Welcome to Redding Way

Good afternoon everyone, and to all players and officials from Cobham Football Club, welcome to Redding Way for this Division One fixture. This game was originally scheduled for the week before Christmas, but lost out to the bad weather of snow and ice. The previous meeting between today's teams was back in August when Cobham won 1-0. Our opponents today are currently in 5th place with 40 points from 21 games, and last weekend made it 13 wins when they beat Eversley 3-2, whilst Knaphill had a 4-0 win over Frimley Green.

The month of January finished on a high for Knaphill with the win at Frimley Green last Saturday to make it a maximum points haul from the five matches played last month. Our other four wins coming against Feltham, Farleigh Rovers, Staines Lammas and Westfield.

The team produced a solid performance against Frimley Green, and Chris Fox opened the scoring with a volley from eight yards. Knaphill then had further chances to increase that lead with efforts from Woody Cardona and Jack Williams, both denied by the keeper. In the second half Knaphill made it 2-0 with a 20 yard volley from Joe Turner, then soon after Matt Baker took his chance well for the third after receiving an excellent crossfield pass from Fox. The scoring was rounded off when Turner fed Ricky Hogsden and the striker made it 4-0 with a 20 yard lob.

Our previous home game saw a 2-0 win over Staines Lammas with goals from James Wills and Woody Cardona, at the halfway stage of Knaphill's league programme. Midfielder Tom Davis suffered a serious knee injury in this game, and was taken to hospital with a cracked kneecap. Tom had an operation last Thursday and will be out for the rest of the season.

Following the Staines game, there was the local derby at Westfield three days later which was to see Knaphill come out 4-3 winners. The visitors went two goals up when Chris Fox broke the deadlock with the first goal,

and Woody Cardona added a second with Knaphill taking control in the early stages of the game. Westfield pulled a goal back five minutes before halftime, then put a lot more pressure on the visitors defence in the second half.

The home side equalised to make it 2-2, before substitute Ricky Hogsden restored Knaphill's lead. Westfield pulled level again, but then three minutes from time, Chris Fox fired home the winner to make it 4-3. Knaphill have now moved up to 12th in the table with 27 points from 20 games, fifteen of those points coming from our last five matches.

Last Saturday, our young Reserves side met 4th in the table Warlingham and put in a good performance in a match that ended in a 3-3. Knaphill came back from two goals down to make it 2-2, then took the lead before the visitors grabbed a late equaliser. Knaphill's goalscorers were Harry Maynard, Jonny Philips and Fraser Wilsh. Today the Reserves are away at Frimley Green.

Whilst the team have been showing good results during January, which will hope will be enhanced during February and beyond, this month will see our 50 seater stand put into place and the installation of the floodlights. It's been a long time from the planning stage, but the club can look forward to all this now coming to fruition.

Looking ahead fixture wise, Knaphill's next game is away to Chobham next Saturday 12th February, kick-off 2pm, then on Saturday 19th February, Farnborough North End will be the visitors to Redding Way when the kick-off will revert back to 3pm

TOUCHLINE TALK

With Joint Manager David Freeman



If someone had said to Adie and myself when we took over back in December that we would not only been unbeaten but win our first five games in charge I would of snapped there hand off. Although we took over in December we did not actually play a game until the 3rd January due to the poor weather we all experienced in that month but since the turn of the year we have not looked back.

The response from the players has been brilliant and its nice to see them all with a smile on their faces and enjoying their football which would of course be the case if you are winning, that's only natural. The team spirit has returned and there is a real togetherness in the camp and plenty of banter flying around too. Those of you who have witnessed our matches recently will see the confidence has come back and were almost playing like the side were this time last year and we all though what happened then! But one thing is for sure we will not get carried away and hopefully turn the second half of the season into a success.

The players seem to be enjoying the training again and mostly this has been down to first team coach Neil Woodyer. Woody played for me back in the club's surrey intermediate days and also captained the side to the division one title back in 2005/06. Since then Woody had a successful spell as Assistant Manager at Combined Counties Premier side Camberley Town up until last season and when the opportunity came to bring him back to Redding Way I jumped at the chance. Since the Feltham win here at the beginning of January we have been playing some decent football, scoring goals and defensively looking sound. Two clean sheets out of five against Staines Lammas and Frimley Green is not bad going considering the side were leaking goals for fun in early stages of the season however, I have to say the recent local derby against Westfield saw us concede three sloppy goals which almost cost us the game but thankfully the new team spirit and belief in the side saw us claim all three points thanks to a late Chris Fox strike.

Last week we made the short trip to Frimley Green. Not the best pitch to play your football on and against a industrious Frimley side who beat us 2-0 back in September, but all the lads put in a good shift and the second half performance proved that we were worthy 4-0 winners. All the goals in that game were of the highest quality in particular Joe Turner's spectacular 20 yard volley. Having said that Matt Baker's goal and Ricky Hogsden sublime lob are well worth a mention.

Over last few weeks we have managed to add some additions to the club. Pat Lofflar has joined us from Hartley Wintney and made his debut in the 3-2 win over Farleigh Rovers, midfielder Woody Cardona has returned to the club following a spell at Cove and scored on his second debut against Staines Lammas and Jack Williams has also joined us from Cove. Jack who is an attacking midfielder has had to play at right back in his first two games due to Dan Cox being injured. Also joining us is Laura Steed. Laura is a Sport Injury Specialist and will be working alongside Sam Downes on matchdays. Speaking of injuries we picked up three injuries in the space of four days. Tom Davis suffered a cracked knee cap in the Staines Lammas game here which rules him out for the remainder of the season, Dan Cox is sidelined with a knee injury and influential midfielder Nick Darnell suffered a ankle injury in the local derby at Westfield. They join Mike Ford in the treatment room but hopefully Coxy, Tank and Fordy will be in training in the next two to three weeks.

As for today's game there will be a little edge to this encounter due to former Cobham players now playing here at Redding Way and of course Adie Wilson who had a spell at Cobham as assistant manager at the start of the season. I do know that most of the Cobham and Knaphill players are 'mates' of the pitch but I'm sure for ninety minutes today friendship will be put aside as both sides battle for the three points. I'm sure I'm not on my own in looking forward to the contest very much and I would like to take the opportunity of welcoming Cobham manager Damian Ray and his players to Redding Way this afternoon.

WELCOMING COBHAM F.C



Cobham Football Club were formed by villagers in October 1892 entering a local junior league. The home ground was never settled with various fields around the outskirts of the village being used at different times. During the late 1920's they played in the Kingston & District league winning Div.1 in successive seasons 1928/9 and 1929/30. In the early 1930s they gained Intermediate status and then quickly achieved Senior Status in 1938 upon election to the Surrey Senior League. After the wartime interruption, Cobham became league champions in 1948/9, narrowly missing a double by finishing runners-up in the League Cup final.

The club established a home ground at Cobham Recreation Ground and continued to play there until the 1955/6 season when they took up residence at the current Anvil Lane ground (also known as the Leg O'Mutton Field). As was the fashion of the day, the Club needed a nickname and because of the Anvil Lane address, they became known as 'The Hammers'. More recently, Cobham were founder members of the Combined Counties League, moving up from the now defunct Surrey Senior League, although they have yet to win the title. In fact the closest they have come was in 1998/9 when the Hammers finished second behind Ash United after leading the table for much of the season. The league has had various sponsored titles over the years but recently retained the original along with the sponsor's title.

Several former Cobham players have moved into the professional ranks, including Trevor Lee and Phil Walker with Millwall and David Coles at Yeovil Town. Also, cricket fast-bowler turned commentator, Bob Willis, made occasional appearances in goal in the 1970s and is a life member of the club. However, pride of place on the clubhouse wall goes to a picture of lifelong Cobham stalwart the late Reg Madgwick who served the Hammers as player, committee member and enthusiastic fund-raiser, often holding bingo sessions in the Cobham village hall.

Reg was a truly unique gentleman who requested his ashes be spread around the ground and left all his worldly possessions to the football club.

The ground's floodlights were installed in the 1997/98 season and were christened with a game against Nationwide Conference side Woking.

The Hammers most recent silverware (and first in the CCL) was won in season 2001/2 when they beat Bedfont 3-2 at Woking to win the CCL Premier Challenge Cup.

Another Ghost Buried

The transformation of Knaphill's form continued with a well earned win against Staines Lammas at Redding Way on Saturday. Having picked up just three league wins in 15 matches prior to the start of the year, Knaphill have now gained maximum points from their last 3 games this month, with new found confidence and commitment in their play. It was only the second time Knaphill have beaten Staines Lammas since they joined the Combined Counties League in season 2007/08.

The game started a quite a fast pace with early pressure from Knaphill on their opponents. Matt Baker fired a free kick wide of the post, and James Wills shot went just wide of the far post in the opening spell. Although Knaphill had a lot of possession and early chances, the visitors returned their challenge with some quick breaks, which also became relevant in the second half. But the home defence coped well.

After Baker's header was just over the bar on 22 minutes, play switched to the other end, and Chris Bullen had an opportunity to score but was denied by keeper Richard Shelley who did well to cut out his effort. Then within two minutes, a Knaphill attack saw Chris Fox fired well over following a neat pass from Baker.

Knaphill got their just reward for perseverance when James Wills delivered a cracking effort from around the edge of the 18 yard area to make it 1-0 after 37 minutes. With just two minutes remaining of the first half, Knaphill's Tom Davis suffered a serious knee injury. The midfield player was taken to hospital where Xrays revealed a cracked knee cap which required an operation over the weekend.

The second half saw Knaphill carrying their slender single goal lead and Staines Lammas creating several chances in search of an equaliser, but with some poor finishing, and some good defending from the home side. Knaphill held firm as they pushed forward in a bid to increase their lead. That came in the 84th minute when Baker's shot was only partially cleared, and substitute Ed Cardona was well positioned to tap home from close range.

There was still time though for a possible third goal, as Fox sent an effort just wide, and Ricky Hogsden went close, only for the keeper to deny him.

WHAT HAPPENED

Knaphill produced a good performance with plenty of effort and determination in the 2-1 win and inflict fifth place Cobham with their first home League defeat of the season. Leading goalscorer Ricky Hogsden, struck both goals to give Knaphill a well earned three points.

After five minutes, Tom Davis put in Knaphill's first effort on goal, but it veered wide of the far post, as both sides had a fair share of possession before Cobham struck into the heart of the visitors defence after 17 minutes as Shane Cheesman glided the ball home from just inside the 18 yard box.

Knaphill were level 90 seconds later, producing a well worked equaliser when from a swift break, Tom Davis delivered a slick pass to Ricky Hogsden who fired in a cracking goal to make it 1-1, his 20th of the season, and Knaphill's 50th in the League.

After 23 minutes Craig Parrington put Hogsden away, but the striker's effort was covered by the advancing keeper. Knaphill were producing some neat one touch football and fluent moves, with their defence quick to cut out danger from their opponents. On the half hour Richard Shelley saved well from Cheesman. Knaphill's territorial advantage was evident, but neither side were able to come close enough forcing a second goal in the first half.

Not too much trouble for either keeper in the early spell of the second half, Parrington's shot was driven straight at the keeper before Knaphill took a deserved lead in the 64th minute when Hogsden took his chance well to steer the ball past Whitsy in the Cobham goal.

Shelley denied Shane Rideout's effort after 74 minutes as the latter stages saw Knaphill having to defend well to stave off a Cobham side pressing for an equaliser, which could have materialised had Ramsey not screwed his shot wide. But Knaphill held firm to finish the game worthy winners.

A goal from defender Gavin Branch deep into time added on, clinched third place for Knaphill in their final game of the season against Cobham at Redding Way.

Right up to that moment, it seemed it might be the same scenario as the final day last season when then, the title was at stake, which Knaphill failed to clinch at Farleigh. But this time, the late, late goal secured what they were after in their last game, a third place finish.

It was Cobham who created more of the early chances, whilst Knaphill made only a couple of goal scoring opportunities before they forged into the lead after 18 minutes when, following a good build up, Nick Darnell hooked the ball past keeper Nick McGregor to make it 1-0. Two minutes later, Martin Cook, in for regular Knaphill keeper Richard Shelley, made a timely save to deny Cobham's Gerald Mensah.

Ricky Hogsden effort after 20 minutes didn't have quite enough sting in it to trouble the keeper, and Cobham came back strongly and went close five minutes later. A goal the visitors had threatened earlier came to fruition when they equalised after 32 minutes through Scott Day. Early in the second half, Knaphill launched an attack, but Chris Fox shot was driven straight at the keeper. In the 64th minute, Shane Rideout gave Cobham the lead when he found plenty of space in the home defence, to drill his shot into the far corner of goal.

The big push forward from Knaphill in search of an equaliser saw efforts failing to make their mark.

But whilst Cobham were seeking a third goal, it was Knaphill who battled back with late perseverance that payed off just as it looked if time would run out on them. 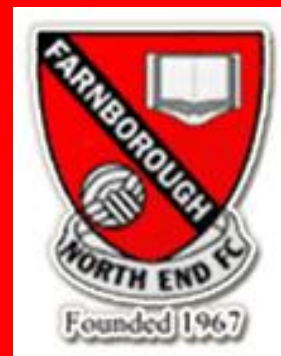

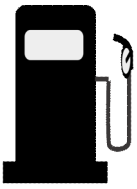

Once play had settled down following a fast spell of attacking football from both sides, Knaphill made the breakthrough in the 29th minute when they powered forward in a move which was finished by Chris Fox *pictured below* who picked his spot well to rifle home from 20 yards to make it 1-0.

Five minutes later Nick Darnell hooked the ball in towards the near post, only for keeper Mike Bradley to tip the effort away for a corner. Knaphill didn't take long to increase their lead when in the 37th minute, Fox's pass found Woody Cardona, *pictured below* who slotted home the second goal from 12 yards. Westfield then forced their way back into the game three minutes later, Simon Shepherd tapping home from close range to reduce the deficit. Westfield put more pressure on Knaphill's defence in the second half and in the 49th minute, Fox had to clear from near the goal line to deny the home side. Then on the hour, Knaphill failed to clear their lines, and substitute Gabriel Adesina equalised for Westfield.

Three minutes later Knaphill regained their lead when Ricky Hogsden, two minutes after coming on as substitute, fired home following a flick on from Matt Baker. It was all square again after 70 minutes when Adesina notched his second, after Shelley had partially saved his first effort.

Just as the game looked to be heading for a draw, back came Knaphill to put late pressure on the home goal, which paid dividends after 87 minutes as Fox powered through to make it 4-3, to secure maximum points and complete the double over Westfield this season.
