## SDCDG Kwik Cricket Rules 2018

1. The Competition is open to any Member Club and will be administered by SDCDG Management Committee.

2. A subscription as defined annually at the AGM will be levied (due 31st March) for each team.

3. Teams will consist of 8 players.

Boys - born on or after 1.9.2007 (Year 6) will be eligible for this competition.

Girls - born on or after 1.9.2005 (Year 8) will be eligible for this competition.

Registered disabled players –born on or after 1.9.2005 will be eligible for this competition.

Note: It is the responsibility of the team manager to establish if a player is the correct age.

4. Each team must provide an umpire (who may give advice) and a scorer. Umpires must ensure that strikers do not face the next ball after being dismissed. The Umpires decision is final.

5. Matches will consist of one 8 over innings per side. The decision to bat first is to be decided by the toss of a coin.

a. Batting - Players will bat in pairs. Each pair will face two overs regardless of how many times they are dismissed. Batsmen will change ends so that any dismissed batsman does not face the next delivery.

b. Bowling - Each player will bowl one six ball over with over arm action subject to 6 Playing Conditions below.

c. Fielding - No fielder is to stand closer than 11 yards from the striker

### 6 Playing Conditions

The M.C.C laws of cricket 2017 Code will apply with the following amendments.

- (1) Under arm bowling will be allowed at the umpires discretion.
- (2) L.B.W. will not apply
- (3) The pitch will be 16 yards long with a minimum recommended boundary of 20 yards measured from the middle stump

### NOTE Umpires are reminded of the following.

- (a) No-ball to be called if the ball bounces more than twice i.e. three times before reaching the popping crease, or dead ball if rolls along the ground and comes to rest before reaching the striker..



- (b) If the ball passes or would have passed above waist height of the striker on the full with the striker standing upright at the crease either umpire to call no-ball.
- (c) If the ball passes above head height of the striker with the striker standing upright at the crease and the ball having bounced once either umpire to call no ball.
- (d) Wide ball – batsman should be able to play a normal cricket stroke from his guard position or from where he is standing
- (e) byes and leg byes are recorded as such whether off a no ball/wide or not
- (f) once any items e.g. bat or foot have made ground and batsmen continued forward momentum they have made ground even if in the air when the bails are dislodged.
- (g) Behaviour of players needs to be managed by umpires/coaches on the field of play by the following.  
L1 and 2 misdemeanors - player will be spoken to by the umpire/coach and told to refrain. He or she will then be warned after a repeat that next time they will be removed. Any further repetition will mean they can no longer take further part in the game

### **Umpires to use their discretion bearing in mind the age and ability of the participants**

7. Scoring - Teams will start with 100 runs. Scoring will be as in normal cricket: - except 5 runs will be deducted for each dismissal. A 2 run penalty will be awarded for wides and no balls with no extra delivery being bowled. All additional runs or extras scored will be added to the penalty. E.g.: - a wide ball which crosses the boundary will count as 6 runs (two for the penalty and four for the boundary) and a no ball hit clear of the boundary will count 8 runs (two for the penalty and six for the boundary). In the last over of each innings, an extra delivery will be allowed for all no balls and wides and no penalty runs given.

Note: Scorers should acknowledge all the umpires signals. Umpires and scorers should consult if there is any doubt as to the number of runs awarded by the umpire.

8. Misconduct, infringement of any rule, interpretation of any rule, or any other matter not provided for within these rules, to be dealt with by the Management Committee of the SDCDG or its nominated representative whose decision will be final.

9. The competition is governed by the DCB Discipline procedure.
