Maximum points from successive games saw Knaphill's hot shot Ross Murray make his tally three goals in two games, with two in Saturday's 2-1 home win over Banstead Athletic, following the previous week's single goal success at Cobham, and bring Knaphill their fourth victory from their last six matches, and another step up the Division One ladder.

There were not too many clear cut chances in the opening stages of the game, but after Banstead fluffed an opportunity to score, a free kick to Knaphill saw Luke Taylor deliver into the 18 yard box, ending with a Matt Edwards header flashing just wide of the post after 25 minutes. Knaphill were having plenty of possession and finally made a breakthrough in the 35th minute. Edwards had his shot on goal saved by the keeper, parrying away to his right, with Murray latching onto the loose ball only to be fouled in the six yard box, and from the resultant penalty, he coolly slotted home the spot kick.

The second half started brightly for Knaphill and within three minutes they had increased their lead, with a slick finish from Murray to make it 2-0. But in the 51st minute that lead was reduced when failure to deal confidently as the ball flashed across the face of the goal, ended with Alvin Sarmiento scoring from close range to give the visitors a bit more momentum to get back into the game.

It then needed another goal from Knaphill to restore a two goal lead as the half progressed. But in the last half hour, their play and control, was becoming too casual, at a time they should have been more threatening on goal to extend that lead. However, after 70 minutes Luke Taylor's delivery seemed on target for goal only to be denied by the keeper. The clearance opportunity came after 82 minutes when the same player should have seen his strike for goal count, but instead screwed his shot wide.

Had Banstead's finishing been sharper they might have got on level terms, but Knaphill, applying a bit more pressure near the end, held on to gain another three points, making it a haul of twelve from their last six games.

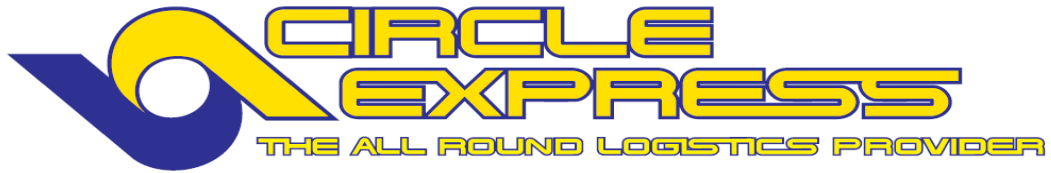

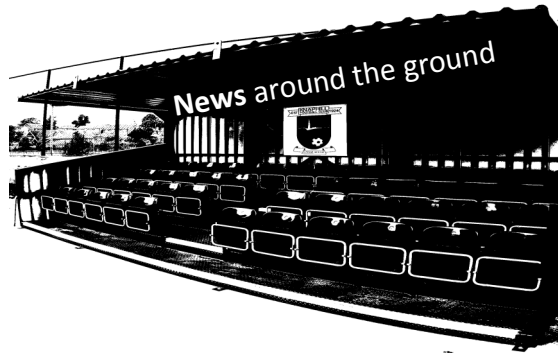

Good afternoon everyone and welcome to CB Hounslow United, their players and officials, also to the match officials, Stephen Earl, Jamie Harris and George Depree. This match becomes the first meeting between the two Clubs this season, the scheduled away fixture being one of many postponed games over recent months due to the weather. But at last, all Clubs are starting to play consecutive matches, especially from the latter stages of February, and let's hope the forthcoming fixtures get played without any disruption.

Knaphill have been able to fulfil all scheduled fixtures in February with five games played, producing three wins and two defeats, and from the last six league matches played, have secured four wins. Certainly a better sequence than we had in the first half of the league programme. We have now lifted ourselves out of the bottom three, to make a steady climb up the table. Kevin Bailey stated in his last programme notes "if we are able to maintain the commitment and performance levels that we have produced since the turn of the year, I am confident we can secure a comfortable mid table finish come the end of the season".

It's certainly not a pleasant position to be in when your team is in the bottom three, when we were, albeit for a short time. Our opponents today know more than anyone else, as they have been at the bottom for a vast majority of the season. Knaphill have, as Kevin mentioned, been showing the commitment and performance levels that have been produced since the beginning of this year, which now sees the team's steady climb up the League table.

Last Saturday, Banstead Athletic made their first ever visit to Redding Way, and only the second meeting between the two clubs since they entered the CCL back in 2006, after their spell in the Ryman League. The match produced another valuable three points in the 2-1 win, with Ross Murray scoring both goals to add to the match winner he scored at Cobham the previous week. The first came from a penalty on 35 minutes, and his second three minutes into the second half. Banstead reduced the arrears after 51 minutes, and although there were no more goals in the half, Knaphill's three points put them another step up the league ladder to twelve spot. Match report on this match can be found elsewhere in the programme.

Whilst the 1st team have fulfilled their February fixtures, our Reserves and Youth have only just resumed their matches after a long layoff due to the weather over the past couple of months. Last weekend the Reserves played their first League game for seven weeks! They made the visit to Worcester Park Reserves, and after trailing 2-0 pulled themselves back into the game, but not quite enough to get even a share of the points, as the home side grabbed a third goal to come out 3-2 winners.

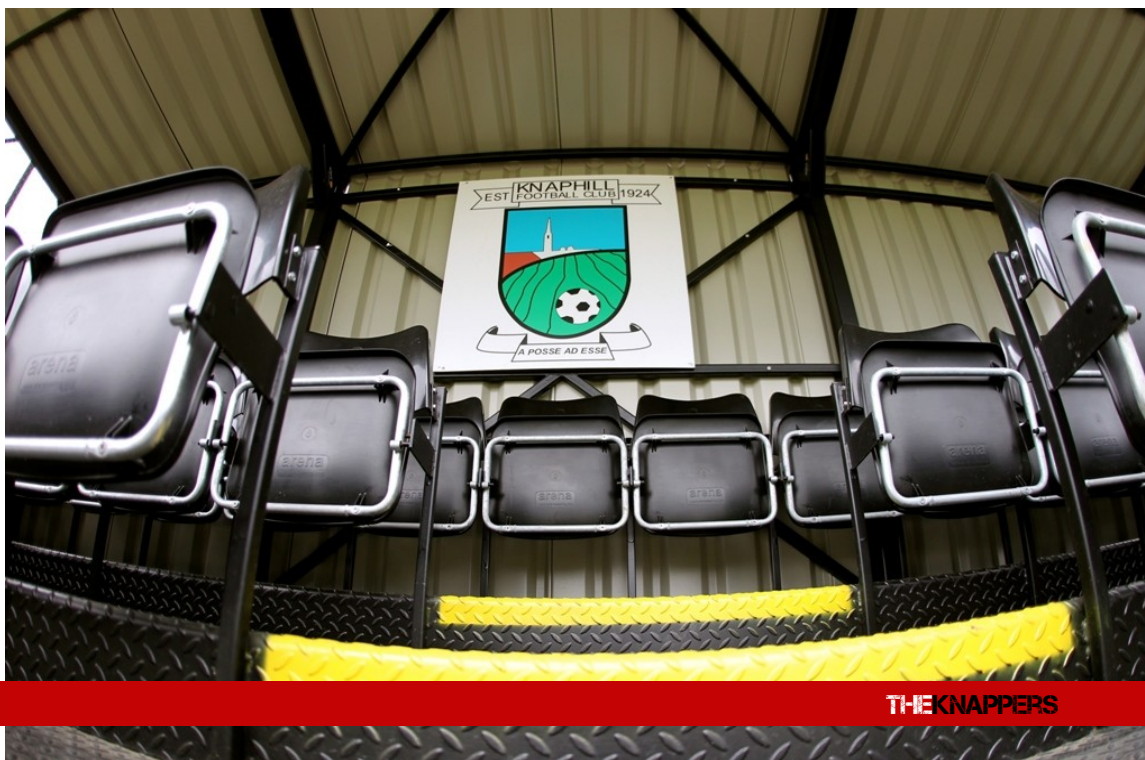
Today the Reserves are away to Raynes Park Vale Reserves in the 2nd round of the Reserves Challenge Cup, the fourth time of trying, having had the game postponed on three occasions. The Youth U18s team got back into action 11 days ago with a convincing 4-1 win over Cove U18s the Southern Youth League. They will have played two games this week, in Cup competition at South Park on Monday, and away to Hartley Wintney in the League on Thursday. Next week the U18s started a run of six home games at Redding Way, then one week away, before finishing the season at home on 23 April.

Back to the 1st team and coming up next Tuesday 5th March, Knaphill are away at Westfield, kick off 7.30pm, the first of three successive away games. The other two sees visits to AFC Croydon Athletic on Saturday 9th March, followed by Worcester Park on Saturday 16th March, kick off 3pm.

That's it for now, back here at Redding Way on Saturday 23rd March when the visitors will be Spelthorne Sports kick off 3pm.



The year has started brightly if spasmodically for Knaphill's U18 team. The weather has played havoc with all of football over the last 3 months and the Young Guns have been hit harder than most with weather cancellations as well as pitch unavailability as 1st team games take precedence over Youth team games.

An early game in January saw the visit of Sandhurst Town to Redding Way, last years fixture in the Allied Counties League ended in a record 7-4 win for Knaphill. What makes a football manager happy ? Just ask Knaphill team boss Phil Ellery who is now seeing his team finding the right balance, playing good football and picking up the points, and is pleased with their recent results. Knaphill have, from their last six matches, picked up thirteen points with four wins and a draw, the latest being a convincing 4-0 win over Bookham on Saturday, and are playing some of the best football since Ellery took up the managerial reins four months ago.

Coming off the back of the highly rated performance against Staines Lammas the previous week, the eagerness and momentum to continue on the up, was enhanced in the Bookham game. The first quarter of an hour saw Knaphill go close with a couple of headers and a shot just wide of the far post, before opening the scoring in the 18th minute. But the visitors were soon to extend their lead when in the 38th minute, Luke Craig fed Pym and the striker nodded home a header over the keeper and under the bar for a two goal lead, and a comfortable finish to the first half.

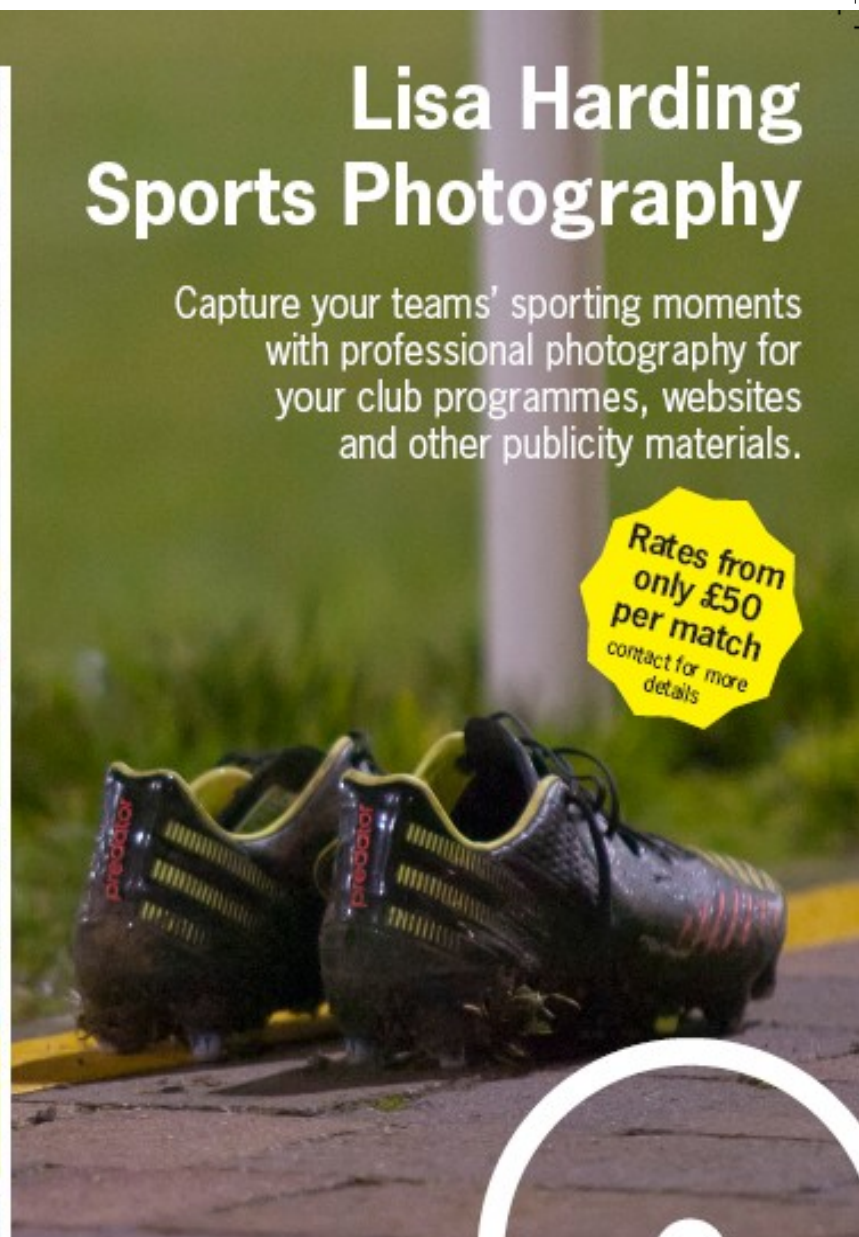
