Club Secretary Bryan Freeman writes on all matters involving the Knappers.

Good evening and welcome to our visitors Bedfont Sports, their players, officials and supporters, also to our match officials, for this penultimate home fixture of the 2009/10 season. Like being in a Marathon, the finishing line to this season's League programme is almost in sight. With the postponements, in what seems a marathon season with 40 league games this season, Knaphill, like several other clubs, see the season extending into the first week of May, and for a few, into a second week of the month.

After our recent 4-0 home win over Sheerwater, we've had nine days since that fixture and this evening's game with Bedfont, in what still has been a busy April. In contrast, Bedfont Sports have been even busier, and certainly not much time between their fixtures this month. Between 20 April until 8 May inclusive, it will result in nine games being played in that period.

Interesting run in for the final games as we look at the top of Division 1. Up to and including last Saturday, leaders Worcester Park had 85 points from 38 games, Staines Lammas played 39 with 78 points in second spot, Mole Valley third in the table with 73 points from 34 games, Knaphill 72 points from 36 in fourth place, and Hartley Wintney 39 games played on 72 points.

Last weekend saw Mole Valley crash to a 5-2 defeat at home by Hartley Wintney. Mole Valley played Chobham on Tuesday night(result elsewhere in this programme) and tonight are away to Farleigh Rovers. Whilst we had a blank Saturday last week, Bedfont Sports had a 3-1 home win against South Park.

Looking back at our game against Sheerwater, ten days ago, the team bounced back well from that 2-0 defeat by Mole Valley with a comfortable 4-0 success over our local rivals. Knaphil got off to a flying



started when Dan Cox made it 1-0 after just three minutes,and despite other chances for the team, it was the only goal of the first half. The team started the second half with virtually a repeat of the first, when again, three minutes into the half, Ed Cardona headed home from eight yards to increase the lead. Cardona got his second and Knaphill's third after 81 minutes, with Ricky Hogsden unleashing an excellent strike soon after to wrap up the three points.

Our Reserves are catching up on a few games this month. Following their 2-0 home win over South Park on 17 April, which was the visitors first defeat in 18 games, there was the narrow 2-1 defeat away to Mole Valley, followed two days later by a 4-2 loss at home against Frimley Green. Last Saturday, they lost 2-1 at Hanworth Villa. This Saturday the Reserves are home to Bedfont Sports Reserves, the first of four home games followed by Mole Valley(6 May), Bookham(11 May), and Farnham Town on 13 May.

Back to the first team, and this Saturday Knaphill are away for a swift return fixture at Sheerwater kick-off 3pm, followed by the visit to Farnham Town next Monday 3 May kick-off 11.30am. The final game of the season is on Saturday 8 May when Cobham will be the visitors to Redding Way kick-off 3pm. Meanwhile, enjoy this evening's game, and have a safe journey home...... **Bryan**



## **BEDFONT SPORTS**





Bedfont sports club was founded in 2002, when David and Terry Reader who ran the Bedfont Sunday side decided that it was time to progress and move into Saturday football and other sports for the local people of Bedfont. Shortly after, they were joined by Bedfont Eagles who became the clubs junior setup. The links were there to see as many of the Bedfont Sunday side had played for Bedfont Eagles over the years. Bedfont Sunday is the oldest of the 3 clubs, founded in 1962 it now has 4 men's sides and are one of the strongest Sunday set ups in Middlesex.

Bedfont Eagles, founded in 1978, has 16 sides from ages 6 to 16. Then we have bedfont sports girls who have 5 girl's teams and 1 ladies team. The club is one of the biggest in Middlesex and has now secured funding to help build a new changing facility to accommodate all its teams, to improve the training facilities to secure their future and install floodlights to carry on progressing.

These works will complete during the current season. Last season saw promoted to the combined counties league, which greatest achievement to date. ## THE LAST TIME WE MET

### Saturday 20th March 2010 Combined Counties League Division One Bedfont Sports 1 Knaphill 2





Although there was a certain lack of quality, this was more of a battling performance and some hard grafting, that steered Knaphill to another three points against Bedford Sports on Saturday, with a 90th minute winner coming from Matt Baker.

As far as chances in the in the first half were concerned, Knaphill fell short of seriously testing Bedfont's keeper, whilst the home side gave their visitors defence some cause for concern, especially in the first fifteen minutes. A quick break in the ninth minute almost saw Bedfont steal the lead as Turner struck the crossbar, and two minutes later, the ball bobbled off the bar and clawed to safety by Richard Shelley.

Bedfont were looking dangerous on the breaks, from which the Knaphill defence had to be alert. With Knaphill's Dan Cox always eager to push forward, the defender drilled an effort wide of the far post on 33 minutes, but just as it was looking to be a first half stalemate, Bedfont took the lead two minutes before the break, when Saman Kanani took his chance well to drive his shot into the far corner of goal.

More determination and chances showed in Knaphill's second half display, and substitute Chris Fox had two chances early on, driving the ball wide of the post, and firing over the bar. Knaphill got themselves back in the game after 58 minutes, when new signing from Farnham Town, Edward Cardona, pursued his intentions into the box and surrounded by two defenders, got the better of them as he scrambled the ball over the line from close range for the equaliser.

Knaphill's best, and most clear cut chance of the half came in the 73rd minute when Matt Baker's shot was palmed away by the keeper, as the ball bounced invitingly for Cardona who should have buried it, but fired over from 12 yards.

Whilst Bedfont had been pressing for a second goal, it was Knaphill's pursuance that brought them the winning goal in the 90th minute. Fox threaded a pass through to Baker who executed the delivery with perfection to make it 2-1. Knaphill held on during the five minutes of time added on, but were relieved when Bedfont's final chance hit the post, in the final minute, as Knaphill recorded their seventh consecutive league win.

Unfortunately our 12 match unbeaten run came to an abrupt end two weeks ago when we lost 2-0 away to Mole Valley.

We had the most uncharacteristic start to the game when we got caught napping in the first three minutes by a long ball which left the whole defence stranded and totally bemused when all they could do was watch Jay Holden the home sides leading goal scorer tap the ball over the line from close range after Richard Shelley fumbled the ball onto the cross bar.

Ten minutes later Matt Baker had a glorious chance to get us on level terms when he misdirected an excellent Eddy Cardona cross by heading just wide of the far post, but it wasn't to be our day.

This set the pattern of the first half if not the game not that we created too much because it was only 20 minutes later that we got caught napping again and went 2-0 down from a move started with a quick throw in only for the same Jay Holden to have the easiest of chances at the near post. Easy pickings indeed for the divisions leading goal scorer made even easier by our inept defending on the day.

I knew our fantastic run would one day come to an end, but I never expected it to end the way it did and to a side where their football somehow does not match their current league position, in my opinion anyway, but we played poorly on the day and Mole Valley deserved their victory, credit where credit is due they are where they are because they have won more games than us, but not necessarily because they play the better football but I guess that is the nature of the game.

As disappointing as it was losing to Mole Valley, we redeemed some pride and found our form quickly on the following Tuesday evening by beating our local rivals Sheerwater 4-0 here at Redding Way.

Our visitors really did not have much of a response to our passing game and could only defend in numbers and minimise the damage. This was our third success in beating another local side, the other two being Westfield and Chobham, just goes to show we must be doing something right despite the unjustified criticism levelled at us from time to time.

This was a good all round team performance combined with some excellent individual contributions particularly from Eddy Cardona, scorer of two goals but should have had a hat trick, Nick "Tank" Darnell who was immense in midfield again, and not forgetting the whole defensive unit who put things right on the night.

We are still in with a good chance of finishing third if we win at three of our last four games, but it will not be easy because I'm sure Bedfont will be keen to revenge their 2-1 defeat against us a month or so ago in which was a closely contested game, hopefully we will be up for the challenge as we were against Sheerwater and produce the kind of performance that was a major factor during our 12 match unbeaten run.

# HOME OF THE KNAPPERS ON THE NET

Knaphill Football Club began its life in 1924 at Waterer's Park.Waterer's Park was left to Woking Urban District Council in 1924 by Mr Anthony Waterer of Knaphill Nursery. The Recreation Ground was originally part of the nursery called "Blue Gates Field" and the park was laid out by Woking Council between 1924 and 1928 - the task taking so long as the bottom part of the field was very "soggy", whilst the rest was uneven and infested with moles. And these conditions can still be seen over 70 years later!

Very little history is known about the Club between 1924 and 1980, although we do know that the team colours were originally red and white.

In 1980 Knaphill were represented in the Old Woking and District League (now Guildford and Woking Alliance League) in Division 3 under Manager Dave Holloway. Dave took them from Division 3 through promotion to the Surrey Intermediate League. Dave then left Knaphill to take over Conference side Woking's reserve and youth teams.

The late Andy Westcott took over the Manager's position at Knaphill in 1984. Andy successfully took the Club from Division 3 to the Premier Division 1, at the same time Clive Howes was running the Reserve Team, who also won promotion from Division 3 to the Reserves Premier Division 1.Geoff Poulton was to go on to take over the running of the Reserve Team from Clive Howes.

In 1990, Mick Garbutt became the Manager of Knaphill and Paul Bambini was running the Reserve Team. Mick Garbutt left the Club in 1994 to join up with Colin Lippiatt and Geoff Chapple at Woking. After this time the club went into decline and was struggling for players for both the First and Reserve Teams. The decision was taken by then Senior Secretary, Sean Carrigy, to approach local team Heathlands, who were playing in the Guildford and Woking Alliance League. Heathlands found themselves struggling for facilities but not players; this gave the two teams the opportunity to amalgamate.

Season 1995/96 saw the arrival of Greg Anderson as Manager, with Sean Carrigy running the Reserve Team.

In 1996 Dave Freeman took over from Greg as First Team Manager. The Reserve Team Manager's position was handed over to Noff Diliberto in 1997; he left the Club a year later, when Carl Barker took over.

Season 2002/03 saw 2 new men at the helm with Mick Garbutt in charge of the 1st Team and Frank Walters in charge of the Reserves. Paul Bailey took over midway through 2002/2003; Carl Barker then had a second spell as Reserve Team Manager with Danny James as Reserve Team Coach and Dave Freeman as 1st team coach.

At the start of the 2003/2004 season the club formed a third team named KNAPHILL 'A' to play in the Guildford & Woking Alliance League due to volume of players at the club. Carl Barker took over as A Team Manager with Danny James in charge of the Reserves.

The 2004/2005 season brought about further changes at team management level seeing Dave Freeman retiring from playing due to injuries and being appointed as 1st Team Manager with Mick Garbutt stepping down to Assistant Manager. There was also a new man at the helm for the A Team with Kevin Fletcher taking over from Carl Barker who had taken up the Chairman role. The club also moved into there new ground at Redding Way and the re-development of the Waterers Park ground, due to finished by April 2005, giving Knaphill Football Club some of the best facilities in the Surrey area.

In the 2004/2005 season the Reserves finished Runners Up to Old Rutlishians and the A Team were beaten by a last gasp winner in the Junior Cup Semi-Final against Shepperton FB with 1st Team finishing 7th in there respective division.

Season 2005/2006 was destined to be a big season for the club with the club established at its new ground at Redding Way and the A Team reverting back to Waterers Park having had the facilities rebuilt. 1st Team Manager Dave Freeman continued in charge for the 2005/2006 campaign and appointed former professional with Bristol City, Bob Pritchard, who has also managed at senior level with Chertsey Town, amongst others, as 1st Team Coach. Kevin Fletcher was appointed Reserve Team Manager having impressed by running the A Team the previous season. The 2005/2006 season did prove successful as we won the Division One title on the last day of the season against nearest rivals Virginia Water and gained promotion to the Premier Division.Season 2006/2007 continued with Dave Freeman in charge of the 1st Team and Paul Bailey re-appointed as Reserve Team Manager. The A Team management was split during the season. Martin Hobson took charge during the first few months but had to resign due to work and family commitments. Gavin Wilcox and Tim Handley then took over until the end of the season.

The 1st Team claimed back to back titles by winning the Premier Division Championship which resulted in us achieving promotion to the Combined Counties Football League, the most successful period in the clubs history up to then. Bob Pritchard took over from Dave Freeman as Manager who became Bob's assistant during September 2007.

## historyofknaphillfootballclub

The 2007/08 season was the busiest the club has ever endured. Over 45 matches were played at Redding Way and the pitch was still the best in the league at the end of the season. Bob Pritchard and Dave Freeman led the club to a very commendable 7th place in the CCL, our first in senior football. The early season had seen Knaphill pushing for a top 5 position, but poor runs over the Christmas & Easter periods saw the clubs performances drop off the leading runners; still 7th place was an excellent result considering the circumstances. Steve Hutton led the Reserves campaign, a massive 40 games with a mixture of good and bad results, beating the leaders of the league on at least two occasions, but dropping too many points by conceding late goals. The A Team had an up and down season eventually finishing in 7th place in the GWAL 3rd Division table.

The closed season also saw the amalgamation of Knaphill FC and Knaphill Wanderers (the junior sides) at long last under the Knaphill FC banner. The Wanderers will keep their identity for the coming season and plans to achieve the highly sought after FA Community Charter status will continue in earnest.

The 2008/09 season started with a most welcome new face, the former Bisley and Farnborough Assistant Manager, Ian Savage. Ian joined us as player/coach and with his experience and knowledge this club has the right to feel proud that he chose to join Knaphill after receiving many other offers from teams at higher levels. Steve Hutton has left his post as Reserve Team manager for pastures new in the summer and was replaced by the very experienced Graham Pope, however Graham left the club in November due to personal reasons and side is now run by Adie Wilson and Lee Cook.

The A Team is now under the control of James Taylor and Brendan Baker who received the good news at the GWAL AGM that their team is to play in the 2nd Division last season after wholesale changes in the leagues constitution. With a reduction in League games in Division One to 34 from 38 in 2007/08, Knaphill entered two new Cup competitions. the Anagram Trophy and the Southern Combination Cup, both of which saw an early exit. However, the team kept a high profile in the League staying in the top half of the table all season, eventually finishing in fifth place. They could have become champions had they won their last game of the season when, in a tightly bunched set of teams in the top six. Knaphill on 69pts needed to win at Farleigh to pip Staines Lammas to the title. Disappointingly they lost 3-2, so near yet so far.

The Reserves finished ninth in their Division with the second half of the season providing a 17 match sequence losing just two games. Adie Wilson having taken over in November from Graham Pope gelled well his players and together that was shown with the results. The A team won promotion to Division 2 of the GWAL, their second move up the ladder having been promoted from Division 3 to Division 2 the previous season. The new season sees a B team starting their first season in Division4(North).

In the close season Terry Chapman was voted in as the new Chairman, replacing Nick Croshaw who stood down after two seasons. The newly formed Ladies side will also come under the senior banner and once again enhance on the size of the football club. Plans for floodlights and hard standing alongwith a 100 seated stand at Redding way are moving forward with the help of Woking Borough Council who continue as in recent years to support the football club.

So, a challenge ahead for individuals, players and management combined for the new season 2009/10.







## LATEST MATCH REPORT

Knaphill bounced back from last Saturday's defeat by Mole Valley, which ended their 12 match winning run, and soon got back on track with a comfortable 4-0 win over local rivals Sheerwater at Redding Way on Tuesday night.

Jack Ball was making his first team debut for Knaphill, in place of Matt Baker, and showed his early confidence, and following a move between Cox and Cardona, finished with Ball firing just wide of the post. Knaphill were creating a number of chances in the first part of the half, but the tempo slowed down as the half wore on, as they took their foot off the pedal, with Sheerwater able to contain the home side from increasing their lead, whilst seeking to get back on level terms themselves.

Knaphill's start to the second half was virtually a repeat of the first, at a swift pace, when in the 48th minute, Ed Cardona headed home from eight yards for a two goal lead. Sheerwater's attempt at reducing the deficit, brought Shelley back in action to save well from Sheerwater's Jerome Smart after 56 minutes.

Cardona was well placed to put Knaphill further ahead in the 67th minute, but volleyed his effort over the bar from just inside the 18 yard box. #### This week Bryan Freeman gets the Inside Talk from ......defender Dan Cox

Dan Cox has been a valuable asset to Knaphill's defence since joining the Club from Godalming Town last November. Dan was playing in the Suburban League side whilst at Godalming and after being at the Club for the latter half of the 2008/09 season, he stayed with them until November of the current season when he considered he wanted to move on, and Town's loss was Knaphill's gain.

There was another honour that came Dan's way when at the Southampton University where he was captain of the team and won the Hampshire Premier Cup and League in 2008. After his brief stay with Cobham in 2008/09, Dan made the move to Godalming halfway through the 2008/09 season.

During his playing time from Junior football through to higher levels, Dan's Dad had, during those years encouraged him in football, watching many of the games he played throughout the years, and to keep playing from that early age of six and to when he moved up to a higher level he is at now.

Dan has been in the defender's role for a vast amount of the time he's been playing football, although he was a striker for a while in Junior football, and has also played at right midfield. 
