Senior Rugby

There is little to report on other than the season ahead! The seniors have continued to train during the pandemic (when allowed under the covid restrictions) and have attracted new players and retained good numbers from the last active rugby in March 2020. The Seniors will return to rugby on 1st July 2021 with the commencement of preseason at Anstey Park. All players over the age of 18 are welcome. Start time 1900. Physio and Sport therapist support will be available at all training and match days. There will also be full match day support for the second team to include a coach from the team, and first aid cover.

The first team will be playing in London SW3 (following promotion in the 2019/20 season) with games spread across Hampshire and Surrey including some good local rivalries being renewed against Petersfield and Basingstoke! The fixtures have been updated on the website and there will be the usual pre match lunches for home games and all club members are encouraged to take part. The league fixtures start on 18th September but there will be a number of preseason fixtures during Late August and early September.

We are still waiting on the finalised fixture list for the second team and this will be published as soon as we receive the details.

<u>The ladies section</u> (Now known as the Ravens) also continues to grow and has developed from a touch rugby side to a full contact team that is planning great things for the new season. Other forms of rugby are also being encouraged at Alton RFC. Chris Sparkes is getting an active walking rugby section together on Thursday nights. This is a great way to remain active and playing the game but without the bumps, knocks and aches the next day (well almost without!)

Junior rugby at Alton continues to thrive at Alton RFC. Despite the restrictions of Covid over the last season we have seen the usual excitement and enthusiasm across Anstey Park on a Sunday morning with some competitive games across the month of may. We look forward to returning in September and experiencing the same sort of success in the older age groups that we have seen in the previous couple of seasons with ort 15 a side teams all having highly successful seasons and topping Hampshire league tables.

The Colts section is an essential part of any rugby club and the valiant efforts of the coaching team led by Ashley Hamer have got a well proven track record of preparing competitive teams over a number of seasons reaching the quarter finals of the national cup in their last full match.

<u>The kids first section</u> teams are also proving to be successful if the laughter and smiles that can be seen on a Sunday morning can be used as a success measure! These are the players that we need to continue to nurture to enjoy the great sport of rugby and eventually (in many years' time) become the players, coaches, administrators and supporters of Alton RFC Volunteers – Coaches, Team managers, First aiders, Referees...

Alton continues to encourage all volunteers to be as well prepared as possible to provide the experience that our players need and want to improve themselves. With this in mind Alton is keen to encourage all volunteers to take advantage of courses and training to keep them up to date with the latest processes and behaviours. During the last 6 months Matt Arrowsmith has taken over the role of Coaching Co-ordinator. We are endeavouring to put courses on at Alton RFC as often as possible but where this is not possible we will signpost you to the nearest venue with suitable courses. Courses and how to book them will be regularly updated on the website.

Alton Way

As part of the new Alton RFC strategy I am developing a document called 'The Alton Way'.

Treasurer's Report: Steve Carter

2021 has been an unusual year to say the least but, with the help of EDC grants and furlough support, the club's finances remain healthy, finishing the year with a surplus of about £10k

As you would expect, subscriptions are down this year but I would lile to say a big thank you to the members who have continued to support the club with their subscription payments despite the reduced playing time and limited opening of the club.

Sponsorship income was, understandably nearly non-existent and with the kitchen being closed for the whole period and the bar being closed for most of the year. our trading income was very significantly reduced.

On the income side of the equation, we were propped up with EDC grants and furlough payments to the tune of nearly £40k, but overall the drop in income was still about £90k for the year (about 55% down).

Fortunately, the cost or sales / expenditure side of the equation was also a lot lower than a normal season. down to about £70k from about £150k the previous year (percentage-wise, a very similar reduction to the income side).

More specifically on the expenditure side of things, we continued to pay the salaries for permanent bar and cleaning staff(offset to a large extent by the furlough payments). Playing-related cools were down, as you'd expect, save for coaching costs, where this year's figure includes the costs of the online fitness programme that was provided to players. ATC gave us a 50% reduction on rent and we had payment holidays from BT and Skv.

Looking forwards, the day-to-day bookkeeping is now in the hands of Styles & Associates, with my oversight, giving me time to focus on the strategic side of the club's finances, ensuring that we remain financially strong and able to invest in the clubs future
