Welcome to Redding Way Bedfont & Feltham in what should be a good encounter tonight. Before tonight's tricky fixture against a team in form we had a similar test Saturday against a high-flying Southall.

Saturday we hosted Southall in the league, it was only a few months previously that Southall absolutely destroyed us at their place, so we was expecting another tough fixture but also I was expecting a reaction to put things right from the lads as it was a heavy defeat last time we faced Southall. We went into the game missing key players JC, Sammy and Felix who all played in our previous win away to Colliers Wood, having said that the starting 11 looked strong.

We started the game slowly and Southall took control with some good attacking play coming at us down both flanks. We defend well early on and had a few good counter attacks with Smithy having efforts blocked and well saved by Southall keeper. It was a scrappy first half with us lacking any real quality going forward which was disappointing because we looked a constant threat the week before against Colliers Wood. The first half looked nail on to be a stalemate until skipper George Rowley got caught overpaying in defence, a Southall striker robbed Rowley in the box and finished comfortably on the stroke of half time. That was a killer blow, it changed the whole dynamic of the game.

We needed to take the game to Southall which was going to be dangerous with the pace they had hoping forward. We started the second half well, winning more second balls and more body's making forward runs. Smithy had 2 free kicks well saved by Southall keeper. Jacob MacDonald missing from 3 yards after getting his feet caught up in a rebound off Smith's free-kick. We huffed and puffed but with little threat as the quality just wasn't there. It wasn't OUR day and Southall ran out winners. A draw was possibly the right result.

## OPPOSITION

## BEDFONT & FELTHAM

---



Bedfont & Feltham Football Club was founded in May 2012 following the amalgamation of Feltham FC and Bedfont Football and Social Club, taking Feltham's place in Division One of the Combined Counties Football League.



Feltham had already entered the 2012–13 FA Vase under their own name so the club played as Feltham FC until the start of the 2013–14 season. Two Sunday sides played in the West Middlesex Sunday Football League under the Bedfont & Feltham name; one finishing second in Division One and the other winning Division Two.

The Yellows' first two seasons saw them finish in a respectable fifth place in the Division One table having been early front-runners. They reached the First Round Proper of the FA Vase in 2013-14 and also won the Middlesex Premier Cup.

The club became eligible to compete in the FA Cup for the first time in 2014-15, and reached the First Round Qualifying. The same season also saw the club win the Division One Challenge Cup and become runners-up in the Southern Combination Challenge Cup competition.

For season 2015-16, the club restructured its squad and Youth set-up. The club started strongly and for the second time in its short history made the First Round Qualifying in the FA Cup and the FA Vase competitions. This season saw the Yellows finish as runners-up in Division One, earning promotion to the Premier Division of the Combined Counties Football League. The club also reached the final of the RPM Records Division One Challenge Cup for the second consecutive season.





The Premier Division experience in 2016-17 started tough with a 2-9 home defeat to Epsom & Ewell on the opening day of the season. This seemed to pave the way for the club's worst season since its formation: Finishing second from bottom in the Combined Counties Football League's Premier Division. This resulted in relegation back to Division One.



The club was knocked out of the FA Cup at the first hurdle and of the FA Vase at the second. On a brighter note, they reached the semi-finals of the Southern Combination Challenge Cup and the quarter-finals of the Middlesex FA Senior Charity Cup having unceremoniously exited all other cup competitions in earlier rounds. This prompted the club to appoint Garry Haylock as Manager in late April 2017.

Life back in Division One in season 2017-18 started very poorly and in consequence, Garry Haylock departed in October 2017 to be replaced by Dan Huxley. The poor run experienced in 2016-17 continued, with the club exiting the FA Cup and FA Vase competitions in the opening rounds. The club reached the Quarter-Finals of the Middlesex Premier Cup; Third Round of the Division One Challenge Cup; Second Round of the Middlesex Charity Cup and Second Round of the Southern Combination Challenge Cup.

The squad saw a number of changes throughout the season and found it difficult to bond. This resulted in a bottom four finish. Dan Huxley announced his resignation at the end of the season.

The club quickly appointed former Staines Lammas manager Adam Bessent. He will attempt to arrest the mediocrity that has dogged the club since relegation two seasons ago.

The Club has retained the FA Charter Standard and is now in its sixth season. The current set-up sees a revived Sunday side and Youth teams from Under 7s to Under 10s.

The new year has continued with two disappointing results in the Suburban Shield, drawn in the group against Abbey Rangers and Flackwell Heath. On Monday we travelled to Abbey Rangers with a squad containing a handful of first team players needing minutes. With an onlooking first team manager in the crowd the early signs were positive as we pressed Rangers relentlessly and created several chances. However we were not clinical in front of goal and a misjudgement at the back allowed their attacker to control a ball on our by-line and put across our six yard box for his team mate an easy finish. Our pressing game ebbed away and we gave Abbey Rangers the confidence to complete a 4-0 victory, something that seemed impossible based on our good early start.

On Saturday we hosted Flackwell Heath in the next group game. This time we put out a very young squad. I had watched our U18 team defeat Guildford City 2-1 on Wednesday, this followed their impressive victory in the cup against Carshalton Athletic two days earlier. Matt Cronan and his team have been leading the boys well this season and I am pleased that Matt and I have been able to promote many of his players into the development team. There were six players in the development squad on Saturday that had played for the U18s earlier in the week. This included Mac Howieson who made his debut at half time in midfield and did not look out of place.

The development team are clearly suffering from a lack of confidence and this allowed Flackwell Heath much of the ball as we struggled to get out of our half. 3-0 down at half time and with few chances created we changed our shape at half time. A penalty early in the second half extended Flackwell's lead however what followed showed a lot of character on our behalf. The players suddenly showed the confidence and ability seen in previous games and in the last 20 mins grabbed two goals, including an excellent curled finish from the edge of the area by Elz Cibwabwa. We could and should of scored more and Flackwell Heath clearly felt relieved by the final whistle.

It has been a frustrating start to 2019 for the development team. We have a chance next Saturday to right some wrongs when we play Abbey Rangers at home in the next round of the Suburban Challenge Plate.

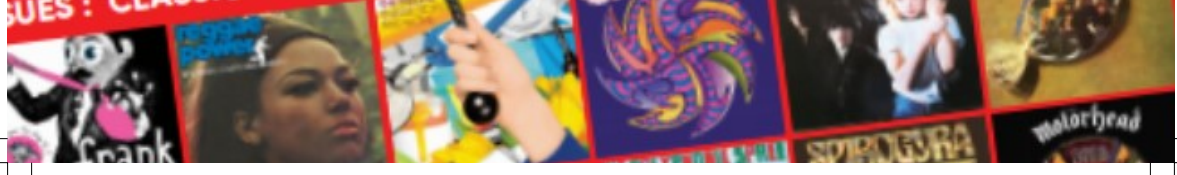
