Appendix 1

Supplementary guidance notes for friendly and competitive matches played at Coles Lane:-

- 1. All paying spectators shall only be admitted if in possession of a valid ticket. This will be a season ticket (home fans) which is valid for home league matches only or a ticket purchased online from Kaizen Risk Free ticketing. There will be no admission to the match at the gate without a ticket and tickets will not be available for purchase at the gate. There will be no cash or tickets at the gate.
- 2. As advised by the FA and League, maximum paying attendance will be 15% of the minimum specified attendance for step 4 clubs ie 200 up to and including 30/8/20 and 30% ie 400 from 31/8/20.
- 3. All spectators, home players and staff and match officials shall be temperature checked on arrival using the digital thermometer provided. (Senior teams only).
- 4. All spectators will be asked to use hand sanitizer on entry (this will be provided at the gate).
- 5. It is the responsibility of the away side to carry out such checks on their personnel. (Senior teams only)
- 6. A record shall be kept of contact details of all spectators, players, coaches and match officials as part of a "test and trace" procedure. (All teams senior and junior)
- 7. Changing Rooms a maximum of 11 personnel in a changing room at any one time. The home side shall use the changing rooms under the main stand (both the home and away dressing rooms) and the away side shall use



- either the classrooms by the carpark or changing rooms 3 & 4 pitchside as required. (Senior teams only as Junior teams are not using changing rooms at present)
- 8. Showers will be provided with as much ventilation as possible. A maximum of 3 at any one time in the changing room showers under the main stand and 2 in the showers in changing rooms 3 & 4. The choice to use the showers is entirely at the risk of the individual as no firm guidance has been given by the FA or Leagues. (Senior teams only as Junior teams not using changing rooms at present).
- 9. Dugouts to maintain social distancing, there will be a maximum of 3 personnel in each dugout. Chairs are available to sit on adjacent to the dugouts and/or substitutes will sit in the main stand behind the dugouts suitably socially distanced. (All teams Senior and Junior).
- 10. Balls will be disinfected by the home side coaching staff each time a ball is required. (All teams Senior and Junior).
- 11. Water breaks should these be agreed, all players shall use their own water bottle and not share with other players. (All teams Senior and Junior).
