KNAPPERS MATTERS

Club Secretary Bryan Freeman writes on all matters involving the Knappers.

Good afternoon everyone and a welcome to our visitors today Coulsdon United and the three match officials, for this Division 1 encounter, which gives us a second successive Saturday game at home. The meeting between the two teams back in November saw Knaphill 6-2 winners with a hat-trick for Ricky Hogsden, and one apiece for Matt Baker, and two players making their debut for the Club, Craig Parrington and Wesley Harrison.

Since that game, Coulsdon's fortunes have not changed. At the time they were at the foot of the table with one point, and is the same situation today which has seen them on the end of some heavy scorelines, with 112 goals conceded in 27 games, but also they've had a few closer encounters. On that last meeting of today's teams, Coulsdon showed a lot of battling spirit and it was believed they could turn the corner and start picking up on results with that enthusiasm. But disappointingly for them it has not materialised.

Whilst Coulsdon were losing at home to Westfield last Saturday, Knaphill chalked up their seventh win from nine games and a total of 22 points since the start of the year in the comfortable 3-0 win over CB Hounslow. It could have been a bigger scoreline had the team kept up the tempo and capitalised on chances in the second half. Basically it turned out that the points were virtually won with a three goal burst in the first half.

The first came when a Dan Cox cross was sliced into the net by a defender after 24 minutes, then 90 seconds later, defender Gavin Brainch's fine strike made it 2-0 and the third followed after 27 minutes when Dan Cox netted an excellent goal from the edge of the 18 yard area and a commanding three goal lead which remained up until halftime. The second half didn't have quite the same impact as



the first, although Knaphill were well in control of the game, but should have made it 4-0 after 77 minutes, but after Chris Fox was upended in the box, Ian Savage was to stroke his spot kick wide.

But the points were in the bag, and the consistency and confidence in our recent results continues. Despite that win, we stayed sixth in the table, six points behind third placed Hartley Wintney (54pts) who have played two games more. On the same afternoon, our Reserves had a good result away to Farleigh Rovers in the 3-0 win. It was only their 18th game of the season, and they still have 17 games remaining. Time marches on, but it's going to be a busy April for the team. More news on that game in Manager Matt Chesterman's column elsewhere in the programme.

A look ahead to other fixtures this month. Next Saturday 20th March, we visit Bedfont Sports a meeting of the two clubs for the first time this season, the home match against them was one of our postponed games earlier in the season. On Saturday 27th March Eversley are the visitors here at Redding Way, our previous meeting at their place, brought about a narrow 2-1 defeat back in October.

We hope that we've seen the last of postponed games, and that we get a good uninterrupted run of fixtures through to the end of the season (whenever that might be!)...and continuing with today's game... onwards and upwards...

Our good run of form continues despite last week's game against Hounslow not being the most inspiring, especially in the second half by which time we were already three up and cruising, nevertheless, we got the all important thing and that is the three points.

I have always maintained that a good performance will reward a side with the right result, and this is certainly the case with us currently because we are playing some really good football at present, coupled with some fine individual performances not least from current captain Nathan Miles, who has been inspirational since taking over the arm band from Nick Darnell

Someone asked me recently what the main difference is now with the side compared with the first half of the season when we had what can only be described as an indifferent start. In my opinion there are a number of factors that have made the difference, but none more so than the belief and confidence which returned to the side after the South Park game plus the realization that we had not performed to the best of our ability, combine this with some very good individual performances, has contributed to our climb up the table.

Speaking of individual performances, I would take this opportunity to mention the excellent progress and contribution of Danny Cox who is currently playing with so much confidence it's a joy to watch him go on one of his mazy runs down the right flank (reminds me of oneself in my younger days, ha!), also Lee "Gambo" Gamble who seems to play with so much time and has stepped up to the challenge in the absence of Steve Green. Gavin Brainch has also been playing really well at left back at a time when his place in the side was under threat from the experienced Matt Burns, who is currently not available due to work commitments. Gav has taken his opportunity and not looked back.



Another factor why we are doing so much better now is that these guys currently represent a good defensive unit which has made a tremendous difference to our recent progress, which has been ably assisted of course by Richard Shelley who is probably having one of his best seasons between the sticks.

Of course I cannot ignore the excellent contribution of our current midfield consisting of Chris Fox who at long last appears to have found some of last season's form, and Tom "Ogie" Davies who has been a revelation on the left and Craig "Paza" Parrington (or is it Victor Meldrew in disguise) who has finally accepted his responsibilities in centre midfield well and Mr. Reliable himself, Nick Darnell who continues to play as if he were still captain.

Not that it is a bad thing, far from it, we are all captains in our own right, some are more natural than others and take to it like water off a ducks back, but Nick has been exemplary in his attitude and has made a major contribution to the team's recent progress. All have come good at the same time including Ricky Hogsden who is having an enforced Surrey FA rest bite, but is probably enjoying his best ever season at this level and Matt Baker who I feel is not quite running on all cylinders just yet, but look out when he does.

Another noticeable difference is the development of the players and how they have responded to their responsibilities and challenge in the absence of influential player coach Ian Savage who is currently recovering from a knee injury, but accepts that he may have to wait a little longer for his chance to get back into the side again, nonetheless, Sav is equally affective off the field as on it which is most invaluable.

Finally I would like to take this opportunity to thank Martin Cook who deputised for Richard Shelley who cried off at the eleventh hour last week through illness. I'm really grateful to Martin who not only had to finish work early, but had to forego extra money in the process to help us out. Now that's what I call "commitment".

Enjoy today's game.

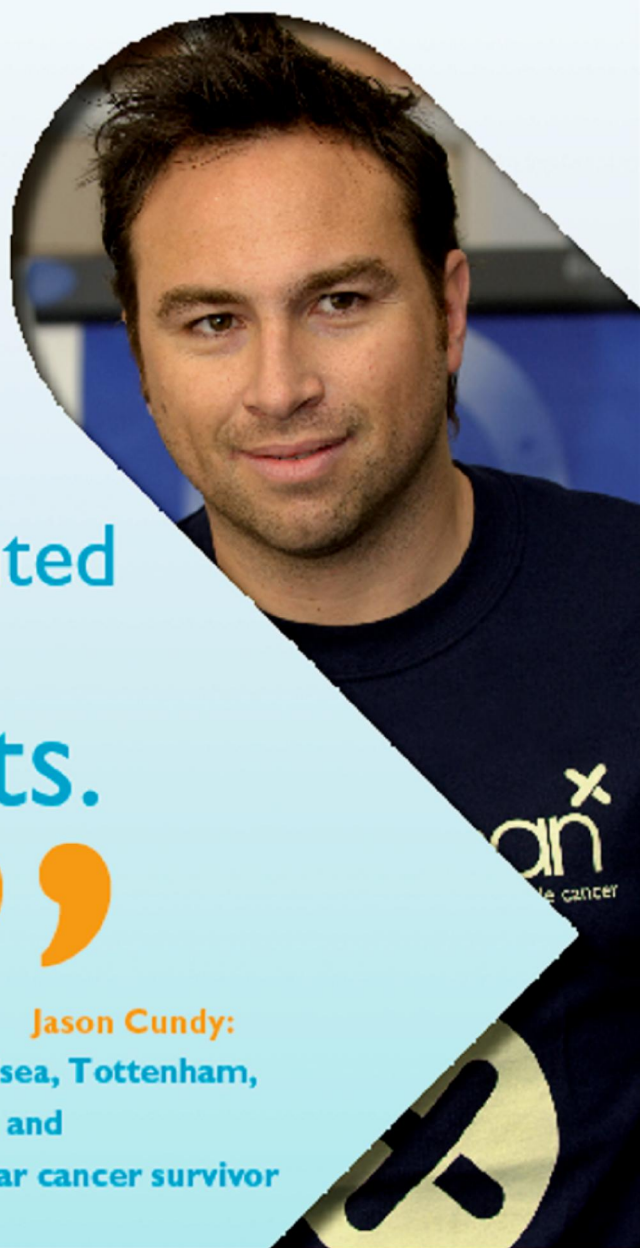

coulsdon utd



Coulsdon United was formed from two clubs who played in the Combined Counties League Division One. Salfords were originally Monotype and ground shared with Coulsdon Town from 2006 because their own facilities were thought to be unacceptable for the new ground-grading rules for the CCFL. Coulsdon Town were previously Netherne. Both teams were playing at Coulsdon Town's ground at Netherne Community Amateur Sports Club, Woodplace Lane, Coulsdon. To share their resources - mainly human -they joined together in 2007 to form Coulsdon United.

Football has been played at Netherne since the early part of the 20th. century when builders engaged on the Netherne Hospital played a game against Chipstead. The present ground became Netherne Hospital's sports and social club and when the Hospital closed the club continued, having been sold to Gleeson's and given a long lease by that company.

In 1968 a team originally Reedham came to play at Netherne and changing their name to Netherne F.C. went on to be promoted into the Combined Counties League which at the time had one division. Due to having no floodlights the team was relegated into the Surrey Senior League but allowed back in to Division One for clubs without floodlights at a later date.

We are looking forward to a more settled time but all depends on ground-grading. It is not easy for clubs to get planning permission for floodlights and many are in the same position. We will wait to see what further rules will be forced on clubs before we know where our future will be.

Coulsdon Utd 2 Knaphill 6

Knaphill's visit to Coulsdon United on Saturday brought a comfortable win over the bottom of the table team with a hat-trick for leading goalscorer Ricky Hogsden. There were some team changes for Knaphill which saw Matt Burns, Craig Parrington and Wesley Harrison making their League debuts for the club.

Knaphill created numerous chances throughout the game, and the final tally of six goals, could easily have reached double figures had they tucked away those opportunities. However, it was not until just past the half hour mark that chances were capitalised on with two goals in the space of a couple of minutes. The first saw Ricky Hogsden feed a pass to newcomer Craig Parrington who despatched a shot from the edge of the 18 yard box to make it 1-0.

The visitors lost little time in increasing their lead in the 34th minute when Wesley Harrison, showing an impressive impact on the game in the opening stages, delivered a neat pass to Hogsden, who cut into the 18 yard area to drill past the keeper. Knaphill's top goalcorer had a good chance for number three, but his lobbed effort just failed to loop high enough over the Coulsdon keeper.

With Knaphill's defence looking a bit unsettled at times, Coulsdon, who put a lot of effort in their game considering they were fielding a number of new players for the first time, seized their opportunity in the 40th minute to reduce the deficit.

Just three minutes into the second half and Knaphill were looking sharper and showed their intent, to bring about the third goal. Harrison's effort was only partially saved by the keeper and the opportunity then fell to the feet of Hogsden to bury his shot into the far corner and strengthen the visitors lead. But Coulsdon were still persevering and seeking a way back into the game, which they did in the 58th minute. Following some slack marking, it allowed Nolan to fire past Richard Shelley rooted to the spot, to make it 3-2.

Knaphill's overall play then kept them in control for the rest of the half which saw three more goals. Harrison's fine run down the left ended with a cross come shot that zipped into the far corner after 65 minutes. The lead was extended when Matt Baker made it 5-2 in the 78th minute, and from a Tom Davis pass, Hogsden clinched his hat-trick and Knaphill's sixth goal to gain maximum points making it their sixth win from seven league games on their travels this season.

HOME OF THE KNAPPERS ON THE NET

Knaphill Football Club began its life in 1924 at Waterer's Park. Waterer's Park was left to Woking Urban District Council in 1924 by Mr Anthony Waterer of Knaphill Nursery. The Recreation Ground was originally part of the nursery called "Blue Gates Field" and the park was laid out by Woking Council between 1924 and 1928 - the task taking so long as the bottom part of the field was very "soggy", whilst the rest was uneven and infested with moles. And these conditions can still be seen over 70 years later!

Very little history is known about the Club between 1924 and 1980, although we do know that the team colours were originally red and white.

In 1980 Knaphill were represented in the Old Woking and District League (now Guildford and Woking Alliance League) in Division 3 under Manager Dave Holloway. Dave took them from Division 3 through promotion to the Surrey Intermediate League. Dave then left Knaphill to take over Conference side Woking's reserve and youth teams.

The late Andy Westcott took over the Manager's position at Knaphill in 1984. Andy successfully took the Club from Division 3 to the Premier Division 1, at the same time Clive Howes was running the Reserve Team, who also won promotion from Division 3 to the Reserves Premier Division 1. Geoff Poulton was to go on to take over the running of the Reserve Team from Clive Howes.

In 1990, Mick Garbutt became the Manager of Knaphill and Paul Bambini was running the Reserve Team. Mick Garbutt left the Club in 1994 to join up with Colin Lippiatt and Geoff Chapple at Woking. After this time the club went into decline and was struggling for players for both the First and Reserve Teams. The decision was taken by then Senior Secretary, Sean Carrigy, to approach local team Heathlands, who were playing in the Guildford and Woking Alliance League. Heathlands found themselves struggling for facilities but not players; this gave the two teams the opportunity to amalgamate.

Season 1995/96 saw the arrival of Greg Anderson as Manager, with Sean Carrigy running the Reserve Team.

In 1996 Dave Freeman took over from Greg as First Team Manager. The Reserve Team Manager's position was handed over to Noff Diliberto in 1997; he left the Club a year later, when Carl Barker took over.

Season 2002/03 saw 2 new men at the helm with Mick Garbutt in charge of the 1st Team and Frank Walters in charge of the Reserves. Paul Bailey took over midway through 2002/2003; Carl Barker then had a second spell as Reserve Team Manager with Danny James as Reserve Team Coach and Dave Freeman as 1st team coach.

At the start of the 2003/2004 season the club formed a third team named KNAPHILL 'A' to play in the Guildford & Woking Alliance League due to volume of players at the club. Carl Barker took over as A Team Manager with Danny James in charge of the Reserves.

The 2004/2005 season brought about further changes at team management level seeing Dave Freeman retiring from playing due to injuries and being appointed as 1st Team Manager with Mick Garbutt stepping down to Assistant Manager. There was also a new man at the helm for the A Team with Kevin Fletcher taking over from Carl Barker who had taken up the Chairman role. The club also moved into their new ground at Redding Way and the re-development of the Waterers Park ground, due to be finished by April 2005, giving Knaphill Football Club some of the best facilities in the Surrey area.

In the 2004/2005 season the Reserves finished Runners Up to Old Rutlishians and the A Team were beaten by a last gasp winner in the Junior Cup Semi-Final against Shepperton FB with 1st Team finishing 7th in their respective division.

Season 2005/2006 was destined to be a big season for the club with the club established at its new ground at Redding Way and the A Team reverting back to Waterers Park having had the facilities rebuilt. 1st Team Manager Dave Freeman continued in charge for the 2005/2006 campaign and appointed former professional with Bristol City, Bob Pritchard, who has also managed at senior level with Chertsey Town, amongst others, as 1st Team Coach. Kevin Fletcher was appointed Reserve Team Manager having impressed by running the A Team the previous season. The 2005/2006 season did prove successful as we won the Division One title on the last day of the season against nearest rivals Virginia Water and gained promotion to the Premier Division. Season 2006/2007 continued with Dave Freeman in charge of the 1st Team and Paul Bailey re-appointed as Reserve Team Manager. The A Team management was split during the season. Martin Hobson took charge during the first few months but had to resign due to work and family commitments. Gavin Wilcox and Tim Handley then took over until the end of the season.

The 1st Team claimed back to back titles by winning the Premier Division Championship which resulted in us achieving promotion to the Combined Counties Football League, the most successful period in the club's history up to then. Bob Pritchard took over from Dave Freeman as Manager who became Bob's assistant during September 2007.

The 2007/08 season was the busiest the club has ever endured. Over 45 matches were played at Redding Way and the pitch was still the best in the league at the end of the season. Bob Pritchard and Dave Freeman led the club to a very commendable 7th place in the CCL, our first in senior football. The early season had seen Knaphill pushing for a top 5 position, but poor runs over the Christmas & Easter periods saw the clubs performances drop off the leading runners; still 7th place was an excellent result considering the circumstances. Steve Hutton led the Reserves campaign, a massive 40 games with a mixture of good and bad results, beating the leaders of the league on at least two occasions, but dropping too many points by conceding late goals. The A Team had an up and down season eventually finishing in 7th place in the GWAL 3rd Division table.

The closed season also saw the amalgamation of Knaphill FC and Knaphill Wanderers (the junior sides) at long last under the Knaphill FC banner. The Wanderers will keep their identity for the coming season and plans to achieve the highly sought after FA Community Charter status will continue in earnest.

The 2008/09 season started with a most welcome new face, the former Bisley and Farnborough Assistant Manager, Ian Savage. Ian joined us as player/coach and with his experience and knowledge this club has the right to feel proud that he chose to join Knaphill after receiving many other offers from teams at higher levels. Steve Hutton has left his post as Reserve Team manager for pastures new in the summer and was replaced by the very experienced Graham Pope, however Graham left the club in November due to personal reasons and side is now run by Adie Wilson and Lee Cook.

The A Team is now under the control of James Taylor and Brendan Baker who received the good news at the GWAL AGM that their team is to play in the 2nd Division last season after wholesale changes in the leagues constitution. With a reduction in League games in Division One to 34 from 38 in 2007/08, Knaphill entered two new Cup competitions. the Anagram Trophy and the Southern Combination Cup, both of which saw an early exit. However, the team kept a high profile in the League staying in the top half of the table all season, eventually finishing in fifth place. They could have become champions had they won their last game of the season when, in a tightly bunched set of teams in the top six. Knaphill on 69pts needed to win at Farleigh to pip Staines Lammas to the title. Disappointingly they lost 3-2, so near yet so far.

The Reserves finished ninth in their Division with the second half of the season providing a 17 match sequence losing just two games. Adie Wilson having taken over in November from Graham Pope gelled well his players and together that was shown with the results. The A team won promotion to Division 2 of the GWAL, their second move up the ladder having been promoted from Division 3 to Division 2 the previous season. The new season sees a B team starting their first season in Division 4(North).

In the close season Terry Chapman was voted in as the new Chairman, replacing Nick Croshaw who stood down after two seasons. The newly formed Ladies side will also come under the senior banner and once again enhance on the size of the football club. Plans for floodlights and hard standing alongwith a 100 seated stand at Redding way are moving forward with the help of Woking Borough Council who continue as in recent years to support the football club.

So, a challenge ahead for individuals, players and management combined for the new season 2009/10.

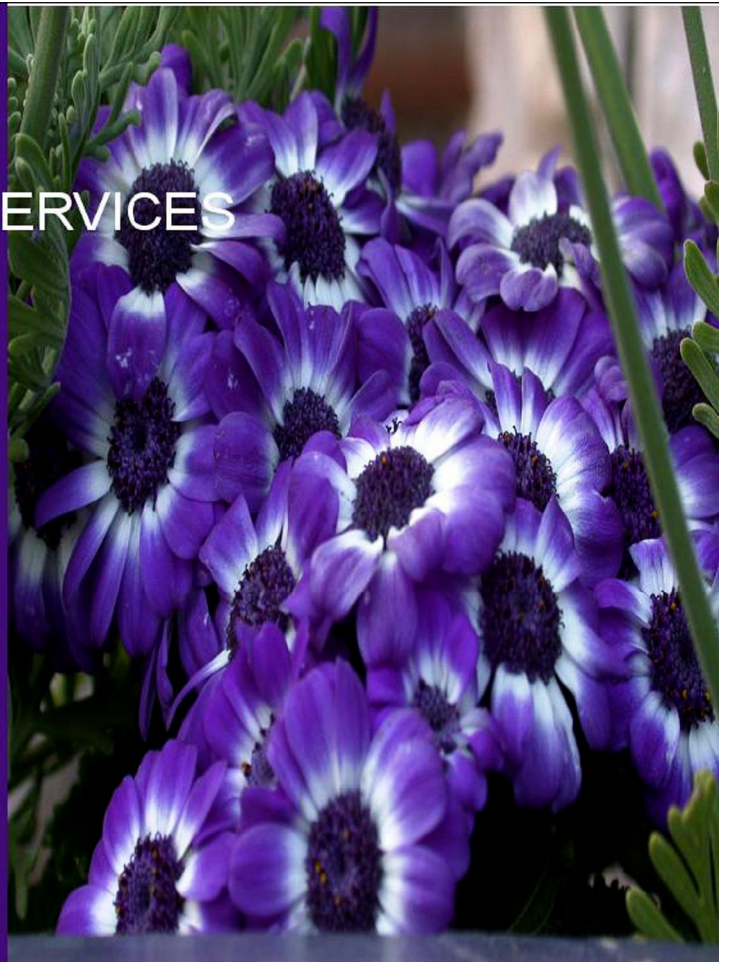

Knaphill notched up their seventh win from their last nine games in the comfortable 3-0 success over CB Hounslow at Redding Way on Saturday. Despite having to make a couple of changes from their previous game with Wesley Harrison coming in for the suspended Ricky Hogsden, who was missing only his second game in 32 this season, and Martin Cook receiving a late call up to the side in place of keeper Richard Shelley, out through illness.

The first half hour saw Knaphill very much in control with plenty of possession, creating chances and a mid-half goal burst producing three goals within the space of four minutes. They should have been one up after just seven minutes. Defender Dan Cox delivered a neatly worked cross, which was fumbled by the keeper, the ball came out to Matt Baker, who could only provide a half hit shot from six yards which slid past the far post. Cox had an effort wide on 19 minutes, before Harrison glided his shot into the side netting three minutes later.

Then Knaphill prised open the visitors defence after another fine cross from Cox was sliced into goal by a defender to make it 1-0. A second goal came 90 seconds later, when defender Gavin Branch sped into the 18 yard box to plant his shot into the far corner of goal. But the best of the three came from the hardworking Dan Cox who, from the edge of the box, rifled home an excellent goal to give Knaphill a commanding 3-0 lead. Plenty of pressure from Knaphill was put on the visitors defence as they glided through with some fluent moves, but there were no more goals to add to their three goal burst of the first half.

The second half did not quite have the same zip in their play as in the first 45 minutes. Had some chances been capitalised on, then it could have produced at least another couple of goals.

One was from a penalty after 77 minutes, when Chris Fox was upended in the 18 yard box, but Ian Savage's weak spot kick sailed past the post. Another of their scoring opportunities came near the end when Nick Darnell was in a good position to score a fourth goal from close range, but fired inches wide of the post.

But Knaphill's mission in gaining maximum points had already been accomplished way before that, with 22 points now gained from a possible twenty-seven in their last nine games, and they will be looking to enhance on that run this Saturday when they play hosts to basement club Coulsdon United at Redding Way.

This week Bryan Freeman gets the Inside Talk fromdefender Lee Gamble

Lee Gamble, who joined Knaphill in September 2009, was unlucky with an ankle injury that kept him out of football from mid-October last year until last month's game against Croydon Municipal. But recently Lee has been enjoying his return to the first team defence and a good run of five unbeaten games. More on that later in this Inside Talk with the Knaphill defender.

Let's go back to Lee's early days in football, and like many youngsters, joined a local junior/youth Club and through to Youth football with two professional clubs. Lee started out in football when he was six years old, joining top local junior Club Meadow Sports, where he stayed for three years. Even at that early age, football scouts were often looking for local talent throughout the early age groups.

Lee was scouted by West Ham, which led to the departure from Meadow Sports and onto spending his next 3 years with West Ham Youth until he was 12 years old, a very early stepping stone and very encouraging step for someone so young to be associated with a top pro.club. From the age of 12 years until he was sixteen, Lee was with Crystal Palace Youth. But although he was there for four years with the Youth set up, Palace decided to release him when he was 16 years old, a set back and a disappointment for Lee, who went on to have a two year gap without football.

Although the experience at West Ham and Crystal Palace was good, Lee's next move back into football, brought him closer to home, and at the age of 19, he was to join Cobham where one of his present Knaphill team mates Tom Davis was playing. It was to be a two year spell with the CCL Club, and his first taste of top local senior football, but Lee was to suffer four months out of the game with a broken foot.

After Lee left Cobham, he had another year out of the game, before he was shown encouragement by his mother's uncle Mick Garbutt, a former Knaphill player, manager, and physio and now vice-president of the Club, to join Knaphill. Lee was pleased to join Knaphill knowing not only Tom Davis, but Nathan Miles, Dan Cox, and Gavin Brainch, his current co-defenders.





Lee had four first team games before an ankle injury in mid-October last year, sidelined him until his first team return against Croydon Municipal in the first week of February. Since then, 24 year old Lee has enjoyed his football and played in five successive games in Knaphill's defence, a sequence which has produced five wins. He's looking forward to continuing a winning sequence and together with the rest of the team, the hopes of moving further up the table and greater heights, by keeping the consistency going in the coming weeks.

Nick Croshaw reports on all the latest news from our ladies, girls and boys teams.

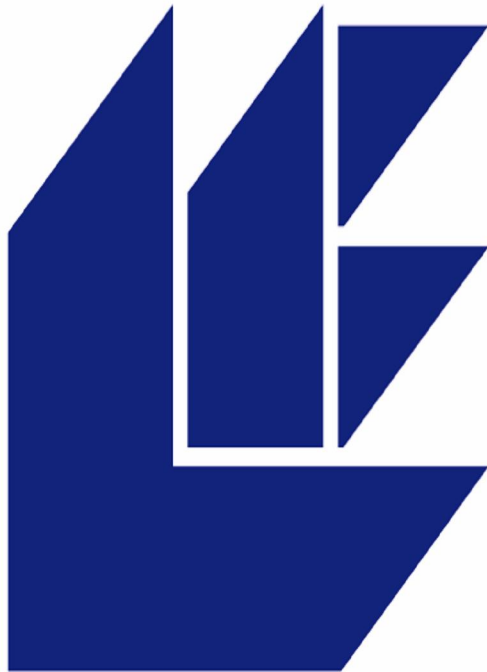

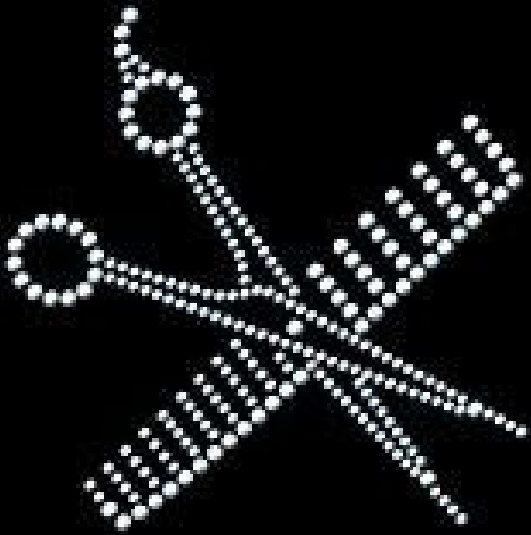

LAST YEAR



The match preview on the Mole Valley website described last Saturday's encounter as their '*biggest game of the season when they entertain a Knaphill side who are bang in form and a very serious threat to our title hopes*'. Sloppy defending allowed a cross from the left to be picked out by Jay Holden who buried his shot past Shelley.

Four minutes later, Mole Valley increased their lead when defender Dan Martin glided home from 10 yards and the defence were undone again. On 37 minutes it was 3-0, this time from the penalty spot following handball by Nathan Miles in the box. The 15 minute blitz rounded off the first half as a breakaway led to Holden finding space and time, to snap up his hat-trick.

The second half Knaphill were able to stem the tide in search of some credibility. But whilst the defence were not quite as vulnerable as the first half, up front lacked the necessary penetration with limited opportunities. Baker had a chance turned for a corner after 64 minutes, and a Matt Edwards shot on 73minutes was deflected away from goal.

No goals in the second half, but basically the game was over in the first 45 minutes, and the idea of trying to make the scoreline a bit more respectable, just didn't materialise. Now it's a case of regrouping for the trip to Dorking on Tuesday night in an attempt to get back on track.
