Good afternoon and welcome to Kirklington Road for today's fixture against Dunkirk

Since my last dialogue with you all we have played 3 times. Clifton away saw us come away with defeat. In truth the wind controlled and ruined the game with both teams getting a huge advantage shooting to one goal. Losing 3-2 and taking no points from the game we sent Levo up for a corner. The ball fell to Fletcher and the keeper managed to make a great save only for them to break and score and leave us with the same points total from the game 0. One of those moments in football where you either get applauded or criticised. We took the latter but the outcome remained the same. When in truth both teams would have been happy with 1 point each.

However I write this with mixed feelings after the previous 2 games. 1 win and 1 defeat keeps us above the target of 1.33 points per game needed but in truth things could and should be so much more different. A week on from the win away against Holwell, we played top of the league Bourne and both performances summed up our season perfectly

Away at Holwell, we ran hard, dug in when needed and took chances we created, could have scored more and walked off the pitch gutted to have conceded after they hadn't really tested Levo in goal. Our next game saw us travel to Bourne and the instructions were simple. play on the front foot, keep your interest levels high, stay consistent in your performance and a reminder that although people were there that would give us no chance, Bourne are only the same level in the pyramid as us so we had nothing to worry about

This was visible on the pitch until we did what we have done all season and shot ourselves in the foot 4 mistakes, leading directly to goals and players not being honest about carrying injuries meant that we faced an uphill struggle AGAIN

Today we welcome Dunkirk, a team who we have played twice this season already. They are on the back of a great run of 9 unbeaten and sit inside the top 5. We know exactly what they bring and it's up to us to combat that and deliver our best. A warm welcome goes to all Dunkirk, supporters, officials and players hope you enjoy today's game

I will finish with this. 14 cup finals remain. You deserve us to give 100% every game and I will be getting that across to the lads before every single game and training session. Up the Wrens Hope you enjoy the game

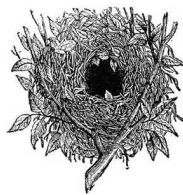

The weather impacted on our January programme and we only managed to play three games. After a mixed display against Kirby Muxloe there was a much improved display against Clifton All Whites. Unfortunately Storm Jocelyn played its part and after going in leading 2-1 at half time the gale force winds made the second half an uphill task and we eventually lost 4-2. In truth we gifted their fourth and had one cleared off the line and also hit the crossbar.

February started with the expected defeat at league leaders Bourne Town, although the manner of the defeat was disappointing. For the opening 19 minutes we matched them and then a self inflicted defensive howler gifted them the opener. Nine minutes later and another avoidable error gifted them a second and the game was effectively over as a contest. You can't gift the top side in the league and expect anything and so it proved as they turned on the power in the second half and we ended up losing 6-0.

In truth the Bourne game won't define our chances of surviving relegation there are quite a few six pointers in the remaining fourteen matches. However it's easy to write them down we have to go out on the pitch and achieve the victories required. The season has been full of false dawns and now is the time to put a run of performances together.

The weather forecasts for this month predict more disruption and the likelihood for two or three matches a week for some teams looms large. As for the weather affecting the games, it definitely affected the 'T' Bar last month, when a pipe to the main water tank failed. With water cascading through the ceiling only prompt action by some of the committee prevented an even bigger disaster. I would like to thank Les, Kevin, Gary and Matt for their efforts on that Friday night.

Dunkirk FC

History

Dunkirk FC were founded in 1946 and their nickname is "The Boatmen". The first league they joined was the Notts Amateur League, of which they were members until 1975. They won the Premier Division in that season, the clubs first major honour. Accepted into the Notts Alliance League, they got off to a good start, eventually finishing runners up, five years later they were champions.

In the 1997/98 season they finished in 4th place and won the League Cup beating Clipstone Welfare 2-0 in the final at Hucknall Town. In 1998/99 season Dunkirk secured runners up spot again snatching it from Goole on the last day of the season with a 2-0 win over South Normanton. The high expectations for the 1999/2000 season never materialised with the club finishing in 6th position in the league. The 2000/01 season saw the Boatmen's worst season in the Supreme Division finishing 10th.

2002/03 saw the Boatmen beat Sutton Town on penalties to win the Floodlit Cup and also reach the league cup final losing though 2-0 to Dinnington Town At Alfreton Towns ground. Dave Harbottle took over the reins as player/manager and quickly drafted former Dunkirk player Wayne Manners as his Assistant, in which they guided the club to 6th in the league Table.

The 2004/05 season may be the greatest season in history for the Boatmen, winning the Central Midlands Supreme Division for the Very First time and also reaching the Floodlit Cup and the League cup final. They lifted the Floodlit Cup for the second time in three years.

The 2008-09 season gave Dunkirk a taste of what life was like in step 6 football and they went into the 2009-10 campaign with huge expectations that silverware would again be returning to Lenton Lane. The campaign though started with 3 defeats in their opening 6 matches but they then went on a 30 game unbeaten record which pushed them into second place in the table but with leaders Bardon Hill Sports playing 8 games more than "the Boatmen" and with an 18 point lead with 16 games remaining a huge effort from Dunkirk was needed. The expectations that the club set themselves though was met when they saw the season out with 9 straight league wins to take the East Midland Counties title by 6 points over nearest contenders and runners up Gresley F.C. This gave the club the opportunity to gain promotion and they were accepted into the Midland Alliance Football League which is a step 5 league in the football pyramid which will be the clubs first time in this level of football. As well as league success the club also had good cup runs when they reached the third round of the F.A Vase when they narrowly lost out in a dramatic penalty shootout against Pickering Town after a replay. They also reached the semi-finals of the Nottinghamshire Senior Cup when they crashed out against Unibond League highflyers Retford United 4-0. In the East Midland Counties League Cup "the Boatmen" who are well known for League Cup success reached the final again when they faced Gedling Town but unfortunately they returned home with runners-up medals as Gedling snatched the tie with an Extra-time 2-1 victory.

The 2011/12 season though saw them find themselves in an unfamiliar position as they struggled near the lower reaches of the division, only just avoiding relegation during the last few weeks of the season finally finishing in 18th position. The reserves claimed the Central Midlands League Reserve League Cup with a 2-1 win against Radford Reserves that was played at Long Eaton United's ground. The club rebuilt again during the 2012/13 season but inconsistency was their main problem throughout the season.

They did however finish in a creditable 10th position winning 18 of their 42 matches losing 16 and drawing 8. The reserves side under the guidance of Mark Harbottle claimed silverware for the second season in concession as they won the Central Midlands League Reserve Supreme Division with a very young side. Dunkirk though are once again on the lookout for a new chairman as David Johnson has had to resign from his position due to work commitments. Craig Smith has taken on this role as a temporary measure but any interested parties who feel they can push the club onto the next level should contact any of the club officials. The 2013/14 Season was a struggle throughout and in January 2014 long term managers David Harbottle and Ian Upton decided to step away from their position and in came Leigh Grant and Kuki Morley as joint Managers. Although the club continued to struggle they did however manage avoid relegation on the final day of the season claiming a point at home against AFC Wulfrunians.

After a tough start to the 2014-15 season managers Leigh Grant and Kuki Morley resigned from their positions as joint managers. The club acted quickly and appointed former captain Nick Hawkins as manager. The club's form continued to be poor as they languished in the bottom 3 at Christmas only having 12 points on the table but a miraculous change in fortunes and team morale occurred as for the second season running the club somehow escaped relegation on the final day of the season as they beat Shepshed Dynamo 1-0 to retain their step 5 status. The Reserve team disbanded at the end of the 2014-15 season but a new team named Dunkirk AFC was created in its place that will play in the Nottinghamshire Senior League Premier Division.

The 2015/16 season was a disaster for the first team as throughout the season they had 4 managers in charge in a very miserable campaign. The fourth manager that arrived though was former player Paul Rawden who knew he had a big job on his hands to try and save the club from the drop but after a late flourish of wins it wasn't enough and the club were ultimately relegated to the East Midlands Counties League after finishing third from bottom. Although the first team struggled the newly formed AFC team had a splendid season as this side made up of mainly youngsters remained competitive throughout the campaign and managed to claim wins over some of the more established sides in the Nottinghamshire Senior League along the way. If we can keep hold of these players a bright future looks in store for the club.

Jocelyn and Naivety Thwart Rainworth

Clifton All Whites 4 v 2 Rainworth MWFC

With a swirling wind at their backs Rainworth deservedly led 2-1 at half time against Clifton All Whites and in truth it should have been more.

The second half was a different story with storm Jocelyn at full force their task became much harder. To their credit they pushed Clifton all the way, but a moment of pure 'naivety' resonated with the travelling support. Trailing 3-2 and with 5 minutes remaining Rainworth inexplicably brought up their keeper and their last man to the edge of the penalty area for a corner.

With storm Jocelyn at its height and at Clifton's backs the gale force winds made accuracy almost impossible and when the ball was cleared Clifton's centre forward had the easiest of tasks of placing the ball in the empty net.

That frustration was compounded when three minutes later Blake Goucher's free kick beat everyone but came back off the lower part of the crossbar. If that ball had hit the back of the net instead of the crossbar it would have been 4-3 and that naive act previously would have cost us dear.

Rainworth started well but in the 8th minute were caught out when an excellent ball by Wayde Hines found the unmarked Isaac Morledge who made no mistake with his header to open the scoring.

The scores were nearly level in the 17th minute when a mix up between Jake Want and Jack Reid, saw the latter's heavy back pass beat the keeper and fly inches past the near upright. Clifton's relief was short lived when from the resultant corner George McKernan hooked it into the top corner for the equaliser.

Rainworth continued to press and in the 25th minute after an excellent build up Brook's goal bound effort was deflected for a corner. From the resultant corner Liam Arnold's powerful header flew inches over. Four minutes later Mason Gee's free kick troubled Want who managed to punch it out for a throw in.

A minute later and excellent passing move saw Oliver Brown drag his effort wide. The pressure now was relentless, and Brooks put his header inches over from close range. Brooks went even closer when he forced Want into an excellent full length save to tip his effort around the post. From the corner Arnold was inches away from connecting with Brown's cross.

In the 37th minute Brooks pulled his effort wide of the far upright with Want beaten. The Clifton goal had another close call when Connor Dimaio's volley from Brooks cross went inches wide.

Rainworth got their deserved goal in the final minute of the half after an unsuccessful attempt to stop Brooks breaking on goal he succeeded in bringing him down inside the area and the referee had no hesitation in pointing to the spot. Brooks stepped up and gave Want no chance to put Rainworth in the lead. At the half time whistle the Rainworth faithful thought they were at least a couple of goals shy of what their play should have brought.

The second half reminded them why when Jocelyn's ferocity went from swirling to full on gale. Rainworth struggled to get into their opponent's half and Burrows gave them a warning with his header from close range.

Then in the 57th minute James Leverton was adjudged to have impeded Coden Duncan and despite his protestations the referee pointed to the spot. Morledge gave Leverton no chance from the spot to bring the scores level.

Rainworth made a couple of changes in the 65th minute bringing on Ryan Faulconbridge and Matt Goodwin for Ethan Wilkinson and Gee. A minute later Callum Fletchers effort was straight at the keeper. Another substitution saw Blake Goucher replace Mason Wilson-Rhiney

Three minutes later and Clifton regained their lead when Burrows's powerful header from a free kick gave Leverton no chance. The 79th minute saw the impressive Brooks round the keeper before going to the ground. The visiting fans cried for the penalty but quite rightly it wasn't given as the fall was a slip when attempting to change direction.

Rainworth made their final substitution bring on James Culf for Dimaio. With 5 added minutes remaining Rainworth went close to equalising when Arnold's effort was blocked on the line and his follow up was cleared for a corner.

The keeper came up for the corner and every Rainworth player was inexplicably in the final third of the pitch. It came as no surprise when it was cleared and Calrick Dunkley had the simple task of putting the ball into the empty goal.

In the 4th minute of stoppage time Brooks was cynically fouled as he raced by defenders. From the resultant free kick Boucher's effort struck the lower part of the upright with Want beaten, sadly for Rainworth that was their final opportunity before the final whistle.

Jocelyn and naivety cost Rainworth on a night when the lack of a natural goal scorer was evident and their quest for points goes on.

Small Steps

Holwell Sports 1 v 2 Rainworth MWFC

At long last Rainworth put in a performance for the full 90 minutes and got their reward today at Holwell Sports.

With illness meaning yet another changed squad with half 19 years old or under and one only 16, the travelling fans were sceptical. After 98 minutes and a couple of nervy moments towards the final whistle they were ecstatic.

Rainworth got off to a fast start and Liam Arnold was inches wide with his header from Connor Dimaio's corner in the 4th minute. Two minutes later and Oliver Brown's header also went inches wide with Alex Brown beaten.

The game settled down and both sides created opportunities without troubling either keeper. Freddie McGrady's effort from range was always rising and Jack York and Tom Pope both pulled their efforts wide.

Alex Brown did well to get to the ball before Mason Wilson-Rhiney from Dimaio's astute pass and the same player put his effort inches wide as Rainworth searched for the opener.

James Leverton, who had an excellent game did well to dive at the onrushing Arisides Cunha's feet in the 27th minute. He did even better when he palmed Joe Brown's fierce effort around the upright at the expense of a corner.

The latter part of the first half saw a concerted effort from Holwell but George Robbins struck his effort straight at Leverton. Two minutes later and it was York who tested Leverton with a fierce drive, but the keeper was equal to the effort.

In the final minutes of the first half an excellent ball from Tom Berry was net by the head of Kamau Balayi, but although he got a lot of power it lacked direction. The two evenly matched teams got to the half time whistle without scoring.

It was Holwell who started the second half on the front foot and Berry did well to block Robbins effort in the opening minute.

The opening goal of the game came in the 55th minute when Dimaio's excellent ball found Matt Goodwin on the right. His excellent curling lob from distance cleared Brown and found the far corner of the goal.

The goal saw Rainworth make a strong push for a second and Brown did well to gather Wilson-Rhiney's effort at the second attempt. Rainworth made their first substitution bringing on Tom Rose for Goodwin in the 68th minute. A minute later and Rainworth doubled their lead when Callum Brooks clipped Dimaio's excellent ball past the advancing Brown.

Both sides threatened in the 75th minute when former Wren George Scott's run and cross was inches away from being converted. Whilst at the other end a great cross from Rose was inches away from the head of Balayi.

In the 78th minute almost scored from an excellent passage of play, but Brook's pass was just too strong for Dimaio.

Rainworth made their second substitution bringing on Ethan Wilkinson for Berry. In the 89th minute Dimaio attempted an audacious lob from the half-way line, with Brown out of his goal, but it bounced wide of the far upright.

On the stroke of normal time Holwell pulled a goal back when Leverton could only palm the ball out, as he appeared to be impeded and Tom Pope headed the ball home.

This saw a frenzied eight minutes in which Holwell threw everything at the Rainworth defence in the search for an equaliser. Rainworth brought on James Culf for Brooks with three minutes of added time remaining. The defence held out and got a deserved victory.

This was an excellent result and Rainworth need to build on it, although it will be a tough ask next Saturday away at league leaders Bourne Town.

A minute later Rainworth were two down as the result of yet another gift. Zac Allen's effort although on goal didn't appear to carry any threat but it was inexplicably missed by Leverton, and the hill had now become a mountain to climb for Rainworth.

Rainworth then produced a cameo five minutes when Brooks driven cross from the byline only needed a touch but beat everyone. This was followed by Mason Wilson-Rhiney's effort from distance, but it just cleared the crossbar.

There had been a feel, at least to the travelling supporters that it was Christmas with the number of gifts being given to Bourne. That theme almost continued in the 89th minute when an attempted clearance almost found the back of the Rainworth net but luckily the ball ricochet wide for a corner.

Just when Rainworth thought they had kept the score line down to five, in the fourth minute of injury time Cox's effort from outside of the area went through a crowd of players for Bourne's sixth.

Rainworth know that although today's game was never in the list of must win fixtures, performances like this are unacceptable in their quest for survival.

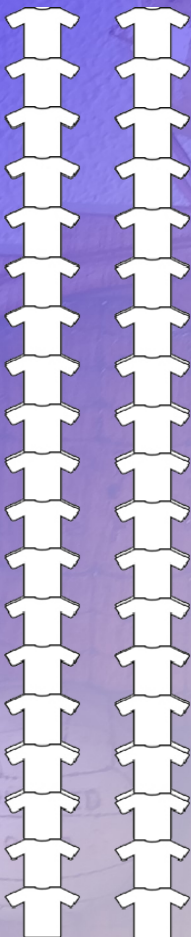
