

Today's visitors Sandiacre appear to be pulling their season around with some fine results taking them out of the relegation places. It is definitely a 'six pointer' and in Rainworth's case a must win, if they are to fight their way out of their current predicament.

'It's a Six Pointer" is a term frequently used nowadays whenever the fixture is a 'must win' for both sides and today's fixture falls into that category. If Rainworth win they move back within touch of the bunch of clubs that at the moment are flirting with relegation. Sandiacre are in that bunch of clubs, so a victory for them will move them into a position where Rainworth would need a major run of victories to catch them.

When we played Sandiacre earlier in the season we could have been out of sight after twenty minutes, but the malaise that has been present all season, the lack of finishing, proved costly and Sandiacre scored two with more than a little help from ourselves, and won all three points. The faithful will recall our home fixture against Lutterworth when we wasted four virtually open goals and had to settle for a point, in a 1-1 draw.

On Saturday at Lutterworth we took time to settle on a 4G pitch, a goalkeeper in top form and as usual contributed to the 3-1 deficit we found ourselves in at half time. The second half was a complete transformation and despite their keepers efforts we turned the game around and got a deserved draw. However, draws when you're in our predicament are of little use it's wins and three points we need.

We can bemoan our 'bad luck' for being where we are, but in truth when you don't score from clear cut opportunities and concede 'soft goals' you reap your own reward. We haven't been good enough in too many games and that has to change, starting today!!

Sandiacre Town FC History

"Sandiacre Town Football Club was formed in 1978 as a Youth Football club. Season 1979/80 saw the number of Youth teams grow to five and with a Saturday Senior side established joining the Central Alliance League as a founding member.

The club played in the Central Alliance League in the 1970s and 1980s. They were one of the founding members of the Central Midlands League in 1983, but the club lost its place in the league in 1990 after failing ground grading. In 1992, the club merged with Lace Web United. They were promoted to the CML again after finishing runners-up in 1991-92. They won the CML Premier Division in 1992-93. Their first appearance in the FA Vase was in 1995, and they reached the first round in 1997-98 and 2004-05.

In 1982 work started on building the club headquarters at St Giles Park which was completed in 1984 with the official opening by Peter Taylor and Roy McFarland on the 28th March 1984.

Over the years many improvements have been made to the ground and in 1995 floodlights were installed. In recent years the raising of monies by the club has resulted in being partner club in the the 4G facility at Friesland School allowing all of the nearly 4O teams associated with the club to train at the same location and allowing Friesland School to be the base for its Youth teams, soccer school and Wildcats.

The club gained Chartered Standard community club status in 2012 and now maintains England Football Accreditation 3 Star club with affiliation to the Derbyshire County Football Association."

With his detailed files on every player, the Leeds legend



showed Jose, Pep and even Marcelo the way. But with this obsession for the opposition bordering paranoia, not everyone approved

Everywhere he looked, he could see the ghost of his predecessor. From the mementos lining the corridors of Elland Road, through to the glittering array of silverware in the trophy room that he had won by "cheating". It

was Don Revie's team, Don Revie's loyal backroom staff, and in the manager's office sat on Don Revie's former desk sat a pile of Don 'bloody' Revie's dossiers.

When Brian Clough arrived at Leeds in the summer of 1974, he immediately set about trying to remove all traces of his predecessor from the ground. He banned all mention of Revie's name and burned the dossiers that had become synonymous with Revie's success at the Yorkshire club.

Many of Clough's new players had learned how to destroy their rivals using the information meticulously collated on opposing teams that was contained within these files. Even cynical senior professionals like no-nonsense centre-half Jack Charlton had bought into the idea of the dossiers.

Yet desperate to eradicate all connections to his former foe, Clough banished all talk of the dossiers for good in one fell swoop.

Sadly, 44 Days later he was gone too.

A Game Of Two Halves

Lutterworth Athletic 3v3 Rainworth MWFC By Paul Fryer

At half time Rainworth had done little to convince the travelling fans they'd get anything out of today's encounter against Lutterworth Athletic. A half later they probably should have taken all three points.

Today at Lutterworth Rainworth showed they had the necessary fight to survive, however, the next eight games will be the judge of that. For forty-five minutes they ran hot and cold and went in at half time trailing 3-1 to Lutterworth Athletic and not many in the crowd would have given them any chance of turning it around.

Forty-five minutes later it was the home side who were hanging on as Rainworth took the game to their opponents, who had Archie Briggs to thank for their point. Rainworth struggled to come to terms with 4G surface when in the 4th minute James Leverton turned Billy Bowes's swerving effort around the upright. Two minutes later and Leverton gathered Reece Hookway's effort at the second attempt.

The inevitable goal came in the 8th minute when despite Leverton's efforts he was unable to prevent Brandon Beardmore's shot from crossing the line off the upright.

Rainworth's first effort on goal came after 15 minutes when Tommy Bedford found Callum Brooks and his effort from the left edge of the area flew just past the far upright.

Just as Rainworth looked to have weathered the storm, they went two down when Hookway cut into the area from the right and unleased a screamer that gave Leverton no chance.

At this stage the travelling fans were hoping Rainworth could keep the score-line respectable. They nearly reduced the deficit in the 24th minute when an excellent run and cross from Brooks found Tommy Bedford but just as it appeared his effort would find the bottom corner Briggs pulled of an excellent save at the expense of a corner. Rainworth did manage to reduce the deficit in the 37th minute when Mason Gee's corner saw Callum Fletcher rise above everyone and his powerful header nestled in the net.

The euphoria was short lived when two minutes later with Rainworth on the attack a misplaced pass was pounced upon by Bowes. He raced clear of the defence and slotted it under the advancing Leverton to maintain their two-goal cushion.

At the half Time whistle Lutterworth held a two-goal advantage and the prospects of a Rainworth win seemed remote.

Rainworth made a double substitution at half time replacing Josh Nettleship and Reece O'Donnell with Kamau Balayi and Ethan Wilkinson.

Rainworth started the second half on the front foot and strong penalty appeals fell on deaf ears when Evan Fortune-West appeared to have been impeded. Three minutes later and Gee's effort on the turn lacked power and was easily gathered by Briggs.

The deficit was reduced to one in the 51st minute when Gee's corner was headed goalwards Balayi and Fortune -West got the final touch placing the ball into the net.

It was constant Rainworth pressure now and Brooks had his goal bound effort blocked in the 52nd minute. The same fate fell to Bedford's goal bound effort that was diverted for a corner.

How Rainworth didn't equalise in the 61st minute was mainly due to Briggs's incredible double save from Fortune-West and Bedford and a massive block by Bradshaw at expense of a corner from Fletcher's follow-up.

It seemed only a matter of time that Rainworth would equalise as Fletcher's goal bound effort was blocked and minutes later Brook's header went inches wide of the upright.


Rainworth made their third substitution bringing on Harley Butcher-Simpson for James Culf. Two minutes later and the Lutterworth goal continued to have a charmed life after a number of chances were blocked before Briggs just beat Brooks to the loose ball as bore down on the goal.

The pace was now relentless, and Rainworth were once again denied as Bedford's goal bound effort was blocked for a corner. At the other end Leverton did well to push Stef Bjelik's effort around the post. From the corner Kurt Parsons headed over from close range. Rainworth got their deserved equaliser in the 87th minute when Brooks found the byline and his cross was clipped home by Bedford. Lutterworth endured a nervy final Rainworth push and managed to hold on for a 3-3 draw.

On their second half performance Rainworth still have a chance of survival, but they must quickly learn to defend as a team and convert more of the chances they create.
