

Meet Nuneaton Borough

Tony Breeden – Joined the Boro in November 2019 after beginning the season at Bromsgrove Sporting. His previous clubs include Kidderminster Harriers, Tamworth and Leamington. He made his Boro debut in a 2-2 draw against Royston Town.



Bradley Foster – Joining the club in November 2021 from Ilkeston, Bradley started out in the Stoke City academy before joining the Derby County U23s. He was released at the end of the 2020/21 season by the Rams.

Damien McCrory – Irish born defender who began his career with Plymouth Argyle where he earned himself a 12-month contract. The hard-tackling Republic of Ireland youth international made almost 200 appearances for Burton Albion and has also represented Dagenham & Redbridge and Notts County.

Scott McManus – Experienced defender who began his career as an apprentice with Manchester United. Played with Prestwich Heys, Curzon Ashton and Crewe Alexandra before settling at Halifax Town where he made 250 appearances.

Liam Daly - 6ft 6in central defender who has much experience in non-league football. Has represented Solihull Moors, Halesowen Town and Leamington.

Jaden Charles – A left back who joined the club in December 2021 on loan from League 2 side Mansfield Town. The young defender started his career at Derby County.

Ryan Pryce – The Welsh Right back joined the club in December 2021 from Hednesford Town. The defender had previously plied his trade at the Cardiff City U23's.

Cameron McWilliams – The pacey defender joined the Boro in December 2021 and had previously been at Northampton Town and Cardiff City U23's before moving to St. Ives.

Ryan Edmunds – A very versatile player being able to play wing back, up front and anywhere in midfield. He has made a total of 43 appearances and has scored a number of vital goals for the club. He joined Boro in November 2018 form Coleshill Town.



Cain Noble – Tough tackling central midfielder who has previously represented Chester. Joined Borough in the close season from Loughborough University.

Greg Kaziboni – Zimbabwean midfielder who started his career in England with Northampton Town. Has also represented Brackley Town, Banbury, Tamworth and Stratford Town.

Gift Mussa – Joined Boro from Bromsgrove Sporting who he joined from Leamington. Spent several seasons with Coventry United.

Chris Clements – Attacking midfielder who began his career with Crewe Alexandra. Has also represented Hednesford Town, Mansfield Town, Grimsby Town and Cheltenham Town.

Isaiah Osbourne – The former Aston Villa, Nottingham Forest, Blackpool and Walsall midfielder initially joined the club in October 2019 before re-signing with the Boro in October 2021.

Dan Bradley – The experienced midfielder started out his career at Aston Villa and played for the England C team. He went on to have success at AFC Fylde, enjoying two spells with the club and then with Alfreton. He joined Nuneaton in December 2021.

Louis Baker - Son of former club captain Carl Baker. Can play all across the midfield and has enjoyed quite a successful breakout season with the club, netting twice including in the FA Cup against Lichfield City.

Meet Nuneaton Borough

Wilson Chingoka – A Zimbabwe U23's midfielder, he joined the club in November 2021 after previous stints at clubs including Tring Athletic and Northwood.

Luke Benbow – A powerful striker who was born in Birmingham. He started his career at The Glen Hoddle Academy, and gained experience with Solihull Moors, Hednesford Town and Redditch United. He joined Boro



in June 2019 for an undisclosed fee from Stourbridge. He finished Boro's top goal scorer in the 2019/20 season.

Leroy Lita – An experienced striker with nine international caps at Under-21 level, Leroy has played at all levels of the game and signed for Boro in June 2020. He began his career as a youth team player with Chelsea before playing for a number of clubs such as, Bristol City, Reading, Middlesbrough and Swansea City, He was impressive in the Premier League scoring 14 goals for Reading in the 2006/07 season which led him to getting a call up by England.

Danny King—Gloucester City striker on loan at Nuneaton until January 3rd, 2022.

Anthony Dwyer—Experienced Southern League striker who has previously represented Barwell, Tamworth, Stourbridge, Hednesford and most recently Alvechurch.

Match Report

Barwell I Coalville Town 0 Monday 27th December 2021

Barwell secured a narrow win over neighbours Coalville Town in this Christmas fixture at the UK Flooring Direct Stadium. It was Ben Stephens who grabbed the only goal of the game to make it 14 for him this season so far. The game, played in front of a large crowd of 804, saw plenty of chances for both sides and Max Bramley did well to stop the Ravens from scoring - the first time that has happened in a league game this season.



There were early chances for Ross Oulton, but the Barwell man shot over the bar, and for Tim Berridge of Coalville. The Coalville striker put a header just wide from a good cross. Ben Stephens then tested Tomasz Bukowski after five minutes when his shot almost caught the goalkeeper out but he did enough to save it.

Tristan Dunkley did well to block a Connor Smith shot close to the line, after the ball had pinged around in the Barwell box. The initial danger had been caused by a Luke Shaw corner that wasn't cleared properly. Shortly after this, Berridge had a run and a shot but he blazed it over.

After 21 minutes, there was good play by Lucas Powell and he won a corner. The corner was headed towards the goal, Bukowski pushed the ball on to the underside of the crossbar. It then came down and bounced on the line and was cleared. Some of the Barwell fans were saying it had crossed the line before the keeper reached it but the goal was not given. Dunkley then followed up with a shot but it hit the post.

At the other end, Bramley made a good save from Tom McGlinchey shot and then Alex Dean shot over. The ball had caused a scramble in the Barwell box and Coalville claimed a penalty but the referee ruled it out. Billy Kee then met a Dean cross with a header that went just wide.

Match Report

The goal came on 28 minutes. Tristan Dunkley received the ball out on the wide and controlled it well. He made a great cross to the penalty spot where Ben Stephens was lurking unmarked. The Barwell striker made no mistake in burying it past Bukowski to give Barwell the lead.

McGlinchey should have done better after a good move for Coalville saw him played in on goal. He looked to be one on one with Bramley but he overhit the ball and the chance went begging.

Barwell almost doubled their lead after a mix up in the Coalville defence but Ben Stephens couldn't capitalise. Max Brogan, impressing in a start for the home side, then brought out a good save from Bukowski as the Canaries looked to extend the lead.

The chances kept coming for Barwell as Brogan had another shot saved and then Stephens shot just over but the half ended with just the slender advantage for the Canaries.

Coalville had a good start to the second half and enjoyed some spells of possession. Tim Berridge had a shot saved when one on one with Max Bramley and then Kyron Stabana made a great block to stop a Connor Smith shot from threatening the goal. Billy Kee also had a free kick that was straight at the wall as the home side continued to stand firm against each Coalville attack.

William Warren and Ashanti Pryce came on for Barwell as Guy Hadland looked to secure the three points for his side.

Barwell I Coalville Town 0 Monday 27th December 2021

Harry Bower brought out a save from Bukowski with a shot on 67 minutes but it was the away side who had the better of the half's chances. Bramley did well to deny substitute Tyrell Waite by getting down low and smothering the ball at his feet. The new signing for Coalville had scored the winner for Tamworth in Barwell's first home game this season.

Alex Dean had a shot that was saved by Bramley. Dean had been played the ball from a short corner and shot from outside the area. The ball rebounded to Waite but a Barwell defender got a clearance in just in time. Lucas Powell then made a fantastic block to throw himself in front of another Waite shot.

With 6 minutes left, Bukowski was called in to action again. He made a brilliant double save from Brady Hickey and William Warren to earn applause from all sides of the ground. For Barwell, however, it was a chance to secure the points that had been wasted. The Coalville keeper then tipped a Warren shot just over the bar.

The game was brought to an and and the Barwell players were able to celebrate a home win. Max Bramley received his man of the match award and was cheered heartily by the Canaries faithful.





BRADY HICKEY

Brady is team captain again this season and is well on the way to being a real club legend. The attacking midfielder re-joined Barwell after a brief spell at Nuneaton Borough in 2018/19 and led the team well last season. A skilful player who can also be combative in the middle of the pitch. He is well known for his ability to score goals and take excellent free kicks. He originally joined Barwell in 14/15 having impressed for Leicester side St Andrews and had a number of trials with league teams, including Leicester City.

MAX BRAMLEY.

Tall, young goalkeeper who joined in October 2019 from the Leicester City youth team. Kept 3 clean sheets in his first 3 games for us and really cemented the number 1 shirt for what was left of the 2019/20 season. Has been on trial in the USA and continues to impress in goal, earning some man of the match awards this season.

MICAH EDWARDS

Midfield player who joined in Summer 2019 and was a Youth player for Derby County before having time with Ilkeston Town and Gresley. Made a real impact in his first season with Barwell and will be one to keep an eye on in 2021/22.

WILLIAM WARREN

An exciting young talent who has joined from Aylestone Park FC in Leicester. Will is highly rated and has already made appearances in the first team.

BEN STEPHENS

Ross has joined Barwell for a second spell at the start of this season. He is a battling midfielder who wears his heart on his sleeve. Ross has been at Stratford Town, AFC Rushden & Diamonds and Daventry Town.

HARRY BOWER

Harry joined on loan from AFC Telford United in August 2021 and then again at the end of October 2021 Previously Harry has been with The New Saints and Oswestry Town and is considered a hot prospect

ELLIOT PERCIVAL

Versatile defender who is at home both at right back or in the centre of defence. Had time with Sheffield Wednesday and Leicester City at youth level.

DOMINIC BROWN-HILL

Dom is back at Barwell for another season having been at Alvechurch more recently. A former Notts County youth plater, Dom is well known for his dead ball skills but there is a lot more to his game than just that.

ASHANTI PRYCE

Signed for Barwell in December 2021. A youth player with Mansfield Town who also had time at Aston Villa and Birmingham City. Has been with Kettering Town and Coventry Sphinx in non league.

TYREACE BROWN

Tyreace joined us in September 2021 and has made an instant impression in the heart of defence. He joined from Romulus in Birmingham, where he was well thought of. He has also featured for Littleton FC, Lye Town and Bilston Town.

WILLIAM EDJENGUELE

William joined Barwell in late September 2021 from Nuneaton Borough. Edjenguélé, born in Paris, began his career with CFF Paris before joining the reserve team of Le Mans Union 72. In 2010 he moved to Greece and Panetolikos, helping them be promoted to the Greek Super League. He then made the move to England in 2012 and appeared 33 times for Coventry City, scoring his first goal for them against Colchester United. Spells with Bury FC, Panteolikos again, another Greek team in Veria and then Dundee United followed. In 2019 he went on loan to Falkirk before joining Wealdstone and then Nuneaton Borough.

KYRON STABANA

Stabana joined Derby County aged 7 as a striker. He was converted to a left and right winger aged 11 before eventually moving to right back at 14 years old. Stabana represented England U17s five times during his scholarship at the club, getting one assist. He signed his first professional contract with the club aged 17. He then had loan spells at Boston United and Tamworth. He was released by Derby County at the age of 19 following his second year as a professional footballer at the club. He joined AFC Wimbledon from Derby and had loan spells at Tamworth and Cork City, where he made 4 appearances before Covid brought an end to the season in Ireland. He joined Tamworth for the aborted 2020/21 season before heading to Barwell in the summer of 2021.

HERVE PEPE-NGOMA

'Peps' is a German born player who came to Barwell from neighbours Coalville Town. He has had spells at Kettering Town, Boston United and Leicester City youth. A long term injury whilst at Boston has kept him out for a number of years but he is back making an impression in the middle of the park again.

LEANDRO BROWNE

Back for a second spell at Kirkby Road, Leandro is an attacking midfielder who can be a real handful at times. Previously with Coalville Town, Belper Town and Burton Albion.

MAX BROGAN

Young midfield player signed in November 2021 from Tamworth.



NUNEATON ST.NICHOLAS -

Club Nickname: 'The Nicks'

The forerunner of the present club has origins dating back to 1889 when the Bible Class students at Vicarage Street School formed Nuneaton St. Nicholas FC.



Originally playing only friendly games, from 1892 Nuneaton St. Nicholas entered Charity Cup competitions.

In September 1894 the 'Nicks' changed their name to Nuneaton Town Association F.C.

NUNEATON TOWN -

Club Nickname: 'The Nuns'

League Record:

1894-95 Warwickshire Junior League; 1896-97 Coventry & District League; 1897-99, 1904-06 Coventry and North Warwickshire League; 1899-1900 Leicestershire League; 1901-03 Nuneaton & District League; 1903-04 Trent Valley League; 1906-08 Birmingham Junior League; 1908-15, 1926-33 renamed Birmingham Combination; 1915-1919 competition suspended due to World War One; 1919-24, 1933-37 Birmingham League; 1924-26 Southern League (Eastern Section).

Grounds:

Played on various fields from 1889 to 1903 located at Higham Lane, Rose Inn Coton Road, Arbury Road (later renamed Queens Road) and Edward Street.

Enclosed grounds at Queens Road 1903-08, Newdegate Arms 1908-15, Manor Park 1919-37.

On May 13th, 1937 at an extraordinary general meeting of shareholders it was decided to wind up the football club despite Nuneaton Town being financially sound having sold their Manor Park ground to Nuneaton Corporation the previous December.

Formed two days after the EGM of Nuneaton Town by a group of local gentlemen.

NUNEATON TOWN / BOROUGH - Club Nickname: 'The Boro'

Recent History:

March 2008 saw a take over from the board that had run the club from 1991. The new directors soon found they had inherited excessive debts despite the sale of Manor Park to property developers.

The new club reverted to its former name of Nuneaton Town and were demoted two divisions from Conference North to Southern League Division One.

Nuneaton Borough

Following the demotion to the Southern League Midlands Division the club gained promotion following a 1-0 play-off final victory over Chasetown at Liberty Way.



The next season, 2009/10, Nuneaton found themselves in the Southern League Premier Division with several teams that were spending vast sums chasing promotion.

After a slow start the team went on a fantastic run that saw them beaten only once at home and included a run of 14 straight victories, narrowing a 24 point gap between the leaders Farnborough to just 2 points at the end of the season.

Again, the play-offs beckoned and a 6-0 thrashing of big spending Brackley Town in the semi-final saw home advantage given to Nuneaton who faced Chippenham.

The final went into extra time and it was befitting that a local player, Eddie Nisevic, who had come through the ranks, got the winning goal returning Nuneaton to the Conference North.

Nuneaton's return to the Conference North for the 2010/11 saw them start well and remain in the top six up until Christmas, where they gained top spot until the last week in March.

Eventually after other clubs played their games in hand, Nuneaton finished just outside of the play-offs.

Fortune smiled on The Boro when the club above them, Eastwood Town, were prevented from taking part in the play-offs due to a technical problem.

Nuneaton faced AFC Telford Utd in the Play Off Semi-Finals but went down 2-1 on aggregate.

Nuneaton Borough

The 2011/12 season was to see Nuneaton gain promotion back to the Conference Premier for the first time in 10 years.

After maintaining a high league position throughout the season Boro' were dealt a blow as the season entered its final few weeks when an administration error led to a 6 point deduction.

This seemed to spur the team on and a final day 3-2 victory at Blyth Spartans ensured their play-off place.

A superb semi-final 2nd leg victory over Guiseley, with a goal from Andy Brown in the last minute of extra time, meant that Boro had to travel to Gainsborough Trinity for the Play-Off Final.

Again Brown (ironically the player concerned in the admin mishap) was the goal hero in a game that saw Boro claim a I-0 victory amid wild scenes of delight amongst the travelling supporters as the club won their place back in non-league's top tier.

The 2012/13 season saw Boro pitting their wits against the countries non-league elite. Up against many full time clubs it took a while to get to grips with their new environment but Boro's team spirit and work ethic never waivered.

Despite spending much of the season in and around the relegation zone a terrific run towards the end of the season saw Boro eventually finish in 15th place.

The 2013/14 season surpassed all expectations with Boro leading the table early on and featuring in and around the play-off positions for most of the season. After manager Kevin Wilkin left for Wrexham, results tailed off in the last month or so of the season but they still finished in 13th position. A new manager, Brian Reid, was appointed and oversaw the last 3 games of the season.

Nuneaton Borough

Season 2014/15 marked the Club's 125th Anniversary. However, Boro made a poor start and this resulted in Brian Reid being replaced as manager by Liam Daish. Despite the managerial change Boro were in the relegation zone for most of the season and finally finished bottom of the table. Liam Daish parted company with the Club at the end of the season and was replaced by Kevin Wilson shortly afterwards.



In season 2015/16 Kevin Wilson was joined by former Forest favourite Steve Chettle as the club looked to bounce back at the first attempt. A 3 point deduction cost them a place in the play-offs as they finished 6th. They reached the Birmingham Senior Cup semi-final beating AFC Wulfrunians 10 -0 along the way before being beaten by Birmingham City at home.

In season 2016/17, after a difficult start, Kevin Wilson left the club and was replaced as manager by Tommy Wright. A nine match unbeaten run helped them to league safety and to reach the FA Trophy 3rd Round before bowing out to York City, they eventually finished in 12th place.

Season 2017/18 saw Boro again struggling at the wrong end of the table when, in October, manager Tommy Wright quit the club to take over at Darlington. He was replaced by Tunisian Dino Maamria who turned the teams fortunes around, guiding them to mid-table safety. This remarkable turnaround earned him a move into league football when he was appointed as manager of Stevenage in March 2018. Gary Charles took charge for the remainder of the season with Boro finishing in 13th place.

Season 2018/19 saw the club revert back to their former name Nuneaton Borough after overwhelming support for the change from supporters. Nicky Eaden was installed as manager with former Boro player Lee Fowler as his assistant. However, the Club was in turmoil off the pitch and almost went out of existence on several occasions. Only the staff and supporters outstanding dedication kept the Club alive and the arrival of lifelong Boro fan Jimmy Ginnelly as manager, and subsequently chairman, saw the Club survive.

Nuneaton Borough

Inevitably such turmoil had an impact on the playing side and Boro were relegated from the National League North.

Season 2019/20 - the season that never was! Boro competed in the Southern League Central Premier

Division and whilst always in touch with the leading pack spells of indifferent form saw them flatter to deceive. The season was ended early, and declared null and void, due to the Covid-19 pandemic with Boro 3 points outside of the play-off places although

Season 2020/21 - a second season that fell victim to the Covid-19 pandemic. Only 8 league games were played and with an injury ravaged squad Boro made an indifferent start. However, shortly before the season was curtailed a number of influential players returned to fitness and Boro were beginning to click. The season ended with Boro 4 points outside of the play-off places.

THE APPEAL of football at Christmas showed its popularity once more even in challenging conditions for supporters.

Despite Omicron cases rising over 100,000 in England and the weather being as wet and windy as ever, fans still turned out in big numbers for the festive fixtures.

Attendances in Non-League have been impressive after fears the pandemic may put off some spectators returning to matches. But football – coupled with the hard work of club volunteers – has shown it can be a safe space. The failed European Super League plan is likely to have also benefitted the lower levels with some supporters turning their back on the top-flight.

Non-League's affordability remains as does the 'real' feel of attending matches and standing on terraces. The game as these levels is continuing to grow and the Boxing Day schedule provided further proof of that.

Stockport County welcomed 8,896 for their Boxing Day clash with Altrincham. It was the highest crowd on the day outside of the Championship and the club's biggest league attendance since 2008.

Elsewhere in the National League, there was 3,830 at Torquay United in their game against Yeovil Town. A crowd of 3,759 was at Hayes Lane for Bromley's televised fixture with Southend United as 3,699 took in the local derby between Aldershot Town and Woking.

In National League North, AFC Fylde and Chorley had 2,608 spectators while the derby between Spennymoor Town and Darlington saw a crowd of 2,404. There was also 2,082 at AFC Telford United for the visit of Chester.

Dorking Wanderers welcomed a record crowd of 2,048 on National League South and put on a show with an 8-0 victory over promotion rivals Havant & Waterlooville.

Tonbridge Angels had the next highest of 1,669 against Maidstone United followed by Oxford City with 1,208.

The Northern Premier League had a combined total of more than 30,000 in attendance for their final games of the year on December 27th. There were ten four-figure crowds across the four divisions, including more than 2,000 at FC United, Matlock Town and Marine. A total of 12,213 fans went through the turnstiles in the 11 Premier Division games, averaging at 1,110 per game.

In the West Division, the average crowd was even bigger coming in at 1,155 across the seven games, including a 2,150 sell-out for Marine's local derby with Bootle, who won 3-0. There were 1,679 at Clitheroe for their 5-1 win over Colne, while 1,100 saw Leek Town win away at Kidsgrove Athletic. There was a four-figure crowd in the East Division too, where Marske United lost at home to Stockton Town in front of 1,250.

Horsham hosted 1,284 for their fixture with Lewes in the Isthmian League Premier while 1,314 were at Bury Town against Stowmarket Town in the North division. In the South East, Herne Bay won 7-2 against Whitstable Town in front of 1,119.

Banbury United attracted their biggest league attendance for 52 years of 1,221. The Southern League Premier Central leaders beat Stratford Town 1-0. Bromsgrove Sporting had 1,658 against Stourbridge and Hednesford drew 1,142 for their game with Rushall Olympic.

In the Southern League Division One South (Step 4), Frome Town's crowd was 1,103 for their 3-3 draw with Melksham Town.

Phoenix club Macclesfield FC, at Step 5, had the biggest attendance on December 27 of 4,353 and there was 972 at Step 6 side Steeton AFC.

The depth, and support, of the English pyramid continues to be incredible.
