

Selby RUFC 35 - 17 Old Crossleyans RUFC - Report by Stephen Ward

This was an excellent all round display, and the first bonus point win of the season, by a Selby side who appear to have turned the corner. With 4 wins and 4 losses from their last 8 games, and 2 of those losses by the narrowest of margins, the hope is that they can now pull away from the relegation places in Yorkshire 1.

Selby suffered a setback as early as the first minute when second row forward, Joe Romaniw has to leave the field with, what appeared to be, a painful shoulder injury and was replaced by substitute prop forward Tom Bell. Only a minute later, Selby fell behind when they were penalised for standing up in the scrum. Crossleyans winger, Ryan Sweeney, who had almost beaten Selby single handedly, scoring 21 points in Selby's 31 points to 10 defeat at Halifax earlier in the season, slotted the penalty for an early 3 points to nil lead. However, Selby soon gained control and penalties after 7 and 12 minutes, the first for offside and the second for 'going over the top'. were successfully converted by fly half Scott Hunt to put the hosts 6 points to 3 in front. Selby continued to dominate, with Crossleyans incurring the wrath of the referee and conceding penalty after penalty. Eventually after 21 minutes, constant pressure from the Selby forwards resulted in the referee awarding a penalty try to Selby and an easy conversion for Hunt for a 13 points to 3 lead. More technical errors by Crossleyans saw ex Selby player and Crossleyans number 8. Sam Broughton, sent to the bin on 26 minutes. Selby capitalised only 2 minutes later after a catch and drive to the line resulted in a try for prop forward Greg Nagle after excellent work by flanker Patrick Rowntree – no conversion from Hunt but Selby seemed to have a comfortable lead at 18 points to 3. Crossleyans went down to 13 men after 32 minutes when fly half Zane Sanders was also vellow carded. With both Broughton and Sanders back on before the break. Selby failed to profit further with their superior numbers and the only other notable action of the half was a magnificent steal and break from prop forward Duncan Hardy who showed a remarkable turn of speed but the move came to nothing with Selby having an 18 points to 3 advantage at the break.


Charlie Cicero replaced Jonathan Booth at the start of the second half with Selby continuing to pressurise their opponents and having the best possible start to the half when immense forward pressure saw prop forward Duncan Hardy driven over the line for an unconverted try and a 23 points to 3 lead after 45 minutes. Crossleyans continued to battle hard and were rewarded on 49 minutes after a tap penalty on the Selby 15 metre line saw the Crossleyans forwards set up a driving maul resulting in a try for flanker Cameron Brannan - Sweeney kicked an excellent conversion to reduce Crossleyans arrears to 10 points to 23. Selby roared back and only 3 minutes later after a successful scrum on the Crossleyans 22 metre line, excellent handling and running lines saw full back Ben Lunt put winger Ashton Dallimore over for the bonus point try near the posts - Scott's conversion gave Selby a 30 points to 10 lead. Still, Selby were not finished, increasing their lead after 58 minutes when some great inter-passing resulted in an unconverted try for full back Ben Lunt and 35 points to 10 lead - with Matthew Leetham replacing Lunt, things were to go slightly pear shaped for Selby at this stage of the game with flanker James Blaymire yellow carded after 63 minutes and Crossleyans taking full advantage shortly afterwards with a try created by their forwards for centre Chris Seymour, once again expertly converted by Sweeney, reducing Crossleyans deficit to 17 points to 35. With Booth back on for Stephen Clark and Lunt replacing Dallimore a fracas on 74 minutes resulted in yellow cards for Selby's Tom Bell and a second yellow for Crossleyans fly half Zane Sanders - Blaymire was back on after 79 minutes having served a 16 minute yellow card penalty. Full time arrived with Selby deserved winners by 35 points to 17.

Pity other results didn't go our way and a stiff test awaits us at North Ribblesdale next Saturday – although we beat them at Sandhill Lane they are a different proposition at home.







VIEW FROM THE BALCONY | REG PHILLIPS

Socialising and looking after the waifs and strays of the Halifax district has long been part of the stated aim of many of the area's local schools and sports clubs throughout the past hundred and fifty or more years.

Crossley and Porters School was originally founded as an orphanage, public house, and marriage rehabilitation unit, unlikely allies but having many similar interests.

The original founders were Spike Crossley and Ann Griely who were both orphans, liked a drink and a fight on a Saturday night and would spend Sunday after two o clock counselling each other.

The original building was erected upon Skircoat Moor, near Halifax in June 1858, and was adapted to receive about 450 children, 44 firkins of ale and assorted weaponry for providing gentle banter.

On opening the Institution, however, there were a limited number of inmates. These numbers soon increased due to the failure of the marriage guidance and the wrong weapons falling into the wrong hands.

The Rules which were drawn up included the following:

- (1) Object: To lodge, board, clothe, educate, apprentice, or otherwise place out in life, orphan children of both sexes, between the ages of two and ten years, and, under special circumstances, up to twelve years of age. The time of remaining in the Orphanage not to exceed fifteen years of age for boys, and seventeen years for girls. A minimum of six sessions of Rugby to be undertaken per week. This shall also apply to the boys
- (2) Qualifications: The children admitted upon the foundation of this Institution must be such as have been deprived by death of both parents, or of their fathers, and whose mothers, or other surviving relatives, are unable to provide means of subsistence and education. In addition they shall know the difference between Porter and Stout and Pale Ale and Lager.
- (3) Disqualification: No child shall be admitted who is blind, deaf, dumb, helplessly lame, or in any other respect seriously crippled, paralysed, or suffering from any infectious, contagious or incurable disease, and no child who has not been born in wedlock, or has been a resident pauper in a workhouse. Or shows a predilection for lemonade over their beer.
- (4) Preference: A preference shall be given to the following cases, but only when all other circumstances shall be equally urgent: 1. To orphans born in the County of York. 2. To children who have lost both father and mother. 3. To the orphans of parents who are in full communion with Nonconformist churches, or regular communicants with the Church of England. 4. To orphans who are addicted to Communion wine.

Despite all the rules and restrictions the school prospered and over many years has produced a string of fine rugby players, gave birth to The Old Crossleyans Association and to todays' visiting club.

Dinnington RUFC 20 v 19 Selby RUFC - Report by Ian Marlow

Selby failed to build on last week's home victory going down by a single point away at Dinnington; and while they will have some comfort at gaining a losing bonus point, they will be very disappointed that they did not register the full five points for a win. And, despite having some mitigating excuses (see later), they will really only have themselves to blame for that

Dinnington are yet another hefty bunch, not just in the pack but in the backs too, and it took a while to realise that the two props idling about in the centres weren't props at all, but actually were their centres! So it was no surprise that they started as they meant to go on, playing a very simple game of driving it in ad infinitum and things looked ominous as they camped on Selby's line early on. However, Selby's defence this season is a much meaner creature than of late and some crunching tackles from the pack, with skipper Charlie Cicero leading the way, repulsed the heavy mob before the first of many thumping runs from No8 Liam Hogan cleared the lines completely.

Selby then showed a little more finesse in attack as both backs and forwards found gaps wide out and up the middle. However, despite Selby's superior cutting edge, their inability to deliver the coup de grace became apparent as great breaks by centre Alex Webster and prop Duncan Hardy went begging as the Swans failed to capitalise on them. Similarly, a couple of surging bursts from flanker Tom Edwards split the Dinnington defence with ease, leading to another gilt edged chance wide out - but the final pass was a shocker and the chance was gone. Finally, to the relief of the travelling Selbyites, another bruising run from Hogan set Webster away again to link up with new boy Andy Gorman and George Stoker, before winger Ash Dallimore was released to race away to score a superb team try for a 0-5 lead

It was hoped that Selby would continue in the same vein but, unfortunately, their 'error compounded by penalty' propensity then returned allowing Dinnington an easy passage to the Selby line, where forward pressure finally paid off as they crossed for a levelling score. Things then turned farcical as a chance for Selby to retake the lead with a penalty of their own was stymied by the lack of a kicking tee, and then the half was up.

With the advantage of the slope and breeze in the second half, not to mention Dinnington's relative lack of mobility, it might have seemed a good idea for Selby to kick deep to maximise their apparently superior attack where it mattered most? In fact, Selby barely got out of their own halve at all as a series of unforced errors gifted Dinnington good field positions; and they then induced that familiar Selby sinking feeling that this was not to be a Swans day when, following yet another Selby fumble, a sparkling back move of their own sent the winger in for a 10-5 lead after 50 minutes.

Back came Selby though as a Hogan turnover was deftly transferred to Webster who again showed what could have been as he sliced open the Dinnington backline to race in from half way to regain the lead 10-12. Dinnington then couldn't believe their luck as Selby again, despite numerous opportunities, failed to clear their lines from the kick off and after yet another unforced fumble in their own 22, Dinnington eventually took advantage of some uncharacteristic, very flimsy tackling to cross again for a 17-12 lead. Then back came Selby again as Hogan capped a fantastic man of the match display by simply shrugging off several would be tacklers to power over from distance to regain the lead, 17-19. But, yet again, another Selby unforced error, followed by the inevitable penalty, gifted Dinnington the lead again at 20-19.

With only two minutes remaining Selby's chance looked to have gone but they somehow seemed to have won it at the death as, following a miscued Webster penalty attempt, Dinnington produced what appeared to be their own terminal error by fumbling the ball right on their own line - allowing Selby's Edwards to simply pick it up and dot it down for what those in the vicinity considered would be the simplest of match winning tries. Alas though, Mr Referee wasn't in the same post code and was "unsighted", so awarded Selby only the knock on, which he did see! Selby still had chances to kill the game off but firstly, despite having the dominant scrum, they butchered the five yard scrum chance before unbelievably another last kick Selby penalty chance (maybe awarded to try to amend a previous decision?) slid wide to bring the comedy of errors to a close.

Selby now have a tough fixture at home on Saturday against the new league leaders Old Crossleyans, who demolished previous favourites Middlesbrough at the weekend, and they will need to take their chances better and cut down on the error count if they are to take anything from the match.
