

Abingdon United • Club History



The club was formed in 1946 when a group of ex-service men decided that the town could support two football clubs. The first meeting to form the club was held in the local Anchor Public House on the bank of the River Thames, as there were no club facilities. They joined the North Berks League and within two seasons had won its Charity Shield. The following year 1953/54 they won the league and cup finalists.

The club had its sights on higher things and five years later entered the Hellenic

League. Since then it has remained in this league and during this time had success in the lower divisions. In 1965/66 they won the Division One Challenge Cup and the following season were the cup finalists.

No further honours came the club's way until winning promotion in 1976/77 to the Premier Division. After a struggle at this level, relegation back to Division One came after four seasons. With a more ambitious approach, the club bounced back into the Premier League where it has remained ever since. It also won the Division One Cup in the same promotion year. Senior status was achieved in 1985 allowing it to be eligible for the F.A. Vase, County Senior Cup and in 1989 entered the F.A. Cup for the first time.

A Members Room, Function Room, Covered Stand and Floodlighting have been completed in recent years to improve the off pitch facilities. 1996/97 has seen the club complete its 50th season and it's most successful. United won the final of the Berks and Bucks Senior Trophy and also winning the League's Floodlit Cup. The highest ever league position was attained when finishing as Runners Up in the Hellenic Premier Division. The following season again saw success come to Northcourt Road with retaining the County Senior Trophy, Hellenic League Reserve Championship and Allied Counties Youth League winners.

In the early days Charles used to play in the Great Western Combi- nation at although little is known about the club's progress back then. From 1950 up until 🛨 the early 1990's, Chalvey competed in the now defunct Slough & District League & over that time the club registered several wins in various senior cup competitions including The Slough Town Senior Cup and The Northkian Senior Cup.

In the 1980's the club were based in the Garibaldi Pub in Chalvey. After a change in landlord, the football club moved to Chalvey Working Men's Club and we then added the W.M.C. to the club name for sponsorship reasons.

The Slough & District League folded after the end of the 1991/92 season and merged with The East Berks Football League and Challey were placed in Division 1. Challey won that league at the first attempt and were then promoted to the Premier Division for the 1993/94 season and won the title 1996/1997. During this period the club had more success in cup competitions and won the East Berks League cup on three occasions and runners up three times. Chabes have also won the Norfalking Senior Cup, Ascot & Fielder. cup and were runners up twice in the Slough Town Senior Cup.

In season 2016/2017, the first team moved to compete in the ukkport Hellenic Football league in Division 2. East in a season that saw the first team win its first league championship in 20 years with 4 matches to spare. It was a feat that was repeated in season 2017/2018 when we retained the League championship we won the year before and



were runners up in the Slough Town Senior Cup. During season 2017/2018, the first team reached a groundshare arrangement with both Slough Borough Council & Slough Town Football Club and saw us play our home matches at the magnificent Arbour Park Stadium. This move has now allowed us to take our deserved promotion to play at step 6 of the National League System for the very first time. This has also allowed our Reserve team to move across from the East, Berks, Football League to play in The ublepost

Hellenic League Division 2 East for season 2018/2019.

THE TOWN OF SLOUGH

Slough (<u>pronounced</u> [slau]) is a town and <u>unitary authority</u> (Borough of Slough) in <u>Berkshire</u>, <u>England</u>. In the 2001 census the <u>population</u> was 119,070 (est. 122,000 in 2006). This, coupled with extensive transport links, makes it one of the most important business centres in the <u>south east</u> of England.

Most of the area was traditionally part of <u>Buckinghamshire</u> and formed over many years by the amalgamation of villages along the <u>Great West Road</u>. The first recorded uses of the name occur as *Slo* in 1196, *Sloo* in 1336, and *Le Slowe, Slowe* or *Slow* in 1437. It first seems to have applied to a hamlet between <u>Upton</u> to the west and <u>Chalvey</u> to the east, roughly around the 'Crown Crossroads' where the road to Windsor (now the A332) met the Great West Road The <u>Domesday</u> Survey of 1086, refers to Upton, and a wood for 200 pigs, worth £15. During the 13th century, King <u>Henry III</u> had a palace in Cippenham. Parts of Upton Court were built in 1325, while St Mary's Church in Langley was probably built in the late 11th or early 12th century, though it has been rebuilt and enlarged several times.

From the mid 17th century, <u>stagecoaches</u> began to pass through Slough and Salt Hill which became locations for the second stage to change horses on the journey out from London. By 1838 and the opening of the <u>Great Western Railway</u>, Upton-cum-Chalvey's parish <u>population</u> had reached 1,502. In 1849, a <u>branch line</u> was completed from Slough Station to Windsor and Eton Central railway station for the Queen's greater convenience.

1918 saw a large area of agricultural land to the west of Slough developed as an army motor repair depot, used to store and repair huge numbers of motor vehicles coming back from <u>First World War</u> in <u>Flanders</u>. In April 1920 the Government sold the site and its contents to the Slough Trading Co. Ltd. Repair of ex-army vehicles continued until 1925 when the Slough Trading Company Act was passed allowing the company (renamed <u>Slough Estates Ltd</u>) to establish the world's first <u>Industrial Estate</u> Spectacular growth and employment ensued, with Slough attracting workers from many parts of the UK and abroad. After the <u>Second World War</u>, several further large housing developments arose to take large numbers of people migrating from war-damaged London.

Slough was incorporated into Berkshire in the 1974 local government reorganisation. The old Municipal Borough was abolished and replaced by a Non-metropolitan district authority, which was made a Borough by the town's second Royal Charter Slough has a strong rivalry with local neighbouring town, Staines. Both are located near Heathrow and vie for out-of-town businesses moving from London. Ali G, a fictional resident of Staines, often pokes fun at Slough and sports teams of both towns enjoy a strong rivalry. Slough has produced many Olympic class athletes as part of the "Windsor, Slough, Eton and Hounslow Athletics Club". Slough has 42 parks and open spaces plus an ice skating arena where Jayne Torvill and Christopher Dean once trained.

According to the Campaign to Protect Rural England (CPRE) in 2006, Slough is England's least tranquil area.

Slough has been the subject of much derision. Some references are mentioned above. However, the BBC aired a four-part series called 'Making Slough Happy', where a team of experts attempted to bring happiness to the whole town. Despite complaints by some residents who said "the series was not particularly representative of the diversity of Slough", this can be contradicted because the sample "50" did provide a cross section of Slough with different ethnic minorities and age groups represented. However, most of the criticism was seen to come from people within Slough while the majority of people outside Slough thought it was quite good, overall it did make a big impact and raised people's awareness of Slough as a whole Slough-raised comedian Jimmy Carr said: "I was born in Slough in the 1970s, if you want to know what Slough was like in the 1970s, go there now".
