Club Secretary Bryan Freeman writes on all matters involving the Knappers.

Good afternoon and welcome to everyone here today for our final game of the season. It's been a long league programme, which started on Saturday 8th August, and here we are nine months and 40 league games later with a first time visit to Redding Way for our visitors Cobham. Knaphill's visit to our opponents at the end of January saw us gain all three points in the 2-1 win. Today is our tenth game since the beginning of April, a month which saw a busy schedule for us and many other clubs.

Reflecting briefly on Knaphill's season, which has been 'one of two halves', the first from 8th August to the end of the year, we played 18 league games, with 7 wins, 2 draws and 9 defeats, whereas the second half of the league programme has seen 21 played, won 18, lost 2 and drawn 1, which included that fantastic 12 match winning run from the 6th February until the 13th April inclusive. What a contrast, if only the form in the first half of the season had matched the second, we would have stormed into the top three sometime ago! I must say that everyone has played their part in the team that has put us where we are now in Division One, well done.

More good results have been produced over recent games. Following the 2-0 win here against Bedfont Sports ten days ago, the visit to Sheerwater last Saturday completed the double over our local rivals. Chris Fox drove in an excellent strike from 22 yards to make it 1-0 on the half hour mark, before Sheerwater equalised shortly before the break, and in the second half, Ricky Hogsden made it 2-1 after 55 minutes, as Knaphill steered their way to another three points.

Then it was onto to our third game inside five days with the visit to Farnham Town on Monday. Not having won at West Street in our previous two



league visits there, would it be third time lucky? Well, we didn't really need luck, as despite a disappointing first half, Knaphill went into the second half in a higher gear, upped the tempo, and came out on top with a deserved win. Knaphill's goalscorers were Chris Fox, Ricky Hogsden and Tom Davis.

It seemed it would be another clean sheet with the score 3-0 at 90 minutes, then Farnham netted two goals deep into time added on, one from a penalty, and the second direct from a free-kick to make it 3-2. There are Match reports on our last three games, against Bedfont Sports, Sheerwater, and Farnham, elsewhere in the programme.Knaphill Reserves had another narrow defeat last Saturday when they lost 2-1 to Bedfont Sports, and following their match against Mole Valley two days ago, the Reserves finish their season next week with home games against Bookham on Tuesday and Farnham Town on Thursday.

Other news this week on a couple of clubs in the top four of Division One, and on Monday, Mole Valley picked up three points from their fixture against Coulsdon without kicking a ball as Coulsdon could not raise a team, whilst Staines Lammas finished their season with a late winner in the 2-1 success at CB Hounslow.

....and finally, around this time last year we went to Farleigh Rovers with the chance of taking the title, unfortunately we didn't, but let's look forward to an entertaining game this afternoon, as Knaphill seek a third place finish for this season.

Before I sign off don't forget we will be holding an end of season barbeque during and after the game today. Enjoy the match, have a safe journey home and see you next season...

We now have a sprinkling of youth and a fantastic attitude. I have been proud to see a couple of young reserves playing in the first team. The reserves with the guidance of Matt Chesterman and Dan Conquer have made it a good season from a poor beginning.

My first season as Chairman of this club has not been without a few problems. Not all my goals for the season have been fulfilled but I feel we are in a better state than we were when I took over. The teams have played well and the financial situation has eased. At the A.G.M we should be able to show a vast improvement in our balance sheet. I may go as far as saying we are at last paying our way. The A.G.M will be announced shortly and if you care about the development of your club you will be present.

We still have issues about the ground playing surface, the football foundation funding for our floodlights and stand, the financial well being of our club and the development of our committee. These matters are being sorted but they do take time. We have a club that is moving forward and one to be proud of and part of.

I take this opportunity to thank all the committee, management and players for their support this year and long may it continue. Well by the time you read this we may know who has won the Premiership and have a change in government but all this will not change my life very much. The highlight of my season was Sheffield Wednesday getting relegated.

Football is a winner if you work hard, support your team and do your bit. I do think Football has gone mad though when you read Chelsea hope to catch fellow-suitors Manchester City cold with a dramatic move for Fernando Torres and are willing to table a British record transfer fee, that could reach £70m, for the Liverpool striker.

In my day most players earned less than £100.00 per week and many a lot less than that. Still it did only cost the equivalent of 5p to watch the game.



October 1892 entering a local junior league. The home ground was never settled with various fields around the outskirts of the village being used at different times. During the late 1920's they played in the Kingston & District league winning Div.1 in successive seasons 1928/9 and 1929/30. In the early 1930s they gained Intermediate status and then quickly achieved Senior Status in 1938 upon election to the Surrey Senior League. After the wartime interruption, Cobham became league champions in 1948/9, narrowly missing a double by finishing runners-up in the League Cup final.

The club established a home ground at Cobham Recreation Ground and continued to play there until the 1955/6 season when they took up residence at the current Anvil Lane ground (also known as the Leg O'Mutton Field). As was the fashion of the day, the Club needed a nickname and because of the Anvil Lane address, they became known as 'The Hammers'

More recently, Cobham were founder members of the Combined Counties League, moving up from the now defunct Surrey Senior League, although they have yet to win the title. In fact the closet they have come was in 1998/9 when the Hammers finished second behind Ash United after leading the table for much of the season. The league has had various sponsored titles over the years but recently retained the original along with the sponsor's title.

Several former Cobham players have moved into the professional ranks, including Trevor Lee and Phil Walker with Millwall and David Coles at Yeovil Town. Also, cricket fast-bowler turned commentator, Bob Willis, made occasional appearances in goal in the 1970s and is a life member of the club. However, pride of place on the clubhouse wall goes to a picture of lifelong Cobham stalwart the late Reg Madgwick who served the Hammers as player, committee member and enthusiastic fund-raiser, often holding bingo sessions in the Cobham village hall. Reg was a truly unique gentleman who requested his ashes be spread around the ground and left all his worldly possessions to the football club. The ground's floodlights were installed in the 1997/98 season and were christened with a game against Nationwide Conference side Woking.

The Hammers most recent silverware (and first in the CCL) was won in season 2001/2 when they beat Bedfont 3-2 at Woking to win the CCL Premier Challenge Cup.

## THE LAST TIME WE MET

Knaphill produced a good performance with plenty of effort and determination in the 2-1 win and inflict fifth place Cobham with their first home League defeat of the season on Saturday. Leading goalscorer Ricky Hogsden struck both goals to give Knaphill a well earned three points.

After five minutes, Tom Davis put in Knaphill's first effort on goal, but it veered wide of the far post, as both sides had a fair share of possession before Cobham struck into the heart of the visitors defence after 17 minutes as Shane Cheesman glided the ball home from just inside the 18 yard box.

Knaphill were level 90 seconds later, producing a well worked equaliser when from a swift break, Tom Davis delivered a slick pass to Ricky Hogsden who fired in a cracking goal to make it 1-1, his 20th of the season, and Knaphill's 50th in the League.

After 23 minutes Craig Parrington put Hogsden away, but the striker's effort was covered by the advancing keeper. Knaphill were producing some neat one touch football and fluent moves, with their defence quick to cut out danger from their opponents. On the half hour Richard Shelley saved well from Cheesman. Knaphill's territorial advantage was evident, but neither side were able to come close enough forcing a second goal in the first half.

Not too much trouble for either keeper in the early spell of the second half, Parrington's shot was driven straight at the keeper before Knaphill took a deserved lead in the 64th minute when Hogsden took his chance well to steer the ball past Whitby in the Cobham goal.

Shelley denied Shane Rideout's effort after 74 minutes as the latter stages saw Knaphill having to defend well to stave off a Cobham side pressing for an equaliser, which could have materialised had Ramsey not screwed his shot wide. But Knaphill held firm to finish the game worthy winners.

# MATCH REPORT





Combined Counties League Division One Thursday 29th April 2010 Knaphill 2 Bedfont Sports 0

When these two teams last met back in March, the scoreline was close, with Knaphill snatching a 90th minute winner. In this game on Thursday evening at Redding Way, it was a slender 1-0 advantage for Knaphill until late in the game, when a second goal secured another three points from a match that overall, the home side did enough to keep intact a sequence of being unbeaten at home since the first week of November last year, whilst keeping up their impressive run of 16 wins from 19 games since the beginning of January.

Chances fell to both sides, albeit not that many clear cut, but that came about by a lack of cutting edge finishing. The early pressure came from Knaphill, whilst Bedfont did, on the break, cause some anxious moments in the home defence from a half that failed to produce a goal.

The second half showed more creation from Knaphill when pushing forward, early chances fell to Nick Darnell and Chris Fox. The ideal opportunity to open the scoring came ten minutes into the half when Knaphill were awarded a penalty. But Ricky Hogsden's spot kick sailed over the bar. Then in the 60th minute, the Bedfont keeper gathered the ball just over the edge of the 18 yard area, and from the free kick, Stephen Flin's glorious effort was driven home to make it 1-0, for Knaphill's 90th league goal of the season.

Richard Shelley denied Bedfont the chance of an equaliser with a good save from one of their swift moves, as chances fell for both sides as the half wore on. Knaphill held onto their slender lead until the 84th minute when substitute Matt Edwards did well to work the way in towards goal from the left along the by line, slipped a pass to another substitute Gavin Brainch, who drilled towards and team mate Ricky Hogsden made sure when his touch helped it on its way to the back of the net.

It put Knaphill on 75 points from 37 games as they stay in fourth place, one point behind Mole Valley in third spot who have two games in hand. On Saturday, Knaphill are away to Sheerwater, a swift return fixture following the game at Redding Way between the two teams less than two weeks ago.

# HOME OF THE KNAPPERS ON THE NET

Knaphill Football Club began its life in 1924 at Waterer's Park.Waterer's Park was left to Woking Urban District Council in 1924 by Mr Anthony Waterer of Knaphill Nursery. The Recreation Ground was originally part of the nursery called "Blue Gates Field" and the park was laid out by Woking Council between 1924 and 1928 - the task taking so long as the bottom part of the field was very "soggy", whilst the rest was uneven and infested with moles. And these conditions can still be seen over 70 years later!

Very little history is known about the Club between 1924 and 1980, although we do know that the team colours were originally red and white.

In 1980 Knaphill were represented in the Old Woking and District League (now Guildford and Woking Alliance League) in Division 3 under Manager Dave Holloway. Dave took them from Division 3 through promotion to the Surrey Intermediate League. Dave then left Knaphill to take over Conference side Woking's reserve and youth teams.

The late Andy Westcott took over the Manager's position at Knaphill in 1984. Andy successfully took the Club from Division 3 to the Premier Division 1, at the same time Clive Howes was running the Reserve Team, who also won promotion from Division 3 to the Reserves Premier Division 1.Geoff Poulton was to go on to take over the running of the Reserve Team from Clive Howes.

In 1990, Mick Garbutt became the Manager of Knaphill and Paul Bambini was running the Reserve Team. Mick Garbutt left the Club in 1994 to join up with Colin Lippiatt and Geoff Chapple at Woking. After this time the club went into decline and was struggling for players for both the First and Reserve Teams. The decision was taken by then Senior Secretary, Sean Carrigy, to approach local team Heathlands, who were playing in the Guildford and Woking Alliance League. Heathlands found themselves struggling for facilities but not players; this gave the two teams the opportunity to amalgamate.

Season 1995/96 saw the arrival of Greg Anderson as Manager, with Sean Carrigy running the Reserve Team.

In 1996 Dave Freeman took over from Greg as First Team Manager. The Reserve Team Manager's position was handed over to Noff Diliberto in 1997; he left the Club a year later, when Carl Barker took over.

Season 2002/03 saw 2 new men at the helm with Mick Garbutt in charge of the 1st Team and Frank Walters in charge of the Reserves. Paul Bailey took over midway through 2002/2003; Carl Barker then had a second spell as Reserve Team Manager with Danny James as Reserve Team Coach and Dave Freeman as 1st team coach.

At the start of the 2003/2004 season the club formed a third team named KNAPHILL 'A' to play in the Guildford & Woking Alliance League due to volume of players at the club. Carl Barker took over as A Team Manager with Danny James in charge of the Reserves.

The 2004/2005 season brought about further changes at team management level seeing Dave Freeman retiring from playing due to injuries and being appointed as 1st Team Manager with Mick Garbutt stepping down to Assistant Manager. There was also a new man at the helm for the A Team with Kevin Fletcher taking over from Carl Barker who had taken up the Chairman role. The club also moved into there new ground at Redding Way and the re-development of the Waterers Park ground, due to finished by April 2005, giving Knaphill Football Club some of the best facilities in the Surrey area.

In the 2004/2005 season the Reserves finished Runners Up to Old Rutlishians and the A Team were beaten by a last gasp winner in the Junior Cup Semi-Final against Shepperton FB with 1st Team finishing 7th in there respective division.

Season 2005/2006 was destined to be a big season for the club with the club established at its new ground at Redding Way and the A Team reverting back to Waterers Park having had the facilities rebuilt. 1st Team Manager Dave Freeman continued in charge for the 2005/2006 campaign and appointed former professional with Bristol City, Bob Pritchard, who has also managed at senior level with Chertsey Town, amongst others, as 1st Team Coach. Kevin Fletcher was appointed Reserve Team Manager having impressed by running the A Team the previous season. The 2005/2006 season did prove successful as we won the Division One title on the last day of the season against nearest rivals Virginia Water and gained promotion to the Premier Division.Season 2006/2007 continued with Dave Freeman in charge of the 1st Team and Paul Bailey re-appointed as Reserve Team Manager. The A Team management was split during the season. Martin Hobson took charge during the first few months but had to resign due to work and family commitments. Gavin Wilcox and Tim Handley then took over until the end of the season.

The 1st Team claimed back to back titles by winning the Premier Division Championship which resulted in us achieving promotion to the Combined Counties Football League, the most successful period in the clubs history up to then. Bob Pritchard took over from Dave Freeman as Manager who became Bob's assistant during September 2007.

The 2007/08 season was the busiest the club has ever endured. Over 45 matches were played at Redding Way and the pitch was still the best in the league at the end of the season. Bob Pritchard and Dave Freeman led the club to a very commendable 7th place in the CCL, our first in senior football. The early season had seen Knaphill pushing for a top 5 position, but poor runs over the Christmas & Easter periods saw the clubs performances drop off the leading runners; still 7th place was an excellent result considering the circumstances. Steve Hutton led the Reserves campaign, a massive 40 games with a mixture of good and bad results, beating the leaders of the league on at least two occasions, but dropping too many points by conceding late goals. The A Team had an up and down season eventually finishing in 7th place in the GWAL 3rd Division table.

The closed season also saw the amalgamation of Knaphill FC and Knaphill Wanderers (the junior sides) at long last under the Knaphill FC banner. The Wanderers will keep their identity for the coming season and plans to achieve the highly sought after FA Community Charter status will continue in earnest.

The 2008/09 season started with a most welcome new face, the former Bisley and Farnborough Assistant Manager, Ian Savage. Ian joined us as player/coach and with his experience and knowledge this club has the right to feel proud that he chose to join Knaphill after receiving many other offers from teams at higher levels. Steve Hutton has left his post as Reserve Team manager for pastures new in the summer and was replaced by the very experienced Graham Pope, however Graham left the club in November due to personal reasons and side is now run by Adie Wilson and Lee Cook.

The A Team is now under the control of James Taylor and Brendan Baker who received the good news at the GWAL AGM that their team is to play in the 2nd Division last season after wholesale changes in the leagues constitution. With a reduction in League games in Division One to 34 from 38 in 2007/08, Knaphill entered two new Cup competitions. the Anagram Trophy and the Southern Combination Cup, both of which saw an early exit. However, the team kept a high profile in the League staying in the top half of the table all season, eventually finishing in fifth place. They could have become champions had they won their last game of the season when, in a tightly bunched set of teams in the top six. Knaphill on 69pts needed to win at Farleigh to pip Staines Lammas to the title. Disappointingly they lost 3-2, so near yet so far.

The Reserves finished ninth in their Division with the second half of the season providing a 17 match sequence losing just two games. Adie Wilson having taken over in November from Graham Pope gelled well his players and together that was shown with the results. The A team won promotion to Division 2 of the GWAL, their second move up the ladder having been promoted from Division 3 to Division 2 the previous season. The new season sees a B team starting their first season in Division4(North).

In the close season Terry Chapman was voted in as the new Chairman, replacing Nick Croshaw who stood down after two seasons. The newly formed Ladies side will also come under the senior banner and once again enhance on the size of the football club. Plans for floodlights and hard standing alongwith a 100 seated stand at Redding way are moving forward with the help of Woking Borough Council who continue as in recent years to support the football club.

So, a challenge ahead for individuals, players and management combined for the new season 2009/10.



## MATCH REPORT





Combined Counties League Division One Saturday 1st May 2010 Sheerwater 1 Knaphill 2

Knaphill notched up their 17th win from their last 20 games in this local derby encounter against Sheerwater at the Recreation Ground on Saturday. Not mixed with the ingredients you'd expect to see from a derby match between local rivals as Knaphill gradually eased their way to maximum points in the 2-1 win.

Sheerwater set the pace in the early stages of the first half when Richard Shelley was tested with an early effort in the first 90 seconds of the game, and Antoni Perri slipped the ball wide of the post in the sixth minute. Nick Darnell delivered Knaphill's first crack on goal which was just wide of the post. But it was the visitors who were doing the early defending as their hosts were seeking that early breakthrough.

Knaphill had not threatened the home goal a great deal, which showed a lack of urgency in their play before their first serious and telling effort was to put them in front after 30 minutes. Chris Fox took the initiative and from 22yards struck the perfect shot that flashed past Nick Rogers to give Knaphill a 1-0 lead. Sheerwater had wasted a couple of chances prior to gaining the equaliser, when in the 41st minute, Ed Cardona gave the ball away which set off a Sheerwater move and finished with Marcus Slimane tucking the ball away to make it 1-1.

After that lack of urgency in their first half display, Knaphill needed to up the tempo if they were to regain the lead. They began to show in the second half, Cardona saw his effort blocked and diverted for a corner after 52 minutes, and three minutes later, Knaphill had made it 2-1. Cardona headed flick on to Ricky Hogsden who fired home past Rogers, for Knaphill's 93rd league goal of the season.

They came close to a third when a misclearance by the keeper was picked up by Hogsden who couldn't quite find the space to squeeze past Rogers, and the second opportunity fell to Matt Edwards whose effort was blocked. Seventeen year old Jack Ball made his second appearance for the team coming on as substitute, and had an early opportunity, but his chance was smothered by the keeper after 74 minutes. A final substitution by Knaphill saw 16 year old Joe Turner make his first team debut for the club and showed signs he could emerged as a future star for club.

## THE MEMORY BANK

The editor looks back on another memorable season for the club and in particular our trip to The Imperial Fields, home of Tooting & Mitcham in the Surrey Premier County Cup 3rd Round.

Knaphill's five goal blitz in the space of 36 minutes against Tooting & Mitcham Reserves on Wednesday night, gave them a passage through to the Quarter-final of the Surrey Premier Cup where they will meet current holders Met.Police next month.

Knaphill set out in an attacking mode straight from the kick-off to rock the home side with two goals in five minutes. The first came when Chris Fox scored in the 3rd minute, getting on the end of a well flighted corner from Craig Parrington, and two minutes later Matt Edwards took his chance well to make it 2-0 after five minutes.

Swift, precise, powerful, and with tantalising pressure, Knaphill continued to have Tooting on the back foot as the visitors stunning start got even better after 12 minutes. Fox was upended in the box and Matt Baker struck home the resultant penalty. The goalscoring increased in the 15th minute, but this time it was from Tooting when Reece Hill delivered a cracking 25 yard drive to reduce the arrears. It provided some instant inspiration for the home side who, when they did find a route to goal relied on long range efforts.

But it was Knaphill who increased their lead after 19 minutes involving a Hogsden, Baker, Fox link, finishing with Fox drilling his shot past the keeper from 12 yards and a 4-1 lead, as Knaphill's continual pressure cast danger in the home defence. Tooting made a quick breakaway move when Luke Wanedio found space to unleash a well struck effort from 20 yards for their second goal after 33 minutes.

The first half scoring didn't finish there as Knaphill went further ahead in the 36th minute when a combination of Parrington, Hogsden and Baker were involved with a swift move. Parrington thread a through ball to Hogsden, he slipped the ball to Baker who rifled home Knaphill's fifth goal. It could have been six as Fox was unlucky when his header struck the crossbar.

The second half was more subdued after the seven goals that came out of the first 45 minutes, buy there were still a number of opportunities throughout the half. Richard Shelley was to deny Tooting with three good saves in as many minutes as the home side tried to reduce the arrears in the latter stages.

Despite pushing for a sixth goal, it was Knaphill's first half superiority over the home side and their continuing efforts in the second, that gave them a very comfortable route through to the next round.

## BOOTROOM BANTER gavin brainch

#### The final one for this season, Bryan Freeman gets the Inside Talk from ......defender Gavin Brainch

Gavin Brainch has been enjoying this season with Knaphill, despite the slow start the team had for the first part of the season, but to go into the second half winning 12 successive games was brilliant, and now we have the prospect of finishing in third place. Gavin said "It's a fantastic squad of players, the best I've ever played with, and who could compete in the Premier Division".

In his days with Junior football, Gavin started with Curley Park Rangers when he was 9 years old, and was captain for 3 years when going through from under 11s to under 14s. At the age of fourteen, Gavin was scouted by Swindon Town when he says "they were half decent", not like they are now, and he went for a trial season with the Football League club, and during the same period of time still played for Curley Park Rangers 1999-2001. During that period he suffered a ruptured Achilles tendon.

After trials with Swindon and the time with Curley Park, Gavin moved onto Camberley Town U.18s in the District League in 2002/2003 and went onto play in Camberley's first and Reserve teams, but was fed up with the Manager, and looked for another Club.

In 2003/04, Gavin joined Lightwater who were playing in the Guildford and Woking Alliance League. He won a League title honour and other awards whilst there and was top goalscorer with 23 goals in 10 games, including being in the side that had an unbeaten run which led to promotion. When Gavin was younger he played as a winger, and as time progressed switched to playing wing back and then to left back. He started with Knaphill at centre back.

He eventually returned to Camberley for a second spell when Paul Barry was first team manager at the age of 21.When Bob Pritchard signed Gavin for the 2008/09 season he was to play centre back, before switching to a left back role. In his first season at Knaphill, Gavin was voted Most Improved Player at the Club.

Getting back to awards, these came in the shape of Manager Player of the month four times and Players player of the Year five times, whilst at Curley Park Rangers, and at Lightwater, he was Players Player of the Year, and Managers Player of the Year.

Gavin has made 37 appearances(incl.7 as sub) for Knaphill this season and has scored five goals, which included one against Bedfont Sports. This one ended up being claimed by Ricky Hogsden as he stated it struck his boot on the way in! But I believe Gavin is still claiming it !

In the Farnham Town game he came on as Sub in what he calls 'a left wing role', and it was in that game that he delivered the perfect cross for Chris Fox to score Knaphill's second goal.


