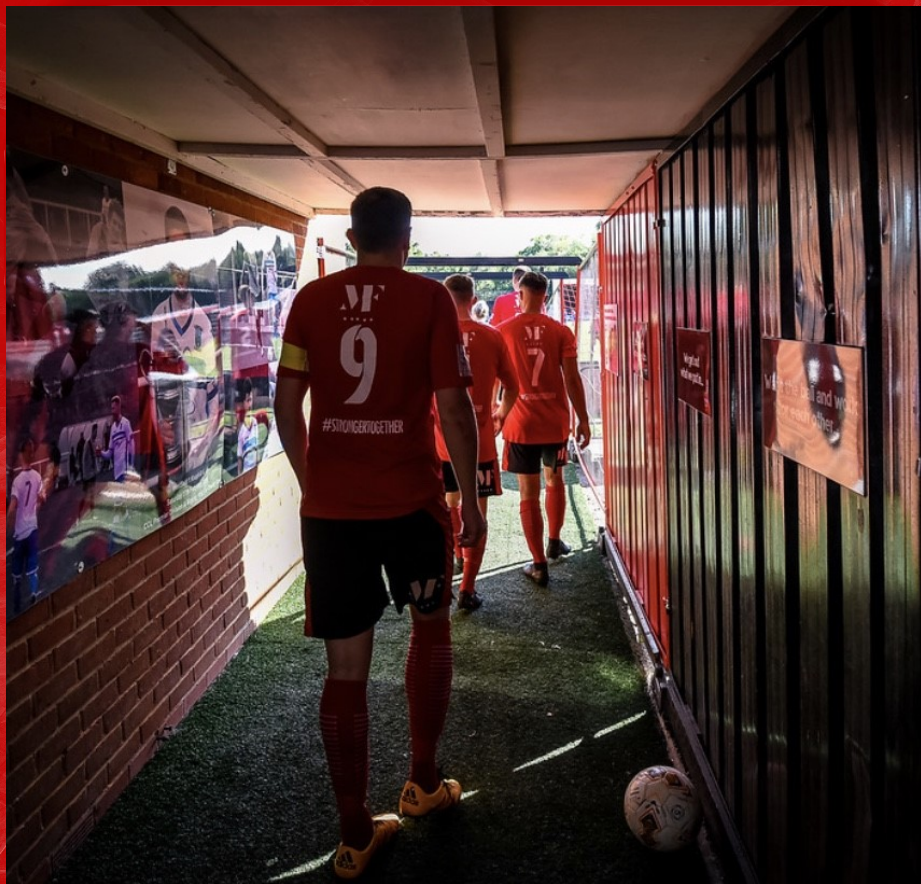

News Pitch

Welcome to the Surrey Hire stadium to our opponents players supporters and coaching staff for this afternoon's game.

Our visitors Molesey FC have got off to a fairly good start before today's game with 10 games played 6 games won 3 draws and just the one loss the only loss being last week against 3rd placed Colliers Wood, despite winning on Tuesday and watched by ourselves they won on penalties I'm sure they will be looking for another 3 points today which could take them to sixth place in the league.

Craig the manager has done a good job keeping a number of the same players from last season when they played a division above ourselves despite being relegated and for me I tip these to be there or there about at the end of the season.

They are a good club with very hard working volunteers behind the scenes with a great history and we don't want to see clubs like these disappear.

Right onto ourselves now on an update on the playing side of things on the pitch, so far this season has been a frustrating start for ourselves as with the quality players we have currently in the squad we have underachieved I feel, no one has beaten us by more than two goals in the league and even in that game we were by far the better team so for me the squad needs time to gel with each other and buy into what Luke and Dean are trying to set down at the club.

We don't have one player from last season so the whole squad has been a rebuild and we will need time, for me the whole season is about getting used to each other getting a core of a squad

together and with some small additions at the right time and for us next season is about aiming for promotion.

So far we are playing as individuals and not as a team, to play as a team this comes with games experiencing the highs and lows a season throws at us, and we have started with more lows than highs, but like most things in football the highs are just around the corner I'm sure.

The old cliché "Rome wasn't built in a day" very much springs to mind.

On the matter of the management and coaching staff for me as vice chairman and director of football the whole team have my backing and support for this season and next, I just wanted to clarify this as after a few recent results certain individuals involved on the management team have been subject to abuse on social media and calling for changes to be made.

We must stress this is not anyone linked to Knaphill football club doing this it all comes from outside the club and very comical to read.

Off the pitch Knaphill Football Club are already trying to put things in place for eventually playing at the next division higher and operating like how we should be so very few changes are being made if and when we do get promotion in the future.

We have a scout out watching games of up and coming opponents that are coming up and also players we potentially are interested in signing this is working very well so far.

Off the pitch we are already in negotiations with the local council on improving our facilities around the ground we are constantly moving and not standing still.

We know a run of positive results is just round the corner for us and we certainly perform against the bigger clubs in this division so let's hope this starts today "come on the Knappers"

The View From The Dugout

Luke Tuffs - First Team Manager

Good afternoon and welcome to the players, supporters and officials of Molesey football club. Molesey have had a good start to the season and although they lost last Saturday, we know what a good outfit they are and I'm sure they'll be doing their best to make amends today.

The same will be said for us, as our up and down start to the season continues. After wins against Raynes Park and Redhill you could have been forgiven for thinking that the magic formula had been found, and we found ourselves on the periphery of the top 5.

Defeats against Frimley Green, (Kingstonian in the Cup) and Cobham have quickly changed that and we are now back into the lower reaches of mid table. The league is however very tight, string a few wins and you are right back into the top pack and it's up for grabs for anyone.

Early observations on the league from me is that it has changed a fair bit from when I was last in it with Hartley. I would argue that the quality of the top sides doesn't match the Hartley side of a few years ago, or Ashford, Camberley or even Molesey as it happens in their prime in the not too distant past.

What has changed for the

better though, is the bottom teams are now a lot stronger.

Everyone is more organised and the gap between the top teams and those struggling towards the wrong end is very little, maybe just a bit of game management and understanding or an extra player to put the ball in the net.

As for us, why are we so inconsistent? Why have we lost the last 3 games after so much promise?

As a manager you have to take stock of your decisions and unfortunately I think I have to take a large share of the blame for the Frimley game. I was so desperate to get crowdbar players that I thought would do perfect jobs for that particular game that I just unsettled the whole thing, and ultimately some of those that we needed to perform, didn't.

This was entirely on me and we changed at half time, the second half being a much better affair and I thought from 3-0 down we were unlucky not to get something from the game.

I will not be making mistakes like that again, but as you'll know this is my first job as a 1st team manager so this is going to be a bit of a learning journey for us



all at times!

Cobham was an entirely different sort of defeat. As much as I'll hold my hands up at Frimley, I thought we got everything right against Cobham and if we had finished just half our chances (including 2 penalty misses) nobody would have batted an eyelid if the final score was 4 or 5 nil.

As it happens, we didn't; and a sucker punch on the 85th minute from Cobham's tenacious substitute wasn't our lowest point as they went on to get a last minute winner. It doesn't take a rocket scientist here - we need shooting practice!

Actually, that's possibly unfair. What we need is confidence, something we are slightly low on at the moment after a couple of set backs. We have a very young group so it's easy for them to worry or lose abit of confidence but that's where the older heads, management and supporters need to help them through.

What else. Just for the record, these notes were due in to Mr Chairman about 6pm yesterday and it's now 1:30am and I'm ploughing through, so if my meandering rambles make even less sense than usual, that's why. I'm up at 6am as well, chin up Tuffs you say.

Anyways -where was I. Ah. Player activity you ask me? Ok so Dan Band aka 'Bandy' has moved to pastures new. Bandy is a fantastic lad and a great footballer, quite simply he hasn't had the rub of the green with suspensions and injuries and just hasn't hit any sort of rhythm.

I think it would be difficult to start Bandy over those that are already fit and sharp, and I think pretty much most of you will

agree George and Frenchy are forming an excellent partnership in there, so the opportunities that he deserves simply weren't going to be there.

Marlon Pinder has come and gone since our last programme notes. Marlon has a reputation as abit of a 'bad egg' as some would put it in local football, but I can assure you he was not. He gave it his all, was always honest and did his absolute best, and I know that if he was able to stay longer he would have started scoring those goals he so needed for his confidence. Marlon has moved to Epsom & Ewell to be closer to home to be nearer his young family, and I know you'll wish him well from us too.

Right it is literally 2am now so I apologise for rushing through but it is bed time. I Was up first thing as well may I add.

Anyways coming in - Jake Maddock, goalkeeper from Hanworth Villa. 'Tuffs why have you signed a goalkeeper that can't reach the crossbar yet and he's 20? And why does he look like a baby buffalo?' I have the

answer to neither of those questions, but what is for sure is Jake is an excellent goalkeeper who I know well from his time at Hartley.

Harry Woodward is on loan from Aldershot Town. Harry was on loan with us at Hartley last year and did a good job. Great lad and a cracking young player.

Jack French - well you've seen Frenchy by now and seen his talents. French isn't only a great player, he's a good friend and a loyal team mate to those around him, make sure he's made welcome.

Callum Abraham-Barlow. Left back on loan from Hartley. Quick, agile, and a big prospect for the future, Callum will be with us to develop and help take us forward.

Molesey



In 1946 Molesey United and West Molesey Old Boys merged to form Molesey Football Club. The new club joined the Surrey Intermediate League and won the league in their first season. After moving to their new ground on Walton Road, they moved up to the Surrey Senior League in 1953. After winning the Surrey Senior Charity Cup in 1956-57, the club were league champions in 1957-58. In 1959 they transferred to the Spartan League, finishing as runners-up in the league and losing the League Cup final in 1959-60. The club won the League Cup the following season and were losing finalists in 1963-64 and 1971-72. They remained in the Spartan League until joining Division Two of the Athenian League in 1973. In 1977 the club moved leagues again, this time joining Division Two of the Isthmian League.

League reorganisation saw Molesey placed in Division Two South in 1984, where they remained until finishing as runners-up in 1989-90, earning promotion to Division One. They won the Southern Combination Challenge Cup in 1990-91. In 1992-93 the club were Division One runners-up and were promoted to the Premier Division. The 1993-94 season saw them reach the first round of the FA Cup for the first time, losing 4-0 at home to Bath City; the club also won the Southern Combination Challenge Cup for a second time. They were relegated back to Division One at the end of the 1995-96 season and then to Division Two in 1998-99. Further league reorganisation in 2002 led to the club becoming members of Division One South, before being placed in Division One in 2004 and then back in Division One South in 2006 as the league was restructured.

In 2007-08 Molesey finished bottom of Division One South and were relegated to the Premier Division of the Combined Counties League. In 2012-13 they won the Southern Combination Challenge Cup again. They won the Premier Division title in 2014-15 and were promoted back to Division One South of the Isthmian League, as well as winning the Southern Combination Challenge Cup, a trophy they retained the following season. Following league reorganisation, the club were placed in the South Central Division in 2018. The 2018-19 season saw them finished second-from-bottom of the division, resulting in relegation to the Premier Division of the Combined Counties League.

Richard Ossai - A fine keeper signed from Camberley Town FC that is a dependable and comforting figure behind any defence.



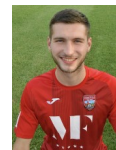
