Club Secretary Bryan Freeman writes on all matters involving the Knappers.

Good afternoon everyone and welcome to the players, officials and supporters from CB Hounslow, also to the three match officials, as we resume our Division 1 programme following last Saturday's postponement of our away fixture at Farnham Town. The last time we met CB Hounslow was in our third game of the season with Knaphill 4-2 winners, through goals from Matt Baker(2) Ricky Hogsden and James Wills.

Our last game here was two weeks ago when our good form continued with a 3-1 win over Farleigh Rovers to complete a season 'double', having won 2-1 away at Farleigh at the end of August. The win saw Knaphill edge past Farleigh in the league table to put us on 45 points and ahead of them on goal difference. Knaphill's run since the beginning of the year has now seen 19 points gained from a possible twenty-four.

With Knaphill having the best of the early exchanges in the first half, the deadlock was broken after 33 minutes when Tom Davis took his chance well to hammer home to make it 1-0. But Farleigh bounced back to equalise on the stroke of halftime. Despite a lot of possession and pressure on the visitors, Knaphill had to wait until very late in the game to finally capitalise on their chances with two emphatic strikes coming in the 87th minute when Matt Baker rifled his strike into the corner of goal to make it 2-1, and two minutes later, Chris Fox gleefully drilled in the third to wrap up the game and points.

With the weather returning to hit the League programme last weekend, our game at Farnham was one of the casualties in Division 1, where only three games were played, Croydon Municipal lost to Hartley Wintney, Eversley drew with Sheerwater, and Warlingham were beaten by Staines Lammas.



After our home win over Farleigh, we were just two points behind third place Hartley Wintney, but they are now eight points ahead, having played two games since the weekend of 20th February(prior to their midweek game v Warlingham)). Knaphill are in 6th spot after 26 games, and one of four clubs on 45 points. The leaders Worcester Park are currently on 62 points, and second place Staines Lammas on 59pts, both have played more games than teams below them.

Last week, Knaphill Reserves also suffered yet another game called off due to the weather, and have played just 16 games, with their last three scheduled matches being postponed. They now have 19 more games still to play between now and the end of the season, which is going to provide a hectic and busy finale to the 2009/10 league programme.

Next fixture at Redding Way will be the visit of Coulsdon United next Saturday 13 March kick-off 3pm. Coulsdon are currently the Division One basement club who from 26 games have gained just one point. After two home games, Knaphill are then back on their travels with a visit to Bedfont Sports on Saturday 27 March.

So, back to today's match which we hope will continue our recent form, with consistency being the focus point if we are to keep in touch with the leading pack.

It is far too early to talk about promotion, so much can happen between now and the end of the season, but one thing is for certain, our confidence is running high at the moment and the general atmosphere and attitude within the squad is excellent, I could not wish for a more contented group of players who have at long last realised the importance that not only talent gets you the results, a combination work ethic is equally important to achieve our goals.





MATCH REPORT THE LAST TIME WE MET OUR VISITORS

Combined Counties League Division One Saturday August 15 2009 CB Hounslow Utd 2 Knaphill 4





Bouncing back from their defeat by Frimley Green in midweek, Knaphill registered their first win of the new season with a comfortable 4-2 result over CB Hounslow on Saturday, with all the goals coming in the second half, as Knaphill strode to a four goal lead before conceding two late goals.

Despite putting a fair amount of pressure on the home defence, Knaphill were unable to translate that into goals, with the visitors showing their early intent in the first half. Chris Fox collected a pass from Ricky Hogsden only to have his effort saved by the keeper at the near post, then Fox latched onto a fine raking pass from defender Nathan Miles, who produced some searing runs into the opponents half, but Fox's shot veered wide of goal.

A cracking free kick from Matt Baker after 22 minutes was foiled by the keeper at the near post as more pressure was exerted by Knaphill on their hosts. Another finely timed run and cross by Miles found Baker, but his hurried attempt at goal went over the top.

In the 38th minute Baker had a shot partially saved, the loose ball running for Hogsden whose effort was smothered by the keeper. With chances spurned by CB Hounslow, the half ended with Knaphill producing plenty of effort, but no goals.

Five minutes into the second half and Knaphill's determined approach saw Baker's 25 yard free kick fly over the bar, and Hogsden's attempt on goal cleared for a corner. Just over the hour and the deadlock was finally broken as Knaphill had found that extra gear and pace as James Wills worked his way into the 18 yard box to score into the far corner from eight yards.

Baker had one shot just wide of the far post before Knaphill breezed through the home defence to take a stronger grip on the game. In the 71st minute, Fox's pass to Baker saw last season's top goalscorer hammered a fierce drive that bulged the back of the net. Two minutes later Knaphill were leading 3-0, Fox the provider to Hogsden who finished with a neat effort into the far corner.

Those two goals had the home defence floundering, whilst action at the other end Vic Flynn had to be sharp to clear a shot from Powell away for a corner, then Wheeler was alert to make a save off a defender's deflection.

After 85 minutes, Knaphill were awarded a penalty for handball in the box, and who else, but Baker stepped up to neatly tuck the ball away with the spot kick to make it 4-0. Two late goals from CB Hounslow in the 89th minute and deep into stoppage time courtesy of some slack defending, did not deflect however in taking the gloss off Knaphill's overall performance and well earned three points.

Knaphill Football Club began its life in 1924 at Waterer's Park. Waterer's Park was left to Woking Urban District Council in 1924 by Mr Anthony Waterer of Knaphill Nursery. The Recreation Ground was originally part of the nursery called "Blue Gates Field" and the park was laid out by Woking Council between 1924 and 1928 - the task taking so long as the bottom part of the field was very "soggy", whilst the rest was uneven and infested with moles. And these conditions can still be seen over 70 years later!

Very little history is known about the Club between 1924 and 1980, although we do know that the team colours were originally red and white.

In 1980 Knaphill were represented in the Old Woking and District League (now Guildford and Woking Alliance League) in Division 3 under Manager Dave Holloway. Dave took them from Division 3 through promotion to the Surrey Intermediate League. Dave then left Knaphill to take over Conference side Woking's reserve and youth teams.

The late Andy Westcott took over the Manager's position at Knaphill in 1984. Andy successfully took the Club from Division 3 to the Premier Division 1, at the same time Clive Howes was running the Reserve Team, who also won promotion from Division 3 to the Reserves Premier Division 1. Geoff Poulton was to go on to take over the running of the Reserve Team from Clive Howes.

In 1990, Mick Garbutt became the Manager of Knaphill and Paul Bambini was running the Reserve Team. Mick Garbutt left the Club in 1994 to join up with Colin Lippiatt and Geoff Chapple at Woking. After this time the club went into decline and was struggling for players for both the First and Reserve Teams. The decision was taken by then Senior Secretary, Sean Carrigy, to approach local team Heathlands, who were playing in the Guildford and Woking Alliance League. Heathlands found themselves struggling for facilities but not players; this gave the two teams the opportunity to amalgamate.

Season 1995/96 saw the arrival of Greg Anderson as Manager, with Sean Carrigy running the Reserve Team.

In 1996 Dave Freeman took over from Greg as First Team Manager. The Reserve Team Manager's position was handed over to Noff Diliberto in 1997; he left the Club a year later, when Carl Barker took over.

Season 2002/03 saw 2 new men at the helm with Mick Garbutt in charge of the 1st Team and Frank Walters in charge of the Reserves. Paul Bailey took over midway through 2002/2003; Carl Barker then had a second spell as Reserve Team Manager with Danny James as Reserve Team Coach and Dave Freeman as 1st team coach.

At the start of the 2003/2004 season the club formed a third team named KNAPHILL 'A' to play in the Guildford & Woking Alliance League due to volume of players at the club. Carl Barker took over as A Team Manager with Danny James in charge of the Reserves.

The 2004/2005 season brought about further changes at team management level seeing Dave Freeman retiring from playing due to injuries and being appointed as 1st Team Manager with Mick Garbutt stepping down to Assistant Manager. There was also a new man at the helm for the A Team with Kevin Fletcher taking over from Carl Barker who had taken up the Chairman role. The club also moved into there new ground at Redding Way and the re-development of the Waterers Park ground, due to finished by April 2005, giving Knaphill Football Club some of the best facilities in the Surrey area.

In the 2004/2005 season the Reserves finished Runners Up to Old Rutlishians and the A Team were beaten by a last gasp winner in the Junior Cup Semi-Final against Shepperton FB with 1st Team finishing 7th in there respective division.

Season 2005/2006 was destined to be a big season for the club with the club established at its new ground at Redding Way and the A Team reverting back to Waterers Park having had the facilities rebuilt. 1st Team Manager Dave Freeman continued in charge for the 2005/2006 campaign and appointed former professional with Bristol City, Bob Pritchard, who has also managed at senior level with Chertsey Town, amongst others, as 1st Team Coach. Kevin Fletcher was appointed Reserve Team Manager having impressed by running the A Team the previous season. The 2005/2006 season did prove successful as we won the Division One title on the last day of the season against nearest rivals Virginia Water and gained promotion to the Premier Division. Season 2006/2007 continued with Dave Freeman in charge of the 1st Team and Paul Bailey re-appointed as Reserve Team Manager. The A Team management was split during the season. Martin Hobson took charge during the first few months but had to resign due to work and family commitments. Gavin Wilcox and Tim Handley then took over until the end of the season.

The 1st Team claimed back to back titles by winning the Premier Division Championship which resulted in us achieving promotion to the Combined Counties Football League, the most successful period in the clubs history up to then. Bob Pritchard took over from Dave Freeman as Manager who became Bob's assistant during September 2007.

The 2007/08 season was the busiest the club has ever endured. Over 45 matches were played at Redding Way and the pitch was still the best in the league at the end of the season. Bob Pritchard and Dave Freeman led the club to a very commendable 7th place in the CCL, our first in senior football. The early season had seen Knaphill pushing for a top 5 position, but poor runs over the Christmas & Easter periods saw the clubs performances drop off the leading runners; still 7th place was an excellent result considering the circumstances. Steve Hutton led the Reserves campaign, a massive 40 games with a mixture of good and bad results, beating the leaders of the league on at least two occasions, but dropping too many points by conceding late goals. The A Team had an up and down season eventually finishing in 7th place in the GWAL 3rd Division table.

The closed season also saw the amalgamation of Knaphill FC and Knaphill Wanderers (the junior sides) at long last under the Knaphill FC banner. The Wanderers will keep their identity for the coming season and plans to achieve the highly sought after FA Community Charter status will continue in earnest.

The 2008/09 season started with a most welcome new face, the former Bisley and Farnborough Assistant Manager, Ian Savage. Ian joined us as player/coach and with his experience and knowledge this club has the right to feel proud that he chose to join Knaphill after receiving many other offers from teams at higher levels. Steve Hutton has left his post as Reserve Team manager for pastures new in the summer and was replaced by the very experienced Graham Pope, however Graham left the club in November due to personal reasons and side is now run by Adie Wilson and Lee Cook.

The A Team is now under the control of James Taylor and Brendan Baker who received the good news at the GWAL AGM that their team is to play in the 2nd Division last season after wholesale changes in the leagues constitution. With a reduction in League games in Division One to 34 from 38 in 2007/08, Knaphill entered two new Cup competitions. the Anagram Trophy and the Southern Combination Cup, both of which saw an early exit. However, the team kept a high profile in the League staying in the top half of the table all season, eventually finishing in fifth place. They could have become champions had they won their last game of the season when, in a tightly bunched set of teams in the top six. Knaphill on 69pts needed to win at Farleigh to pip Staines Lammas to the title. Disappointingly they lost 3-2, so near yet so far.

The Reserves finished ninth in their Division with the second half of the season providing a 17 match sequence losing just two games. Adie Wilson having taken over in November from Graham Pope gelled well his players and together that was shown with the results. The A team won promotion to Division 2 of the GWAL, their second move up the ladder having been promoted from Division 3 to Division 2 the previous season. The new season sees a B team starting their first season in Division4(North).


In the close season Terry Chapman was voted in as the new Chairman, replacing Nick Croshaw who stood down after two seasons. The newly formed Ladies side will also come under the senior banner and once again enhance on the size of the football club. In-form Knaphill continued their climb upwards in Division 1 with a well deserved 3-1 win over Farleigh Rovers at Redding Way on Saturday. In their last eight league games they've gained 19 points from a possible twenty four, to put them within touching distance of the top three. But for all their endeavours, graft and determination, Knaphill had to wait until the last few minutes to stamp their final authority on the match with two excellent goals.

Both teams seemed to want to an early advantage with a high speed start to the opening stages of the game. Knaphill were creating more chances than their opponents and should have taken the lead after 18 minutes, but somehow a precision pass from Gavin Brainch found Matt Baker in front of goal, who was unable to add a finishing touch, then two minutes later, Ricky Hogsden hit the side netting as he cut in on goal.

In the first half hour, Knaphill were having the better of the exchanges, and the deadlock was broken in the 33rd minute when Tom Davis took his chance well to hammer home from 15 yards to give Knaphill the lead. Farleigh bounced back to equalise in the 45th minute when the home defence failed to clear danger, allowing Steff Malcolm to make it 1-1.

Knaphill showed determination to regain the lead early in the second half when Baker had a shot turned away for a corner by the Farleigh keeper, before a Chris Fox header went over the bar. Prior to that, Knaphill keeper Richard Shelley made a fine save to deny Farleigh's Hindson. Knaphill put pressure on the visitors defence but found themselves unable to capitalise on some of their chances.

Fox had a good opportunity after 82 minutes, but with the keeper stranded, it was a defender who made a timely block from his shot. However the pressure and workrate paid off with emphatic strikes coming late in the game. In the 87thminute, a cross from Davis found Matt Baker who rifled his strike into the corner of goal for a 2-1 lead, then two muinutes later, Chris Fox gleefully drilled home the third goal to wrap up the game and maximum points.

The only blip on the days proceedings was the sending off of substitute Matt Edwards for violent conduct late on.

This week Bryan Freeman gets the Inside Talk frommidfielder Tom Davis

Tom Davis, probably better known by his team mates as his nick name of 'Hodgie', (how that came about I didn't ask!), is making his mark in the first team where to date he has featured in the squad for nine games this season, after starting in the Reserves, when he signed for Knaphill on 3rd September last year. He made is debut two days later in the match against Farnham Town Reserves.

Tom, or Hodgie, was born in Chertsey on 8th November 1985 and began to show his footballing skills from the early age of six years old when he joined the Bisley Cubs. Tom was to be the leading figure of their team with the number of matches he played and goals scored during his stay at the Club until he was 11 years old. Then it was time to move on, when he joined one of the leading Junior clubs in the local area, Meadow Sports, where he stayed until he was fifteen.



At Meadow, Tom was in the team that won the League title every year and the County Cup once. Progression was always in the mind of Tom as far as his football went, and on leaving Meadow Sports, he moved to join Westfield and played for the Youth under 18's. At 17 years old, he joined Cobham where he received Youth Player of the Year, and Players Player of the Year awards. He also went onto gain the Players Player of the Year award and Manager's Player of the Year award for the first team by the age of eighteen.



Tom was injured in 2006, three days after his 21st birthday and was in and out of the side due to injuries for two years, with injuries cropping up in pre-season for three years. Staying in the Combined Counties League football, Tom made a further step with his next Club which was Knaphill when he signed in September last year.

Reflecting on the time he moved up to the level of football in the CCL, Tom found it was definitely more physical, tougher, and played at a quicker pace, but with a challenge, and it's the challenge he has given himself by the move across from Cobham, relegated last season, to a progressive Club that he is now with.

But he says that he feels the need to be fitter, lose a couple of stone, and believes that with consistency, keep winning, and hard work from the team, comes an opportunity for Knaphill to maybe grab a promotion place. Tom recently scored his first goal for the first team in the 3-1 win over Farleigh Rovers two weeks ago. His other sporting interests over the past years have been Golf, Cricket and Tennis, but football will always be his number one sport.

John Wood is the current Treasurer of Knaphill Football Club, and it's the second time he has taken on that role, the first was way back in the 1960's, whilst John's first connection and involvement with Knaphill goes back a long time – 52 years in actual fact! John moved from his Essex home to his new location in Surrey in 1958 which led him to finding a local Football Club to join, which after moving to Knaphill, the obvious choice was Knaphill FC.

On joining, John was to stay for many years, first on the playing side from 1958 for five years, when the Club was in the Woking & District League, now known as the Guildford & Woking Alliance. In 1960, whilst still a player, he took on the role of Secretary and Treasurer for Knaphill. John resigned as Secretary in 1985, but carried on for another five years as Treasurer and for both of these roles spanning 25 years, he received a long service award from the Surrey County FA.

Whilst with the Club in the Woking & District League, Knaphill progressed with three teams, and included one fantastic season of winning the League, League Cup, and Charity Cup and became the first club locally to have a sponsor from a local company. Knaphill Vice-President Mick Garbutt was with the Club as a player and manager, whilst John was still in the dual role of Secretary and Treasurer. John was with Knaphill when they joined the Surrey Intermediate League in 1983.

Attending Knaphill's Annual Dinner & Dance in 1985, players from previous years met up with John on that evening when he was honoured for his 25 years dual role with a Trophy, Silver Plate and a Red Book, the latter of which was in a version of 'This Is Your Life' – a popular tv programme. These were originally going to be presented to John by Trevor Brooking, West Ham & England player for many years. But at the time of the event, was unable to make the occasion – he was involved in a Cup replay with the Hammers!

Now, after many years, John has returned to the fold at Knaphill and in 2008 resumed the Treasurer's role, and in that capacity also serves the Club in their third League, the CCL, following the Surrey Intermediate League and the Woking & District of the past years.

Both teams had opportunities in this half, but with Staines feeling comfortable with their slender lead, Knaphill engineered the best goal of the game. After 75 minutes, Matt Edwards worked his way to the edge of the 18 yard box delivered a perfectly flighted cross which was met by Hogsden with a pin point header for the equaliser.
