Can be practised alone by kicking ball off a wall or hard surface. Should be able to achieve it with their left and right feet	See this link for demonstration of the skill  Face passing player / wall / hard surface  Step to the side of the ball with the non-kicking foot  Pivot on that foot  Cut the ball back with the inside of the opposite foot	<ul> <li>Level 1 – Is able to get body in position to receive the ball</li> <li>Level 2 – As above, also steps to the side of the ball with their non-kicking foot</li> <li>Level 3 – As above, also pivots on the non-kicking foot</li> <li>Level 4 – As above, also cuts the ball back quickly to perform next action with their stronger foot</li> <li>Level 5 - As number 3, also cuts the ball back quickly to perform next action with their weaker foot</li> </ul>	Once you have awarded your daughter a level, she is welcome to count how many times she can achieve this on her own and tell you. Once they move to a new level, they start again at Level J • Level A – Between 451-500 • Level B – Between 351-400 • Level C – Between 351-400 • Level D – Between 251-300 • Level F – Between 251-300 • Level F – Between 151-200 • Level H – Between 101-150 • Level I – Between 51-100
Turning - Stop Turn  Can be practised alone. Should be able to achieve it with their left and right feet	See this link for demonstration of the skill  Stop the ball with the sole of the foot Step forward with the same foot, planting it in front of the ball  Bends knees to create platform to accelerate in opposite direction  Take the ball away with the outside of the opposite foot	<ul> <li>Level 1 – Is able to stop the ball with the sole of their foot</li> <li>Level 2 – As above, also steps forward with the same foot, planting it in front of the ball</li> <li>Level 3 – As above, also bends knees to create platform to accelerate</li> <li>Level 4 – As above, also takes the ball away with the outside of their stronger foot</li> <li>Level 5 – As number 3, also takes the ball away with the outside of their weaker foot</li> </ul>	
Turning - U Turn  Can be practised alone. Should be able to achieve it with their left and right feet	See this link for demonstration of the skill  Non-kicking foot plants as the kicking foot reaches for the ball  Drag the ball back as you turn, shielding the ball from the defender  The next touch is made with the nearest surface of the nearest foot	<ul> <li>Level 1 – Is able to plant non-kicking foot whilst kicking foot reaches for the ball</li> <li>Level 2 – As above, also can drag the ball back as they turn</li> <li>Level 3 – As above, also shields the ball with their body as they turn</li> <li>Level 4 – As above, also takes the ball away with the outside of their stronger foot</li> <li>Level 5 – As number 3, also takes the ball away with the outside of their weaker foot</li> </ul>	
Turning - Drag Push  Can be practised alone. Should be	See this <u>link</u> for demonstration of the skill  Reach in and drag the ball back using the sole of the foot	<ul> <li>Level 1 – Is able to reach in and drag the ball back using the sole of their foot</li> <li>Level 2 – As above, also moves the ball across the front of their body</li> </ul>	Level J – Between 0-50  If they are able to perform the drill using their left and right feet,

able to achieve it with their left and right feet	<ul> <li>Move the ball across the front of the body</li> <li>Take the ball away with the outside of the opposite foot</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Level 3 – As above, also transfers body weight to change direction quickly</li> <li>Level 4 – As above, also takes the ball away with the outside of their stronger foot</li> <li>Level 5 – As number 3, also takes the ball away with the outside of their weaker foot</li> </ul>	they just need to do it roughly equal times with both feet to achieve a level e.g. to achieve Level A, they just need to do it approx. 250 times with each foot, not 500
Turning – Cruyff  Can be practised alone. Should be able to achieve it with their left and right feet	See this link for demonstration of the skill  • Fake to pass or shoot planting the non-kicking foot in front of the ball  • With the opposite foot, use the inside of the foot to move the ball behind the non-kicking foot  • Take the ball away with the non-kicking foot	<ul> <li>Level 1 – Can fake to pass or shoot whilst planting the non-kicking foot in front of the ball</li> <li>Level 2 – As above, also uses the inside of the kicking foot to move the ball behind the non-kicking foot</li> <li>Level 3 – As above, also shields the ball with their body as they turn</li> <li>Level 4 – As above, also performs next action (pass, dribble or shoot) with stronger foot</li> <li>Level 5 – As number 3, also performs next action (pass, dribble or shoot) with weaker foot</li> </ul>
