RAY ADAMSON | WELCOME

Good afternoon and welcome to Sandhill Lane for our fourth home fixture of the season against high-flying Middlesbrough, a match which I understand may carry the double significance of also being a Yorkshire Shield First Round Match. I would also like to extend a special welcome in particular to those Club stalwarts who will be enjoying a pre-match lunch and who have received the accolade of Vice President or Honorary Life Member. The Club owes each and every one of them a debt of gratitude for many years service, which have helped create a ground and facilities that are the envy of many many people who are lucky enough to pay us a visit.

A look at the current League table shows that Middlesbrough currently sit in second place whilst we have improved our own position with a couple of hard earned and very valuable wins. Middlesbrough played their latest fixture against Guisborough on a Friday night and I will be very interested to hear the reasons for that being the case and of course to find out whether the evening was a success and something we could look at for future League matches, particularly at the time of the 6 Nations when player availability can sometimes provide us with a selection headache. Amongst the disappointments were the concussion injuries to Skipper Charlie Cicero and Harry Cruise with barely a quarter of the game gone, but the resilience and sense of togetherness amongst the squad will no doubt stand the players in good stead for the difficult fixtures to come. Best wishes for a speedy recovery go to Charlie and Harry and of course any of our players currently recovering from injury.

It is really good to see that we have been able to continue to turn out 4 sides even though the 4th team fixture against Old Modernians had to be cancelled due to lack of opposition. The thirds were even able to travel to Ribblesdale with 3 subs, which is another very positive indication of the work being put in to ensure as many people as possible are able to turn out on a Saturday. My congratulations and thanks go to Captains, Managers and players involved in all of our lower sides. It was really interesting to read in Keighley's programme last weekend that the RFU are again looking at the composition of Leagues in the Northern Division and having to consider the possibility of combining some of the teams in farthest West Yorkshire with teams from the Eastern fringes of Lancashire. There are a number of important meetings taking place in the next couple of months and the views represented at them will no doubt help to shape the future of Leagues throughout the North.

Following on from our pre-match lunch today we intend to hold a couple of pre match Members' Lunches before Christmas to gauge their popularity. I am sure that details about them and how to book a place on a table will appear in the match day programme and on the Club's Pitchero website very soon.

Finally a gentle reminder to everybody taking part in or spectating this afternoon's game to please show respect to the match officials, players from both sides and other spectators. THE LAST TIME WE MET | Selby RUFC 32 v 49 Middlesbrough RUFC

Report by Ian Marlow

Selby returned to league rugby with another defeat against Middlesbrough that keeps them rooted to the foot of the table but in scoring six tries of their own the Swans provided further evidence of a turnaround in their performances that gives some hopes for the future.

Selby's forward dominance, particularly in the scrum, continued from last week but also continuing was their inability to turn pressure into points. And as so often has happened this season, the disappointment of a missed Selby penalty kick was compounded by a try from Middlesbrough who were confident throwing the ball around all afternoon. Selby's pressure did then lead to an unconverted try for Danny Wilkinson playing assuredly at scrum half before Middlesbrough cut loose again with poor Selby tackling allowing two further tries to move well ahead on the scoreboard.

It was to Selby's credit that these setbacks did not lead to any collapse in confidence or performance, as has been witnessed before this season, but instead seemed to act as a catalyst for renewed effort which showed the recent improvement in resilience of this young team. Firstly winger Harry Cruise squeezed into the corner for another unconverted try before Selby's forward domination finally paid off with a line out catch from Jack Hebdon. who was excellent all match, giving the big boys the chance to trundle over with Ben Booth providing the coup de grace.

With the half coming to a close and the scores still tight Selby then showed their inexperience and weakness as from a position of control they disappointingly lost possession to allow Middlesbrough to score again to take the wind from Selby's sails at half time.


Any chance of Selby regaining their momentum after half time was negated as yet another bugbear of the season resurfaced as they shot themselves in the foot with another silly yellow card. Middlesbrough duly took advantage with a catch and drive try before Selby returned the favour with one of their own - Ben Booth again being the man in possession as the ball was dotted down. The next twenty minutes belonged to Middlesbrough as they continued with their assured handling to score two more tries but, again, Selby were not for cracking and came back to earn their own Middlesbrough yellow card after sustained pressure on the opposition line. It was Selby's chance to take advantage of the extra man and indeed they did with two further tries from Liam Hogan and, to complete his hat trick, Ben Booth again taking advantage of the work of his fellow forwards to grab the glory with an injury time try.

While the final scoreline of 32-49 indicates a relatively conclusive loss the try count of 6-7 against gives a better indication, not just that Middlesbrough converted most of their kicks at goal while Selby did not, but that the teams were much more closely matched than the scoreline suggests. Given that Middlesbrough are a good top of the table side this should give cause for optimism that Selby can, with a little bit more experience and composure and the return of some key players, still turn the season around and start to move up the table.

Next Saturday Selby are playing away with an interesting first league fixture against Old Rishworthians who were promoted last season - and while the Old Boys will be an unknown quantity the Swans will be hoping to build on recent promise with a win.



STEVE CRUISE | FROM THE DUG OUT

Well today we entertain the team who I predicted would win the league this season, as you know I only took over the reins here last January and in that time Middlesbrough were the best team I saw by a country mile, I appreciate York and Scarborough got promoted and I did take a lot of criticism on the 'Yorkshire forum' for saying that, but I can only give an honest rugby view and in terms of pure rugby quality the Teesiders were streets apart from anyone else. Their favourite billing doesn't appear to be holding them back this term either as they sit in second place as we speak, their only blemish was a surprising defeat at the hands at Old Crossleyans in Halifax in September. So this is a mouth-watering prospect for our young team as they attempt to stamp their mark on the league this term.

Since my last programme notes we have enjoyed two back to back narrow victories, firstly at home to a much improved Hullensians team (Thanks in no part to an influx from Ionians and Hull) and last week we earned a very creditable 4 point win away on the 4G pitch at Keighley. Our second half performance and our overall defensive effort gave us a worthy victory, its never easy winning away in Yorkshire One and to win at a ground where the home team obviously have an advantage through their knowledge of the surface was very rewarding. Particularly in the second half I thought we gave the opposition a lesson in how to turn possession to point and how to execute when presented with opportunities, something the hosts failed to do in the first 40 minutes.

Last week we suffered from 3 head injuries, two of our players (captain Cic and Harry Cruise collided heads) and are out today through the head injury protocol, Harry may have to take a longer period out of the game because of the number of head knocks he has taken in the last 12 months. We take these things very seriously, rugby is important but so is the welfare of the player and in line with RFU regulations our physio Hayley Brady has a detailed report of every players injuries so she can make considered opinions based on facts. Medical advice drives selection at Selby and I hope it does these days at most clubs, the days of a player saying "I think I'm ok" should be well in the past. On the positive side we should have 4 players who were unavailable last week re-joining the group for today's game.

Yorkshire One this year is proving to be a very competitive league as Hullensians beating Beverley last week is testament to this view, in the early weeks our guests today are chasing Crossleyans for top spot, but the money men at Moortown are pressing hard and last week's defeat might just inspire Beverley to get back on track. As for ourselves we are sat in 9th but maybe 6th or 7th is more of a true reflection of our season to date. One thing is for sure we will surprise teams this year and I hope it starts today.

We have actually drawn our opponents today away from home in the Yorkshire Shield in a few weeks' time and there was a discussion between the two coaches of making todays game a 'double header' with Middlesbrough effectively forgiving home advantage but in the end this hasn't happened for one reason or another, so we will be heading to Acklam on the 10th November.

Our youth system continues to develop players at a pace and I have been pleased to be able to give first team debuts to Olly Turver, Olly Raynor, Edward Kelly and Eddie Brown over the last few weeks all of whom are studying at various locations and only available infrequently. We are working really hard on the transition of our players from colts to adult rugby and a big part of this process is first of all knowing where every boy is, when they are available and also working with Academies and Universities as a partnership for the good of the player so they are able to balance the amount of game time and training within specific laid down guidelines.

Sam is here on a twoyear visa and based on his personality and impact so far we very much hope he spends the whole time at Sandhill Lane. As a rugby player I'll let you decide, but all I will say he is a typical Kiwi forward, for those of you that remember Karim Brown. well just add, bigger, more powerful. Welcome Sam and enjoy your home debut



Finally it was very interesting watching last weeks game on the 4G pitch, I'm not so sure where I stand on them, there are certain clubs where there is no doubt there is a major benefit due to their poor playing surface and having spoken to the committee at Keighley last week this was one of their key drivers for sure. I also understand that Yarnbury (thank god everyone says) and Old Brodleians are also investing in one but £700,000 is an awful lot of money. Then from a playing perspective there are arguments on both sides of the scale. On the positives, the game is more expansive, its faster, it quickens up the ruck area, the ball is never really wet or muddy and it definitely changes the team's style of play (just look at Newcastle Falcons three years ago and how they play now). Then on the downside I had players with really bad burns on their knees and legs, the ball can bounce in different directions to what is does on grass, it can actually provide backspin and at scrum time if you are dominant and get a team moving backwards their studs don't slide in the grass and they have more time to repurchase their footing. Anyway, you will all have an opinion but one thing is for sure its grass at Sandhill Lane and with such a beautiful playing surface why should we change. I bet Middlesbrough are considering one though!!!!

Enjoy the game today, I'm two points behind on my little purple book and could do with them back







VIEW FROM THE BALCONY | REG PHILLIPS

We are pleased to welcome our visitors today from the historic city In 1801, Middlesbrough was a small farm with a population of just of Middlesbrough.

In 686, a monastic cell was consecrated by St. Cuthbert following a campaign of incessant nagging by his future wife, Hilda, Abbess of Whitby. In 1119 Robert Bruce, Lord of Cleveland and Annandale, converted the church of St. Hilda of Middleburg into the world's first Bingo Hall.

Before its final closure on the Dissolution of the Monasteries by Henry VIII in 1537, the church was maintained by 15 Benedictine monks, who became the first playing members of their newly formed local rugby club. Vicars, pastors, priests or rectors of various places in Cleveland were all made to feel welcome along with various other Celtic incomers, although Hilda & her nuns were persona nun grata.

The importance of the early church at "Middleburg", later known as Middlesbrough Priory, is indicated by the fact that, in 1452, it possessed four altars, until three of them were stolen by persons unknown, although the Celtic incomers were strongly suspected of having been put up to it by Hilda out of revenge

After the Angles, the area became home to Viking settlers who set the standard locally for rape & pillage that the area still upholds to this day. Names of Viking origin (with the suffix by) are abundant in the area - for example, Ormesby, Stainsby, Brianby and Fredby were once separate villages that belonged to Vikings called Orm, Steinn, Brian and Hagar, but now form suburbs of Middlesbrough. The name Mydilsburgh is the earliest recorded form of Middlesbrough's name and dates from the Anglo-Saxon ruler Thethil the Thyort tongue (AD 410-466), while many of the aforementioned villages are recorded in the Domesday Book of 1086.

Other links persist in the area, often through schools for unmarried mothers or mysterious road names, which cannot be identified because the road signs have been stolen. Or now-outgrown or abandoned local settlements, such as the medieval settlement of Doggingsby, deserted by 1757, which amounts to little more today than a series of grassy mounds near the A19 road.

25, although the Rugby club boasted 563 members & five teams. During the latter half of the 19th century, however, it experienced rapid growth.

In 1828 the influential Quaker banker, coal mine owner and Viking descendant Joseph Pease sailed up the River Tees to find a suitable new site to sow his wild oats & investigate the current opportunities for rape & pillage. He located a site near Stockton which seemed more suitable, however to place new coal staithes.

As a result, in 1829 he and a group of Quaker businessmen bought the Middlesbrough farmstead and associated estate, some 527 acres (213 ha) of land, a failed nunnery, a failed monastery but a thriving unmarried mother's school, and established the Middlesbrough Estate Company. Through the company, the investors set about the development of a new coal port on the banks of the Tees nearby, and a suitable town, which originally included 447 back to back houses & 322 public houses on the site of the farm (the new town of Middlesbrough) to supply the port with labour.

By 1830 the S&DR had been extended to Middlesbrough and expansion of the town was assured. Of the 796 successful graduates from the established school a full 3% went on to become happily married. The small farmstead became the site of such streets as North Street, South Street, West Street, East Street, Hilda Street, Hagar Street and Thethil Thtreet, laid out in a grid-iron pattern around a market square, with the first house being built in Wedlock Street in April 1830. The town of Middlesbrough was born. New businesses quickly bought up premises and plots of land in the new town and soon shoppers, con merchants, butchers, bakers, candlestick makers, innkeepers, joiners, blacksmiths, tailors, builders and painters were moving in. Nuns & Monks, however were moving out and by 1851 Middlesbrough's population had grown from 40 people in 1829 to 7,600.

LAST WEEK -V- KEIGHLEY RUFC

Keighley RUFC 14 v 20 Selby RUFC Report by Ian Marlow

Selby moved further away from the Yorkshire One relegation positions by toughing it out and leaving it late for the second week running to snatch the victory and points in a tight, bruising match away at Keighley. And while there is an old rugby maxim that says 'if you win the breakdown, you win the match', this match was proof indeed to pay no attention to perceived wisdom as Selby broke the world record for lost possessions but still came away with a well-merited win.

Playing into a stiffish breeze Selby didn't wait long to demonstrate their legendary generosity by kicking out on the full from the kick off and then conceding a soft penalty to put Keighley in prime position on their line - but prop Millar McCoy turned the ball over excellently to save the day. Play then concentrated in midfield as both teams showed their mettles with some mean tackling before second row Stephen Clark ran a beautiful line to hit the ball at pace and scorch through the defensive line for a seemingly certain and fabulous try. Unfortunately, a last ditch tap tackle upended the ginger galloper and the chance was lost, and then to compound Selby's disappointment Keighley put together a cracking back move of their own to send their centre in for a 7-0 lead after 15 minutes.

With Keighley now dominating the breakdowns the chance for Selby to establish any decent possession and field position was scant and when a clash of heads removed both captain Charlie Cicero and fly half Harry Cruise from any further involvement in the game, the Swans and their chances of victory were starting to look a bit bedraggled. Then out of nowhere Selby scored a cracking try as a quick tap penalty from acting captain and scrum half Danny Wilkinson from an innocuous position deep in his own half was moved deftly on by young centre Olly Turvey to winger Ash Dallimore, who simply blistered up the touchline leaving the Keighley cover for dead to streak in from 60 metres to tie the scores after 30 minutes.

Selby's chronic inability to hang onto the ball at the breakdown then returned to cost them as Keighley took advantage of two consecutive turned over possessions to score again for a 14-7 lead and then, after Liam Hogan senselessly binned himself, the Swans were left desperately hanging on until half time as Keighley pushed for another score to take the match away.

With hooker James Dentith having to leave the field at half time with another head injury and with Dallimore and centre Alex Webster also now struggling with leg injuries Selby, with no remaining substitutes, were starting to resemble the walking dead - but it is a measure of their much improved resilience that this didn't affect their defensive capabilities as they denied Keighley any second half scoring opportunities. The problem for Selby was that their troubles at the breakdown continued unabated, so despite the pack dominating the scrummage the Swans never had the ball long enough to do any damage themselves.

However, with time fast running out Selby suddenly started to get firmly on top as the pack, with Clark and New Zealander new boy Sam Phipps leading the way, started to get a real grind on their opposition - and it was great to see young hooker Charlie Thompson, a late replacement call up, stepping up to the mark when needed and getting stuck in to play a full part in Selby's recovery. After a break from Webster set up field position, the pack did the rest as they drove over for young but portly Sam Broughton to touch down and then after Selby's scrum forced another penalty, full back George Stoker stroked it over to take the lead 14-15. And there was still time for Wilkinson and winger Matt Leetham to break blind to take play deep into Keighley territory where the

pack, once again, asserted their dominance by forcing their way over for Broughton, or maybe Wilkinson, or maybe neither, to touch down for the 14-20 win.

Selby now take on Middlesbrough in a league and Yorkshire Shield double header at home on Saturday – and, while Selby's commitment and durability are not in doubt, coaches and players will be focussing on improving their ball control if they are to have any chance against the promotion favourites.
