Formed in 1959 as Woolwich Town, the club initially competed in the London Metropolitan Sunday League, winning the Senior Section Championship in 1965/66, 1970/71 and 1974/75.

The club briefly changed their name to Woolwich Heathway but reverted back within a year and in 1991 the club made the switch to Saturday football when they joined the London Spartan League Division Two. They also moved from Woolwich Barracks Stadium to share with Greenwich Borough FC.

Despite finishing 9th the club went up to Division One as a result of a re-structure in 1992/93. In 1994/5 the Dockers finished as runners-up in the London Intermediate Cup and London Spartan League Intermediate Cup.

The summer of 1995 saw the club attain senior status and promotion to the London Spartan League Premier Division. In October of 1995 the club moved from Greenwich to Erith Stadium.

In March 1996 the club were given permission to cross the pyramid and tendered their resignation to the Spartan League to join the Kent League for 1996/7.

They also played in the FA Vase for the first time, losing 4-0 at home to Lewes in the first qualifying round.

From June 1997 the club reflected their new location by changing name to Erith Town and made their bow in the FA Cup, losing 3-0 to Harlow Town in the 1997/8 season.

The following season the Dockers moved back to Greenwich Borough for a year while extensive building work took place at the Stadium.

The return to Erith in 1999/2000 saw them attain seventh place in the League and a place in the London Senior Cup Final under manager Micky Watts.

John Adams took over from Watts in 2002/3 and over the next few years the club had several changes of manager before Mark Tompkins took the reins following a poor start to 2006/7.

'Tommo' guided the club to silverware lifting the Kent League Cup with a 1-0 win over favourites Hythe Town at Folkestone Invicta.

Tompkins resigned on the eve of 2008/9 and his place was taken by Steve O'Boyle who took the team back to the League Cup Final where they lost 3-1 on penalties to Croydon following a 1-1 draw.

O'Boyle resigned in October of 2010 and was replaced by his assistant Tony Russell. He brought success as the club lifted the Kent Senior Trophy for the first time with a 3-1 win over Tunbridge Wells in the Final .

After Russell moved to neighbours VCD Athletic at the end of October 2012, James Collins and the returning Tompkins had spells in charge.

The club entered a groundshare arrangement at Cray Valley Football Club at the start of 2013-14 where they recorded a second successive third place in the League, with their best ever League record.

A troubled 2014-15 season saw both Simon Austin and Ennio Gonnella manage the club prior to appointment of joint managers Martin and Joe Ford who steered the club to safety on the last day of the season.

An improved finish of thirteenth came in 2015-16 with the club announcing a return to the Borough of Bexley with a two season groundshare agreement at VCD Athletic's Oakwood ground starting in 2016-17

THE BEST COMPETITION IN THE WORLD



FA Cup Facts

The FA Cup is the oldest football competition in the world at 148 years, the first games were played in November 1871, with the first FA Cup final being played between The Wanderers and The Royal Engineers at the Kennington Oval in London, now more famous for being a County cricket ground. The Wanderers winning 1-0.

43 different teams have won the FA Cup, the most successful of which (as of 2019) is Arsenal who have won 13.

14 teams have got to the final only to lose, Leicester City have competed in 4 finals, but have lost them all.

The competition is open to teams from levels 1-10 (level 1 being the Premier League), Chichester City being in the Isthmian division one south east are level 8 and start in the extra preliminary round.

To get to the first round proper, Chichester City would have to win six rounds in the qualifying section for a chance to play Football League opposition, and would also become £60,140 richer.

Our South coast neighbours Portsmouth are the longest holders of the cup, having beaten Wolves 4-1 at Wembley Stadium in April 1939.

By September the Second World War had started and the competition was suspended for 7 years. Because Portsmouth was a strategic naval base, the cup was looked after safely at the Bird In Hand public house in the Hampshire village of Lovedean for the duration of the war.

They have been in a total of 5 finals 1929, 1934, 1939, 2008, 2010, and 7 semi finals 1929, 1934, 1939, 1949, 1992, 2008, 2010. Portsmouth are one of only four teams to win a final at both Wembley Stadiums.

There have been 5 FA Cup trophies made, the first known as "little tin idol" was stolen in 1895 and never recovered, an exact replica was made and was used until 1910. Due to copyright issues, the FA decided to change the design and the new larger cup that we know today was used until 1992.

This was replaced by an exact replica, but as the cup was handled more, it developed more wear and tear and was replaced in 2014 by a third replica, this time made heavier to withstand more handling.

CHICHESTER CITY REACH THE FIRST ROUND

On November 5 2019, it will be 59 years to the day that Chichester City reached the FA Cup 1st round proper for the first and only time in their history. They were drawn against Football League Division 3 side Bristol City, who at the time were lying 16th in the table.

Chichester City by contrast were 6th in the Sussex County League several leagues below Bristol, who were professional while Chi were Amateurs with most players having day jobs.

Having been drawn at home, Chichester conceded home advantage due to the lack of ground capacity and played the game at Ashton Gate in front of a crowd of 12,500. Chichester's share of the gate receipts were £700, a considerable amount of money in 1960 and would be put to good use making ground improvements at Oaklands Park. An added bonus from reaching the first round was that for the 1961/62 season they received a bye for the first 3 qualifying rounds going straight to the fourth qualifying round.

The game itself was a bruising 11-0 defeat, with a 5 goal haul for former Portsmouth centre forward John Atyeo, it was not surprising really when you consider what the score would be if Chichester's title winning side of last season played League 1 side Portsmouth.

In the second half they started to move quicker and their tackling improved and the experience in fact made them a better side on their way to retaining the Sussex County league title, that they had won for the first time the year before.

Bristol City eventually lost in the 4th round 5-1 at Leicester City.

FIRST ROUND MATCH REPORT

Bristol City v Chichester City FA Cup 1st Round Saturday 5 November 1960.

Chichester City received a soccer lesson and an 11-0 thrashing at the hands of third division Bristol City on Saturday, but the people of Chichester can be proud of their team.

They were 8-0 down at half time, rushed off their feet by the Bristol full-time professionals. In the second half they came back to try even harder, and hold their opponents to only three goals when the crowd where expecting something like 20.

Chichester were beaten in the first ten minutes. They were mesmerized by the skill of the Bristol forwards, and were unable to start up any attacks of their own.

Several brilliant saves by Peter Thomas began what was to be a memorable match for him. Never has he played so well, and never has he let in so many goals, while playing for Chichester.

Bristol's barrage was staved off for the first few minutes, thanks mainly to Thomas, who made particularly fine save from the head of former England forward John Atyeo. The home side attacking was so intense it had to bring a goal. From a fantastic angle on the left wing inside-left Adrian Williams gave Bristol the lead.

The tenth minute saw the writing on the wall for Chichester. Thomas flung himself across to stop a shot from Adrian Williams, but out-side right Tait was there to score from close range.

Despite the obvious disappointment at being two goals down in such a short space of time, Chichester tried to settle down and gradually the defence tacked more crisply and the forwards got nearer the Bristol goal

Gilfillan should have scored after 29 minutes. He had the chance of a shot from the edge of the penalty area, but was too slow in taking the opportunity, Alan Williams came across to clear. Instead of scoring themselves, Chichester conceded a further goal, Derek Bailey putting through his own goal when Thomas had it covered.

Bad covering resulted in Bristol's fourth goal. Bailey went to challenge Bobby Williams, who slipped the ball to Atyeo, who's task was an easy one.

The fifth was lucky for Bristol. Atyeo flicked hopefully at a centre from the left, and the ball sailed over the helpless Thomas into the net.

Then came a glaring miss from Harris, who otherwise had a good game. Gilfillan jiggled his way through the Bristol defence, and set up a glorious chance for the outside-left, but a rush of blood to the head and the ball sailed wide.

Another unlucky break streak for Chichester saw a sixth goal. Again Thomas had the shot covered, but the ball struck his thigh and curled into the net. A 15 yard drive from Adrian Williams made it seven, and then Bobby Williams dribbled around Thomas for the eighth.

Gilfillan miraculously got his foot to a low cross from Harris, and the ball scewed wide. He then smartly anticipated a back pass, but was unlucky to have Cook smother the shot. But then Bristol went into a nine goal lead, outside-left Derrick who had a tough time against young Tony Cunningham centred and Adrian Williams tapped the ball in.

No one could be faulted for the tenth. A terrific shot into the corner of the net from John Atyeo surprised even his colleagues. Atyeo then crowned an excellent performance, when he cheekily rounded Thomas to notch his fifth goal and Bristols 11th.

At the final whistle the crowd stood and clapped the gallant amateurs, and no one cheered more than the 400 Chichester supporters who had every reason to be proud of their side.

Club Chairman Jack Duffin had this to say about his team: "We are just as proud of them now as we were when we started". Captain Roy Gilfillan admitted he was disappointed at such a heavy defeat "We wanted just one goal, and I think the crowd wanted it just as much as we did" he said.

CHICHESTER — Oldest club in Sussex

WE are indeed fortunate to be able to stage today's first round F.A. Cup match with the leading Sussex amateur club, Chichester City, at Ashton Gate today, and we wish the Sussex club well, and hope that the game will receive good support.

Drawn at home, Chichester were compelled through lack of accommodation to request that the game be switched to Bristol.

Founded in 1881, Chichester are the oldest amateur club in Sussex, and for 75 years played at Priory Park. Four years ago, owing to a Council ruling, the club had to leave and leased a new ground at Oaklands Park.

Facilities there are gradually improving, but Chichester just could not accommodate all the people who would have wanted to see to-day's game, so it was with reluctance that

that the decision to play here, in Bristol, was made.

Having surrendered the right to play before their own supporters, with its obvious advantages, Chichester hope for a good gate today, for it will help them to go ahead with their plans for improving their new ground, which they aim to make one of the best amateur enclosures in the county.

Chichester has withstood many blandishments to turn semi-professional, and has retained its amateur status from its formation. They have always been noted for a

father and son tradition, and at one time had five sons of former players in their side.

Several players have joined professional clubs, including Jesse Willard, the former Brighton captain and Crystal Palace player, who is still a coach with the Palace.

Liverpool's Alan Arnell was a former Chichester player, and David Joyce joined Portsmouth two seasons ago.

Chichester have won most of the major honours in Sussex football and were easy County League champions last season. Several years ago the club decided to build their teams with local youths, concentrating on lads leaving Boys' Clubs.

Seven of the present side were obtained in this way, and so far this season both the first and second teams are unbeaten in League and Cup matches.

Their outstanding performance this season is the defeat of Dorchester Town in the last round of the F.A. Cup by four goals to one at Chichester. Inside-right Nigel Hillier announced his engagement before the match and celebrated by scoring a hat-trick.

The club's veteran, and only imported player is a Scot, Roy Gilfillan, son of Jock Gilfillan, the old Portsmouth goalkeeper. Roy is a permit player and is their coach.

He played as a professional in the Hampshire League for Newport (Isle of Wight) for many years.

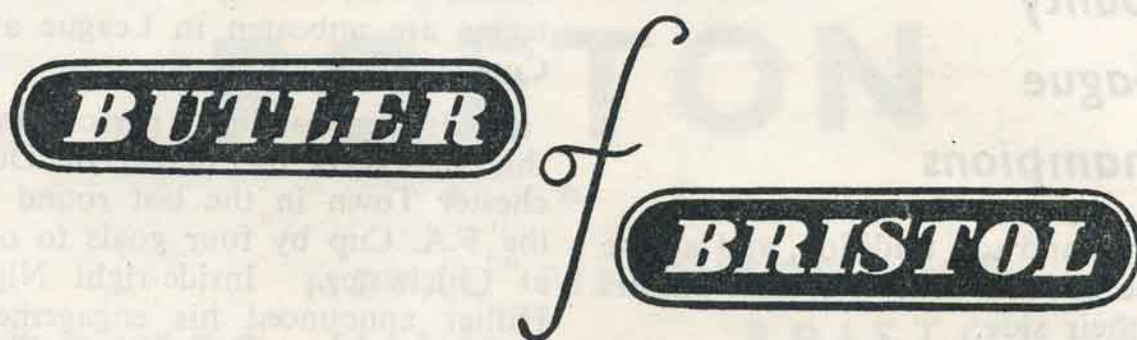

Peter Thomas, goalkeeper, 24, a works study engineer in electronics. Born in Bognor he played for Sussex Boys Clubs and joined City in 1956. Recognised as one of the best amateur goalkeepers in the South.

Tony Cunningham, right-back, 20, another Bognor Boys' Club player, signed in 1957. He is a builder's merchants clerk.

Freddy Knotts, 21, a motor mechanic from East Wittering. Signed in 1956 from the now defunct Chichester United. Formerly a left-half, he is one of the best backs in Sussex.

John Rumsey, right-half, 24, local boys' club player, signed in 1954. A dairy produce salesman he is a well-built player and hard tackler.

Derek Bailey, centre-half, 25, a woodworking machinist from Bognor. Former boys' club player, who joined City from Bognor Town in 1955, and was a centre-forward for three seasons. A burly player, he has plenty of speed.

David Aburrow, left-half, 21, a local boys' club product, signed in 1955. He is at present on National Service and stationed at Chatham. Tall and well built, David is a plumber by trade.

David Green, outside-right, 27, comes from Midhurst, and was signed from that club in 1957, having previously played for Horsham in the Corinthian League. A painter and decorator he is also a good cricketer with several centuries to his credit. Next to Gilfillan, he is the oldest player in the side.

Nigel Hillier, 25, local boys' club product, and son of an old Chichester player. Joined the club seven

years ago and played in the first team at an early age. Nigel has captained Sussex for two seasons, and led the Army side when stationed in Malaya. He is the club's and the County's leading scorer, a good cricketer and useful goalkeeper. Nigel is a constructional engineer.

Roy Gilfillan, centre forward, 33 was born in Edinburgh, and is the son of Jock Gilfillan, the old Portsmouth goalkeeper. Micky Blythman, inside-left, 26, a local boy who joined the club in 1954 with Allan Arnell who later went to Liverpool. He has also played for Crawley in the Metropolitan League. He is the best ball-player in the side.

Peter Harris, 19, was born in Selsey, and is the youngest player in the side. He has played a leading part in Chichester's run of success in the Cup this season, and can play on either wing. League clubs are all ready on the trail of this player. Peter is a printer by trade.

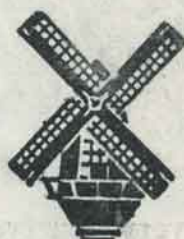

2019/20 FA Cup Extra preliminary

A Numbers Game

Half of the 736 clubs who will participate in the 2019-20 FA Cup will begin their campaigns on the second weekend of August in the Extra Preliminary Round.

This means twice as many clubs than the total number of Football League and Premier League sides will see their FA Cup dreams dashed before most people have returned from their summer holidays.

The Extra Preliminary Round is made up of 19 clubs from Step Four in the non-league pyramid, 277 Step Five club, and 72 teams who currently compete at Step Six, also known as Level Ten (Premier League is Level One) in the overall pyramid.

Success and Failure

Amongst their number are two clubs, **Northwich Victoria** and **Chatham Town**, who both reached the last eight of the competition way back in the nineteenth century. They are two of fifty-seven clubs in this year's Extra Preliminary Round who have tasted 'proper' round FA Cup football in the past. The most recent example being current Hellenic Premier League side **Westfields** who made the First Round just three years ago after starting at this same Extra Preliminary Round stage.

At the opposite end of the spectrum are those clubs who've yet to win an FA Cup match. Twenty-five clubs can justify having that record as they are making their debuts in the competition, but 15 other clubs have actually participated in the FA Cup before yet have failed to win a Cup game so far.

Sunderland Ryhope Colliery Welfare have had four FA Cup campaigns without a win since Ryhope Colliery Welfare and Sporting Club Vaux came together in 1988, but club members will point to the First Round 'proper' appearance of the club formed in 1892 as evidence that Cup victories have been achieved in the past.

United Counties League Division One side **Wellingborough Whitworth**, however, have no such contested history to fall back on, and will be participating in the FA Cup for the fifth time this season looking to secure their first victory.

As a quirky aside **Sunderland Ryhope Colliery Welfare** is the only club competing in this year's FA Cup whose name contains all the letters of the words 'FA Cup'. They have also been drawn against fellow Northern League Division One local rivals **Sunderland Ryhope Community Association** for the second successive season, a tie where there are a record 67 letters in the two collective names.

The shortest combined names of clubs facing each other in the Extra Preliminary this season is thirteen, the clash between Western League Premier Division sides, **Street** and **Odd Down**.

Starting Out

All 25 FA Cup debutantes have been kept apart in the Extra Preliminary Round draws and some have tougher ties on paper than others.

Bradford based side **Campion** have been drawn away from home against **City of Liverpool**, a recently promoted Step Four club who have never failed to win their Extra Preliminary Round ties in the past, albeit they are only competing in the FA Cup for the third time.

Staffordshire side **Stone Old Alleynians** have been drawn to travel to **Worcester City**, a club with 102 FA Cup campaigns under their belt, including within their history a trip to the Fourth Round 'Proper' after a famous victory over Liverpool in 1959.

The debut club with arguably the most difficult Extra Preliminary Round tie is Leicestershire based side **Melton Town**. They've been drawn to travel to **Workshop Town**, a club competing in the FA Cup for the 112th time and one which has faced and beaten five other clubs playing in their first FA Cup match. The glimmer of hope for Melton is that their more seasoned opponents have exited the FA Cup in the Extra Preliminary Round three times in the last five seasons.

One of the twenty-five debut clubs is **Coggeshall United**. For 137 seasons the small Essex town of Coggeshall had never had a club compete in the FA Cup, but the Weavers now make it two clubs from the town in the last two seasons following the debut of **Coggeshall Town** last year. The Seed Growers were the last debut club standing last season. Can the Weavers emulate that feat?

Like Coggeshall United, **Ilkeston Town** were formed in 2017, but unlike the Essex based side's home town, the town of Ilkeston has been represented many times in the past in the FA Cup. In fact the Robins will be the third 'Ilkeston Town' to play in the competition. Both previous 'Ilkeston Town' clubs won their debut FA Cup matches, as did two clubs who competed under the name 'Ilkeston'. So can the current Derbyshire club make it five debut wins out of five for the town of Ilkeston at **Loughborough University**?

Two clubs making their FA Cup debuts this season were actually formed in the nineteenth century, although neither has had to wait the 140 years after formation that the aforementioned **Coggeshall Town** had to do so before making their FA Cup bow.

Kent based **Sutton Athletic** were formed in 1898 so have waited just a mere 121 years to participate in this famous old competition! However, formed 10 years prior to that is **Norwich CBS**, formed originally as the works team of Norwich Union Insurance. They've had a couple of name and location changes in the intervening 131 years (CBS = County Building Services) and now compete in the Eastern Counties League Division One North.

Same Old, Same Old

Obviously those sides drawn against debut clubs will be facing new opponents in the FA Cup. However, many clubs (fans) at this stage of the competition often bemoan the fact that they face familiar foe every season, either because they are members of the same league, or because they get drawn against each other time and time again.

There is some sympathy for the former reason, but there are two things to consider. Firstly, just about a quarter of clubs in the Extra Preliminary Round will face opponents who they will meet twice in their League campaigns, which isn't that many. Secondly, when the third round draw is made, Premier League and Championship sides are far, far more likely to be drawn against opponents from the same division.

There is a myth surrounding being drawn against the same opponents every season in the FA Cup. At the extremities of the country this is more likely to happen, to North-east and South-west clubs, but even so, out of 184 Extra Preliminary Round ties this season, just 19 pit together two teams who have met in the competition before. And the most frequently meeting two sides have done so just three times in the past.

Plymouth Parkway have a two-to-one head-to-head victory ratio over their opponents **Buckland Athletic** in their past FA Cup encounters, but for two other three-time past meetings, the history is decidedly in favour of one side over the other.

Northern Counties East League Premier Division side **Garforth Town** will be hoping to win their first FA Cup encounter against Northern League Division One side **Shildon** at the fourth attempt, but history shows that Northern League clubs tend to win more often than not against NECL clubs in the competition.

Similarly, **Pagham** of the Southern Combination Football League Premier Division will try at the fourth attempt to beat fellow Step Five side **Tunbridge Wells** who compete in the Southern Counties East League Premier Division.

Records to Protect

Several clubs appearing in this year's Extra Preliminary Round have never actually been eliminated from the competition as early as this round. Most of them have only had two or three campaigns, but a few have competed in the FA Cup many times before.

Bishop's Cleeve are competing in the FA Cup for the 16th time, and **Steyning Town Community** for the 21st time. It'll be the 40th campaign for **Fleet Town**. **Burscough** have had 72 previous FA Cup campaigns, whilst **Kendal Town** are participating in the FA Cup for the 89th time. And not one Extra Preliminary Round exit amongst them.

Rugby Town will be taking part for the 44th time and will travel to **Sporting Khalsa** making their seventh venture into the competition. Neither of these two sides, either, has tasted defeat at this stage of the competition before, so one of them will suffer an unpalatable new sensation this season.

What about the Minnows?

Seven Extra Preliminary Round ties involve two clubs who both are members of Step Six Leagues. The winners of the **Hackney Wick** versus **Framlingham Town** all-Step Six tie will at least equal their best FA Cup run to the Preliminary Round.

Other Step Six sides have not been so fortunate in the draw and will pit themselves against clubs from two levels above them in the non-league pyramid, and away from home. But which of **City of Liverpool** (4) vs **Campion** (6), **Worksop Town** (4) vs **Melton Town** (6) or **Willand Rovers** (4) vs **AFC St Austell** (6) is likely to result in an FA Cup 'Cupset'?

It All Kicks-off

The 184 Extra Preliminary Round ties take place over the second weekend of August with the majority of games occurring on the Saturday. However, there are matches scheduled on the Friday and the Sunday, too, with **Skelmersdale United** vs **Penistone Church** (at Prescott Cables) and **Bexhill United** vs **Eastbourne Town** (at the Saffrons) two of the Friday night games.

Will any of these 368 clubs still be going by the time EFL clubs join the competition in November?
