



Abingdon United • Club History



The club was formed in 1946 when a group of ex-service men decided that the town could support two football clubs. The first meeting to form the club was held in the local Anchor Public House on the bank of the River Thames, as there were no club facilities. They joined the North Berks League and within two seasons had won its Charity Shield. The following year 1953/54 they won the league and cup finalists.

The club had its sights on higher things and five years later entered the Hellenic

League. Since then it has remained in this league and during this time had success in the lower divisions. In 1965/66 they won the Division One Challenge Cup and the following season were the cup finalists.

No further honours came the club's way until winning promotion in 1976/77 to the Premier Division. After a struggle at this level, relegation back to Division One came after four seasons. With a more ambitious approach, the club bounced back into the Premier League where it has remained ever since. It also won the Division One Cup in the same promotion year. Senior status was achieved in 1985 allowing it to be eligible for the F.A. Vase, County Senior Cup and in 1989 entered the F.A. Cup for the first time.

A Members Room, Function Room, Covered Stand and Floodlighting have been completed in recent years to improve the off pitch facilities. 1996/97 has seen the club complete its 50th season and it's most successful. United won the final of the Berks and Bucks Senior Trophy and also winning the League's Floodlit Cup. The highest ever league position was attained when finishing as Runners Up in the Hellenic Premier Division. The following season again saw success come to Northcourt Road with retaining the County Senior Trophy, Hellenic League Reserve Championship and Allied Counties Youth League winners.

Abingdon Town • Club History

The club was established as Abingdon Football Club in 1870. In 1892 they joined the Oxford & District League. After absorbing St Michaels in 1899, they went on to win back-to-back league titles in the next two seasons. After the second title the club joined the Berks & Bucks League, but left after a single season to join the West Berks League. In 1904 they changed leagues again, this time transferring to the Reading Temperance League.

The club play at Culham Road. A stand was built in 1928 and two years later the club were able to buy the ground for £300 (Then sold and leased back in the early 2000's). The stand burnt down following an Easter Monday game soon after World War II and was replaced in 1948.

A covered terrace was built in 1950. The pitch was later rotated 90° and a new main stand built in 1991, with its seats taken from the original Wembley Stadium. One end of the ground has covered standing, with an open terrace at the other end. The ground has a capacity of 3,000, of which 1,771 is covered and 271 seater

In 1919 Abingdon joined the North Berks League, going on to win the league title at the first attempt. After a second championship win in 1922–23 the club switched to the Reading & District League. In 1928 they became Abingdon Town. After a third-place finish in Division One in 1931–32 the club were promoted to the Premier Division. Although they finished bottom of the table in the next two seasons they were not relegated. They finished bottom again in 1936–37, after which they transferred into the Oxfordshire Senior League for a season (in which they also finished last), before returning to the North Berks League in 1938.

Following World War II Abingdon Town rejoined the Reading & District League in 1945. They were runners-up in 1946–47 after losing a championship play-off to Thatcham Town. However, the following season saw the club win the league. In 1950 they moved up to the Spartan League, in which they played for three seasons before becoming founder members of the Hellenic League in 1953. When the league gained a second division in 1956 the club were placed in the Premier Division and went on to win the division in its first season. They were champions again in 1958–59, also winning the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup, and retained the league title the following season.

After their back-to-back titles, Abingdon's success diminished and in 1965–66 the club finished bottom of the Premier Division and were relegated to Division One. The following season saw them finish as Division One runners-up, earning an immediate promotion back to the Premier Division. Although they went on to be runners-up in both 1970–71 and 1971–72, the club finished bottom of the division again in 1974–75, resulting in relegation back to Division One. However, another immediate return was achieved as they won Division One at the first attempt, losing only one league match all season.

Abingdon Town were Premier Division champions for a fourth time in 1986–87, and after finishing second the following season, they returned to the Spartan League, joining its Premier Division. The club won the Spartan League at the first attempt, earning promotion to Division Two South of the Isthmian League. They were Division One South champions in 1990–91 and were promoted to Division One. After seven seasons in Division One the club were relegated to Division Two at the end of the 1997–98 season. The following season they were relegated again, this time to Division Two. The club returned to Division Two when the league was restructured in 2002, although it was effectively a rename of Division Three.

Despite a seventh-place finish in Division Two in 2004–05, Abingdon Town dropped into the Premier Division of the Hellenic League. The next nine seasons saw the club struggle, finishing outside the bottom four on only three occasions. In 2013–14 the club ended the season in last place in the Premier Division, subsequently dropping two divisions into Division One of the North Berks League.

The club was inactive during the 2016–17 season, but returned to the uhlsport Hellenic League for the 2017–18 season, joining Division Two East, which was largely composed of reserve teams. They moved up to Division One East prior to the 2018–19 season.

THE HUMBLE GOAL POSTS

The original incarnation of association football didn't involve a crossbar. The FA's Laws of the Game, introduced in 1863, initially stated that a goal should be 'two upright posts, eight yards apart, without any tape or bar across them'. However, other sets of rules did require a tape or cord to be strung between the two goalposts.

In a match between Charterhouse and Crusaders in January 1863, Charterhouse's Kenneth Muir Mackenzie shot just over the 'cord', and appealed that it should have been a goal. 'Some unfortunate accident had happened to the pegs which tightened the cord,' reported Bell's Life, 'so that it was hanging slack, and deviating considerably from the straight line, and would not admit the ball under the required limits.'

In 1866, after a peculiar incident in which a goal was scored at Reigate, when the kicker 'raised the ball quite 90 feet in the air between the goal-posts', the FA changed its rules to add the requirement for a tape. Solid crossbars began to be used in the 1870s, but, it wasn't until 1882 that the updated Laws of the Game required every club to provide crossbars.

In the winter of 1887-88, an FA Cup fourth round replay between Crewe Alexandra and Swifts was ordered to be replayed again due to an argument over a crossbar. The initial match was played at Crewe, and an end-to-end game finished as a 2-2 draw. However, tempers were high, with Swifts claiming Crewe had played 'none too fair a game'.

The replay, at the Oval on the following Saturday, involved 'some very exciting play', and the Swifts triumphed 3-2. However, Crewe subsequently lodged an appeal with the FA, claiming that one of the crossbars was a full two inches lower than the required height.

The FA duly ordered another replay, two weeks later, at the neutral venue of the County Ground in Derby. In unfavourable conditions, the game was 'by no means a brilliant one'. Crewe had an early goal disallowed for offside (although 'some of the spectators avowed that the umpire was mistaken'), but eventually won 2-1. Swifts went out, and Crewe went through – eventually reaching the semi-final.

Referee's Trivia

Refs blow whistle on Hanky days

In football's early days referees had to signal their decisions by waving a handkerchief rather than blowing a whistle. This obviously flawed practice, of course, relied on the players looking in the ref's direction in order to appreciate their sporting semaphore. Salvation thankfully arrived from the unlikely source of Birmingham based toolmaker Joseph Hudson, who invented the pea whistle in 1860. The new invention was quickly taken up by the police to replace their cumbersome hand rattles. Football soon followed suit, and in 1878 Hudson and Co unveiled the 'Acme Thunderer', a whistle specifically designed for sporting occasions. Hudsons have now manufactured more than 160 million Thunderers.

Offside change

In 1925 the FA attempted to avert a rise in what it considered defensive tactics by changing the offside law to favour the attacking side. The change meant that two rather than three defenders now needed to be ahead of the most advanced attacker for a player to be onside. The FA's efforts proved an instant success, with 1,600 more League goals scored in the first season after the change.

Hill takes the Flag

On 16 September 1972 Jimmy Hill stepped down from his position in the commentary box at Highbury to take over the duties of an injured linesman during a league match between Arsenal and Liverpool. Hill, a qualified referee, volunteered to run the line after Dennis Drewitt was unable to continue. The match ended in a goalless draw, but without Hill's intervention it would have been abandoned.


