Chasetown Football Club has a duty of care to protect the safety and welfare of its staff, volunteers, visitors customers, and contractors at all times and must ensure the implementation of safe and effective social distancing and hygiene measures in line with government advice to limit the potential for COVID -19 infection. if at any time the club believes that such safety and welfare are potentially compromised it reserves the right to consider cancellation or amendment of any activity while measures are reviewed. All activities will be carried out in line with Government COVID -19 guidelines and are continually reviewed. this risk assessment must be read in conjunction with all other activity and site-specific risk assessments. This updated assessment now allows for the return of spectators in line with FA guidelines regarding crowd numbers.

Admission will be by pre-purchased ticket or payment at the turnstile. When purchasing a ticket supporters will be requested to supply all current Track and Trace information and this will be held by the club, and the supporter will be given a card with an individual recognition number on it which will be used at each return visit to the ground. Supporters to be encouraged to arrive early to avoid queues forming at the turnstile. Signage to be displayed requesting socially distanced lines at the entry point.	Situation to be monitored on a game by game basis. Visiting clubs to be contacted prior to games and an agreed allocation of tickets will be made available to 'away' fans, visiting clubs will be asked to keep a log of tickets purchased for track and trace purposes. We will look to introduce a cashless payment system throughout the club to eliminate staff having to handle cash.

Club Covid Register	High	The club will set up a COVID register for all supporters, this will entail supporters giving the club all of their contact details to allow a TRACK and TRACE system to be put in place. Each supporter will then be issued with a card containing a supporter number. This will then be presented to the turnstile operator at each game, the operator will then log the supporter number against the club sheet, thus ensuring we know all of the game attendees.	If a supporter comes to a game who is not on the register, they will be directed to a club official who will take down their contact details.
NHS COVID 19 APP	High	The govt has devised a system to TRACK and TRACE people attending events. The logo and APP sign-in points will be positioned at the entry points to the ground, and in other strategic areas. ALL visitors to the ground will be encouraged to sign into the ground using this APP.	
Supporters attending the game.	High	A Supporters Code of Conduct has been issued for all people wishing to attend games, supporters to be encouraged to read and implement measures. Upon entering the ground supporters are requested to find a space, either a seat or standing space to watch the game. Signage	Hand sanitizing stations to be positioned around the ground to allow spectators to maintain hygiene standards if so required.

Clubhouse and bar.	High	A separate risk assessment has been prepared and issued for this area, see Club Website for details. Strict single flow one way systems will be in operation, with a Steward on the door to monitor numbers accessing the area.	At this stage only cans and plastic glasses will be used for drinks on sale.
Catering and hospitality	High	No club hospitality facilities will be available. A facility will be available for supporters wanting to purchase food or hot drinks. All food hygiene aspects will be handled by mobile proprietor. A socially distanced queuing system will be set in place by the facility to ensure safe operation.	Litter bins etc to be on hand to take any waste, and hand sanitizers will be available.
Exiting ground at end of the game.	Medium	All 3 large exit gates from the ground will be opened near the end of the game, this will ensure that anyone wishing to leave before the end, and to ensure a smooth flow of people can safely leave the ground at the end of the game.
