Management Committee Candidates

James Byrne – Standing for Chair

I have been involved in youth football locally for 16 years now. Started out with running a boys team from U8 - U16, then did Mini Ducks for ages 3-5, then onto Inclusive football sessions before starting an U8 girls team when my daughter showed an interest in playing the beautiful game. I was Vice-Chair of the Juniors for 3 years and have been a Director at Aylesbury United for the last 3-4 years as well. I am passionate about growing girl's football and offering the opportunity for females of all ages and abilities to develop and enjoy playing the game

Jason Savage – Standing for Treasurer

I have been involved with the club since 2014 when my two daughters joined the Club and I took over as treasurer for the 2016/17 season. When I took over, there was little control of finances and the Club's balance sheet wasn't in a very healthy position. After completely reorganising the book-keeping, and stabilising the accounts, I have introduced policy to ensure that the Club breaks-even each season, alongside bringing in additional funding through several grants in order for the club to undertake additional activities.

I was planning on stepping down as treasurer as I would like to focus my efforts more on the club's marketing, as well as social and charitable activities – however, as we have not currently had sufficient interest from other volunteers to take on the role, I am re-standing to the 2019/20 season.

Catriona Cameron – Standing for Club Secretary

I have been involved in woman's football for 25 years, both as a player and coach. I have been with Aylesbury United for 13 years. The growth of the sport has been fantastic and I think this is highlighted by the fact that Aylesbury United Ladies and Girls are almost able to offer teams for every age group. I am hoping that as a club we can work towards more females getting involved in the coaching and running of teams, as this is an area which is still underrepresented by females.

Marie Johnson – Standing for Senior Club Welfare Officer

I have worked in Social Care for the last 24 years in a variety of roles, including managing residential respite services for Bucks CC for children with learning disabilities, as well as Family Group Conference Practitioner, working with families in crisis. Currently I am the Assessment Manager for the Fremantle Trust.

Throughout my career safeguarding has always been at the fore of what I do. I have trained staff in safeguarding, I have implemented policies and procedures and have carried out investigations alongside the Multi Agency Safeguarding Hub at Aylesbury Police Station.

I believe I am an approachable person, who is able to listen and respond without emotion or judgement, which enables people to talk to me and for me to form good, professional relationships.

The children's welfare is paramount and I know the importance of having a clear reporting structure, as well as the correct policies and procedures in place to safeguard both the children and the volunteers working with them.

My name is Alison Kemp and I have a 16 yr old Daughter who currently plays for the U16's & Ladies and a Son who is 21, who is a coach with the U14's. I have been involved with the committee for the last 3 1/2 years helping the club to grow to its current status.
