

Adam Canning gives us his views:

Good afternoon and welcome to The Crofts for what is a very important game for the 1st XV.

We started the season well with two fairly convincing wins (in the end!), against newly promoted Burbage and Coventry Welsh, but these wins came at a cost with a number of key players added to our already long list of injuries.

Injuries are a part of the game and all teams at all levels will suffer but I've never seen anything like the bad luck we're having over the last 12 months. It does make you wonder as a coach if there's anything we can and should be doing differently in training but when you're only together for a few hours a week you have to rely on the players to be working on their strength and conditioning away from the club.

It wasn't our day and we agreed that fitness and tackling lower were our key areas for improvement so hopefully we should benefit from two weeks of really hard work since then against an always physical Manor Park.



We agreed that we wouldn't get carried away when we won, nor when we lost, this season so there was no overreaction after the Ledbury defeat.

We've got a competitive squad of skilled players who are developing all the time so fingers crossed we will bounce back to winning ways today.

Fantastic OLRFC Mini Festival full of sunshine and smiles from everyone involved

On Sunday 6th October 2019 Old Leamingtonians Rugby Club hosted yet another (11th) bonanza Rugby Festival for local Mini age groups. 68 teams from 9 different clubs had a marvellous day of tournament rugby involving all age groups from under 7's to under 12's.

In all there were around 700 players supported by an army of 70+ volunteers who very successfully managed the Car Parking, Catering, Marshalling and Refereeing at the Crofts on Bericote Road.

The rugby was run under the RFU core values of teamwork, respect, enjoyment, discipline and sportsmanship and was incredibly well supported by local businesses as well as Premiership Club Wasps who sent along two of their players, Sam Wolstenholme and Ben Morris. The Wasps players visited every pitch, talked to players and gave them real encouragement to support the game into the future.

At least 8 players from the OLs 1st XV were also engaged in spreading the rugby gospel across the whole of the Crofts domain and their contribution was much appreciated by players and parents alike.

A raffle with gifts donated by local businesses such as a signed Lions shirt, a Wasps shirt signed by all the team and Wasps match day tickets plus many other entertainment prizes raised £1000 which will be used to invest in the development of mini and junior players to assist them in making the transition to

The catering operation run by the volunteers served breakfasts and after that bacon and sausage burgers and tea and coffee all day. The weather was gentle autumnal sunshine for the whole of the tournament and all of the logistics ran smoothly."

MATCH REPORTS

League: Midlands 3 West (South) Saturday 21st September 2019 Fixture: Old Leamingtonians RFC 1st XV v Coventry Welsh RFC 1st XV Result: Old Leamingtonians RFC 1st XV 45 - 19 Coventry Welsh RFC 1st XV

Venue: The Crofts, Bericote Road

Another six try haul saw OLs continue their good start to the new season with a comfortable win over Coventry Welsh but it was not as easy as the score might suggest.

The match kicked off under a blazing September sun and the first half saw the home side taking advantage with high balls into the visiting defence that kept the game firmly camped inside the Coventry Welsh half of the field.

The Old Leams three-quarters were again in good form and the ball was constantly being played out wide committing Coventry Welsh to full time defence. On the eight minute mark a flowing move by the OLs backs was finished by winger Calum Semple who crossed for the first of OLs six tries. The conversion was successful. Two minutes later fly half Bradley James scored the best try of the game when he collected the ball 40 metres from the visitors' goal line and seeing a gap in the defence cut through for a searing run to touch down between the posts. He converted his own score to push OLs into a 14 point advantage. Five minutes later OLs added a third try, this time coming from another flowing three-quarter move that saw right wing Liam Wellings crash through three defending tackles to touch down. Again the conversion was successful.

The game was continued with Coventry Welsh using crash ball tactics that forced OLs onto the defence and saw the visitors come more into the game but an infringement by the visiting pack gave Brad James the opportunity to increase the home side lead with a well taken 40 metre penalty. With half time approaching OLs went off the boil and allowed Coventry Welsh to enjoy a period of dominance that resulted in the visiting forwards claiming a late first half try that was converted to bring



the half time whistle with OLs enjoying a lead of 24 points to 7.

The second half started with Coventry Welsh again dictating play through their forwards and crash ball tactics but it was OLs that claimed the next score when centre Henry Reynolds intercepted a pass and ran the ball in for try number four between the posts. The conversion followed.

The game continued with OLs playing whole team rugby and resisting the crash bang game of the visitors. The period of Coventry Welsh dominance came to an abrupt end when winger Liam Wellings collected the ball way out right inside his own half and then made a searing cross field run evading desperate tackles from the visiting defence to touch down for try number five. This was also converted by Bradley James. With 15 minutes of the match remaining it seemed that OLs thought they had done enough and they allowed Coventry Welsh back into the game. This was a costly period for OLs as Coventry Welsh responded with two tries in five minutes, one of which was converted to reduce the lead.

Coventry Welsh continued to dominate the final ten minutes but their commitment to attack left their defence short which allowed wing forward Andrew O'Toole to collect a spilled ball and run in try number six from 40 metres. This final try was converted to give fly half Bradley James a 19 point match haul.

This was another fine display from OLs playing total rugby with half backs Toby Lord and Bradley James having outstanding games.

MATCH REPORTS

League: Midlands 3 West (South) Saturday October 5th 2019 Fixture: Ledbury RFC 1st XV v Old Learningtonians RFC 1st XV Result: Ledbury RFC 29 - 17 Old Leamiongtonians RFC 1st XV

Venue: Ross Road, Ledbury

After two excellent winning league matches OLs away trip tip to Ledbury in Gloucestershire was always going to be a test with a number of senior players out through injury. The referee on this occasion was the daughter of Warwickshire Ref Kindy Devlin, down in Gloucestershire at college.

Playing up hill in the first session OLs found it difficult to escape from their imprisonment in their own half and it wasn't more than five minutes before Ledbury put together a fine passing movement which outflanked the OL defence to allow them to cross the line wide out on the left. The conversion was slotted by Ledbury 10 Jamie Rayfield. making it an early 7 - 0 to the home side.

Even when Old Leamingtonians did break out into Ledbury territory, handling errors and poor decision making quickly put them back downfield. Nevertheless they doggedly got back into attacking mode and from a well won ruck in the Ledbury 22 the ball was shipped to centre Liam Wellings who powered his way over for a try out on the left side. The conversion was missed and the score moved to 7-5.

OLs lost the ball at the restart, regained it and then kicked away possession following which they conceded a penalty just outside their 22 which was converted by Rayfield to increase the home side lead to 5 points.

After 25minutes OLs 12. Ciaran O'Connor left the field with a head injury, his place taken by Simon Hemming. No further points were added in the half with the score at 10 -5. OLs also lost second row, Joe Talamini to a head injury, replaced by Tom Smith.

OLs playing downhill now really got into the game with their set scrum completely overpowering their opposition.



They drove down to the Ledbury 5 metre line, recycled the ball from a maul and Wellings almost got over the line. Again the ball was recovered and fly half Henry Reynolds cut through to score under the posts. He converted his own try making the score 10 -- 12.

Again OLs went on the attack from the restart and won a penalty which they used to get them a line-out inside Ledbury's 22. From subsequent forward drives Tom Smith got a one handed try right in the corner of the left field. The score was now 10 - 17.

The OL supporters believed that this was the turning point and were looking forward to further scores down the hill. Ledbury had other ideas and large holes in the OL defensive line-up allowed Ledbury right back up-field from where they handled well to arrive under the OL posts for another converted try which brought them level at 17 - 17.

After this OLs went back downfield and won a penalty outside the Ledbury 22. The kick was missed and from this point on Old Leamingtonians made a multitude of handling errors. Instead of using their superior forward power they tried to throw the ball wide with disastrous consequences.

Ledbury scored again out on the left (not converted) and shortly after completed another attack by scoring just right of the sticks giving them a bonus point and allowing Rayfield an easy conversion to bring the score to 29 -- 17.

Having been in the lead around 15 minutes from time OLs will rue their poor defence, poor ball handling and poor decision making which caused them to lose a game they should have won.

I am pleased to welcome our Patrons who have gathered at the club once again and hope that they will offer fantastic support for our lads following another successful lunch here at The Crofts.


On behalf of the club I also welcome the management. players and supporters of our league opponents today Manor Park RFC.

Manor Park had a good away win at Daventry last weekend in the third round of the RFU Midlands Senior Vase competition by 17pts – 21pts and are the sole surviving Warwickshire club going into the next round which will be the quarter-finals scheduled for 30th November. In the RFU Junior Vase both Claverdon and Harbury lost their respective home ties in the third round and with Rugby Welsh also losing Warwickshire will have no representation in the last eight of this competition.

In the third round of the RFU Intermediate Cup, Stratfordupon-Avon lost at Leighton Buzzard and Leamington conceded their tie at Malvern being unable to field a front row. Barker Butts went down at Northampton Old Scouts and Silhillians lost at Stafford. Only Old Laurentians managed to win their match at home against Leicester Forest and thereby proceed to the guarter final stages. So, only two Warwickshire teams remaining in the quarterfinal draws from the last 24 teams in the Midlands across three competitions. I can't remember a season when our county representation was as low as this approaching the

In the league Manor Park have played three, won two, lost one, having beaten Ledbury away, something we failed to do last time out. They have however lost away at Woodrush by 10pt – 26pt and most recently at home to a strong Old Coventrians outfit who currently sit at the top of the table with a full 15 points from their three games to date.

Having lost to Ledbury our lads will be seeking a return



to the rugby which saw us score forty points in each of our two opening league games. There is no doubt today's game will be a stern test for us and we need to perform well particularly as we have to travel to Old Coventrians ourselves the following weekend. This too promises to be an uncompromising match if previous clashes are anything to go by. Equally a win for Manor Park today would bolster their hopes for that weekend when they entertain currently unbeaten Rugby St Andrews at Heath End Road

We also welcome Lewis Lacev from Durham, the match official for today's match and hope that he is able to oversee an open and incident free encounter. Whatever the outcome of the match I hope that you all enjoy your day at The Crofts today.


