Right onto ourselves now on an update on the playing side of things on the pitch, so far this season has been a frustrating start for ourselves as with the quality players we have currently in the squad we have underachieved I feel, no one has beaten us by more than two goals in the league and even in that game we were by far the better team so for me the squad needs time to gel with each other and buy into what Luke and Dean are trying to set down at the club.

We don't have one player from last season so the whole squad has been a rebuild and we will need time, for me the whole season is about getting used to each other getting a core of a squad

together and with some small additions at the right time and for us next season is about aiming for promotion.

So far we are playing as individuals and not as a team, to play as a team this comes with games experiencing the highs and lows a season throws at us, and we have started with more lows than highs, but like most things in football the highs are just around the corner I'm sure.

The old cliché "Rome wasn't built in a day" very much springs to mind.

On the matter of the management and coaching staff for me as vice chairman and director of football the whole team have my backing and support for this season and next, I just wanted to clarify this as after a few recent results certain individuals involved on the management team have been subject to abuse on social media and calling for changes to be made.

We must stress this is not anyone linked to Knaphill Football Club doing this it all comes from outside the club and very comical to read.

Off the pitch Knaphill Football Club are already trying to put things in place for eventually playing at the next division higher and operating like how we should be so very few changes are being made if and when we do get promotion in the future.

We have a scout out watching games of up and coming opponents that are coming up and also players we potentially are interested in signing this is working very well so far.

Off the pitch we are already in negotiations with the local council on improving our facilities around the ground we are constantly moving and not standing still.

We know a run of positive results is just round the corner for us and we certainly perform against the bigger clubs in this division so let's hope this starts today "come on the Knappers"

# The View From The Dugout

Luke Tuffs - First Team Manager

Good evening and welcome to the players, supporters and officials of Egham Town FC. Egham have a new manager themselves who has done a good job since he come in with results steadily improving for them under his tenure.

For us, after a win and with everyone on a high, it's probably a good time to have an open and honest look at where we are, as a club and as a group and take stock of what has gone on, and what the plan is going forward.

Everyone starts the season looking to win the league, whatever your stature, experience, however long you've been together and whatever your backing, anybody that doesn't build to try to win things in my opinion is doing it wrong.

That's just what we did, and my idea was to bring lots of players that I've seen that have played higher levels and mix them with the best younger players in the area and a few experienced heads of the level that I know would

do us proud.

So pre season and the opening games was us finding our feet, seeing where we were at and getting to know each other.

As you'll have guessed from the up and down results and turnover of players, this wasn't to be the magic formula we had hoped it was, and pre season excitement was quickly dampened by the reality of competitive men's football at Step 5.

Now I quickly do need to defend those no longer with us, this is absolutely not a witch hunt and we need to thank each and every person that has turned out for our football club. They are all good people and excellent players that will enjoy success elsewhere.

For some of them, they quite simply couldn't adapt to the level or didn't fit our system.

In a couple of cases, it was simply getting no rhythm with bans and suspensions constantly stopping them hitting the ground and



hampering any consistent game time which hopefully they are getting at their new clubs.

So we simply started again, is this all part of the first build through trial and improvement, or is the last few weeks the start of something new and a second build, well ill leave you to decide that.

Either way, we've now kept the same core for 3 or 4 games and partnerships are beginning to form which can only be a good thing.

Despite the fact it's only 9 points from the last 15, for me, it's been positive. Let's look back and break this down. Firstly, Beating Raynes Park (I don't think we were great but it's 3 points). We then beat Redhill 2-0, we played well setting up not to get beat and nick on the counter which we did successfully.

The first 45 minutes at Frimley Green which saw us go behind were entirely my fault, not the players, and the second half when we got personnel and shape right we blew them out the water, just too little to late alas.

Cobham, we we were excellent for 85 minutes and 1-0 up and if we score either of those penalties we surely go on to win the game.

Then Molesey on Saturday. A totally different sort of win where I don't think anybody can

say they played their best game but what we did was win as a team and grind out the result when Molesey were having large spells of the game. That's the first time we've won like that as a group and was very pleasing to see.

So what does this all mean for us you say. I believe we aren't far off, we have a young but excellent side that just need consistency and a little bit of game understanding which is slowly coming as I'm sure you'll agree.

Today will be another tough game but here's to hoping for another solid team performance and 3 points!

## Opposition

# The Away End

Egham Town



The club was originally formed as Runnymede Rovers in 1877, before reforming as Egham in 1905. They won the West Surrey League in 1921-22, before becoming founder members of the Surrey Senior League in 1922 and going on to win the league in its first season. In 1927-28 the club finished as league runners-up, and subsequently joined Division One West of the Spartan League. A sixth-placed finish in 1928-29 saw them placed in the Premier Division for the 1929-30 season. After finishing bottom of the division in 1931-32, they were relegated to Division One.

Egham left the Spartan League at the end of the 1932-33 season and returned to the Surrey Senior League. The club closed down during World War II, but was not restored when the war ended. A public meeting on 9 December 1963 led to the club being reformed as Egham Town. They joined the Parthenon League for the 1964-65 season, but rejoined the Surrey Senior League at the end of the season. After two seasons in the league, they moved to the Spartan League in 1967. The club won the Spartan League in 1971-72, before joining Division Two of the Athenian League in 1974. They won Division Two at the first attempt, earning promotion to Division One. The following season saw them finish as Division One runners-up.

In 1977 Egham joined Division Two of the Isthmian League. Restructuring saw them moved to Division One South in 1984, before Division Two was restored in 1991. They were relegated to Division Three at the end of the 1997-98 season and remained there until restructuring saw them placed in Division One South in 2002. The club were transferred to Division One West of the Southern League for the 2004-05 season, but were moved back to Division Two of the Isthmian League the following season. In 2006 the club left the Isthmian League and joined the Premier Division of the Combined Counties League. They were Premier Division champions in 2012-13, earning promotion to Division One Central of the Southern League. A third-place finish in 2015-16 saw them qualify for the promotion play-offs, in which they were beaten 4-2 on penalties in the semi-finals by St Ives Town after a 2-2 draw. The following season saw the club finish fifth, qualifying for the play-offs again and they went on to lose 4-0 to Farnborough in the semi-finals.

At the end of the 2017-18 season, Egham were transferred to the South Central Division of the Isthmian League. They finished bottom of the division in 2018-19 and were relegated to Premier Division of the Combined Counties League.

Richard Ossai - A fine keeper signed from Camberley Town FC that is a dependable and comforting figure behind any defence.



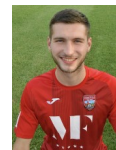
