Good afternoon and welcome to Sandhill Lane for our re-arranged fixture against Hullensians. I'm sure you are all aware that the previous game, the opening fixture of the season, had to be abandoned at half time due to an injury to the day's referee and that Selby were holding a 12 points to 3 lead at the time. I hope that we are able to get the game to a conclusion and that Selby are able to get themselves into a similar, match-winning position.

A look at the current League table shows that there is not much difference in position between ourselves and Hullensians, the one significant difference being that we have managed to pick up one victory from our 4 completed fixtures whilst Hullensians arrive today still looking to record their first. I am sure that that will give Hullensians all the incentive that they need and that Selby will be in for another testing afternoon today.

Last weekend saw us totally dominate the Scrum against current League leaders Crossleyans, however their excellent defence and incisive counter attacking showed why they are faring so well since their promotion from Yorkshire 2 last season. Amongst the disappointments there were a number of big positives for the Selby side, not least of which was the spirit shown to compete throughout 80 minutes and the fitness which allowed us to score three excellent tries in the final 10 minutes. Hullensians had a difficult away trip all the way over at Rishworthians and went down to an unusually heavy defeat by 46 -14, giving us another reason to regard them as a very dangerous opponent this afternoon.

It is really good to see that we have been able to turn out 4 sides for the last 3 weeks and it was especially gratifying to hear the Wath second team manager remark that the "measure of a really good Club is one that is able to turn out 4 sides regularly". My congratulations and thanks go to Captains, Managers and players involved in all of our lower sides. I understand that all four teams were able to turn out with a healthy number of subs last weekend, which makes the possibility of actually turning out a fifth team again a realistic one. Having received a text midweek from fourth team Skipper Chris Young about my availability I know that it can't be too far away!!

We are of course greatly indebted to all those companies and individuals who kindly sponsor our first XV fixtures and I hope that today's Sponsors thoroughly enjoy their afternoon in the Swan's Nest and the hospitality that we are proud to be able to provide.

Prior to the Middlesbrough game on Saturday 20th October I intend to host a pre match lunch for our Vice Presidents and Honorary Life members and would like to take this opportunity to invite them all again to have a word with me to book their places as the popularity of the event increases year on year. Following on from that we intend to hold a couple of pre match Members' Lunches before Christmas to gauge their popularity. I am sure that details about them and how to book a place on a table will appear in the match day programme and on the Club's Pitchero website very soon.

Finally a gentle reminder to everybody taking part in or spectating this afternoon's game to please show respect to the match officials, players from both sides and other spectators. There is nothing better than a hard fought game of Rugby played out in front of a knowledgeable and friendly crowd and we all have to play our part in ensuring that everybody here this afternoon can go home afterwards having enjoyed some great entertainment, whether a player, flag man, referee, water boy, allickadoo or a member of the paying public. We have a duty to all visitors to Sandhill to ensure that their afternoon is not ruined by the actions of one or two individuals and that everybody adheres to the RFU suggested Code of Conduct, so I would ask that everybody makes sure that they behave in a manner befitting our great game.

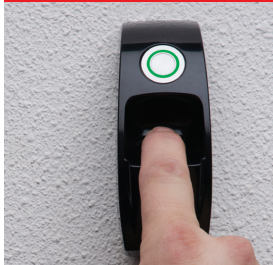

THE LAST TIME WE MET | OPENING MATCH OF THE 2018 SEASON

Selby RUFC 12 v 3 Hullensians RUFC - Match abandoned at half time

Selby's season opening Yorkshire One league fixture fell victim to the referee's pulled hamstring just before half time and with him being unable to continue, and no suitable replacement available, the match was abandoned and will now be replayed on 6 October at Sandhill Lane. However, the opening forty minutes (or nearly fifty given the lengthy treatment the ref received from Selby physio Hayley Brady in a forlorn effort to mend him) gave an intriguing taste of what the Selby faithful may expect in the forthcoming season – and it was a bit of a curate's egg!

On a gloriously sunny but breezy day Selby played with the advantage of the wind and started very strongly in the forwards, demolishing the Hullensians scrum on a couple of occasions early on, but then going on to squander their gain with unforced errors in midfield. However, a great team try soon followed as Ash Parkinson made a great turnover on half way before feeding new hooker Joe Raddings (who has obviously not missed out at feeding time in the family household) for the young but beefy hooker to show a surprising Phil Bennett-esque sidestep and turn off pace to break the gain line and then find a good pass to the ever supporting Danny Wilkinson. A cute kick to the corner followed from Selby's new vice-captain for wingman Ash Dallimore to scoop up and score for a deserved 5-0 lead.

More signals for an encouraging season followed as Selby's defence then held firmly resolute as the Humbersiders tried to muscle their way upfield; and following another turnover, veteran talisman Andy Kehoe belied his indeterminate age to find a gap to stride clear to put Parkinson in for another fine try and a 12-0 lead. So with barely 15 minutes gone the season was looking rosy for Selby - but not for too long! Any Selby supporters present at the corresponding fixture last year will have Hullensians' Lazarus-like resurrection to win from twenty point down seared into their memory as the stuff of nightmares – and events started to turn in their favour again as they stuck to their task manfully and Selby started to plague themselves with a series of errors to allow them back into the match with good field positions. A couple of runs at the Selby line were repulsed desperately before constant pressure earned them a penalty kick to reduce the deficit to 12-3.

For Selby's part, the pack continued to hold the clear upper hand and it was disappointing therefore, particularly with the strong breeze behind them, that Selby never managed to position their dominant pack anywhere near the Hullensians line in the whole of the half - where they would surely have been favourites to go over? In fact, with Selby maybe guilty of overplaying and losing possessions, the ball was actually in the Selby half of the field for the majority of the half, allowing Hullensians to grow in confidence and endeavour.

So, with the game finely poised at half time and a potentially intriguing second half to come, with Hullensians looking resurgent and about to have the benefit of the wind, the game came to a disappointing and sudden halt. Some Swans supporters were convinced Selby were going on to win comfortably, but others thought that they may well have dodged a bullet by not scoring enough with the breeze behind them – but nobody will ever know!

Selby will be looking to get their season underway, again, away at Heath next Saturday. It promises to be a tough fixture and hopefully everyone, including the referee, will manage to make it through the entire game unscathed.

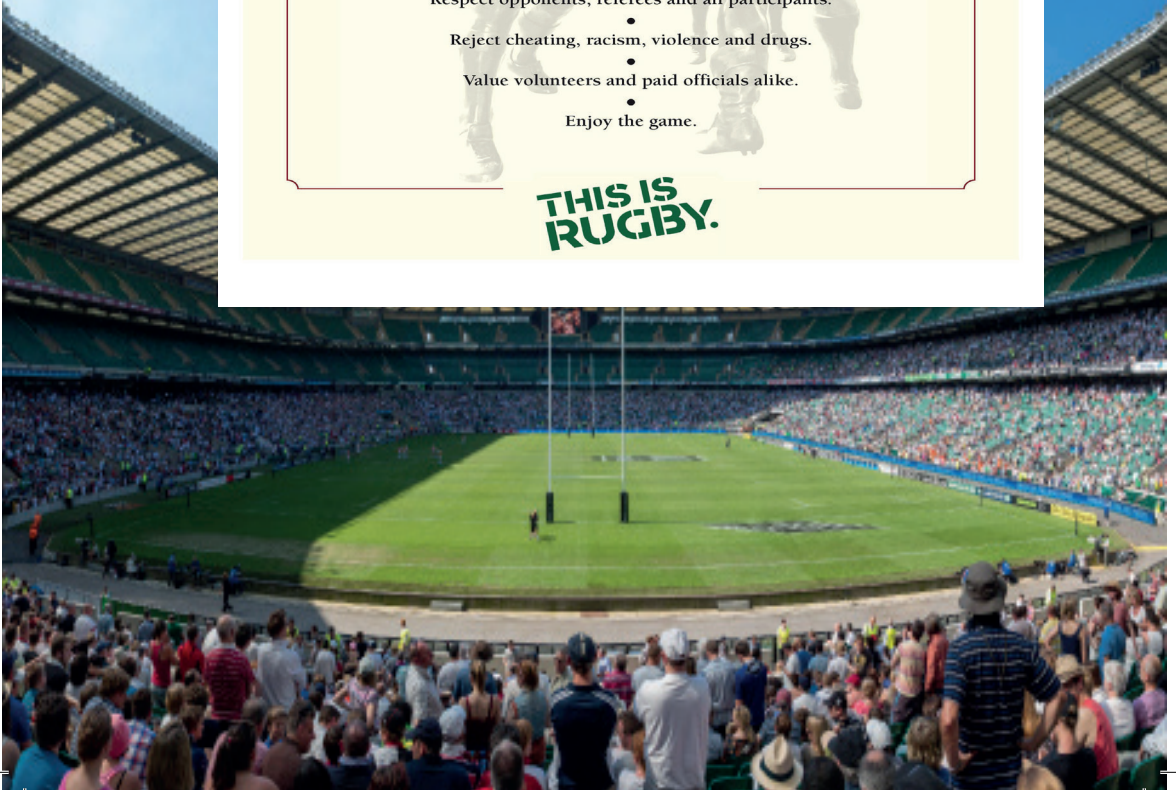

STEVE CRUISE | FROM THE DUG OUT

Well, here we are again, not only is it unusual to have home fixtures in consecutive weeks but replaying an abandoned is pretty much a first for me. I do hope our referee's hamstring stands up to the strains of today's match!!! I heard of our opening day abandonment whilst attending a wedding and by the sounds of it we had made a very positive start and were leading 12-3 at the interval so if I could I would take that again today.

Over the last two weeks I believe we have lost two games, one we should have won and the other we could have, this has resulted in being 9 league points worse off than we deserve. I already mentioned in last weeks notes that we should have walked away from Dinnington with 5 points and not 1 and last week I thought we gave a creditable performance against the league leaders. In summary we were dominant for large parts of the game, had at least a 70/30% territory advantage in the game, but we eventually succumbed to a team that showed us how to capitalise on errors and how to take advantage of a numerical difference when they scored 14 unanswered points when we had a yellow card. We need to learn how to start converting our supremacy into points and hopefully with what we have been doing on the training ground you will see a much more improved performance from a game management perspective.

Still, on the positive side we are improving week on week and we are a much better team than we were at this period last year. I know its early in the season but games like today we have to win if we are to avoid being dragged into a lower half of the table battle.

Playing wise we don't have Alex Webster again this week, although he is back for our trip to Keighley next week, Andy Kehoe is on concussion protocol and we have injury scares to Stephen Clarke, Tom Edwards and Ashley Parkinson so at the time of writing I'm not quite sure of our final squad. Last week I thought Eddie Browns was superb but leaves us to Newcastle University and is only available now when he doesn't have a midweek game. That said Sam Broughton is back in the squad today, Harry Cruise returns from Injury and they will be joined by a couple of new faces in Olly Raynor and Olly Turvey who have both come up through our youth system and enjoyed representative honours. We are also hoping to see the debut of Sam Phipps as well but this all depends on clearance.

Last week's yellow card made me think quite hard about the laws of our game and if we have them quite right. I know what I am about to say is controversial but I feel that giving someone a yellow card for retaliation is a far too easy option for the referee. Let me be clear I am not saying the player should stay on the field far from it I actually agreed with the card, but what I don't get is the initial perpetrator gets away scot free and in our case last week gave the opposition 10 minutes' advantage which won them the game. Its too easy to say the player shouldn't do it, I agree, what I am after is that BOTH players receive a 10-minute cooling off period because at the end of the day our player would not have reacted in the way he did if there wasn't any provocation in the first place. Certain teams play for this week in week out and get away with it. Sure, the referees at level 7 don't have the luxury of touch judges to assist them and they can only give what they see but last week's decision baffled me because the official was right on the spot and saw what happened.

Once again, we have strong 2nd, 3rd and 4th teams out today with 4/5 subs for each team so it won't be too long before we decide to 'cut the cord' and re-join a very select band of clubs in the country who run 5 senior team.

Last year we enjoyed two very narrow defeats at the hands of our opponents today and we struck up a good friendship as we both worked our way out of the relegation zone and I hope that they enjoy their day at Sandhill Lane, before and after the game, but I hope the bit in the middle they don't enjoy quite as much!!

Although Hull's reign as capital of culture has ended here are four reasons to visit Anlaby :

1. It has a rich history...

It is an ancient village that first appeared in the Domesday Book, when it was home to just 19 people (including a priest). It has Moat Hill on the western edge of the village, which is thought to have been built in the 14th century and to have included a moat filled with sturgeon, roach, tiddlers and early prams. Anlaby Hall was built in around 1680 and is reported to have housed a fine collection of pornographic rugs, and while Anlaby House came along in the late 1900s it's main claim to fame was that the stone used in its construction was imported from Bransholme.

2. It takes leisure seriously...

Haltemprice Leisure Centre in Anlaby is the busiest centre of its kind in East Hull, offering all manner of sports and leisure pursuits from darts and dominoes to drafts and ludo to more than one million visitors a year. Plans are afoot to invest £6 million in the centre, bringing other useful services under the same roof, such as a doctors' surgery, sexual health clinics, plastic surgery for all including extensions for men, and perhaps a library. There will also be newly-laid outdoor pitches, a cafe serving 38 different types of bacon sandwich and additional parking.

3. It has good village shops...

Anlaby Road is the main shopping street at the heart of the village. It has seen some setbacks in recent years, with traders going out of business due to the easy access from Bransholme, takings disappearing to Spain, and internet Trolls. It would help to encourage more trade by tidying up the main road into Hull a little and lowering rates, but the council insists the area has enjoyed significant investment through the Cuddle a Councillor programme. In the meantime, more and more people are making good use of Anlaby Retail Park in Springfield Way, where big name chain stores like Marks and Spencer, Next, Asda, Weed'R'Us, and Tinder for Beginners have outlets.

4. It has a thriving community...

You can find local clubs offering all kinds of sport- rugby, football, cricket dog watching etc , and many social activities- Find the Copper, Fish Tampering, Lilo Laying etc etc

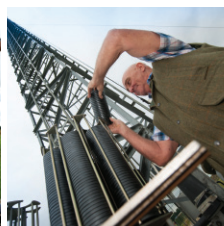

LAST WEEK -V- OLD CROSSLEYANS

Selby RUFC 15 – 27 Old Crossleyans RUFC - Report by Ray Adamson

Despite a herculean effort from Selby's Forwards which saw them totally dominate the current League leaders at the Scrum, Selby were unable to turn their advantage into points until the last 10 minutes of the game by which time the result was already decided. Two short spells, one in each half, when the visitors scored 2 unanswered tries showed what a dangerous side Crossleyans can be with ball in hand and given the opportunity to employ their attacking, offloading skills. With Selby lacking a reliable place kicker, opportunities that may well have gained reward from the kicking tee were repeatedly turned down and the kick to touch or scrum taken instead. Despite having little difficulty securing their own ball in the set piece, Selby found the Crossleyans defence a tough nut to crack and ultimately lacked the creative flair to turn pressure into points.

Having spent the majority of the first half hour in the Crossleyans half Selby had nothing to show for their tremendous effort and within the space of 10 minutes the game swung decisively in the visitors' favour. Firstly a penalty conceded in a promising attacking position allowed Crossleyans to relieve pressure, then a yellow card to centre Liam Hogan forced a re-shuffle in the three quarters and a heavy tackle by stand off Andy Kehoe saw him having to leave the field with concussion. Crossleyans took immediate advantage of the situation and racked up 17 unanswered points in the last 10 minutes of the half when winger Gareth Sweeney opened the scoring from a penalty in front of the posts and, with Selby still trying to work out the most effective combination for their re-structured back-line, Rob Oliver and Billy Hammond took advantage of the miss-matches in the three quarters to run in tries under the posts, both of which Sweeney converted with ease. Anyone arriving at half time and looking only at the statistics of the first half would have had difficulty believing the score line and so it continued into the second half.

Although Crossleyans skilful ball handling and solid defence allowed them to spend an increasing amount of time in the Selby half, the Selby defence were up to the task and whenever a scrum was awarded, the home side dealt with it powerfully and so were able to quickly return to the attack. Having again enjoyed the better of possession and territory for the opening 20 minutes of the second half and turning down kicks at goal, Selby were dealt a couple of hammer blows as the game moved into the final quarter as two sweeping attacks by Crossleyans saw them add a further 2 tries in the space of a couple of minutes, the first scored by Joe McFarlane and then quickly added to as Billy Hammond crossed for his second. Although neither conversion was successful, the game was won and lost at 27-nil in favour of the visitors.

It is great testament to the Selby players' spirit and fitness that they were able to strike back so decisively in the final 10 minutes and at least give a mark of respectability to the score-line and gain reward for the unstinting work of the forwards. On 70 minutes a penalty kick to the corner saw Selby with the chance to attack from a 5 metre line out and following numerous drives at the line Second Row Stephen Clark showed excellent footwork as he took advantage of the smallest of gaps on the blind side to step and force his way over just a few metres in from touch. When Crossleyans were penalised from the kick off, quick thinking from Scrum Half Danny Wilkinson saw Selby return to within 5 metres of the Crossleyans line and set up the position from which Winger Ashton Dallimore was able to add to his tally of first team tries. As the game moved towards the final whistle Selby's other winger, Matthew Leetham, was able to show off his skills to cross for the final score of the game. A poor kick out of defence by the Crossleyans scrum half landed between the 22 and ten metre line and the ball was quickly moved into open space where Leetham was given the chance to run at his opposite number one on one. For the rugby purists it was a classic winger's try as Leetham first stood his man up and then showed great acceleration to go round the outside of the final defender to dive in at the corner.

No doubt Selby will reflect on the chances missed in this latest League fixture but will also take great heart from a performance which put the League leaders under such pressure for long spells of the game and should promise much for the rest of this season's Yorkshire 1 campaign.
