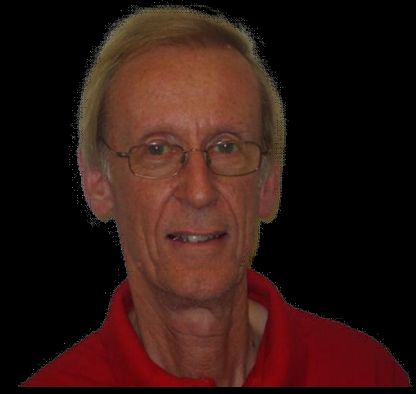
KNAPPERS MATTERS

Club Secretary Bryan Freeman writes on all matters involving the Knappers.

Good afternoon everyone, and welcome to Redding Way where today we welcome for the first time to Knaphill, the players, officials and supporters from Croydon Municipal, making their debut in the Combined Counties League this season. We have already had a fixture against our opponents which resulted in a 3-0 win away on the first Saturday in October. The goalscorers on that day being Ricky Hogsden and Bradley Cann(2). Croydon, prior to their midweek match against Crescent Rovers had played 23 games, won six and lost twelve with a total of 23 points. Their game at home to Eversley last week, was postponed.

Talking of postponements, Knaphill have had four Division One games called off at home due to the weather, and two away so far this season. But reflecting on the overall positions of Clubs who have suffered postponed games this season, and that means the majority of them, there are 17 Clubs on, or either side of our total of games played up to last Saturday. Six teams having played 22, seven are on 21(including Knaphill) and four clubs have played less than us which includes Farnham on 18. Those figures were prior to the midweek games this week.

Knaphill have had an encouraging start to 2010 in our league programme for January, although only three games in Division 1 were played (two were postponed). After gaining a point at South Park at the beginning of last month, the next game came three weeks later on Saturday 23 January, when we finally returned to Redding Way after 11 weeks, and gained maximum points against Warlingham in the 4-0 win. All four goals came in the second half, Nick Darnell and Matt Baker giving Knaphill a two goal lead, before two late goals from Ricky Hogsden and Craig Parrington made it 4-0 in time added on. Then last Saturday, a first visit to fifth place Cobham which saw the team secure back to back league victories with a 2-1 win, both goals coming from Ricky Hogsden, his first saw the 50th goal scored in Division 1 this season, and Ricky's 20th of the season. The result inflicted Cobham with their first home league defeat this season. It was the first time since 12 December that we had played two Saturdays in succession !

In between those two league games was the Surrey Premier Cup 4th round match away to Cup holders Met.Police. Well, we certainly copped it in that game (a blip in between the two league wins ?) as Knaphill crashed out of the competition 6-2. Matt Baker and Craig Parrington our goalscorers. On Wednesday night we suffered a set back with a 1-0 defeat to a new look Feltham side in what was has to be described as the worst pitch myself and the club have seen in a long time.

Looking ahead now to what's coming up for the rest of this month. Next Tuesday 9 February is the rearranged game away to **Westfield** kick-off 7.30pm. Next Saturday 13 February, we are away at **Hartley Wintney** (3.00pm) before returning to Redding Way on Saturday 20 February and the home fixture against **Farleigh Rovers**, when we revert back to a 3.00pm kick-off. The month finishes with a trip to **Farnham Town** on Saturday 27 February(3.00pm).

Meanwhile, we look forward to 90 minutes of entertaining football this afternoon.....enjoy the game....

AWAY DAY MATCH REPORT



Surrey Premier County Cup Quarter Final
Wednesday January 27 2010
Met Police Reserves 6 Knaphill 2

Knaphill's run in the Surrey Premier Cup came to an end when they were beaten by the holders Met. Police at Imber Court on Wednesday night. Despite plenty of effort and good overall work rate, Knaphill were blitzed by an eight minute spell of three goals in the first half and three more in the second.

But this quarter final tie opened at a fast pace with the best football coming from Knaphill in the first 20 minutes with creativity and some good passing of the ball as they pressed for an opening goal. An early chance fell to Ricky Hogsden who drilled his effort just wide of the far post, and a Matt Baker shot wide of the near post, as Knaphill were looking sharper to the ball than their opponents.

Keeper Richard Shelley was brought into action after 23 minutes when Williams volley was tipped over the bar, then soon after the home side missed a good clearer opportunity to open the scoring. As the half progressed Knaphill were not able to pose the all important finishing touch on goal, despite their good work in the orchestration of constructing their moves.

The Police took the lead after 37 minutes when Cobden, on a quick break down the left, cut into the 6 yard box to fire home. Two minutes later Dexter's 25 yard effort made it 2-0. The home side had now stepped up a gear, whilst Knaphill were losing some of their early momentum. Shortly before halftime, Baker netted for Knaphill, which look to be a good well taken goal, apart from the linesman who adjudged him offside.

Then in the 45th minute, Met. Police increased their lead through Cuthbert. But there was still time for Knaphill to pull one back, which they did in first half stoppage time when Craig Parrington fired in a cracking shot from almost 30 yards which zipped past the keeper.

In the second half the home side made it 4-1 after 55 minutes with a diving header from Dexter, and they grabbed a tighter control on the game when they scored a fifth three minutes later through substitute Read. With Parrington having score the best goal of the night in the first half, Baker netted the second best strike in the 69th minute. After Tom Davis free kick from 20 yards cannoned off the crossbar, the ball was only partially cleared, and Baker struck well for Knaphill's second.

The Cup holders however, had the final say of the night with a sixth goal in the 89th minute for a final 6-2 score-line and their passage into the semi-finals.

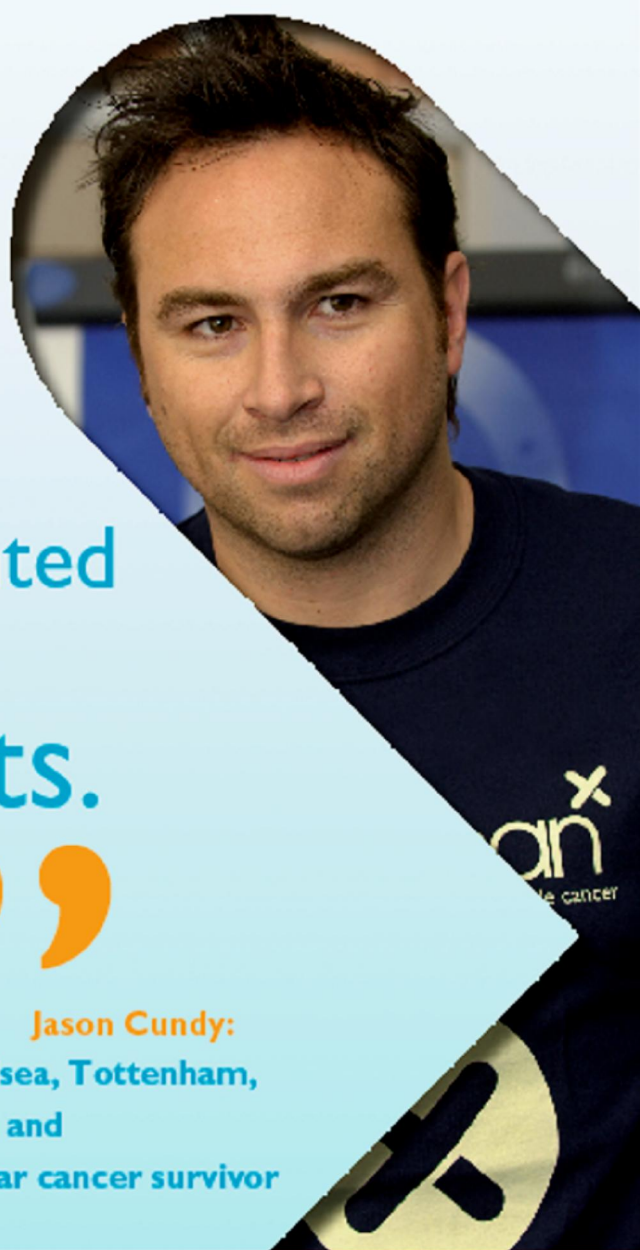

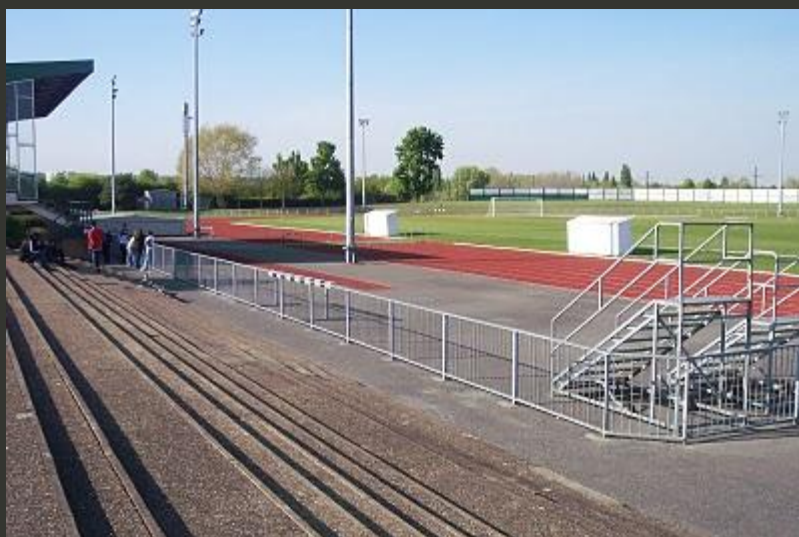

KNAPHILL F.C AGAINST RACISM



Knaphill Football Club began its life in 1924 at Waterer's Park. Waterer's Park was left to Woking Urban District Council in 1924 by Mr Anthony Waterer of Knaphill Nursery. The Recreation Ground was originally part of the nursery called "Blue Gates Field" and the park was laid out by Woking Council between 1924 and 1928 - the task taking so long as the bottom part of the field was very "soggy", whilst the rest was uneven and infested with moles. And these conditions can still be seen over 70 years later!

Very little history is known about the Club between 1924 and 1980, although we do know that the team colours were originally red and white.

In 1980 Knaphill were represented in the Old Woking and District League (now Guildford and Woking Alliance League) in Division 3 under Manager Dave Holloway. Dave took them from Division 3 through promotion to the Surrey Intermediate League. Dave then left Knaphill to take over Conference side Woking's reserve and youth teams.

The late Andy Westcott took over the Manager's position at Knaphill in 1984. Andy successfully took the Club from Division 3 to the Premier Division 1, at the same time Clive Howes was running the Reserve Team, who also won promotion from Division 3 to the Reserves Premier Division 1. Geoff Poulton was to go on to take over the running of the Reserve Team from Clive Howes.

In 1990, Mick Garbutt became the Manager of Knaphill and Paul Bambini was running the Reserve Team. Mick Garbutt left the Club in 1994 to join up with Colin Lippiatt and Geoff Chapple at Woking. After this time the club went into decline and was struggling for players for both the First and Reserve Teams. The decision was taken by then Senior Secretary, Sean Carrigy, to approach local team Heathlands, who were playing in the Guildford and Woking Alliance League. Heathlands found themselves struggling for facilities but not players; this gave the two teams the opportunity to amalgamate.

Season 1995/96 saw the arrival of Greg Anderson as Manager, with Sean Carrigy running the Reserve Team.

In 1996 Dave Freeman took over from Greg as First Team Manager. The Reserve Team Manager's position was handed over to Noff Diliberto in 1997; he left the Club a year later, when Carl Barker took over.

Season 2002/03 saw 2 new men at the helm with Mick Garbutt in charge of the 1st Team and Frank Walters in charge of the Reserves. Paul Bailey took over midway through 2002/2003; Carl Barker then had a second spell as Reserve Team Manager with Danny James as Reserve Team Coach and Dave Freeman as 1st team coach.

At the start of the 2003/2004 season the club formed a third team named KNAPHILL 'A' to play in the Guildford & Woking Alliance League due to volume of players at the club. Carl Barker took over as A Team Manager with Danny James in charge of the Reserves.

The 2004/2005 season brought about further changes at team management level seeing Dave Freeman retiring from playing due to injuries and being appointed as 1st Team Manager with Mick Garbutt stepping down to Assistant Manager. There was also a new man at the helm for the A Team with Kevin Fletcher taking over from Carl Barker who had taken up the Chairman role. The club also moved into their new ground at Redding Way and the re-development of the Waterers Park ground, due to be finished by April 2005, giving Knaphill Football Club some of the best facilities in the Surrey area.

In the 2004/2005 season the Reserves finished Runners Up to Old Rutlishians and the A Team were beaten by a last gasp winner in the Junior Cup Semi-Final against Shepperton FB with 1st Team finishing 7th in their respective division.

Season 2005/2006 was destined to be a big season for the club with the club established at its new ground at Redding Way and the A Team reverting back to Waterers Park having had the facilities rebuilt. 1st Team Manager Dave Freeman continued in charge for the 2005/2006 campaign and appointed former professional with Bristol City, Bob Pritchard, who has also managed at senior level with Chertsey Town, amongst others, as 1st Team Coach. Kevin Fletcher was appointed Reserve Team Manager having impressed by running the A Team the previous season. The 2005/2006 season did prove successful as we won the Division One title on the last day of the season against nearest rivals Virginia Water and gained promotion to the Premier Division. Season 2006/2007 continued with Dave Freeman in charge of the 1st Team and Paul Bailey re-appointed as Reserve Team Manager. The A Team management was split during the season. Martin Hobson took charge during the first few months but had to resign due to work and family commitments. Gavin Wilcox and Tim Handley then took over until the end of the season.

The 1st Team claimed back to back titles by winning the Premier Division Championship which resulted in us achieving promotion to the Combined Counties Football League, the most successful period in the club's history up to then. Bob Pritchard took over from Dave Freeman as Manager who became Bob's assistant during September 2007.

The 2007/08 season was the busiest the club has ever endured. Over 45 matches were played at Redding Way and the pitch was still the best in the league at the end of the season. Bob Pritchard and Dave Freeman led the club to a very commendable 7th place in the CCL, our first in senior football. The early season had seen Knaphill pushing for a top 5 position, but poor runs over the Christmas & Easter periods saw the clubs performances drop off the leading runners; still 7th place was an excellent result considering the circumstances. Steve Hutton led the Reserves campaign, a massive 40 games with a mixture of good and bad results, beating the leaders of the league on at least two occasions, but dropping too many points by conceding late goals. The A Team had an up and down season eventually finishing in 7th place in the GWAL 3rd Division table.

The closed season also saw the amalgamation of Knaphill FC and Knaphill Wanderers (the junior sides) at long last under the Knaphill FC banner. The Wanderers will keep their identity for the coming season and plans to achieve the highly sought after FA Community Charter status will continue in earnest.

The 2008/09 season started with a most welcome new face, the former Bisley and Farnborough Assistant Manager, Ian Savage. Ian joined us as player/coach and with his experience and knowledge this club has the right to feel proud that he chose to join Knaphill after receiving many other offers from teams at higher levels. Steve Hutton has left his post as Reserve Team manager for pastures new in the summer and was replaced by the very experienced Graham Pope, however Graham left the club in November due to personal reasons and side is now run by Adie Wilson and Lee Cook.

The A Team is now under the control of James Taylor and Brendan Baker who received the good news at the GWAL AGM that their team is to play in the 2nd Division last season after wholesale changes in the leagues constitution. With a reduction in League games in Division One to 34 from 38 in 2007/08, Knaphill entered two new Cup competitions. the Anagram Trophy and the Southern Combination Cup, both of which saw an early exit. However, the team kept a high profile in the League staying in the top half of the table all season, eventually finishing in fifth place. They could have become champions had they won their last game of the season when, in a tightly bunched set of teams in the top six. Knaphill on 69pts needed to win at Farleigh to pip Staines Lammas to the title. Disappointingly they lost 3-2, so near yet so far.

The Reserves finished ninth in their Division with the second half of the season providing a 17 match sequence losing just two games. Adie Wilson having taken over in November from Graham Pope gelled well his players and together that was shown with the results. The A team won promotion to Division 2 of the GWAL, their second move up the ladder having been promoted from Division 3 to Division 2 the previous season. The new season sees a B team starting their first season in Division4(North).

In the close season Terry Chapman was voted in as the new Chairman, replacing Nick Croshaw who stood down after two seasons. The newly formed Ladies side will also come under the senior banner and once again enhance on the size of the football club. Plans for floodlights and hard standing alongwith a 100 seated stand at Redding way are moving forward with the help of Woking Borough Council who continue as in recent years to support the football club.

So, a challenge ahead for individuals, players and management combined for the new season 2009/10.

Combined Counties League Division One

Saturday January 30 2010

Cobham1 Knaphill 2

Knaphill produced a good performance with plenty of effort and determination in the 2-1 win and inflict fifth place Cobham with their first home League defeat of the season on Saturday. Leading goalscorer Ricky Hogsden struck both goals to give Knaphill a well earned three points.

After five minutes, Tom Davis put in Knaphill's first effort on goal, but it veered wide of the far post, as both sides had a fair share of possession before Cobham struck into the heart of the visitors defence after 17 minutes as Shane Cheesman glided the ball home from just inside the 18 yard box.

Knaphill were level 90 seconds later, producing a well worked equaliser when from a swift break, Tom Davis delivered a slick pass to Ricky Hogsden who fired in a cracking goal to make it 1-1, his 20th of the season, and Knaphill's 50th in the League.

After 23 minutes Craig Parrington put Hogsden away, but the striker's effort was covered by the advancing keeper. Knaphill were producing some neat one touch football and fluent moves, with their defence quick to cut out danger from their opponents. On the half hour Richard Shelley saved well from Cheesman. Knaphill's territorial advantage was evident, but neither side were able to come close enough forcing a second goal in the first half.

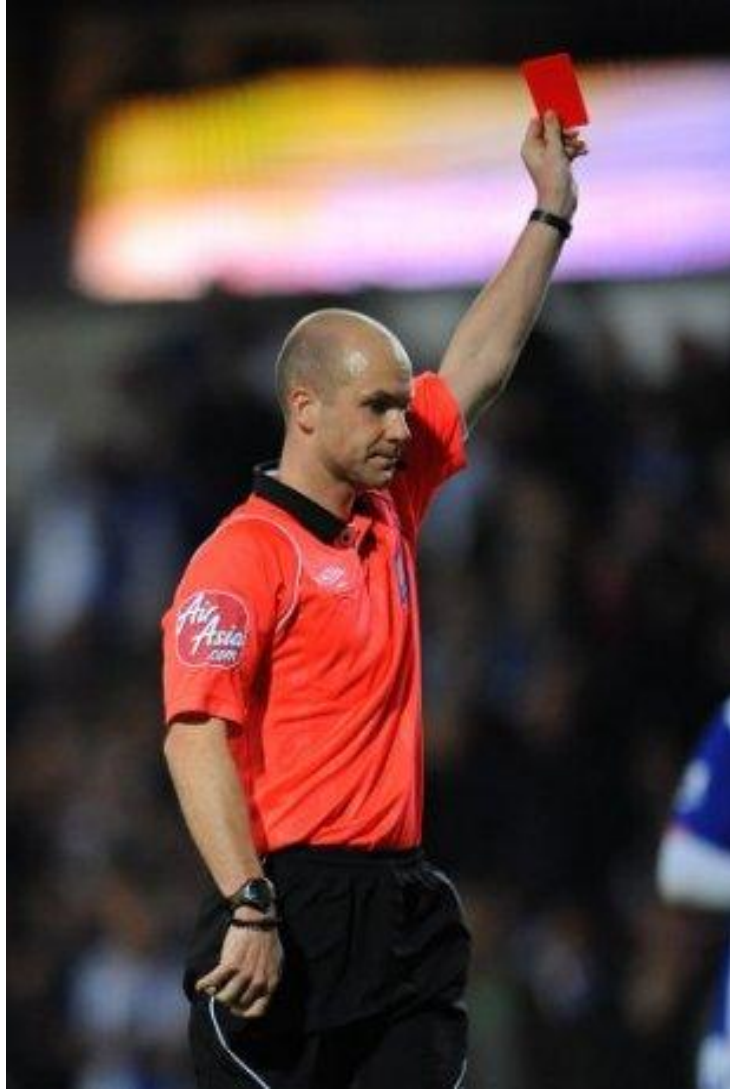

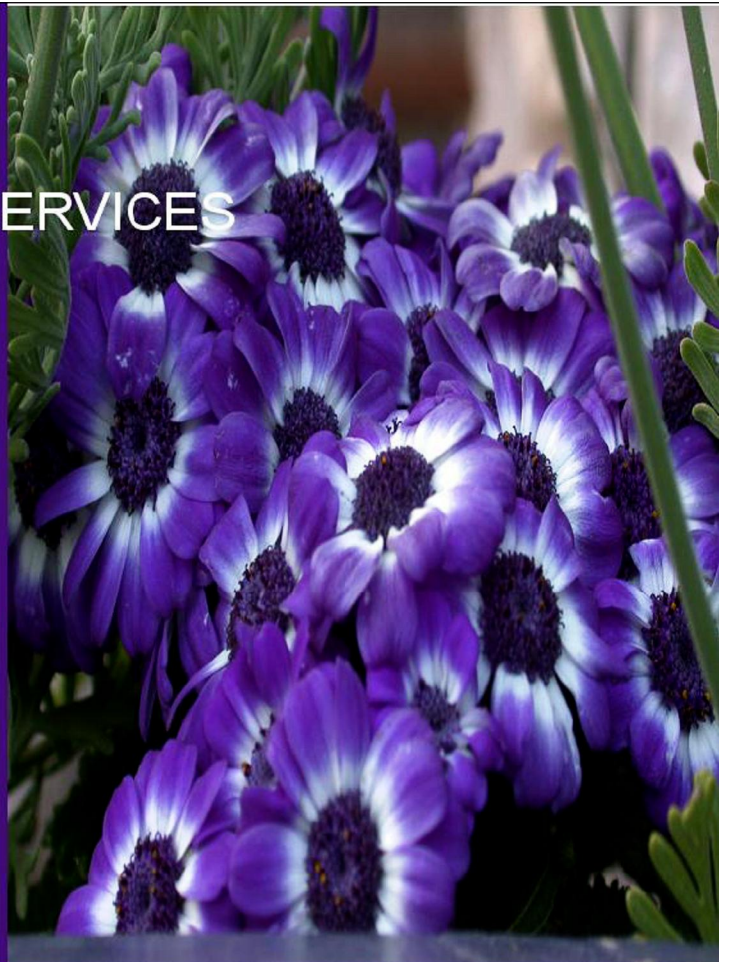

Remember the football song 'Football's Coming Home'? Well, football certainly did at Redding Way on Saturday when Knaphill returned to their home ground for the first time in 11 weeks, and marked the 'homecoming' with a convincing win. Following a goalless first forty five minutes, four goals in the second half, completed a league double over visitors Warlingham this season.

A bit of a frustrating first half for Knaphill, who created a number of chances, several of which were thwarted, not only in the first, but second period too, by goalkeeper Daniel Eaton. First scoring opportunity for the home side came in the fourth minute when Craig Parrington's 25 yard effort was tipped over by the keeper. Then three minutes later, Matt Baker's free kick was spilled by Eaton, who quickly retrieved the ball to deny the striker. The opening spell produced some fast pace football from both sides. Tom Davis fired in a Knaphill effort from 18 yards, which was well covered by the keeper. Although Knaphill were creating some good openings and

opportunities, Warlingham also produced a few anxious moments for the home defence as the half wore on. Nick Darnell's header for Knaphill, was gathered just short of dipping under the bar, before Ricky Hogsden saw his blistering shot parried away after 25 minutes.

In the 27th minute, Warlingham were reduced to ten men when James Ang was sent off for a foul on home defender Nathan Miles. Knaphill keeper Richard Shelley was well tested by the visitors after 34 minutes, having to tip away a goalbound effort. Knaphill, who continued to press for an opening goal, were still unable to find a way past the visitors keeper as the first half ended goalless.

The deadlock was broken in the 58th minute when Daniel Cox threaded the perfect pass through to Darnell who took his chance well to fire into the far corner of goal to give Knaphill the lead. Following another effort on goal from Davis, Knaphill increased their lead as Baker worked his way into space, and from the edge of the 18 yard box drilled home to make it 2-0.

Two minutes later, Parrington's seering drive from 25 yards was pushed over by Eaton as Knaphill entered the last twenty minutes, their play flowing well. But despite Knaphill looking comfortable with their two goal lead, a couple of good chances were spurned by Warlingham, as the visitors were looking to pull a goal back.

But extended pressure paid off for Knaphill, and near the end of the game, two goals came in time added on, when Baker's shot was partially saved by Eaton, leaving Hogsden to glide the ball home from close range, then Parrington finished off the scoring with a well flighted lobbed effort that beat the keeper from 35 yards to seal the win for Knaphill, in only their second league game in the space of six weeks.

This week Bryan Freeman gets the Inside Talk fromstriker Ricky Hogsden

Ricky Hogsden has won quite a few honours in his striker's role in local football, but it wasn't as a striker that saw the start of his early playing days. Ricky started playing when he was 10 years old with Sheer Tigers – as a goalkeeper. Following his time at Sheer, he moved onto Onslow Boys and slowly started moving 'upfield' and played a midfield role at Onslow for 2 years. In those earlier years Ricky was in the side that won the League title with Sheer, and a Cup finalist medal with Onslow. He also had a year with Cranleigh Youth for whom he played in the evenings.

At the age of 15 years, Ricky was moving up a gear as far as Leagues were concerned, and joined Shalford, then in the Guildford & Woking Alliance, for what was to be a seven year spell. At that time, quite remarkable for a player to stay with a Club for that number of years, but it was well worth his commitment shown to that Club, as Ricky went on to win four League winners medals, League Cup winners medal, and County Cup runners-up medal. Quite a haul !

He was with Shalford when they gained promotion to the Surrey Intermediate League, and in the seven years he was with the Club, Ricky was top goalscorer. Now that's consistency! Unfortunately, Ricky didn't know the total number of goals he'd scored during that spell when we were talking about his time there. But it wasn't only the goals that got him an award. He was also voted Manager's Player of the Year twice, Players Player of the Year twice, plus the Surrey Advertiser Player of the Year award.

Was that enough medals and awards for Ricky ? No, it wasn't, as when he joined Westfield from Shalford for season 2007/08 he became.....you've guessed it – top goalscorer for the Combined Counties League side. The goal-scoring hotshot was only at Westfield for one season as the team there was split up with many players leaving, which saw Ricky looking for another Club which ended with the move to Knaphill for the 2008/09 season.

How did he find the level of the game when he originally moved on from Shalford to Westfield and then Knaphill. 'Found it physical, but a better level of football in the CCL' said Ricky. And in his first season at Knaphill, Ricky enjoyed last season with good players with him in the team, but did feel that the team didn't play to their full extent and obviously disappointing for all not to clinch the title on the last day.





He rates this season's side better than last year, although not playing to their full potential. Hope though for the second half of the season to start picking up with some consistency and a winning run.

As far as Ricky's position as a top goalscorer in his previous years is concerned, he may well be challenging for that title this season, as he could be putting in a challenge to previous seasons Knaphill top shot Matt Baker. Following the match against Warlingham two weeks ago, Ricky was in front with 18 goals and Matt with 14. Could be an interesting second half of the League programme.....

Strike partners Matt Baker and Ricky Hogsden have already scored 33 goals between them this season and are rated as the best front two in Division One.

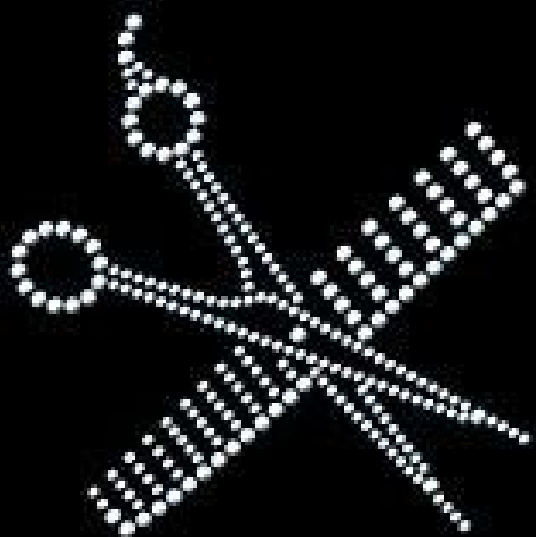

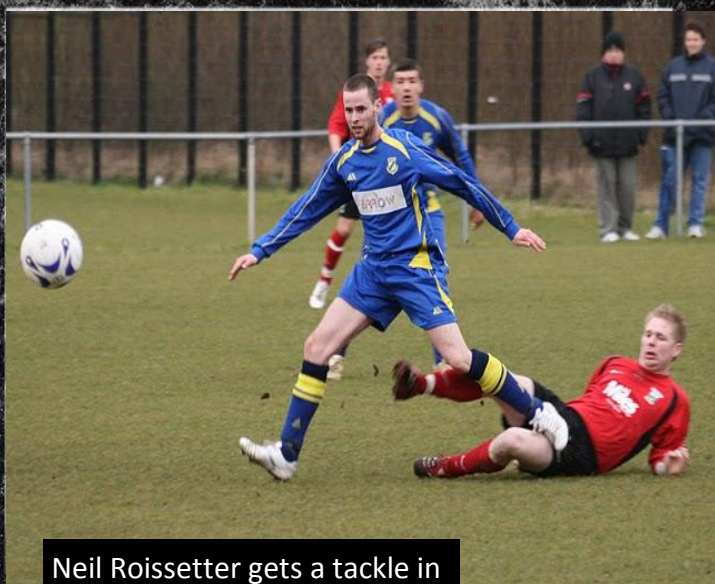
