
Oh yes! those programme awards, that was when it was done by a professional, our very own 'Gordon Foster'. Unfortunately it's gone downhill since I took over.

## Saffron Dynamo FC History

The Club was founded in 1963 by a group of friends playing friendly matches on Sunday afternoons on Saffron Lane Recreation Ground (hence part of the name). The original "right half" was Bob King who is now the Secretary-Treasurer.

League football in the Leicester Sunday League followed with home matches being played at Aylestone Playing Fields, Braunstone Lane East. A major turning point in the Club's fortunes came in 1975 when we joined the Hinckley Sunday League, playing on Sunday mornings. The years in the Hinckley League were consistently successful with championships and cup finals in abundance - Sunday morning football turned out to be a great move.

In 1976, the Club moved to Cambridge Road, Whetstone (now Cosby!) initially renting a pitch from Wellington Vice FC. In 1984, with the demise of The Vice, the ground was purchased from the Old Wyvernians Association.

A move to Saturday football and entry into the Leicester and District League followed in 1991 before joining the Leicestershire Senior League in 1994. At this point, the old wooden clubhouse was refurbished by players and local tradesmen.

The Club has steadily built up the number of junior teams to the point where we now operate at all age groups from Under 7's through to Under 18's. A new development for the current season is the inclusion of an Under 16 team playing on Saturday mornings in the Midland Junior Premier League.

Drainage and floodlights for the main pitch became a reality in August 2005 meaning that our ambition to play in the Leicestershire Senior League Premier Division and the Midweek Floodlit Youth League could be realised.

FA Charter standard adult status was awarded in 2005 followed by Development Club status in 2008 and Community Club status in 2010. The new clubhouse was opened in 2011, providing first class changing facilities and social area.

The Club are firmly committed to providing a quality, safe and friendly facility that can be of benefit to all ages within football and the local community.

# Kamikaze Defending Cost Rainworth Rainworth MWFC O v 1 Blackstones FC By Paul Fryer

If they gave prizes for gifting goals Rainworth would be battling for the top spot. The gift they gave Blackstones today proved costly as it was the only goal of a tight game.

There seemed no danger in the 3rd minute with Rainworth in control of the ball, seconds later a kamikaze pass to the keeper resulted in Nathan Rudman accepting the gift for the opening goal.

Rainworth appeared to suffer from the error and struggled to get into the pace of the game early on. Kieran Duffey-Weeks free kick was headed clear by Liam Arnold at the expense of a corner. From the corner James Leverton made an excellent one handed save at the expense of yet another corner.

It wasn't until the 18th minute that Rainworth made any impact in the game when Callum Brooks ran past four defenders only to run out of pitch. Two minutes later they went close when a great passage of play saw Brooks set up Tommy Bedford, but his effort was just over.

Rainworth continued to search for the equaliser, and they almost achieved it in the 29th minute when Brooks's cross found Evan Fortune-West, but his goal bound effort was deflected for a corner. Minutes later an excellent pass from Harvey Thomas found Bedford but his effort went the wrong side of the upright.

Fortune-West's free kick beat Niall Shackleton but it went just over as the pressure mounted on the Blackstones goal. It wasn't all Rainworth however, and Duffey-Weeks squandered a chance when the ball deflected into his path only to put his effort well over.

Rainworth had the last effort of the half when they were awarded an indirect free kick six yards from goal. Fortune-West tapped it to Brooks but his effort was blocked and cleared.

The first substitution of the match saw Rainworth replace injured captain Arnold with George McKernan at the start of the second half. In the 54th minute Blackstones were denied a second by Leverton's outstanding one handed save by Leverton when he denied Alfie Ferguson.

Blackstones went close in the 60th minute when Duffey-Weeks put his effort just wide of the far upright. Rainworth were denied in the 64th minute when Brooks's cross found Fortune-West, but his goal bound effort was deflected for a corner. Three minutes later and another Brooks cross was hit straight at the keeper by Bedford.

Rainworth made their second substitution bringing on Reece O'Donnell for Josh Nettleship. There were strong appeals for a penalty in the 75th minute when Thomas appeared to have been brought down in the area, but the referee waved play on.

Another substitution in the 79th minute saw Rainworth replace Harley Butcher-Simpson with Ethan Wilkinson.

Play was end-to-end and Joshua Barrett set up Harry Peasgood but his effort went just over, whilst at the other end Bedford's effort was gathered at the second attempt by Shackleton.

Rainworth thought they had equalised in the 84th minute but Fortune - West's goal bound effort was blocked by Shackleton's outstretched leg. Three minutes later and Rainworth almost gifted a second, but Duffey-Weeks squandered the opportunity.

In added time Rainworth had three good opportunities to get something from the game but a combination of good defending and poor finishing denied them. Brooks was denied by Shackleton's hand and then his lob beat Shackleton, but it also cleared the crossbar. The last notable effort of the match saw Bedford inches away from converting Fortune-West's cross.

Today Rainworth were the masters of their own downfall and know they should have got something out of the match. Next Saturday they will have the opportunity to make amends when Saffron Dynamo's are the visitors.
