice and following reviews of the effectiveness of the risk assessment.

This risk assessment does not remove the risk of catching coronavirus, but it reduces / manages the risk as much as is practically possibly.

Individuals using Malmesbury Victoria Football Club are asked to consider their own personal circumstances before deciding to attend the club. Once on the club premises they are asked to follow social distancing guidelines, personal hygiene guidelines and instructions issued by Bar staff volunteers and committee members at all times.

<u>Priority System</u> Red = High Priority / Amber = Medium Priority / Green = Low Priority

1. Managing Risk

Objective: To reduce risk to the lowest reasonably practicable level by taking preventative measures in order of priority.

If 2 meters social distancing cannot always be maintained, then this can be reduced 1 metre plus for a short period if mitigating measures are taken. This includes the wearing of a face covering, not sitting face to face, and minimising the amount of time spent with someone at less than 2 meters.
