### Introduction

Details of this will be announced once finalised.



The day was also an opportunity to make formal presentations of Club Caps to Will Harrison and Geoff Appleton, who actually was awarded a club cap 40 years ago, but with usual AK (or Kersal as it was then) organisation, Geoff never formally received his cap. There again 40 years for an action item to remain on the Committee Meet minutes is not unknown! Will and Geoff are photographed below with previous club cap recipients Stuart Domville and Roger Salt. Unfortunately Chris Nettleton was unable to make the event, but will formally receive his club cap at a future date.



It was also an opportunity to showcase the improvements made to the clubhouse and the changing rooms, even if there are a few things to finish off as yet. See later on that. Awards were made to Trizzo and Gav for their efforts in improving the changing rooms, as shown below with their tankards and 'Bob the Builder' hats



A big thank you is also in order to everyone else who has contributed in any way to the improvements to the clubhouse, changing rooms and surrounds.

### **Club Improvements**

As stated there are still a few things to be finished off. It's on the agenda in due course to reconfigure the changing room toilets to make them more usable. (Players will know exactly what I mean by that as you don't venture in there without a full protective body suit and series of injections!), and improve the flooring throughout. The club has also now invested in a washing machine, which will in due course cut kit laundry costs considerably. And before anyone asks, NO we are taking in any other washing.

There are still some advertising display boards to go back up plus some club memorabilia, which has been delayed whilst up to date team photos etc are received, enlarged and framed. Most of these have now been sorted and hopefully should be on display in the next couple of weeks, together the old team photos, which were originally on the back wall in the main bar.

One interesting (or maybe not) aspect to come out of the improvements was an old newspaper (circa 1967 when the clubhouse was built) being found. It has references to problems with 'Big Brother' – no not the TV programme but the USSR as it was then. Also the economic crisis the UK was experiencing at that time. Hmmm 40 odd years on and things haven't changed in this country!

### **Future Development Fund raising**

As previously reported in RGN, future profits from the annual AK Firework Display will be ring fenced for future development projects, and longer term a new roof, heating system, enlarged / improved car park, and increased changing facilities are very much on the agenda once we have the necessary funding.

However the next main priority, based on immediate need would appear to be major floodlight improvements, which would benefit all teams training at AK. There is currently possible funding available through the Olympic Legacy Fund, although AK would be in a better position to bid for this if we are in a position to show we have funds of our own to contribute towards this.

In the last edition, the previous '**buy a brick**' or has it is now called '**Be a part of AK's history**' fundraising was mentioned and accompanying this RGN are full details of the latter. There has so far been a reasonably good response to this, but if you want to get 'your name in lights' so to speak for a long time in the future, then you need to act fast. ***The closing date for this is going to be Friday 12<sup>th</sup> October***

Finally as regards AK Development, please also remember that the current improvements to the clubhouse came about through views expressed at the Club Members Meetings back in November 2011. As well as improving the facilities for benefit and rugby experience of AK members, they are also intended to attract more lettings and therefore income to AK. NB: all club members are welcome to stay down and watch the ***Grand Final***




(much better than watching the Sale Shark's prima donnas!) and if you want talk bxxxxxxxs also – there is no law against!

## Future Editions of RGN

As sole editor and producer of RGN I have given quite a lot of thought to whether RGN should continue to be published and if so in what format.

The good news (I think) is that editions of RGN will still be produced, but the bad news is not on a regular monthly basis, and certainly not with as much content rugby wise. My reasoning on this is as follows

- Firstly not being the greatest with IT or typing skills, it does take quite a lot of time to produce each edition.
- Contributions from within AK (with one or two notable junior coach exceptions) are few and far between. It is also difficult to do a fair assessment of such as 'Team of the Month', if not all teams playing info is available, and / or becomes a lot of additional work for the editor to chase up on.
- As previously mentioned a lot of the info within RGN is already on the website. RGN was never designed to replace the website, which should be the first port of call for club members for info and reporting.
- As a communication tool I don't now consider RGN works all that well, and particularly in comparison to say Facebook, Twitter or text, which seem now to be more up to date ways of communicating, rather than through email or newsletters. Certainly the info contained in recent editions re such as club members working parties seemed to have little impact, based on the relative few who actually turned up for those, in comparison to the total number of players, non players, coaches and parents from the Junior sections the club has.
- Likewise other requests and such as competition items have met with limited response.

So RGN will continue in a somewhat reduced format and certainly I will look to produce an end of season version, summarising what has happened on all fronts throughout the season. However I would suggest to all teams that they make sure any items of interest (reports, photos etc) are uploaded on to the AK Website (it is quite easy to become a member / team admin on there and upload items). Also that all club members should regularly check out the website to see what is going on. RGN to some extent will become a reminder service in that respect and flag up any other items of interest.

The revised format for RGN does also mean that '*Player of the Month – NOT*', will also disappear but doesn't mean that misdemeanours that happen won't still be reported.
