Welcome to Redding Way

Good afternoon everyone, and a welcome to the players, officials and supporters from Bedfont Sports, who are currently in the promotion frame in Division One.

Our last meeting with today's opponents was early in November when we lost 3-2 after a battling performance almost snatched a point in the latter stages. Knaphill's goals came from Ricky Hogsden and James Wills. The midweek results for today's teams saw Bedfont Sports lose away to Warlingham 3-0, whilst Knaphill had the 1-0 win against Eversley.

Following our win over Frimley Green last Saturday in what proved to be a goal bonanza, ten goals in total and a 6-4 win for Knaphill, we went into our first league match under Floodlights at Redding Way on Tuesday with Eversley the visitors. The fixture saw a return to Redding Way of former Knaphill player coach Ian Savage, who joined Eversley earlier in the season, and he could see for himself on the night, how much we have changed with our form and results since his departure from Knaphill.

But before touching on that match, a brief reflection on last Saturday's feast of Goals. Ten in total, with eight coming in the second half – entertaining for the spectators, but maybe not for the Managers of both sides, who saw their teams have lapses in defence leading to some of the goals. However, it was a first for Knaphill to have so many goals scored, not only since we've been at Redding Way, but in any match, home or away for years!

With the final outcome of a 6-4 win for Knaphill, it was a roller coaster ride of scoring which showed its main impact in the second half. The Knaphill goals came from Matt Baker(2), Woody Cardona(2), Ricky Hogsden and Alex Lumley.

Onto Tuesday night, and it was lighting up time at Redding Way for our first League match under the new Floodlights. Well, there wasn't a goal rush as three days previously, but in front of our biggest crowd of the

season, one goal, a penalty, was enough to give us maximum points to make it 11 wins from our 14 unbeaten games.

Both sides created chances and had goal scoring opportunities throughout the game, but the deadlock was broken after 28 minutes when Chris Fox was upended in the box, and from the resultant penalty, Matt Baker tucked away the spot kick. Richard Shelley denied the visitors a goal chance on three occasions with some fine saves and on the night Knaphill produced an impressive performance. Match Report elsewhere in the programme.

Although our position still remained 10th in the table, after Knaphill's win, four teams are now on 48 points from tenth to seventh spot, only separated by goal difference, and all four clubs are just three points away from fifth place. So the theme after that is to keep on picking up the points to burst clear of the teams around us, oh yes, and look to the others to drop some!

Last Saturday our Reserves lost 3-0 away to Mole Valley Reserves, who are now the Reserves Division champions. Also last week, on Wednesday, the Youth U18s lost to Ascot Utd U18s 3-1. The Reserves are away to Bedfont Sport Reserves this afternoon.

Today, we play our third successive home game, and looking ahead – next Tuesday we are at home again with a visit from Chobham kick-off 7.30pm, then we go to Hartley Wintney on Friday 15 April kick-off 7.30pm. This game was switched from its original Saturday date. The following Tuesday 19 April, we are back at Redding Way with Warlingham the visitors kick-off 7.30pm..

Deserved Win

In front of their biggest crowd of the season, Knaphill chalked up their 11th win in an unbeaten run of 14 matches with a 1-0 win over Eversley at Redding Way on Tuesday night, playing their first League game under the new floodlights. It was an impressive performance from Knaphill in a game that was evenly matched. After Tuesday night's results, four clubs including Knaphill, are now on 48 points (separated by goal difference), with all four just three points away from fifth place in the table.

Knaphill sent in their first telling effort on goal after 12 minutes with Chris Fox shooting wide of the post, and soon after Ricky Hogsden fired in a long range that veered wide of the goal. The opening stages of the half were played at a fast pace, both teams intent on trying to make an early breakthrough. For Knaphill, this came after 28 minutes when Chris Fox was upended in the 18 yard box, resulting in a clear cut penalty, from which Matt Baker slotted home the spot kick to make it 1-0.

Eversley were pressing forward looking for that gap to get a goal scoring chance. and in the 35th minute Richard Shelley denied the visitors when Darren Sked was through, only for the keeper to make a fine save. Knaphill's work rate was good in a half that was to see a fair amount of possession, with their defence coping well with some swift breaks from the visitors.

In the second half chances came and went for both teams. Early in the half Alex Lumley swung over a fine cross into the box, missed by Cardona, but latched onto by Hogsden who from eight yards hooked his effort over the bar. On the hour mark it was Hogsden who fired just wide of the post, and in the 65th minute at the other end, Shelley saved at the near post as Eversley pushed for an equaliser, followed a minute later by the keeper denying the visitors again.

Knaphill had a chance to increase their lead in the 69th minute when Baker's shot curled wide of the post. The home defence had to defend well to hang onto their single goal lead, but it was Knaphill that came close to grabbing a late second goal two minutes into stoppage time, when a fierce free kick by Baker from the edge of the 18 yard area saw the Eversley keeper forced into punching the effort clear. But in the end it proved the single goal was enough to reward Knaphill with maximum points and keep the unbeaten run going.

When these two teams last met back here in March 2010, the scoreline was close, with Knaphill snatching a 90th minute winner. In this game on Thursday evening at Redding Way, it was a slender 1-0 advantage for Knaphill until late in the game, when a second goal secured another three points from a match that overall, the home side did enough to keep intact a sequence of being unbeaten at home since the first week of November last year, whilst keeping up their impressive run of 16 wins from 19 games since the beginning of January.

Chances fell to both sides, albeit not that many clear cut, but that came about by a lack of cutting edge finishing. The early pressure came from Knaphill, whilst Bedfont did, on the break, cause some anxious moments in the home defence from a half that failed to produce a goal.

The second half showed more creation from Knaphill when pushing forward, early chances fell to Nick Darnell and Chris Fox. The ideal opportunity to open the scoring came ten minutes into the half when Knaphill were awarded a penalty. But Ricky Hogsden's spot kick sailed over the bar. Then in the 60th minute, the Bedfont keeper gathered the ball just over the edge of the 18 yard area, and from the free kick, Stephen Flinn's well struck effort was driven home to make it 1-0, for Knaphill's 90th league goal of the season.

Richard Shelley denied Bedfont the chance of an equaliser with a good save from one of their swift moves, as chances fell for both sides as the half wore on. Knaphill held onto their slender lead until the 84th minute when substitute Matt Edwards did well to work the way in towards goal from the left along the by line, slipped a pass to another substitute Gavin Brainch, *left* who drilled in the second goal, his fifth from the defender this season.

Knaphill chalked up their 11th consecutive league win in the local derby encounter against Chobham at Redding Way on Saturday, which continued their amazing sequence that has now produced 39 points from a possible forty-five in the past fifteen league games played since the beginning of the year.

Knaphill got off to a bright start taking a two goal lead within the first fifteen minutes, showing their early intent when Ricky Hogsden's second minute effort was saved by the keeper, then a minute later Matt Baker made his mark when he drilled in a strike from the edge of the 18 yard box to make it 1-0.

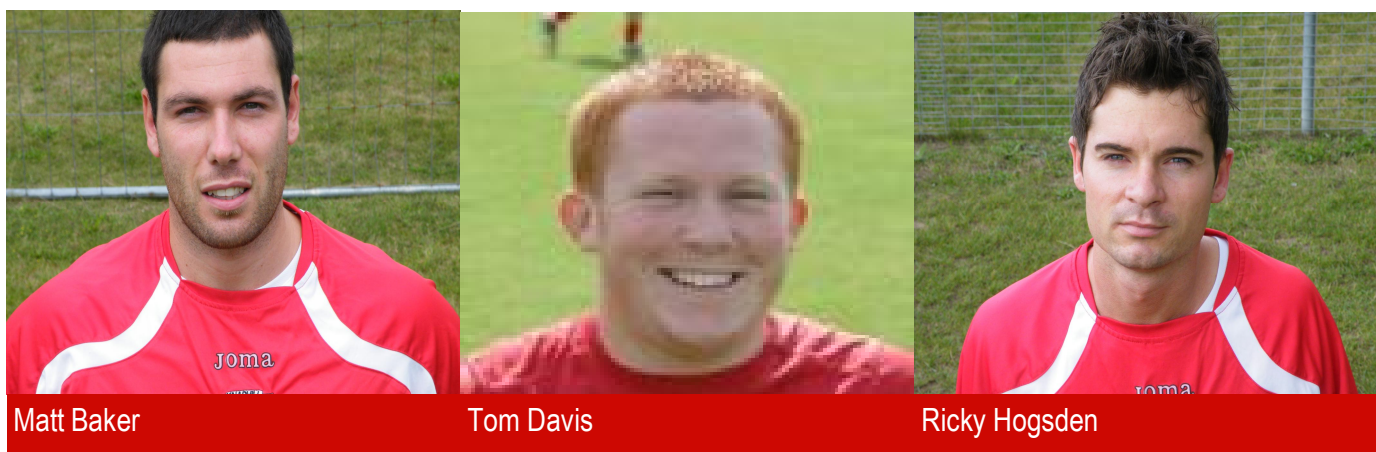
With some early pressure, Knaphill increased their lead in the 11th minute when Baker provided the pass for Tom Davis to latch onto, and he unleashed his shot into the far corner of goal. Chobham then had an opportunity to reduce the deficit when Jack Thompson delivered a strike from just inside the box which forced a good save from Richard Shelley.

From around the midway mark of the half, Knaphill were given a couple of nervy moments in their defence by the visitors. Knaphill were losing a bit of their shape allowing Chobham to engineer some swift breaks as the half progressed. On 24 minutes Thompson crossed the ball for Andy Carr, who fired just wide of the far post. Knaphill went close to a third goal three minutes later when Baker's header was cleared off the line.

After 35 minutes, Knaphill had an opportunity to increase the lead, but Hogsden saw his shot beaten out by Scott in the Chobham goal, allowing Chris Fox to follow up, but his effort was way over the bar. Three minutes before halftime, Chobham pulled a goal back when Carr strove into the box to drive the ball in between the diving Shelley and the post to reduce the deficit.

Ten minutes into the second half, Knaphill's Dan Cox worked his way down the right, cut in and crossed for Hogsden to steer past Scott to make it 3-1 in the 55th minute. Hogsden had a golden opportunity to increase the lead after 61 minutes, but on a one to one with the keeper, had his effort pushed away for a corner by the keeper.

Chobham battled away and pressurised the home defence as Miles was forced into having to hook a goalbound shot from Lvan Kurtaj, away to safety. At the other end, Hogsden blasted over after a cross from Davis. Both sides had further chances in the half, but the scoreline remained at 3-1 to secure another three points for Knaphill.

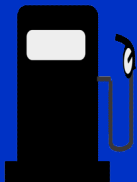

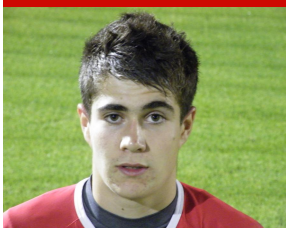
