Business Plan – MP updated the meeting on the Business Plan

- CH has access to an extra pitch wef September
 - o meaning the Club now has 5 pitches to use
 - o by the 1st week in September, all park pitches will have posts
- MP has asked for drawings for a 2-storey clubhouse to be drawn up
- Planning permission has been obtained for new floodlights. MP explained that a condition, however, is that they are switched off by 9pm;CHRCL asked for 10pm, but a group within the Council objected.

Substance abuse – MP stated this is not acceptable at CHRCL (anywhere on our premises). He wanted this message shared and stated members have a responsibility to ensure this didn't happen.

Code of Conduct – MP explained that the Club is be enjoyed but respected at the same time. He also explained how members can help towards respecting the Club; know you limits.

Club Survey — this was sent out a couple of months ago. However, MP mentioned that not every age group uses social media.

MP talked through the results analysis (kept with these minutes) and highlighted some of the main themes – underage drinking, Love Admin usage, 1st Aid; an action plan will be drawn up to address the issues. Playing, the social side and volunteering all received positive comments; suggestions for improvements also received.

MP reiterated the message that volunteers are always needed.

AOB raised from the floor

Chet's clock – Paul Moore stated that £1400 was raised for a clock to be purchased in Marc Chetland's memory; could this be finally sorted out.

Recognition – David Sole asked for Ian Ellis, John and Carol Perrigo and Donna Moore to be thanked for all they have done for the Club this season.

Camp Hill Heart – Jim Looney explained this Minis & Junior section award; it is for those who go above and beyond for the section. This season's recipients are Simon Fellows, Jonathon Simpson and Brian Freeman.

Children with additional needs – Lauren Kennedy raised that no guidance on helping children with additional needs while playing rugby. Chelsea Moore offered to look into this.
