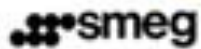

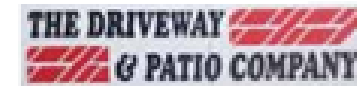

ABINGDON UNITED CLUB HISTORY

The club was formed in 1946 when a group of ex-service men decided that the town could support two football clubs. The first meeting to form the club was held in the local Anchor Public House on the bank of the River Thames, as there were no club facilities. They joined the North Berks League and within two seasons had won its Charity Shield. The following year 1953/54 they won the league and cup finalists. The club had its sights on higher things and five years later entered the Hellenic League. Since then it has remained in this league and during this time had success in the lower divisions. In 1965/66 they won the Division One Challenge Cup and the following season were the cup finalists.

No further honours came the club's way until winning promotion in 1976/77 to the Premier Division. After a struggle at this level, relegation back to Division One came after four seasons. With a more ambitious approach, the club bounced back into the Premier League where it has remained ever since. It also won the Division One Cup in the same promotion year. Senior status was achieved in 1985 allowing it to be eligible for the F.A. Vase, County Senior Cup and in 1989 entered the F.A. Cup for the first time. A Members Room, Function Room, Covered Stand and Floodlighting have been completed in recent years to improve the off pitch facilities. 1996/97 has seen the club complete its 50th season and it's most successful. United won the final of the Berks and Bucks Senior Trophy and also winning the League's Floodlit Cup.

The highest ever league position was attained when finishing as Runners Up in the Hellenic Premier Division. The following season again saw success come to Northcourt Road with retaining the County Senior Trophy, Hellenic League Reserve Championship and Allied Counties Youth League winners. 2001 saw the construction of new changing rooms, together with turnstiles, to the Northcourt Road Ground and 2005 saw the construction of a new 150-seater stand and a covered stand. The club clinched promotion to the Southern League in season 2005/06. The club returned to the Hellenic League in 2013/14. United gained runners-up in Division 1 in season 2016/17 to clinch promotion back to the Hellenic Premier League. The 2017/18 saw the young Development team clinch runners up in the Hellenic Div 2 and also winning the League Challenge cup. The 2017/18 season also saw the introduction of United's first women's team who obtained League promotion in its first season together with the County Cup and League Cup. Season 2018/19 saw the women team progress into the Southern Region League, while the First Team were dropped down to the Hellenic Division 1.



CHIPPING SODBURY CLUB HISTORY

The Sods started playing friendlies in 1885 against teams from Bristol, Swindon and South Gloucestershire. In 1898 the Sods joined the North Bristol & District League Division 1. They later dropped out of the league and continued playing friendlies until the 1905-06 season, when they joined the Wotton & District League as founder members. The Sods played two seasons in this league before again returning to friendly fixtures until the 1911-12 season. For the next 40 years, the Sods played association football on and off and were members of different leagues until they resigned from the Western League Division 2 at the end of the 1952-53 season. The history books also show that Women's Football first began in the town in the 1940's.

In the summer of 1959 Cliff Phelps decided to bring association football back to the town. It had been six long years since the boys had worn the blue and white of Sodbury in the Western League. After several meetings at the Bell Inn (now Brooks Bar & Kitchen) the new club was formed. Major L.M Harris became President, Mr E Purbick Chairman, Mr C. Phelps Vice Chairman, Club Captain was Dennis Greenaway and Youth Captain Michael Boulton. In the 1959/60 season the Sods entered a senior team into the Dursley & Wotton League and a team into the Youth Section. In the following season, the Sods joined the Bristol & District League and throughout the 60's remained in Division 3.

The early 70's didn't get off to a great start and the Sods were relegated from Division 3 and subsequently Division 4. It wasn't until the mid-70's that the Sods luck began to change. Mike Fox became player manager and in the 1976-77 season the Sods finished third in Division 5, which was enough at the time to gain promotion. The 1978-79 season saw the club go one better and finish runners-up in Division 4. To finish the decade and celebrate twenty years of the club's rebirth, the Sods went on to become Division 3 champions and earned promotion to Division 2.

The early 80's saw continued success and a fourth-place finish was enough to give the Sods promotion to the Bristol & District Division 1. The following year saw the Sods secure promotion again, this time to the Bristol & District Senior Division. The Sods did face a relegation from the Senior Division in the 1985 – 86 season but returned in the 1988 – 89 season. Another big success story for this decade was the rebirth of the Reserves Team in the 1981 – 82 season. In just eight years, the Reserves Team achieved six promotions rising from Division 5 to the Senior Division.

The 90's kicked off with a third-place finish and promotion to the Bristol Premier Combination Division 1. In the 1992 – 93 season the Sods achieved a fourth-place finish and were crowned Bristol Premier Combination League Cup Champions. The Sods remained in Division 1 of the Bristol Premier Combination League until securing promotion to the Premier League in the 1999 – 00 season. Another significant milestone for the club was in the early 90's when the club's players and volunteers came together to build the Sods clubhouse and changing rooms.

After three seasons in the Premier Division, the Sods faced relegation in the 2001-02 season. A new era began for the Sods when in the 2002-03 season, former players Les Underdown and his Assistant Jeff Clark took charge. A mid table finish in their first season saw Les leave and Jeff step up. In the 2004-05 season the club launched a third team and in the 2005-06 season the First Team secured promotion back into the Premier Division. The following season saw success for both the Reserves and Third Team, both achieving promotion. The 2007-08 season proved to be another great year for the Sods when the First Team finished as champions of the Premier Combination League and the Reserves Team finished as champions of the Bristol and Dihen under a new Manager and in their first season, the Sods were unfortunate to finish bottom of the County League, however were fortunate to escape relegation. Mark Stenner was soon appointed as the new Manager and tasked with helping the club climb once again.

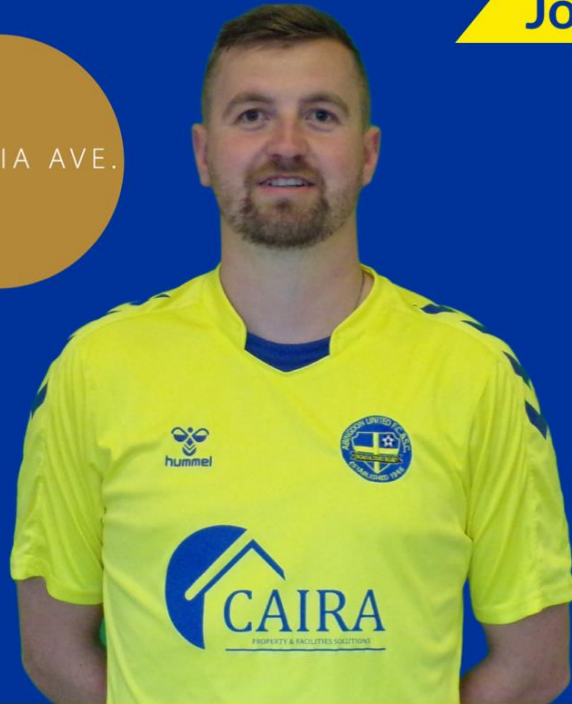
