

Keenen Meakin-Richards – First Team Manager Keenen stepped up to the position of first team manager from the Youth Academy following the departure of Andy Morrell. Having previously played for Hednesford Town, Keenen has had an extensive playing career turning out for Hinckley United, Halesowen Town, Bromsgrove Rovers, Chasetown, Highgate United, Walsall Wood and Sporting Khalsa amongst others.

Graham Deakin – Assistant Manager 'Deaks' began his career with Walsall playing a handful of first team games under Paul Merson before moving on to Tamworth. He had a successful non-league career with spells at Halesowen Town, Redditch and Bromsgrove before he hung up his boots to become 1st team manager at Romulus, later stepping down and becoming the Academy manager for 4 years.

Jemiah Richards – First Team Coach Jemiah began his career with Stafford Rangers playing national conference football. He continued his non-league career with spells at Worcester City, Halesowen Town, Redditch, Bromsgrove Rovers and Walsall Wood. Jemiah is a qualified sports therapist and used these skills as a physio at Walsall Wood before become coach at the wood, moving onto coach at Alvechurch. Before coming to Hednesford he was first team coach at Racing Club Warwick.

Richard Mills – Goalkeeper Coach Millsy played at Stafford Rangers as a young man. He then decided to focus on his coaching and teaching. Millsy has been coaching at Birmingham city for a number of years, alongside working as a tutor and goalkeeping coach at Romulus Academy.

Oliver Basey - Goalkeeper Current Birmingham City FC U21 goalkeeper returning for a second spell with the Pitmen in March 2022 after a successful month loan at the end of 2021. Oliver had a schoolboy/Academy career with Sunderland FC before joining Blues.

Joe O'Shaughnessy – Goalkeeper Current Wolverhampton Wanderers FC U21 goalkeeper, joined the Pitmen on Ioan in January 2022. Joe had a schoolboy/academy career with Burnley and Wrexham before joining The Wolves on a professional contract.

Bradley Clarkson - Goalkeeper Promising young shotstopper who joined the Pitmen from Darlaston Town (1874) FC having played senior football previously with Wolverhampton Casuals FC. Brad is also well known to Graham Deakin having been with Romulus FC Academy.

Wes Atkinson - Defender Wes is an example to every player having worked his way back after more than two years of career threatening injuries. The former West Bromwich Albion and Notts County full back also played at Boston United before his injury nightmare began. Now fit and picking up where he left off he has proven himself to be a first class, dependable right back for the Pitmen.

Carter Lycett – Defender Carter is an England Schoolboy International, where he was made captain and is an exciting young prospect who really showed his impact in the first team last season. This year will be a chance for Carter to demonstrate his talent over a full season.

Tom Armitage - Defender After a few months of trying to sign Tom after his release from Burton Albion FC, KMR finally got his man in November 2021 when he was transferred from Nuneaton Borough FC. Tom is an attacking left back with tremendous energy and work rate and is definitely another young player with huge potential.

Lewis Ludford-Ison - Defender Lewis is a dominating defender with great pedigree. Ison who turns 24 next month, began his career with Coventry United where his impressive performances earned him a move to football league side Bristol Rovers. In 2019 after 18 months at the Memorial Stadium Ison moved back to Coventry United where he picked up where he left off with some impressive displays prior to the lockdown in December that caught the eye of the Hednesford Town management team who despite lockdown continuing wanted to bring the young defender to the PRG Stadium. Promoted to team captain in January 2022.

Josh Webb – Defender Josh is a former England youth international who joined the pitmen summer 2021 from Coleshill Town. Josh began his career at Aston Villa through the youth system through to the U23's where he turned pro for 5 years at Villa. His impressive performances earned him a move to Scottish Premiership side Kilmarnock.

Callam Mendez-Jones – Defender Callam is a strong central defender who started his career with West Bromwich Albion. He moved onto Accrington Stanley on loan before joining the Pitmen in 2017. Moving on to Halesowen Town, Rushall Olympic and Redditch United, Callam rejoined the Pitmen last season to bolster the defence.

Martin Riley – Defender Martin is a vastly experienced central defender who joined the Pitmen from neighbouring Tamworth FC in November 2021. He began his career with Wolverhampton Wanderers FC and has also been with Shrewsbury Town, Kidderminster Harriers, Mansfield Town, Wrexham and other good clubs. Martin's undoubted class and experience will be invaluable to KMR's young squad.

Harvey Portman - Defender 18 year old Harvey joined the Pitmen from Stourbridge FC in early 2022. An elegant left sided central defender with a maturity well beyond his years. Definitely one to watch for the future.

Jed Davies – Midfielder Jed is a 25-year-old creative midfielder who is no stranger to Keys Park as he was on loan back in 2017 and then signed permanently in 2018, only to leave for Stafford Rangers in 2019. He began his career as a junior with Chasetown, before moving on to Coalville Town and Tamworth.

Reece Flanagan – Midfielder 25 year old Reece began his career with Walsall making 39 appearances for the Saddlers before leaving the club and moving on to Leamington in the National League North, a short spell at Rushall Olympic followed before he joined Stratford shortly before the curtailment of the season 2019-20. Reece is a hardworking, determined midfielder with a great range of passing.

Courtney Richards – Midfielder Courtney, 26, arrived at the pitmen in November 2020 after impressing with his performances at Bromsgrove. Courtney began his career at Coventry city youth system, moving onto Brighton & Hove Albion where he signed his first pro deal. Courtney then moved onto Torquay United where he established himself as club captain. Courtney's previous non-league clubs also include Solihull Moors, Macclesfield, Nuneaton, Alvechurch and Stratford.

Todd Parker – Midfielder Todd is a dynamic midfielder who signed for the pitmen in summer of 2021. Todd has excellent pedigree coming through the youth ranks at wolves. He is looking to really place a stamp on this league this season.

Cain Smith - Midfielder Cain is a competitive centre midfielder, formerly of Mansfield Town FC Academy, who has just returned from a scholarship in the USA. He last played for Upper Iowa University and has signed for the Pitmen after receiving his international clearance.

Lewis Hayden - Midfielder Joined the Pitmen in early February from Walsall Wood FC, having previously been with Coventry United, Solihull Moors and Rugby Town. A hard working, tenacious centre midfielder who can also play RB or RWB.

Cameron Ebbutt - Forward Cameron transferred into the Pitmen from Bromsgrove Sporting, his previous clubs include Bristol Rovers, Hereford and Gloucester City. Cameron is a versatile attacking player that prefers the number 7, 10 and 11 positions.

Kyle Bennett - Forward Kyle joined the Pitmen in January 2022 from AFC Telford United. A hugely talented and experienced attacking player with almost 400 English Football League appearances under his belt with Wolves, Bury, Doncaster Rovers, Portsmouth and others. He will bring vast experience to the young Hednesford squad.

George Cater - Forward A tricky attacker who rejoined the club after spending three successful years with Chasetown, where he scored prolifically.

Andre Landell – Forward Andre (27) is a talented and versatile forward player who can operate a number of positions. Andre returns to the Pitmen following a spell with us early in his non-league career. Andre joins Hednesford Town FC after a short spell at Bromsgrove Sporting. His career has seen him play consistently in this league at a number of clubs including Stourbridge, Rushall Olympic & Alvechurch as well as in the USA as a youngster.

Riley O'Sullivan - Forward 6ft 2" Riley joined the Pitmen from Coventry United FC in October. The former Mansfield Town academy striker was scoring freely for Coventry United and was being looked at by many clubs at our level. Riley is another young player with great potential

Chay Tilt - Forward A tricky and skilful wing player who joined the Pitmen from Redditch United FC. Chay has West Bromwich Albion, Queens Park Rangers and Stourbridge among his former clubs.

Barwell 2 Banbury United 6 Saturday 9th April 2022

Banbury United showed their Champions credentials with a comprehensive win over Barwell on Saturday, despite giving away a two goal lead in the first half. Tristan Dunkley got the first Barwell goal and Ben Stephens got the second, making it twenty one for the season for the



striker. Banbury, however, went back in front at the end of the first half and then scored three second half goals without reply to claim the win.

Barwell welcomed Banbury United on to the pitch with a guard of honour to recognise their clinching of the league title in their previous match. There was warm applause from around the ground.

The first chance of the game fell to Ben Stephens for Barwell but his volley was well saved by Jack Harding in the Banbury goal. The ball came back from the keeper and fell to Tristan Dunkley who saw his shot deflected away for a corner. After seven minutes, there were strong claims for a Barwell penalty as Tyler Haddow was bundled to the ground inside the area. The referee waved away the protests from the Barwell players.

A minute later and the visitors took the lead. They surged forward on the right hand side with Henry Landers and he crossed the ball. Max Bramley got something on the ball but it still found its way through to the middle of the six yard area. Chris Wreh was on hand to make a simple tap in. It was a disappointing moment after Barwell's early pressure.

Two minutes later and that disappointment grew as Jack Stevens grabbed a quick second goal. It was a calamitous goal to give away for the home side with a poor clearance going straight to the Barwell man. Max Bramley was out of his goal and Stevens was able to loop the ball into the unguarded net. The Barwell faithful were fearing the worst with their side being two nil down after just ten minutes.

The home side did react well, however, and managed to get back in to the game. Before that, they were grateful to Bramley for a fine save on sixteen minutes when he stretched high to deny Morgan Roberts. Around twenty minutes into the game and the Banbury keeper managed to dally on the ball and was put under pressure by the



Barwell attackers. A poor pass from Harding to a defender was seized upon by Stephens but he couldn't make the moment count. Just seconds later and Tristan Dunkley did make it count when he put a rebounded ball in to the net to claw a goal back.

Barwell saw an opportunity for something in the game and after Giorgio Rasulo had struck the foot of Bramley's post, Ben Stephens scored the equaliser. The ball was played in from the right hand side and it reached Stephens who was, surprisingly, left unmarked at the back post. He controlled the ball well and smashed the ball home to great celebrations.

The game was full of chances and they kept coming as the half entered the last fifteen minutes. Benjamin Acquaye went close a couple of times for the away side and then Chris Wreh managed to fluff a shot when unmarked and close to goal. In stoppage time, the third Banbury goal came and it was a real blow to Guy Hadland's men who would have wanted to be level at half time. It was Morgan Roberts who got the goal as he controlled a cross well and put the ball past Bramley.

Barwell started the second half well and there was a chance for Stephens to head the ball close to goal after William Edjenguele had made an overhead kick to put the ball back in the area. Good Banbury defending meant the chance wasn't taken. It wasn't long after this when Banbury extended their lead with Morgan Roberts on hand again. It was a great strike low and hard past Bramley.

Just 12 minutes later and Banbury had their fifth through Jack Stevens. Jay Williams crossed the ball and it was left to Stevens to score a straightforward goal, his second of the game. The sixth came on seventy five minutes when Chris Wreh got his second goal of the game. He had the ball close to goal but to the right hand side of the six



yard box. The experienced striker did well to strike the ball in to the top of the net.

It was a difficult half for Barwell with Banbury looking dangerous but there were no more goals scored. The result continued Banbury's strong season at the top of the league but for Barwell the search for those final few points to secure Step 3 football next season continues.

Barwell recorded an Easter Monday derby day win at Nuneaton Borough to secure their step 3 status for next season. A large away following cheered goals from Ben Stephens and Tyler Haddow against a Nuneaton side that ended the game with nine men. Scott McManus was sent off



in the sixth minute for the hosts and then they were further reduced for the final ten minutes due to an injury after all three subs had been used.

Both sides knew that they needed something from this game to be sure of being safe at the bottom of the table. There was an early advantage given to Barwell due to the sending off in the sixth minute. Ben Stephens was bundled to the ground from behind by McManus and then there appeared to be a stamp on his back. The referee had no hesitation in immediately producing the red card and reducing Nuneaton to ten men.

The sending off disrupted the pattern of the game with little of significance happening for another fifteen minutes as Nuneaton sat back and looked to recover. Barwell were looking to play the ball around and create some space to take advantage of the extra man. The first chance for Barwell came when Ben Stephens had a shot deflected after good work by Tristan Dunkley who was a handful for the Nuneaton defence all afternoon.

In the 25th minute Stephens grabbed the opening goal, making it twenty-two for the season for the Barwell player. There was excellent build up play on the edge of the box from Barwell and a good pass was made to the Barwell attacker who then controlled the ball well before turning to shoot. The shot was well placed and gave Tony Breeden no chance to save it.

Nuneaton had chances in the first half. Charlie Dowd always looked like he could create something for the home side and his cross had to be cleared by Dominic Brown-Hill after 28 minutes to avoid further danger.

Nuneaton made a half time substitution as they looked to try and get the point needed to be sure of survival ahead of the final game of the season. They pressed in the early minutes of the half and forced an early corner that they then wasted.



Barwell were able to withstand this early pressure and started to create chances themselves. Brady Hickey had a shot that was over the bar as the game approached the hour mark. He received a pass from Stephens who had been set free by a great long pass from Dunkley.

Five minutes later and there was a claim for a Barwell free kick on the edge of the area. Dunkley picked up the ball behind the Nuneaton defence and ran through on goal. Nuneaton defender Isaiah Osbourne managed to get close enough for a small tug on his shirt sleeve just outside the area. This was enough for Dunkley's run to be interrupted and not enough for the referee to give the free kick.

Barwell kept the ball well for long periods of the second half and made the most of the man advantage. Nuneaton were limited in the impact they could make as they tried to counter attack. Tyler Haddow came on for Barwell and had a snap shot that went over the bar as the game entered the final fifteen minutes.

Nuneaton made two more substitutions and brought on two strikers in Anthony Dwyer and Luke Benbow to try and get the equaliser. However, they lost Osbourne to injury in the 80th minute and had to play with nine men.

Barwell looked to take further advantage of this. Brown-Hill took a free kick on the right hand side, close to the edge of the area. He saw an opportunity to surprise Breeden at his near post but the experienced goalkeeper was able to react quickly and make the save. Max Brogan, also on as a substitute, then had a shot deflected.



With just over five minutes to go, Nuneaton had a massive chance to equalise. The home side counter attacked and Dwyer was able to find Benbow in the area. Benbow's effort was blocked and went out for a corner. Many of the home fans had their head in their hands unable to understand how a goal had not been scored.

Barwell dealt with the resulting corner and then secured the win with a goal by Tyler Haddow. Ben Stephens had the ball on the right hand side and made a wonderful cross that took out all of the defenders. The ball found Haddow, three yards out, and he recovered from a poor first touch to put the ball over the goal line. There was huge celebrations by players and fans alike.

In stoppage time Breeden made a good save to tip a Stephens free kick over the bar. The final whistle brought celebratory scenes from all in the Barwell camp as well as relief. The target of remaining at this level of the non-league pyramid had been achieved.





Meet the Canaries



BRADY HICKEY

Brady is team captain again this season and is well on the way to being a real club legend. The attacking midfielder re-joined Barwell after a brief spell at Nuneaton Borough in 2018/19 and led the team well last season. A skilful player who can also be combative in the middle of the pitch. He is well known for his ability to score goals and take excellent free kicks. 

Opposition History

Hednesford Town

The Pitmen were formed in 1880 with the amalgamation of two teams, the Red and Whites (who were also known as West Hill) and Hill Top. The newly formed club played their games at 'The Tins', which was at the rear of The Anglesey Hotel in Hednesford and remained there until 1904, when they moved to 'The Cross Keys'.



'The Cross Keys' was home to the Pitmen until the 1994/95 season when the club moved to the new purpose-built 'Keys Park' stadium, which has a 6039 capacity and currently holds a Football Association Grade B ground grading certificate. Hednesford Town FC may have a long and proud history but it was not until January 1990 that the club's fortunes turned for the better. The 1989/90 season had been a struggle and, at the beginning of the year, the club were in a deep relegation battle and, with gates below 300, relegation from The Beazer Homes Midland Division looked a distinct possibility. In an effort to avoid relegation the club appointed former goalkeeper, John Baldwin, as manager and he gradually began to turn the club around and relegation was avoided.

The following season the team finished third and then gained promotion to the Beazer Homes League Premier Division, after finishing the 91/92 season as runners-up to Solihull Borough. In the same season the club became the first English football team to play at The Welsh National Stadium losing I-0 to Cardiff City, in the final of the Welsh Cup. In the first season in the Premier Division the Pitmen finished in a creditable fourth position and reached the Staffordshire Senior Cup Final losing to Stoke City over two legs. The 93/94 season saw the club reach a cup final for the third year running, this time it was The Birmingham Senior Cup Final where at The Bescot Stadium they were beaten 3-0 by a full strength Walsall team. The following season the club were crowned Beazer Homes League Premier Division champions with the team defeating Leek Town in front of 2776 supporters at The Cross Keys to clinch the title and promotion to the GM Vauxhall Conference.

Opposition History

Hednesford Town

The Pitmen commenced their first season in The Conference at their new Keys Park home and in the club's first season in the top flight of non-league football they finished in third place behind champions Stevenage Borough and Woking. The 1996/97 season will go down as the best in the club's history as the Pitmen reached the first round of the FA Cup for the first time in 72 years, eventually losing in the fourth round at Middlesbrough, in front of 27,500 supporters. The following season saw the club finish in seventh position and further FA Cup success was enjoyed as, in front of millions of Match of the Day viewers, the Pitmen beat Hull City 2-0 at Boothferry Park but in the second round lost to Darlington. In the 98/99 season the club reached the first round of the FA Cup for the third season running. This time the team beat Barnet 3-1 in the first round but lost by the same scoreline away at Cardiff City in the next round.

League success did not follow the fine cup runs and the 1999/2000 season saw the team drop to 17th position then, after John Baldwin had stepped down during December 2000, the club were relegated for the first time in their history. A succession of managers were appointed to replace John Baldwin including Neil Pointon, Colin Lambert, Paul Raynor, Kenny Hibbitt and Ian Painter. The club's first season back in the Southern League was a big disappointment and only a last day victory away at Newport (IOW) saved a second consecutive relegation. The team started the 2002/03 season with Ian Painter in charge but, with the Pitmen hovering around the relegation zone, Ian was replaced during February 2003 by Barry Powell, who returned to the club after a spell at Stafford Rangers. Barry had previously been assistant manager to Kenny Hibbitt.

Despite the club's FA Trophy success in May 2004, when Canvey Island were defeated 3-2 at Villa Park, Barry Powell was replaced as manager by Chris Brindley. The club had failed during the 2003/04 season to finish high enough in the league to move into the new Conference set up but promotion came twelve months later, when a place in The Football Conference Northern Division was gained after winning play off games away at Merthyr Tydfil and Chippenham Town

Opposition History Hednesford Town

The 05/06 season saw the Pitmen again reach the first round of the FA Cup but the team were defeated 4-0 away at Histon. The team continued to leak goals and, as a result of a number of poor results, Chris Brindley left the club by mutual consent in early December 2005. Chris' assistant manager, former Wimbledon star, Steve Anthrobus, was appointed Manager but he was unable to save the club from relegation to The Unibond Northern Premier League.

Former Nottingham Forest player, Phil Starbuck, was appointed manager in July 2006 and, despite challenging near the top of the table for the majority of the 06/07 season, a slump in form after Christmas saw the team eventually finish in 7th position. In the 07/08 season, the Pitmen ended a disappointing season in 8th position and Phil Starbuck was replaced during the summer by Dean Edwards who appointed former Scottish international, Matt Elliott, as his Assistant Manager.

The 08/09 season saw the Pitmen in commanding form for the first half of the season once again, but a loss of form in the New Year saw the title challenge fade away, with the team finishing in a disappointing 8th place. One consolation was that the side went on to win the Birmingham Senior Challenge Cup for only a second time after a wait of 73 years, beating Stourbridge 2-0 in the final. After a disappointing start to the 2009/10 campaign Dean Edwards left the club and Simon Line, formerly of Market Drayton Town FC, was appointed to the vacant team manager position. Simon brought former Kidderminster Harriers player, Delwyn Humphreys, to Keys Park as his number two.

More managerial chaos followed in early January 2010 when Simon Line handed in his resignation for 'personal reasons' and this resulted in the appointment of former Pitman and Northern Ireland star, Bernard McNally into the Keys Park management hot seat. Delwyn Humphreys agreed to stay on as Bernie's Assistant Manager, after a short spell as caretaker manager, following Line's departure.

Opposition History Hednesford Town

Under this management team the Pitmen finished the season strongly and ended in a creditable fourth place, earning a play off semi-final tie away at Chippenham Town FC, which the Pitmen lost 2-0. After a shock early exit from the 2010/11 FA Cup Bernard McNally and his then assistant Stuart Brock left the club to be replaced by the former AFC Telford United management team, Rob Smith and Larry Chambers in late September 2010.

After a very successful season finishing 2nd in the Southern League Premier Division, winning the Southern League Cup and losing on penalties to Salisbury City FC in the Play-off Final the Pitmen were moved laterally into the Evo-Stik Northern Premier League. After a satisfactory first season back in the Evo-Stik NPL, finishing in 5th place and earning a Play Off place, losing to promoted Bradford Park Avenue, Smith set about rebuilding the team for the new season, making wholesale changes.

The 2012-13 campaign was one of the best in the history of the club, with the club finishing second in the league with 93 points and then gaining promotion through the Play Offs, beating AFC Fylde and then FC United of Manchester, the Final setting a new attendance record at Keys Park of 4412. The promotion to the Conference was complemented by winning both the Birmingham and Staffordshire Senior Cups in a truly historic season.

The success story continued in 2013-14 with Smith and Chambers once more guiding the team to the play-offs, losing narrowly over two legs to Altrincham FC who were eventually promoted. The team also acquitted themselves well in the FA Cup getting to the First Round proper, losing 2-1 to Crawley Town FC and also got to the Final of the Birmingham Senior Cup, losing to Conference Premier side Tamworth FC

The 2014-15 season was a season of consolidation for the Pitmen who were in play-off contention at Christmas but faded in the run-in, finishing in a creditable 8th place in the Conference North.

Opposition History

Hednesford Town

Soon after the commencement of the 2015-16 season the club were rocked by the news that Smith and Chambers were leaving to take up the vacant management positions at rivals AFC Telford United. After a flurry of interest in the posts at Keys Park, former manager Bernard McNally was appointed to the manager position to be assisted by club stalwart Chris Brindley however after a poor run of results



stalwart Chris Brindley, however, after a poor run of results in which the team only picked up 8 pts in 11 league matches McNally was relieved of his duties. In mid December 2015, former Chelsea and Leicester City star Frank Sinclair was appointed to the manager's position, bringing in Chris Millington as his Assistant, a colleague of his at Oldham Athletic FC Academy.

Despite their best efforts Frank and Chris were unable to avoid relegation and left the club in April 2016. After much interest in the vacant manager role, the club appointed Liam McDonald fresh from a very successful season with Redditch United FC. After losing Liam McDonald to Solihull Moors FC in November 2016 there followed another period of management instability with Paul Casey having three months in charge followed by his assistant manager Gary Birch. When Gary Birch resigned at the end of the season the club moved quickly to appoint manager Neil Tooth who had been the preferred external candidate when the previous internal appointment had been made, however, in September Neil Tooth left the club and this heralded the return of Rob Smith and Larry Chambers to Keys Park.

The new management team heralded a strong mid-season resurgence by the Pitmen but this did not last and the performances dropped off towards the end of the season, finishing in a disappointing 16th position in the League

Opposition History

Hednesford Town

The 2018-19 season started with mixed results but took a turn for the worse in late November when Smith and Chambers left the club to take up a position elsewhere, the club decided in late December to appoint Nicky Eaden as Manager who was joined by Gary Hayward as Assistant Manager. After a strong finish to the season Gary Hayward was appointed as team manager and recruited Mark Ward from AFC Mansfield as his Assistant and fans favourite Danny Glover as player/coach. In early December 2019, Gary Hayward and Mark Ward left to take up a management offer at Buxton FC, Danny Glover and Ben Bailey took immediate charge of team affairs and was joined by experienced former Port Vale FC manager, Dean Glover to assist in the dugout.

This was the season that coronavirus struck with the season shut down in mid March and all resuts expunged. Amidst all of the chaos though, 2020 saw Hednesford Town FC move into a new era of ownership as Graham Jones took over the club as Chairman aong with his partner Hayden Dando on 1st May.

Shortly afterwards, Andy Morrell was appointed as team manager with Danny Glover as his Assistant Manager and former Stafford Rangers manager, Alex Meechan, joining the coaching staff. With only a few weeks of the new season past and with the Pitmen on the bottom of the league and out of the FA Cup, Andy Morrell and Alex Meechan left the club and were replaced by Keenen Meakin-Richards and Graham Deakin as the interim management team.

In another disrupted season due to the pandemic, Keenen MeakinRichards andGraham Deakin were confirmed as the management team, they were joined by Jemiah Richards as coach and Richard Mills as goalkeeper coach.

The agony and ecstasy of this season's run-in still needs to be settled, but the Buildbase NGAs don't necessarily wait for the trophies to be lifted before honouring its winners.

The choice, as always, is yours, so get your votes in and give your club's star man the recognition he deserves.


