Good afternoon everyone and on this third Saturday of the new season, a welcome to the players and officials from Bedford Sports, the supporters from both Clubs, and our three match officials for this Division One encounter at Redding Way. From the original fixture list for today, this game was not on the agenda, but was scheduled to be played in November. But due to Bedford having a 'walkover' in their FA Cup Preliminary round tie against Bicester, (who have now folded) they were without a game, and with Knaphill already having a blank Saturday in the fixture list, the game was brought forward to today.

Our opponents this afternoon were very much in the running for a promotion spot last season, only to falter in the final run in. Our two games against Bedford in the 2010/11 season brought a 2-0 win for Knaphill at home, and a 3-2 defeat away. Bedford Sports have got off to a flying start at this season, three wins from their first three games, Farleigh 2-0, South Kilburn 3-0, and last Saturday 1-0 at home to Worcester Park. On the same day, Knaphill got off the mark in the local derby game against Sheerwater with maximum points in the 4-2 win. A result that saw us jump from bottom place before kick-off and up to ninth after the match!

The game though did provide an early shock start for the home side as Sheerwater took the lead in the third minute, but after fifteen minutes Knaphill equalised through Brian Murphy. Knaphill took the lead in the 44th minute when Chris Fox unleashed a terrific shot from the edge of the 18 yard box make it 2-1. Ricky Hogsden extended the lead on 76 minutes, but Sheerwater struck back with a second goal two minutes later. Five minutes from time, Fox was upended in the box and Matt Baker duly despatched the penalty to make it 4-2 and seal the three points.

After our defeat by Guernsey on the opening day of the season, other Division One clubs were probably looking to see how the league newcomers would be faring against other teams after that first match. Their second game was at Hartley Wintney on with a 2-2 draw, the home side snatching a point in injury time, and last weekend Guernsey beat Warlingham 3-0 in front of a 1,441 crowd (just 34 less than against Knaphill). They are at Eversley today. It may prove difficult for other clubs to keep them out of the top three as the season progresses. However, it's early days yet, but don't rule out some challenges for the leading pack from a few other clubs in Division One this season.

Knaphill Reserves kicked off their season last week against Raynes Park Reserves and gave an excellent performance with a 4-1 win, the goals coming from Halona Masemba(2) and one apiece for Perry Coles and Liam Welch. Manager Andy Martin and his Assistant Gary Taylor have a very young side, but if they continue with their showing from last week, then more of the same could well be flowing in the forthcoming weeks. Unfortunately for the team, they are without a game today, but resume their League programme next Saturday at home the CB Hounslow Reserves.

Knaphill play their third successive home League game next Tuesday when Hartley Wintney are the visitors to Redding Way, kick-off 7.30pm however should Hartley draw there FA Cup tie today then they will replay on Tuesday 23rd August which will our fixture with them will be arranged for another day. Next Saturday 27th August, we are away to Farleigh Rovers, and the last fixture this month will be on Bank Holiday Monday 29 August at home to Eversley, with a 12.00 kick-off.

Saturday August 20 2011 Knaphill 4 Sheerwater 2 Combined Counties League Division One

With the opening day defeat by Guernsey now behind them, Knaphill opened their account in the first home League game of the new season in Saturday's local derby against Sheerwater at Redding Way, which saw them secure maximum points with a 4-2 victory over their local rivals.

The game looked like getting off got to a flying start for Knaphill when in the first 30 seconds, Chris Fox went on an electrifying run on the left flank and headed for goal, but the opportunity saw his effort blaze over the bar. It was Sheerwater though that stunned the home side in the third minute, when a cross from the left found Dan Bennett who, with space in the 18 yard box, rifled his shot past former Sheers keeper Tony Davis to make it 1-0,

After 13 minutes, Fox put Matt Baker through, but the Knaphill striker saw his effort parried away by Graham Palmer, who then turned a shot from Ricky Hogsden away for a corner. Knaphill didn't have to wait too long to get themselves back on level terms, when in the 15th minute Hogsden slipped a pass to Brian Murphy who ended with a one on one with the Sheerwater keeper, who fumbled the ball allowing Murphy to make a simple tap in for the equaliser.

As the half progressed, Knaphill were getting more into their stride pushing the visitors on the defensive, although the home side did have to be aware of some swift breaks into the heart of the home defence by their opponents. On the half hour Hogsden's header was saved by Palmer at the foot of the near post and a further chance for Knaphill saw Alex Lumley's shot tipped over by the keeper. In the 44th minute, the industrious Chris Fox weaved his way towards goal and from the edge of the 18 yard box unleashed a fierce drive into the far corner to give Knaphill a 2-1 halftime lead.

Some of the momentum was lost by both sides in the first part of the second half, but scoring opportunities were renewed with just over an hour gone, when first Knaphill's Chris Fox hit the post, then Davis was to deny Sheerwater a goal scoring opportunity. Knaphill's defence had a close escape in a goalmouth scramble after 73 minutes, but managed a desperate clearance to safety.

Knaphill increased their lead through Ricky Hogsden to make it 3-1 after being set up by Marcus Sili-man after 76 minutes, but Sheerwater reduced the margin within two minutes when Dan Bennett scored from close range after the home side were slow to clear their lines. Five minutes from time, Knaphill scored their fourth from a penalty after Fox was upended in the box, with Baker firing home the spot kick to make it 4-2, and gain their first points of the season.

Welcome Everybody to "Seven Days", our Weekly Catch Up of events within The Cherry Red Records Combined Counties Football League for season 2011/12.

We are now one week into the season and looking at the results so far it is certainly looking mighty interesting especially if your loyalties are with Guildford City, Bedfont Sports and Staines Lammas Reserves.

Following their 6-2 victory over Mole Valley SCR Guildford City recorded a 4-1 home victory against Sandhurst Town thanks to goals from Jaydon Gibbs, Dan Moody, Austin Gachenu, Alexander Jeffers did pull a goal back for The Fizzers late on but a further goal from Joel Hughes restored the three goal advantage to give a final scoreline of 4-1.

Second half the home side had a lot of the ball but the long ball tactics saw some brave defending by Ash but they held on to bag the points

Division One early season pace setters are Bedfont Green with 3 wins out of 3, their latest victims were Worcester Park who were last seasons champions, a solitary headed goal from George Marks was sufficient for them to secure maximum points closely followed by new boys Guernsey who in midweek picked up a very good point at Hartley Wintney sharing a most entertaining 2-2 draw, they then followed that up with a 3-0 home win over Warlingham on Saturday courtesy of goals from Angus Mackay and a brace from Glyn Dyer.

The clubhouse now contains a mixture of contemporary photos and club history for those who wish to learn more about the club. The home dressing room has new features to make the match day experience more comfortable and entertaining for the players before the don their Knappers shirts.

Around the ground itself you may have noticed the top rail of the post and rail fencing is now painted white. After visiting a number of different grounds during evening games last season, it was seen that most clubs had bright railing to help show them up when the floodlights were on. We now have a tarmac hardstand down the dugout side of the ground which now allows access from the clubhouse to the far end of that side without having to cross any potentially muddy ground. This was installed to meet the requirements for entry into the FA Vase this season. For next season we will need to do the same to the far side to meet the requirements for entry into the FA Cup, which has long been a target of the club.

Knaphill's victory over promotion chasing Bedfont Sports at Redding Way on Saturday with goals from leading goalscorer Ricky Hogsden, paved the way to their 12th win in an unbeaten sequence of 15 matches, which has accumulated thirty nine points, an excellent run considering their previous 15 games had reaped just twelve points!

Bedfont opened the game at a fast pace with frequent attacks on the home defence as the threat of an early goal was snuffed out by some good goalkeeping from Richard Shelley, who was to deny striker Lee Tunnell on three occasions. The striker's first effort came after three minutes before the keeper saved again after twenty minutes.

Knaphill's first effort on goal was a rather weak long range shot from Chris Fox past the post in the 16th minute, then five minutes later Matt Baker produced the first major threat on the visitors goal with his driving effort saved at the foot of the post by the keeper.

But as the half wore on and into the latter stages, Knaphill were getting back into the game, although not before another dangerous move from the visitors saw Shelley deny the onrushing striker a goal scoring opportunity on the half hour.

After 40 minutes, Knaphill finally came good and broke the deadlock when a neat pass from Joe Turner found Ricky Hogsden, who drilled his shot past the keeper and into the far corner to make it 1-0. Whilst Shelley had played his part in denying Bedfont in the first half, the visitors had rued some later chances and Knaphill's opening goal had stunned the visitors.

Knaphill upped their workrate in the second half, whilst Bedfont were denied chances for an equaliser by the home defence, plus some of their own off target shooting. Knaphill produced three goal scoring opportunities from Nick Darnell, Baker and Hogsden, but then after 58 minutes Knaphill prised the visitors defence open and with swift precision, Hogsden slotted home from eight yards.

With the home side's two goal lead, Bedfont were showing some frustration as Knaphill were seeking to enhance on their lead. But although the visitors went close to reducing the deficit after 82 minutes when Tunnell struck the post from a free kick. But Knaphill held firm to finish with another three worthy points.

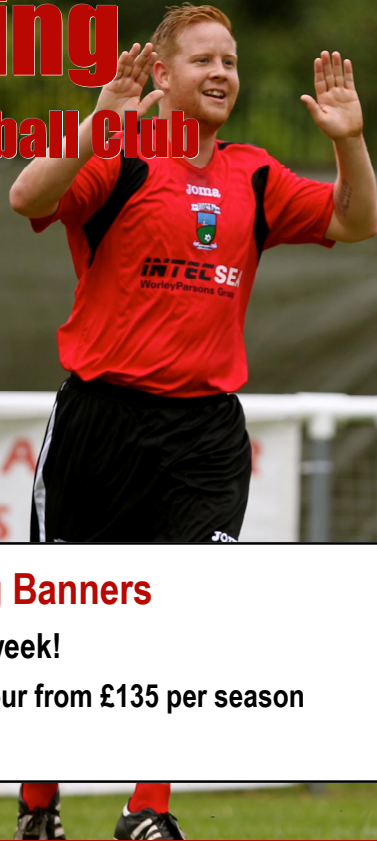
