

Welcome to Redding Way

Good afternoon everyone. Today we welcome to Redding Way the players and officials from CB Hounslow for a quick return fixture between the two teams, also welcome to our three match officials for this Division One encounter. It was just nine days ago that saw the previous meeting which on the night produced a 3-0 win for Knaphill and stretched their unbeaten run to ten matches which has included nine wins. That result put us in 8th place in the table, albeit for less than 48 hours!

With no game allocated to us last Saturday, and with all other teams playing, by the end of the day, we had slipped back to 10th position without playing! There are now four clubs on 40 points, including Knaphill, and two teams Eversley and Hartley Wintney, are just above Knaphill on goal difference. One of the four teams, Farleigh Rovers(11th) produced the surprise result of the day beating leaders Farnham Town 2-0. The biggest score of the day came at Hayes Gate who were hammered 9-1 by Worcester Park.

Plenty of goals too at South Park where the home side trounced Farnborough North End 7-0. At Cobham, it was Sheerwater who produced a good result, gaining a 2-0 win over their hosts. The current top four in Division One reads: Farnham, Bedfont Sports, South Park, Worcester Park. The latter two Clubs have chalked up 165 league goals between them so far this season!

Since Knaphill's last home game, the 1-1 draw against South Park, it's been a maximum haul of points from the last two away games. In the 3-1 success at Sheerwater two weeks ago, Knaphill trailed briefly to a Sheerwater goal on 28 minutes, but the lead was short lived as Ricky Hogsden equalised on the half hour mark, with Joe Turner making it 2-1 five minutes before halftime. Woody Cardona extended the lead after 70 minutes to make it 3-1 and give the visitors their fifth win on their opponents ground since joining the CCL in 2007.

Our next game was against CB Hounslow played at Bedfont Sports FC, and a 3-0 win for Knaphill, the goals coming from Jack Williams on 62 minutes, Alex Lumley making it 2-0 ten minutes later, and Joe Turner completed the scoring in the 77th minute as Knaphill recorded their 9th win of their unbeaten sequence. First team match reports, plus news and reports of our Reserves and Youth team can be found elsewhere in the programme.

Following several delays in commencing the installation of the floodlights, work finally got underway this week, and with the Stand already in place, we hope to be playing our rearranged fixtures for midweek under the lights during April with 7.30pm kick off. From the last weekend in March to the first week of May, we are scheduled to play 10 games (Saturdays and Midweek), eight of them in April.

Next Saturday 26th March, we are away to Feltham (who play at Bedfont Football & Social Club, Hatton Road, Bedfont), and the following week 2nd April, Frimley Green are the visitors to Redding Way kick-off 3pm.

As you can see the floodlights are in and almost completed. Personally I am very proud of what this club has achieved in such a short time with people no longer at the club and to the current crop of players and non players still involved, everyone has contributed to what you see around the ground at the moment and long may it continue.

Lastly I would like to welcome Roy Wright and his players to Redding Way today. We have a good record against CB Hounslow here since our arrival in the Combined Counties League so hopefully that will continue this afternoon.

Ground Development Update

At last the contractors are beginning the long awaited installation of the floodlights. Their progress has been held up by the recent wet weather, which has delayed the use of the heavy machinery used to erect the pylons. The stand was dropped into place on February 11th and the lights were supposed to follow shortly afterwards. The decision to delay the installation was the correct one, as no-one wanted the damage that would have been caused to the pitch surrounds.

As we have been waiting for four years for these developments to be completed at Redding Way and with the completion of the project so close, it is not surprising that this latest delay has led to much frustration from all parties concerned. At this moment in time we are currently scheduled for 4 1st team games, 1 Reserve team fixtures and 4 Youth team matches including a Cup semi-final tie against Hanworth Villa/Cobham due to be played in the second week of April.

The first game under lights should be the Reserves game against Farnham Town Reserves on the 29th March, while the first team should have their first experience under lights on the 5th of April playing Eversley. All kick-offs will be at 7.30pm and the usual warm welcome will be extended to all our visitors both old and new.

The completion of this part of the ground development is only the beginning of the works that need to be completed to bring Redding Way up to the standard required by the FA to play at this level and above. There will be hardstand to be completed around all four sides of the ground, although one side will need to be completed during the summer to comply with the Ground regulation requirements for the FA Vase. It has been a dream of the club since gaining 'senior' status to compete in the FA Vase and the FA Cup, hopefully this dream will be realised in early August when the boys run out in the preliminary round of The Vase.

Once promotion has been gained to the Premier Division a further 50 seat stand and additional covered standing will need to be installed as well as a tannoy system and an additional entry to the ground.

All of this costs money and although we have had great support from the Borough Council and The Football Foundation, we have had to pay our share of the costs and will continue to do so. Youth Cup Semi Final

Latest from the treatment room

Defender **Mike Ford**is making slow progress with his ankle injury he picked up in his full debut against Feltham on the 3rd January. Fordy tore ligaments on both sides of his ankle during the 3-1 win at Redding Way and he is set to be sidelined for another 3 weeks.

Defender **Dan Cox** is still sidelined with a knee injury and a return date as yet to be set for the former Godalming Town player. Midfielder Tom Davis is currently undergoing rehabilitation following his serious knee injury against Staines Lammas in January.

WHAT HADDENED HERE

Knaphill notched up their seventh win from their last nine games in the comfortable 3-0 success over CB Hounslow at Redding Way in the corresponding fixture last season. Despite having to make a couple of changes from their previous game with Wesley Harrison coming in for the suspended Ricky Hogsden, who was missing only his second game in 32 this season, and Martin Cook receiving a late call up to the side in place of keeper Richard Shelley, out through illness.

The first half hour saw Knaphill very much in control with plenty of possession, creating chances and a mid-half goal burst producing three goals within the space of four minutes. They should have been one up after just seven minutes. Defender Dan Cox delivered a neatly worked cross, which was fumbled by the keeper, the ball came out to Matt Baker, who could only provide a half hit shot from six yards which slid past the far post. Cox had an effort wide on 19 minutes, before Harrison glided his shot into the side netting three minutes later.



Then Knaphill prised open the visitors defence after another fine cross from Cox was sliced into goal by a defender to make it 1-0. A second goal came 90 seconds later, when defender Gavin Brainch sped into the 18 yard box to plant his shot into the far corner of goal. But the best of the three came from the hardworking Dan Cox who, from the edge of the box, rifled home an excellent goal to give Knaphill a commanding 3-0 lead. Plenty of pressure from Knaphill was put on the visitors defence as they glided through with some fluent moves, but there were no more goals to add to their three goal burst of the first half.

The second half did not quite have the same zip in their play as in the first 45 minutes. Had some chances been capitalised on, then it could have produced at least another couple of goals.

One was from a penalty after 77 minutes, when Chris Fox was upended in the 18 yard box, but Ian Savage's weak spot kick sailed past the post. Another of their scoring opportunities came near the end when Nick Darnell was in a good position to score a fourth goal from close range, but fired inches wide of the post.

MATCH REPORT

Saturday 5th March 2011 Sheerwater 1 Knaphill 3 Combined Counties Division One



Derby Joy!

Knaphill made it eight wins from nine matches since the beginning of January with a 3-1 success over local rivals Sheerwater on Saturday. It was the fifth time the visitors had beaten their hosts at their venue since joining the CCL. The match produced plenty of action, with attacking play from both sides, but after going behind on the half hour mark, Knaphill replied quickly and went on enhance their points tally with 25 now gained from their last nine games.

It was a quick pace start that was to produce chances for both teams. Sheerwater were looking dangerous on the counter attack whilst Knaphill had early opportunities from Turner and Baker in the first five minutes. Sheerwater went very close to opening the scoring in the 19th minute when Jamie Daltry's header came back off the post during a spell that saw the visitors needing to be alert to stem Sheers quick breaks.

Knaphill were denied what appeared to be a clear cut penalty after 23 minutes when Chris Fox was upended in the box, the only outcome being a corner to the visitors. Two minutes later Cardona's cross was met by Hogsden whose effort was erractically delivered over the bar. With action swinging back to the other end, Sheerwater took the lead in the 28th minute after the Knaphill defence had failed to cut out a corner, and from six yards Jake Olekszy took his chance well to make it 1-0.

The lead however was short lived as two minutes later Knaphill were level. Lee Gamble's well flighted cross from the edge of the 18 yard area reached the far post and Ricky Hogsden was in the right place at the right time to tap the ball home for the equaliser. This made the visitors add more pressure on the home side, and in the 40th minute Joe Turner's scuffed effort on the volley from 20 yards gave Knaphill the lead.

A determined Sheerwater were trying to get back into the game early in the second half, and Sam Connelly went close with a header which was over the bar after 56 minutes. Plenty of possession and generated moves from both teams, but the ratio of goal scoring chances were reduced for a while. But with 63 minutes gone, Knaphill were denied another penalty, even clearer than the one in the first half, as the hard working Fox was again fouled in the box, but no spot kick.

Knaphill made it 3-1 in the 70th minute when Matt Baker's header came back off the bar and Ed Cardona planted his header past the keeper from close range to give the visitors a 3-1 lead from which they were now looking comfortable with. Although Sheerwater had their best chance to reduce the arrears near the end as Chris Wye headed over, Knaphill held firm to reap another three points.

Knaphill's next fixture is this Thursday evening(10th March) when they play CB Hounslow Utd at Bedfont Sport FC, kick-off 7.45pm.

Brian Murphy's return to Knaphill in January this year has given him an encouraging comeback in the first team. Brian has kept a regular spot since taking over in midfield from the injured Nick Darnell at the end of January. His first game was the 4-0 win away at Frimley Green, and of course has been part of the team that has chalked up nine wins from their past 10 games.

Born in County Cork on 13th November 1986, Brian's start in football came when he was 11 years old at school, he then went on to progress with local junior teams including Bracknell based Forest FC, now disbanded. Going up to a higher level as he got older, Brian was to play for Wokingham Youth in the Allied Counties League, and Aldershot, before moving on to Bisley in a three year spell in the Hellenic League, gaining a League Championship medal.

The 24 year old midfielder has had two spells with Hellenic League side Finchhampstead, the first one seeing him as captain of the team. In between the times there, Brian played his first season at Knaphill who he joined in August 2008. But the 2008/09 season was over on at the beginning of November when he broke his fibula and tibula in the match against Chobham at Redding Way. At the time it was estimated he'd be out of the game for up to 15 months. He has played 10 games from the start of the season until the beginning of November.

Knappers Cruise To Victory

Knaphill's progress in 2011 continued as they chalked up their ninth win from ten games in their unbeaten run, with a 3-0 win over CB Hounslow on Thursday night. The amount of possession and chances, had Knaphill dominating large periods of a goalless first half. But the second half produced three goals and three worthy points which moved Knaphill up to 8th in the table.

Knaphill had the best of the opening exchanges, with three efforts stemming from free kicks. James Wills first opportunity after seven minutes went straight at the keeper, then Brian Murphy's shot had the keeper diving to his left to save. A forcefull free kick from Matt Baker from around 30 yards, went agonisingly past the post, and minutes later on a roaring run, saw him home in on goal only to see his effort just over the bar.

Up until then, CB Hounslow did very little to cause keeper Richard Shelley any problems as the defence dealt comfortably with the home side's attacks. Knaphill continued to seek a breakthrough, with Baker heading over the last chance of the first half to find the net.

The second half saw some early opportunities for both sides, the closest scoring chance came early in the half when Chris Fox had his shot only partially saved by Archibald as the ball came out to Ricky Hogsden who from six yards scooped his shot over the bar in after 48 minutes. The home side showed more pace and direction as they too were looking for an opening to break the deadlock. But that was to come from Knaphill as they went ahead after 62 minutes when defender Jack Williams delivered a thunderous shot into the far corner from 25 yards.

Not to rest on their laurels of a single goal lead, Knaphill made it 2-0 after 72 minutes and involved another defender, as Alex Lumley weaved his way into the 18 yard area to shoot past the keeper. Soon after the goal, CB Hounslow were down to ten men with a player being sent off following a hard tackle on Brian Murphy.

Although the home side' attempts to reduce the arrears came to no avail, it was Knaphill who took a commanding lead in the 77th minute following a mix up with defender and keeper, which allowed Joe Turner to grab the easiest opportunity he'll ever have to score, by virtually walking the ball into goal to make it 3-0.


