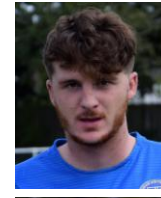

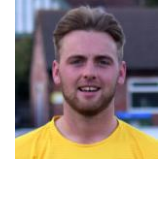

Abingdon United • Club History



The club was formed in 1946 when a group of ex-service men decided that the town could support two football clubs. The first meeting to form the club was held in the local Anchor Public House on the bank of the River Thames, as there were no club facilities. They joined the North Berks League and within two seasons had won its Charity Shield. The following year 1953/54 they won the league and cup finalists.

The club had its sights on higher things and five years later entered the Hellenic

League. Since then it has remained in this league and during this time had success in the lower divisions. In 1965/66 they won the Division One Challenge Cup and the following season were the cup finalists.

No further honours came the club's way until winning promotion in 1976/77 to the Premier Division. After a struggle at this level, relegation back to Division One came after four seasons. With a more ambitious approach, the club bounced back into the Premier League where it has remained ever since. It also won the Division One Cup in the same promotion year. Senior status was achieved in 1985 allowing it to be eligible for the F.A. Vase, County Senior Cup and in 1989 entered the F.A. Cup for the first time.

A Members Room, Function Room, Covered Stand and Floodlighting have been completed in recent years to improve the off pitch facilities. 1996/97 has seen the club complete its 50th season and it's most successful. United won the final of the Berks and Bucks Senior Trophy and also winning the League's Floodlit Cup. The highest ever league position was attained when finishing as Runners Up in the Hellenic Premier Division. The following season again saw success come to Northcourt Road with retaining the County Senior Trophy, Hellenic League Reserve Championship and Allied Counties Youth League winners.

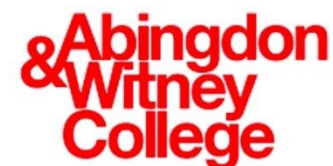

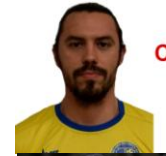

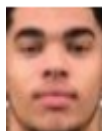

AFC Aldermaston • Club History

Our club was founded as AWRE Football Club in 1952 by Charles Green, Ted Hall, Gordon Carter, and Don Sharp, and were nicknamed "The Atom Men" after the newly founded Atomic Weapons Research Establishment. As the AWRE complex was still under construction when the club was established, the players used empty contractors' huts as changing rooms – carrying the tin bath into whichever building was designated for that day's football. The players were also responsible for the pitch, and would mow and mark out the pitch before the match started. The club received support from Sir William Penney during his work at AWRE on the Operation Hurricane project.



In the late 1960s/early 1970s, we changed our name, to AFC Aldermaston. In 1979 we were promoted from the Reading & District League into Division One of the Hellenic League, where we spent the next seven seasons. From 1988 until 1991 we played in local football leagues, including the North Hampshire League, before joining Division Three of the Hampshire League in 1991. We finished fifth in the first season, earning promotion to Division Two. However, we were soon relegated back to Division Three the following season, where we remained until 1999. When the Hampshire League was re-organised prior to the 1999–2000 season, we were placed in the Premier Division.

When the Hampshire and Wessex Leagues merged in 2004, we became members of Division Two of the Wessex League. At the end of the 2004–05 season we suffered relegation. The division was renamed Division Two in 2006, and was disbanded at the end of the 2006–07 season, and as a result we moved up back up to Division One. 2009–10 season, was our worst season and during a very difficult time we lost 40 consecutive games, which broke the previous record of 39 straight losses held jointly by Stockport United and Poole Town. The 40th defeat came on 8 April 2010, a 2–0 loss to Downton. This was undoubtedly the worst time for the club in living memory, and it took a great effort to keep going at this time. The losing streak thankfully came to an end on 10 April 2010, when we club drew 1–1 against Warminster Town, and then finally winning the next match against Petersfield Town 2–1 win for Aldermaston, to provide a much needed boost for all of us at that difficult time.

Unsurprisingly, we finished bottom of Division One with just the one win in 40 matches, and were relegated to the Hampshire Premier League, where played for four seasons before moving to the Thames Valley Premier League for season 2014-15, when we reached the final of the Berks & Bucks Intermediate Cup, which we narrowly lost 2-1 to Hale Leys Utd, the final of the Reading Senior Cup played at the Madjeski which we lost 1-0 to champions Marlow Utd, and the final of the Basingstoke Senior Cup where we lost to our local rivals Tadley Colleya 2-1 AET. 2015-16 season we finished seventh in the TVPL Premier Division, and again reaching the final of the Reading Senior Cup only to be beaten in a fourth final 1-0 to Cookham Dean. We made a welcome return to Step 6 football as we were promoted to Division One East of the Hellenic League. 2016-17 saw us finish 7th in the Hellenic League this matched our highest ever finish at Step 6 football. 2017-18 season saw us finish 11th in the Hellenic League. 2018-19 season saw us finish 3rd in the Hellenic League this beat 2016-17 seasons highest ever finish. This was well deserved by everyone connected to the club. Also getting to the Reading Challenge Cup Final at the Madjeski Stadium which saw us lose 5-0 to Hellenic Premier League Winners Wantage Town and collecting the runners up medals. We are hoping to improve on last season's 3rd place finish for the 2019-20 season.

Off the field we have added a 4th Adult Team which will be a Development Team for Saturday's and started a Sunday Team as well as an Adult Ladies football team. Our Youth section is growing year after year and we are now starting to see the Youth team players make the step into Saturday adult football which is pleasing to see as a club.

Last Season action against AFC Aldermaston



. HISTORY OF THE TOWN OF ABINGDON

(NORTHCOURT, BARTON AND SHIPPON)

Barton is down Radley Road. Before all the houses were built, the area around Barton Court Farm was originally a large Roman villa. A smaller building stood opposite and there were grain dryers nearby.. When the Romans left our shores, the villa was apparently left in a state of advanced decay. Very early Saxon settlers quickly moved in. By the time of the Norman conquest the area had grown into a small village worthy of note in the Domesday Survey (1086), where its name appears to apply to the whole area around Abingdon.

Shippon, north-west of the town, was *Sipene* at Domesday: this is the *Serpen Hill* on which a battle supposedly took place between the Saxons & the Danes in the 9th century. and Abingdon and its abbey were burnt to the ground. At least some of the local militia seem therefore to have put up some resistance.

The FitzHarris estate is only just north of central Abingdon. King William gave the area to a Norman knight called Owen, just after the Conquest. The motte of [his castle](#) can still be seen off Kingston Close. The name comes from Hugh FitzHarry who lived there in the 13th century. He wasn't a popular man locally since he imposed huge fines on people when their livestock strayed onto his property. He eventually sold up to [Abingdon Abbey](#). However, at the last moment, he was somewhat reluctant to leave and the monks had to call in a professional negotiator. [FitzHarris House](#) was later built immediately south-west of the old motte and became the residence of the Tesdale and Bostock families. After the Second World War, it became a girl's school but this did not last and the mansion was demolished in 1953. It is now a green with 'Harwell' houses around it.

Though owned by [Abingdon Abbey](#), [Northcourt](#) was always a small village to the north, completely separate from the town. Only in recent years have the two merged. As the name suggests, this was the 'North Court' or 'Grange' of the abbey, a farm where agricultural produce was grown The harvest would have been stored in the great 12th century tithe barn which still exists today next to Abingdon United football club. Appropriately, it was converted into a church in 1961. The grange was always an important part of the abbey's estate and it was therefore the first target of the Oxford mob when they marched south to join the people of Abingdon in their [Great Riot](#) against the power of the Abbot in 1327. They burnt many buildings and drove out all monks and their tenants. Barton Court was the home of the great Reade family. They were keen Royalists and, during the Civil War, King Charles I was entertained at their home on a number of occasions by Sir Thomas Reade. It was from here that the King said goodbye to Queen Henrietta Maria for the last time, before her journey to Exeter and France in April 1644. After Abingdon fell to the Roundheads, Sir Thomas' grandson, Compton, had to lead the defence of their house until it "was burnt over his head", probably in March 1646. Barton was left in ruins and the Reades did not return. Timbers from the house featuring Parliamentary bullet holes were reused in the nearby Barton Court Farm and the Bowyer family later built a replacement mansion that was pulled down in the 1970s.
