Someone already has Covid-19 • Someone with Covid-19 attends a training session or match and spreads it to the rest of the group	 All players should undertake the following self-screen check list before travelling to a training session or other football activity. If the answer to any one of the questions is 'yes', you should NOT travel to the training session or match and follow all applicable Government Guidance (e.g. call NHS 111). Track and trace • Someone displays symptoms of Covid-19 following training / match	 All parents to update emergency contact details Managers to ensure that they keep a register of their players who attended each training session / match Managers to bring QR Code poster for their team to all home matches and encourage all adults in attendance to scan it Manager to ensure that they have contact details for opposition managers Manager to contact opposition manager for anyone played in the last 2-weeks in the event of one of our players displaying symptoms Opposition managers are responsible for recording names, contact details and attendance for their players. Also, for letting us know if one of their players displays any symptoms within 2-weeks of playing us 	Parents to ensure emergency contact details are correct Managers to ensure they record attendance of their players and contact opposition if necessary Opposition managers to ensure they record attendance of their players and contact us if necessary	Ongoing - every training session and match
Travelling to and from training / matches • Limited space • Lack of air circulation	 Although ideally there would be no lift sharing at all, if it is required to get players to matches or training, it should be kept to an absolute minimum with as few people in one car as possible. This may mean sharing those requiring lifts amongst several parents. There should never be more than 6 people in any one car as this would be breaking the law as it stands.  Surface areas The virus spreads by touching of contaminated surfaces 	 If lifts are given to people outside of your own household the windows should be open or partially open to increase ventilation and all those in the car aged 11 or over should wear a face mask. Anyone providing a lift to someone outside of their own household must ensure that they notify the player's parents if anyone in their household is displaying symptoms within 2-weeks of providing the lift. Similarly, if someone has given someone in your household a lift, then you must notify the person who gave the lift if someone in your household is displaying symptoms within 2 weeks of the lift being provided Coaches should ensure they are never left in a car alone with any child not in their own household. Coaches must have a valid MOT and Insurance and must send a copy of their MOT and Insurance Certificate to Mark Rogers before giving any lifts Only those coaches with a current, up to date CRC should provide lifts Where possible, travel to training or matches should not be via public transport 	Everyone to ensure that guidelines are followed whenever people from outside the same household are

These will be 2 metres apart from any other players and during break times within training or matches, players will go to their 'Safe Zone' Players are to bring their own hand sanitizer with their name on, this will be stored in their 'Safe Zone' Players to sanitize their hands during break times in training and matches Players will be discouraged from using their hands to touch the ball unnecessarily Players will bring their own refreshments, and these will be kept in their individual 'Safe Zone' an not shared Spectators are to ensure that they maintain a 2-metre distance from anyone not in their household at all times 	Managers to liaise with other AULGFC managers to arrange staggered start times, setup 'Safe Zones' and ensure their players use them Parents to ensure that players bring their own water bottle, hand sanitiser, sun cream and any necessary medication. Training / match day equipment The virus spreads by touching of contaminated surfaces	 Corner poles, goalposts, match balls and respect barriers must be wiped down with appropriate cleaning equipment before the match kicks off, at half time and during any other breaks in play Signage reminding people to wash their hands should be attached to respect barriers at matches All equipment (balls, bibs and cones etc) must be regularly wiped down with appropriate cleaning equipment and cleaned thoroughly after every training session or match Bibs should not be shared.
