



Formby Cricket Club Code of Conduct Children

1. The ECB actively encourages clubs to use the Code of Conduct for Members and Guests as a starting point for producing an additional Children's Code of Conduct.
2. NSPCC research shows that when children are empowered to create rules for themselves these rules are usually far more greatly respected, and often stricter, than those that adults responsible for supervising the groups might impose.
3. With the above thoughts in mind, the Formby Cricket Club Chairman requires the Junior Cricket Committee to establish a Code of Conduct for Children. Possible topics to discuss and agree with the children, although not exhaustive, are as follows:
 - (a). Why do they come to the Club and what do they want to get from attending?
 - (b). How do they want to treat, and be treated, by adults including officials, adult members of the Club and spectators?
 - (c). How do they want to treat, and be treated, by other children at the Club?
 - (d). How do they want to be able to raise any concerns they have?
 - (e). What rules, or limits, would they like to see put in place?
 - (f). How do they think that breaches of the code of conduct should be dealt with?
